HOURLY VISIBILITY BREAKDOWN

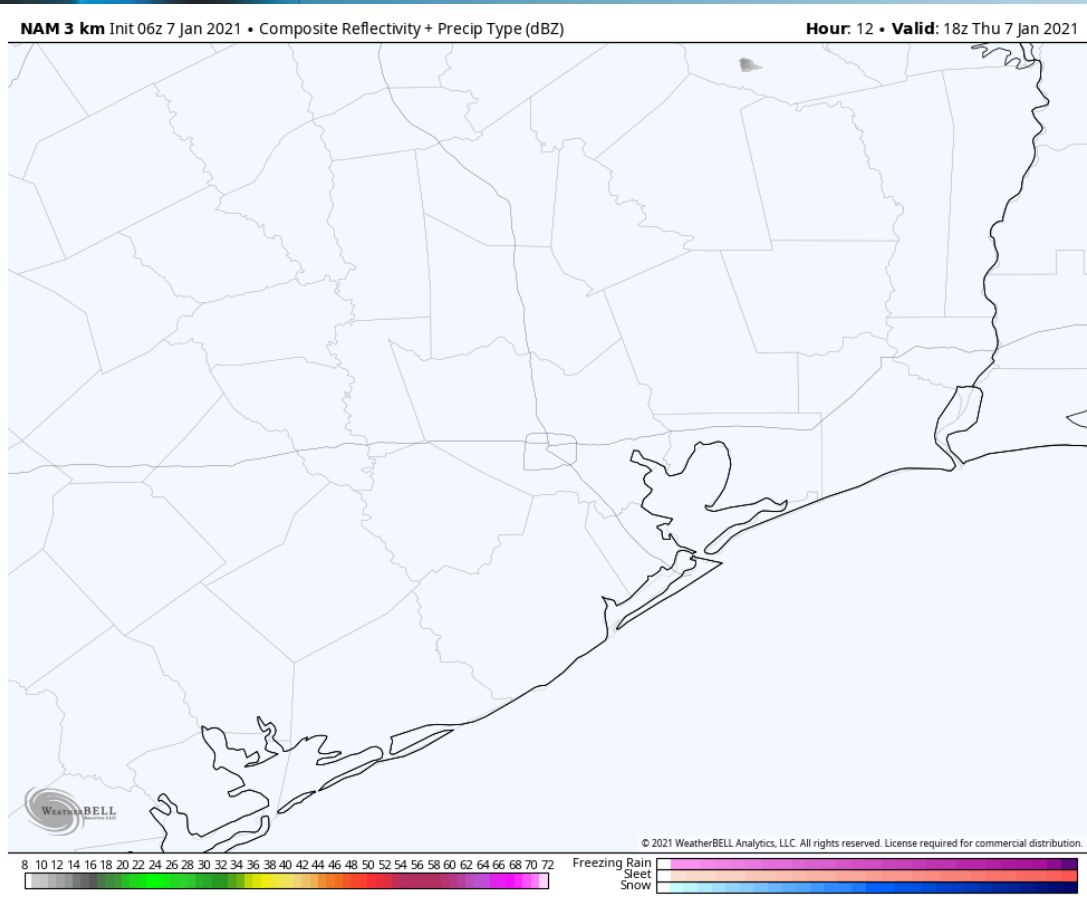

Short-Term Forecast Discussion

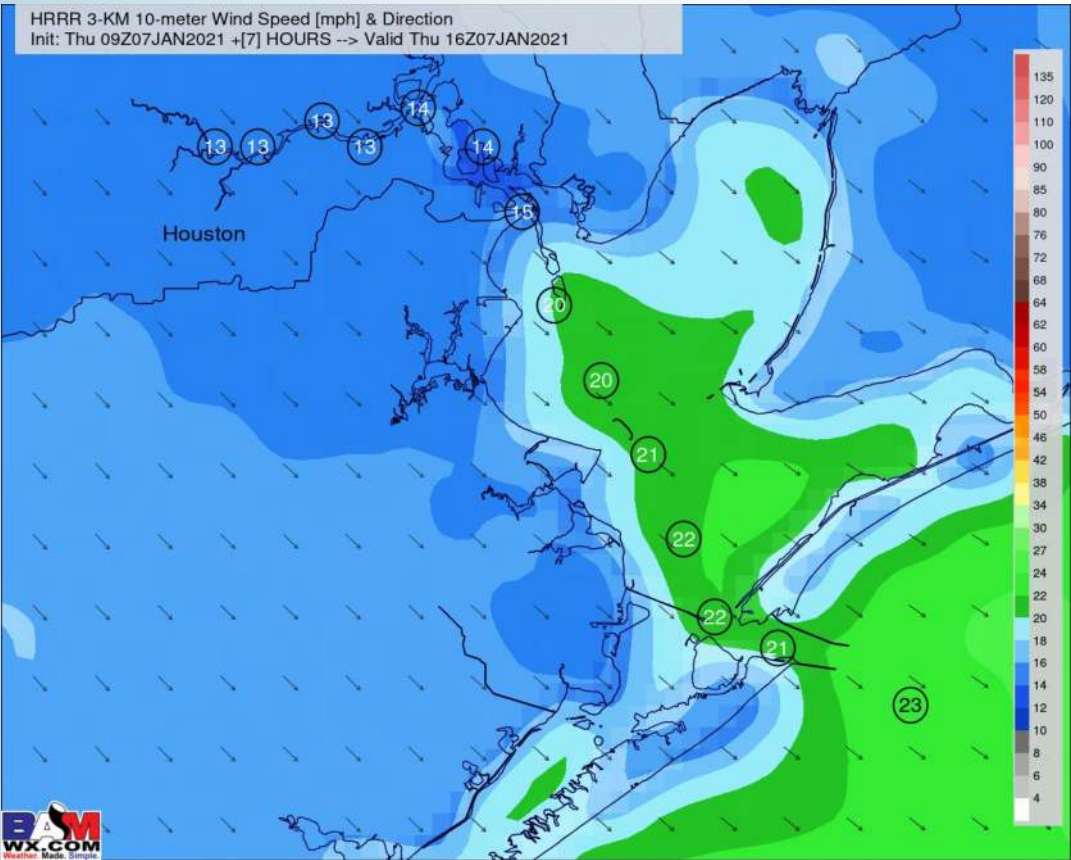
- Today is looking to be a dry day.
- Winds will be out of the NW sustained at 20-25 MPH with 30 MPH gusts for the boarding station. Stations north of Morgan's Point will have 10-15 MPH winds with 25 MPH gusts. Around 6PM winds will begin to shift N with sustained winds for the boarding station dropping to 15-20 MPH.
- Today's high temperatures will be in the upper 50s.
 - No fog is expected today.

Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)

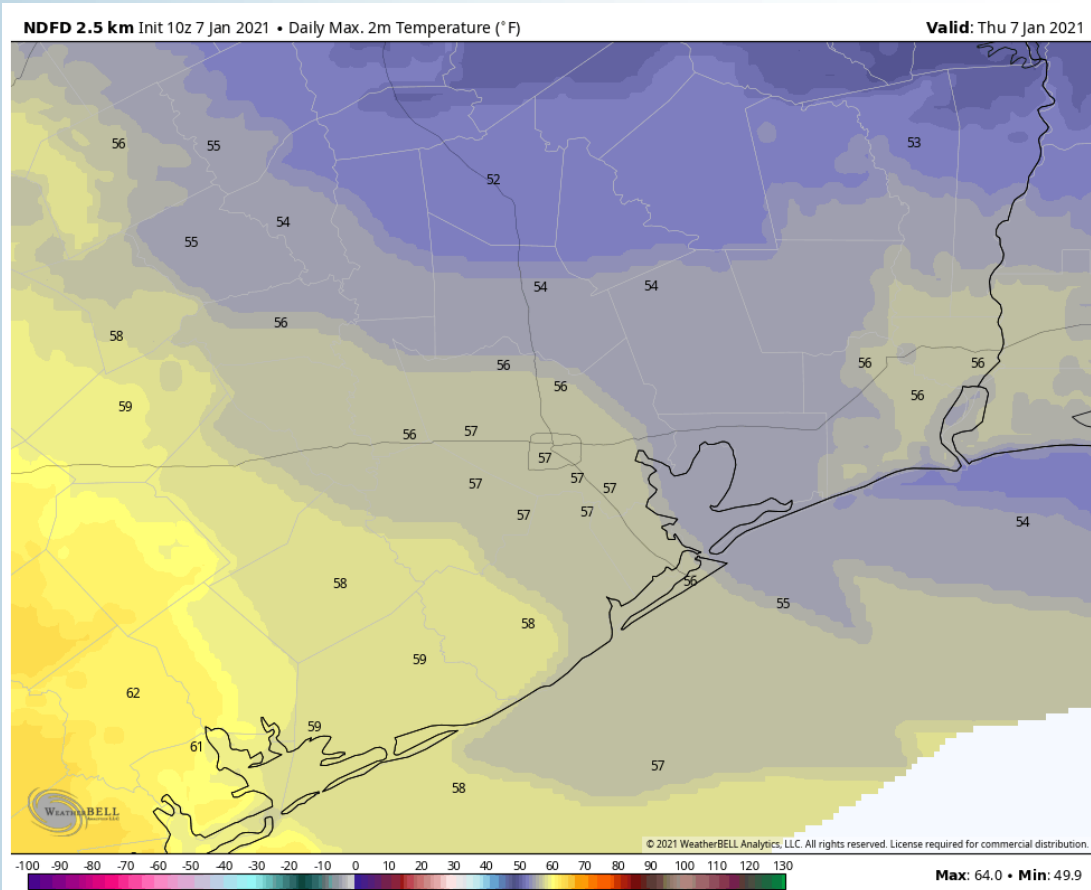

Sustained Winds (10 AM CT)



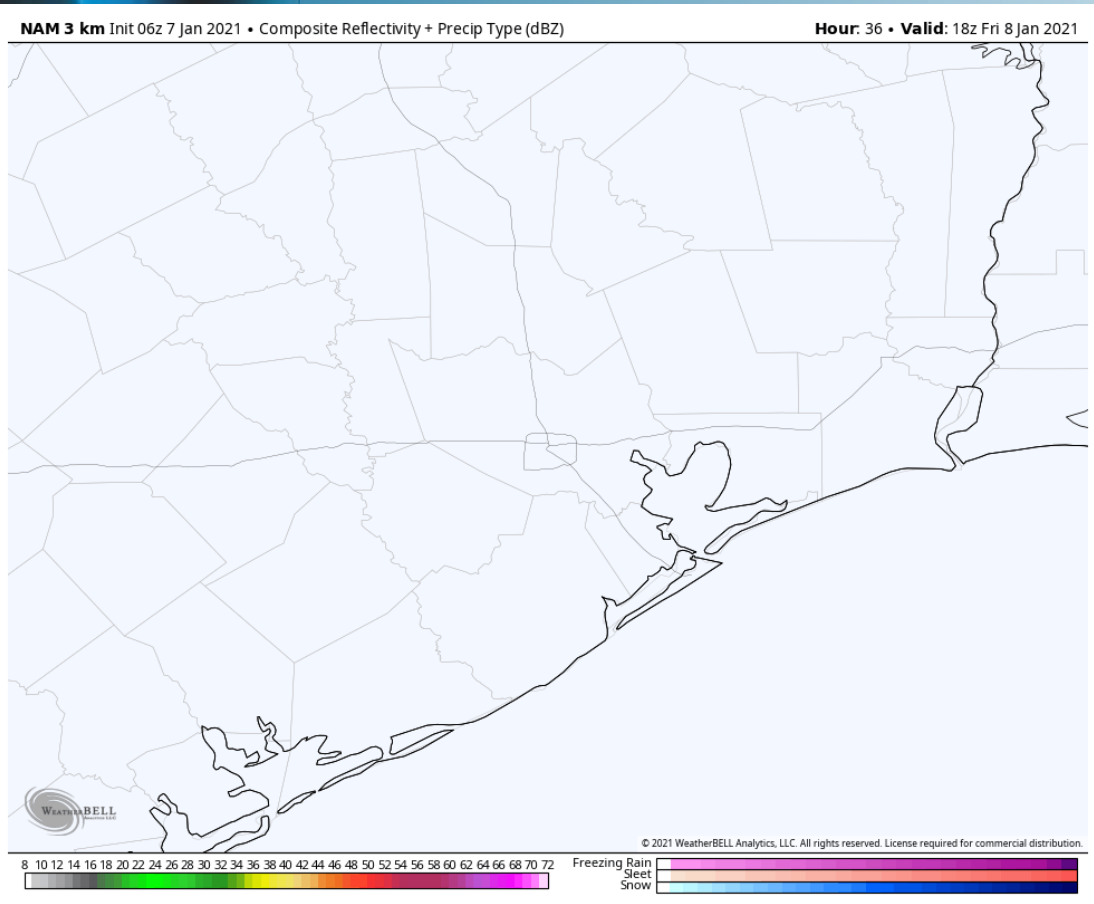

Short-Term Forecast Discussion

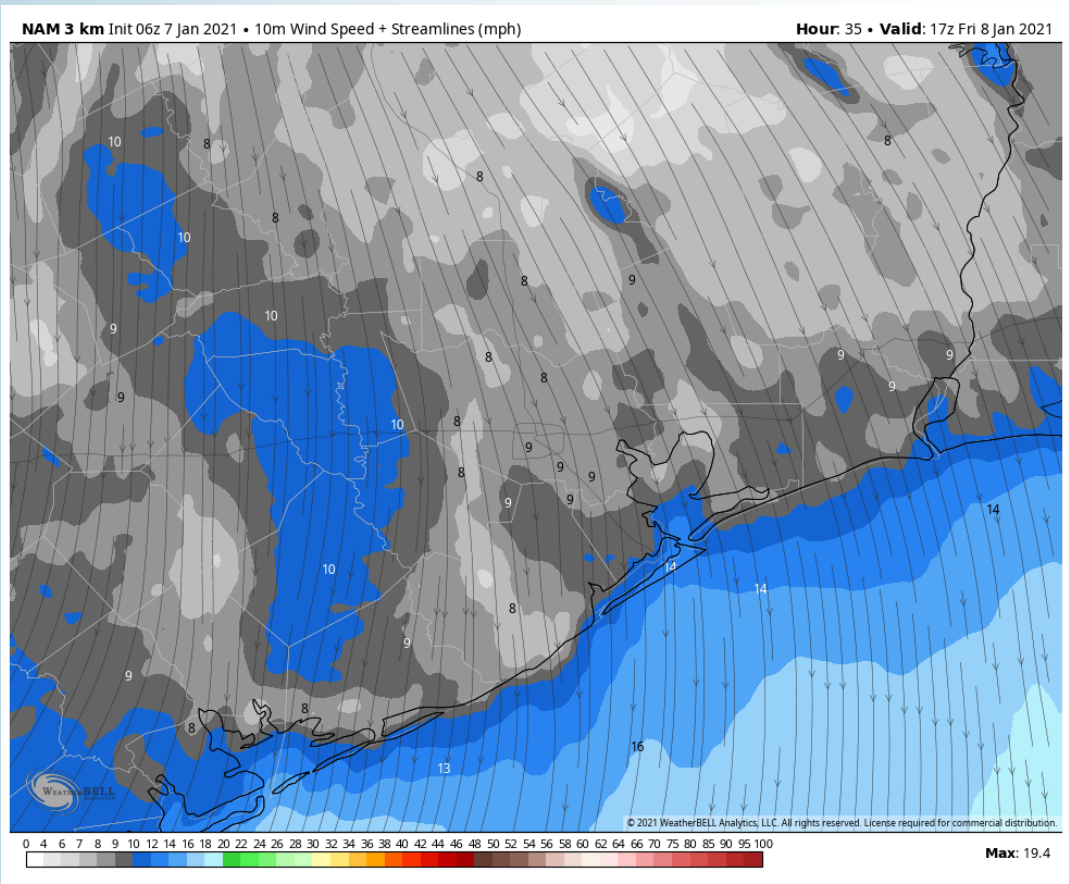
- Friday looks to be a dry day.
- Winds are out of the N generally they will be sustained at 13-18 MPH with gusts at 20 MPH at the boarding station. Stations north of Morgan's Point will have winds around 8-13 MPH. Late evening/ overnight winds will begin to shift NE.
- Temperatures Friday will be in the mid 50s.
- No fog is expected for Friday

Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)

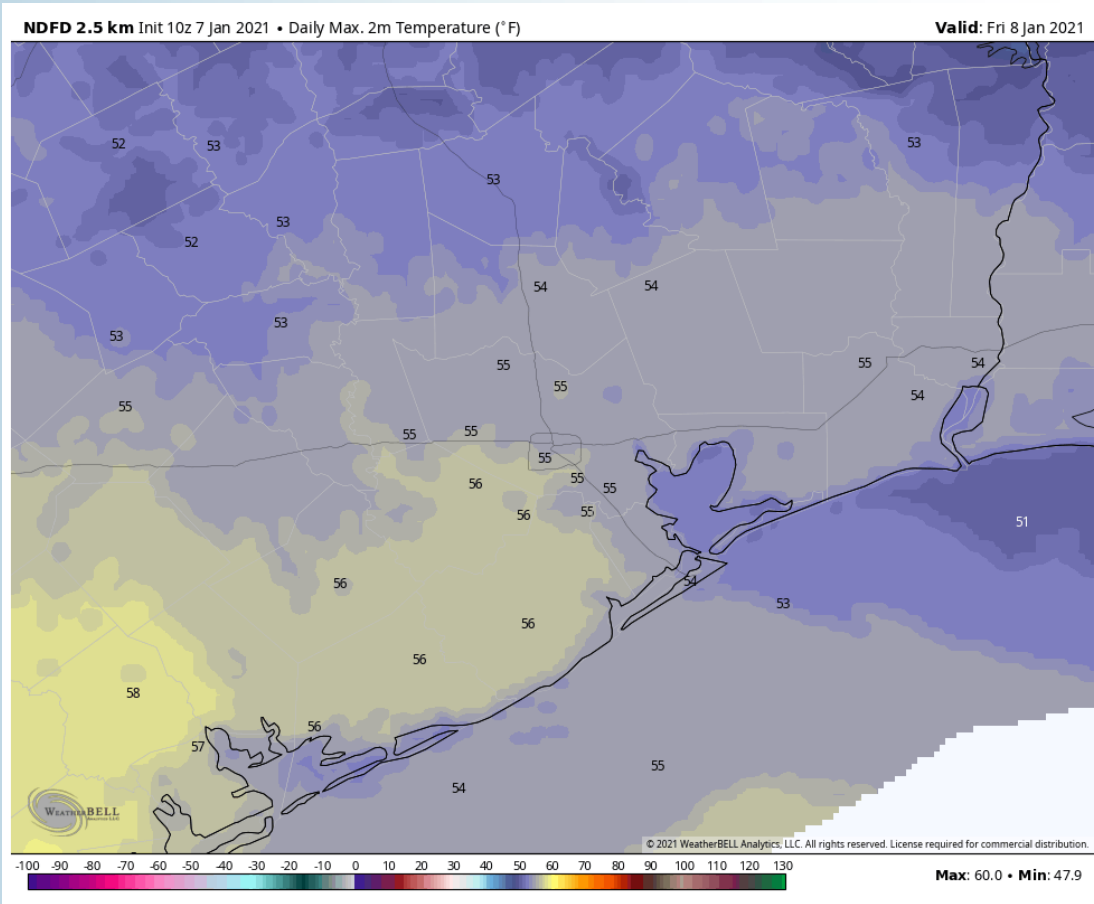


Friday, January 8th, 2021

Sustained Winds (11 AM CT)



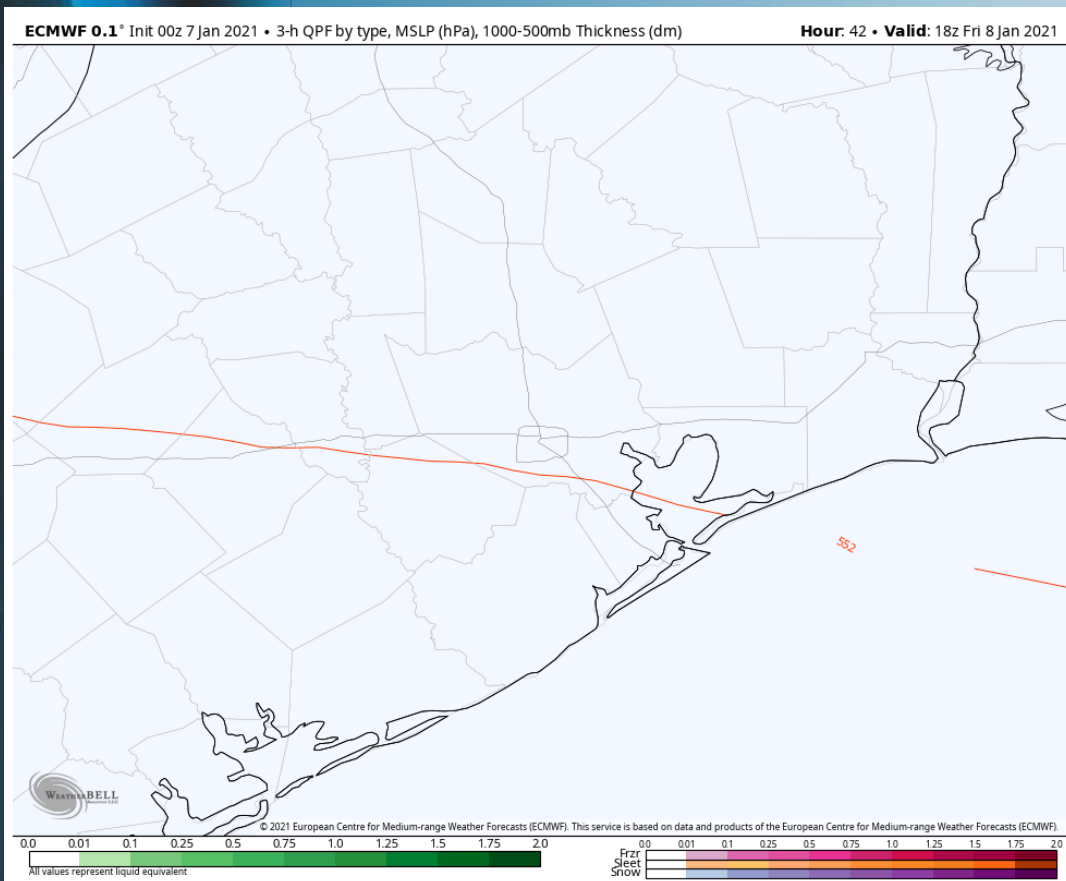

Short-Term Forecast Discussion

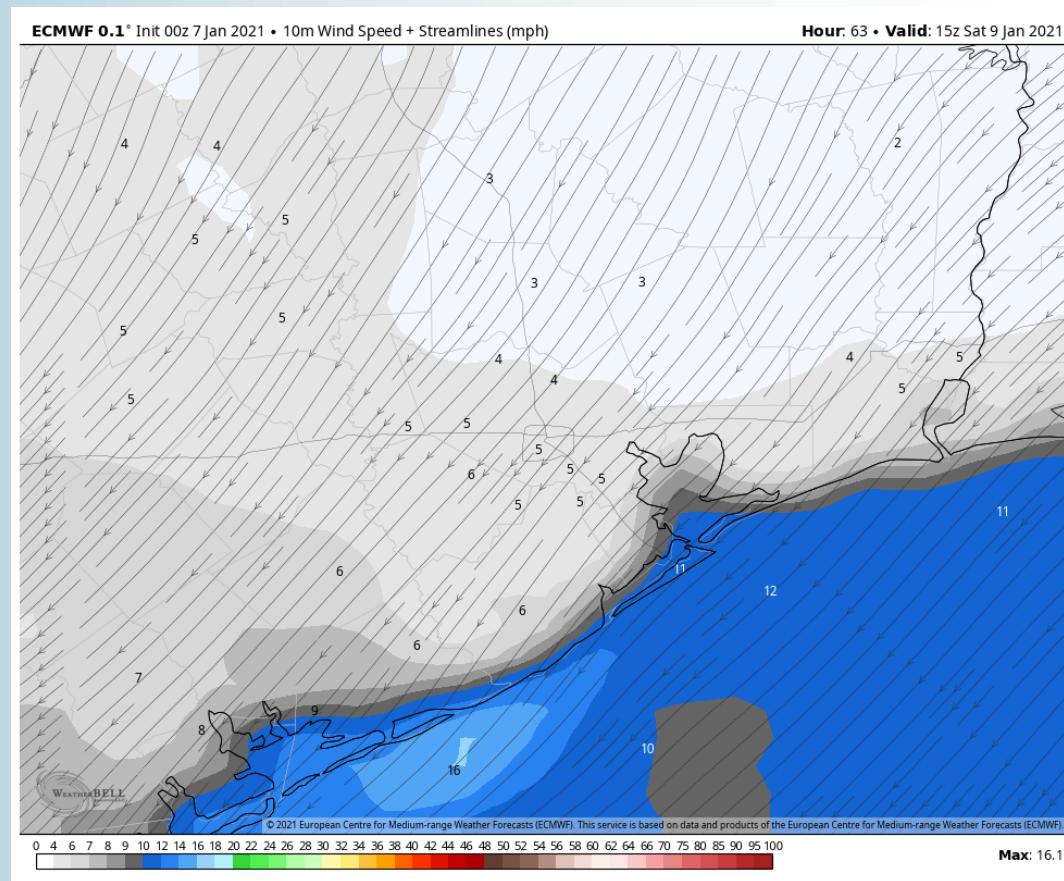
- Saturday looks to be a dry day.
- Winds will be out of the N with sustained winds at 10-15 MPH with gust up to 20 MPH for the boarding station. Stations along Buffalo Bayou will have sustained winds of 3-8 MPH. Winds will shift through the morning until noon to be out of the NE. Afternoon into the evening winds will shift to be out of the E.
- High temperatures will be in the mid 50s.
- No Fog is expected at this distance.

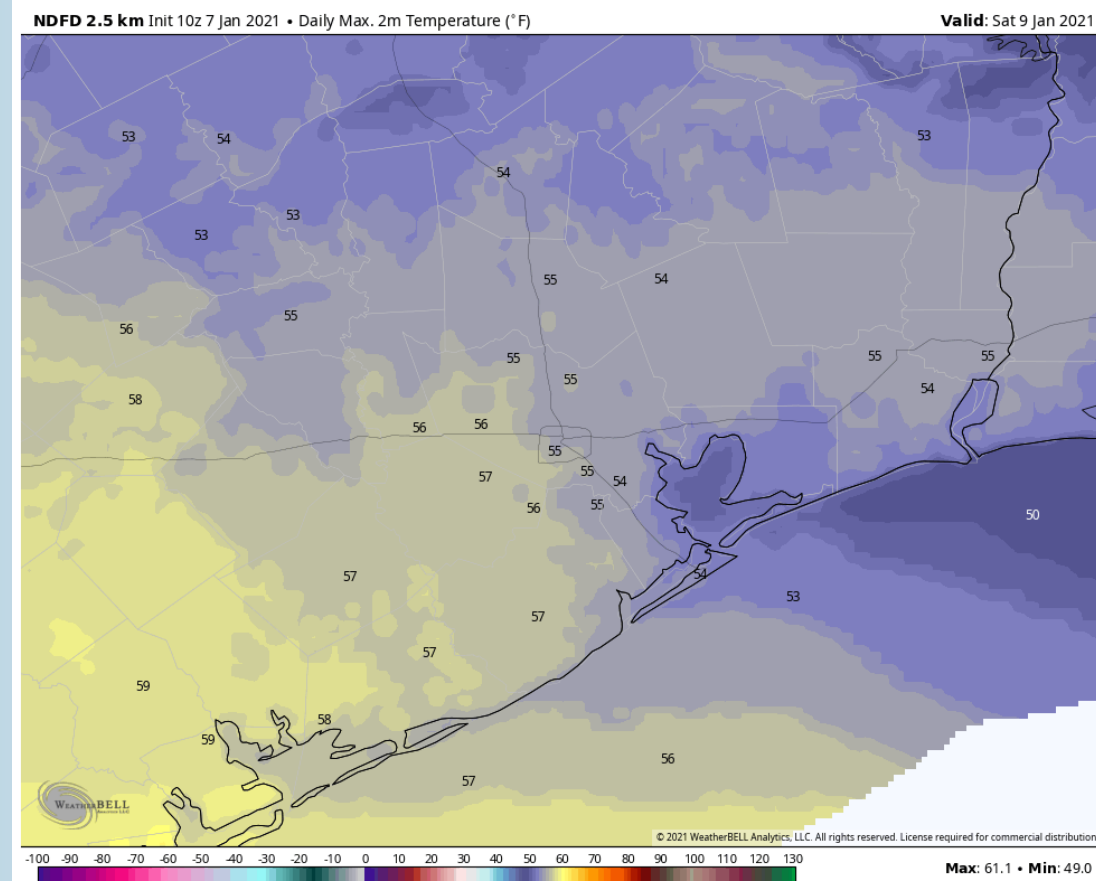

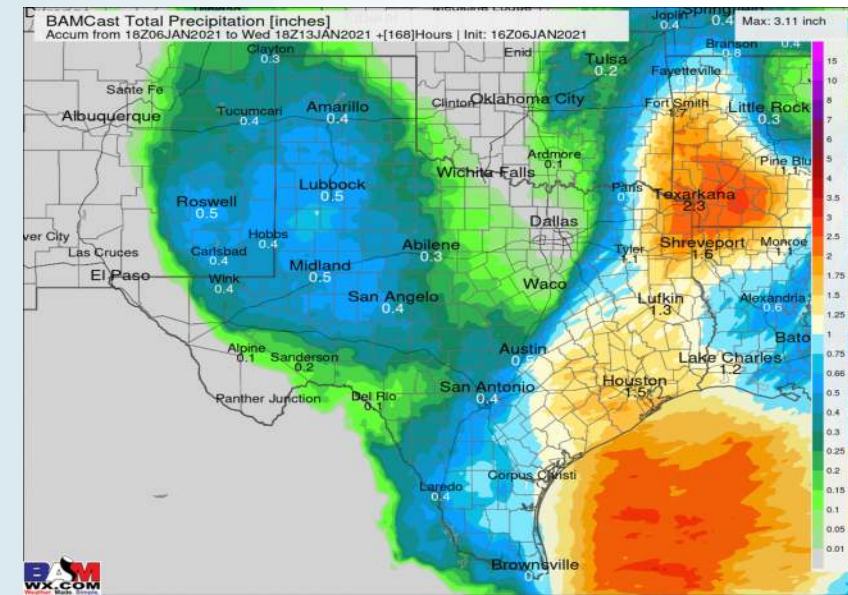
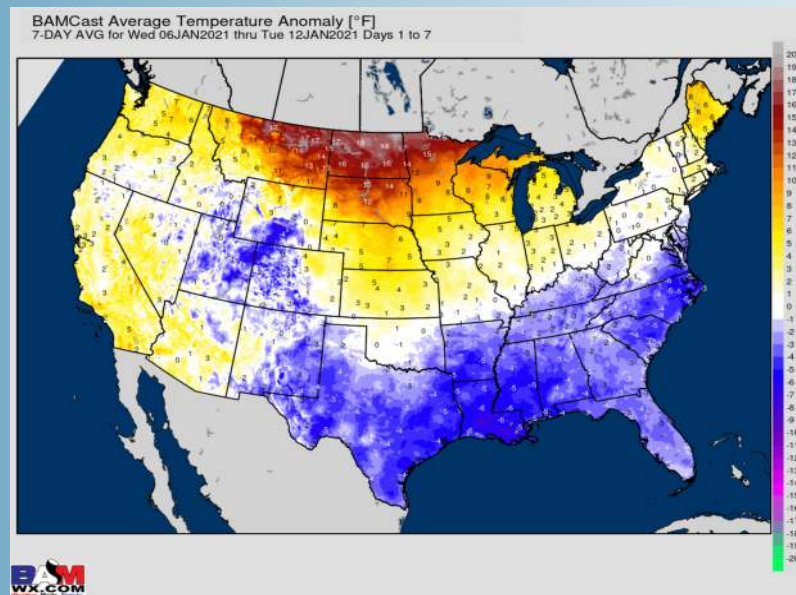
Sustained Winds (9 AM CT)



High Temperatures Saturday



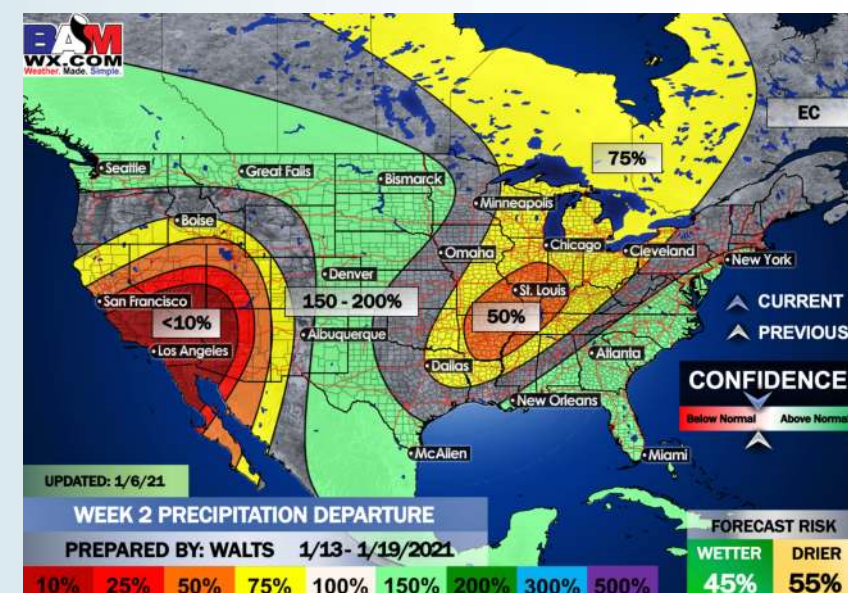
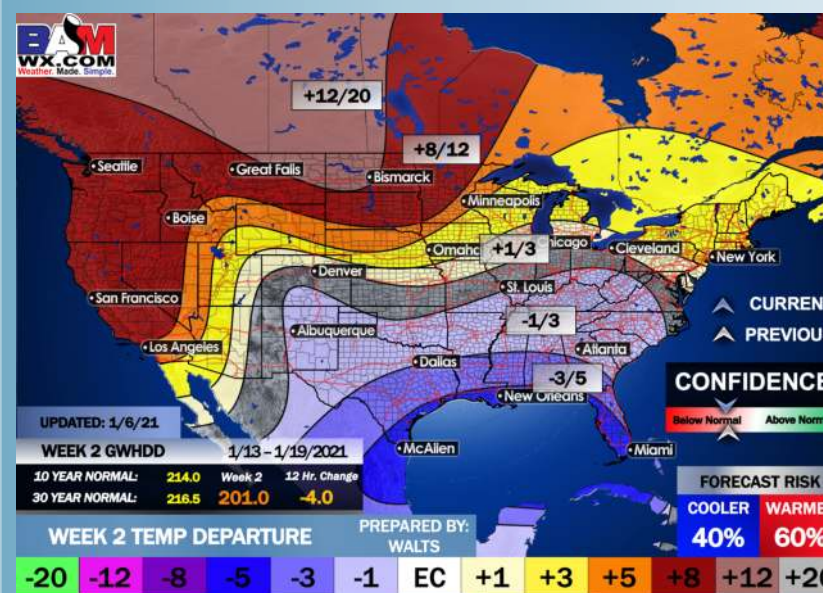
Week 1 Forecast



Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Below normal temperatures are expected. Temperatures begin to drop with front passage tonight. An overall dry pattern is anticipated outside of a shot of moisture tonight and Sunday.
- Our latest favored week 2 guidance features the Houston area at below normal temps and about normal precipitation. Periodic shots of precipitation will be possible as these fronts pass the area.
- Our latest weeks $\frac{3}{4}$ forecast features the Houston area at below normal temperatures and about normal precipitation. Long range guidance continues to favor more of a cooler pattern for the S US.
