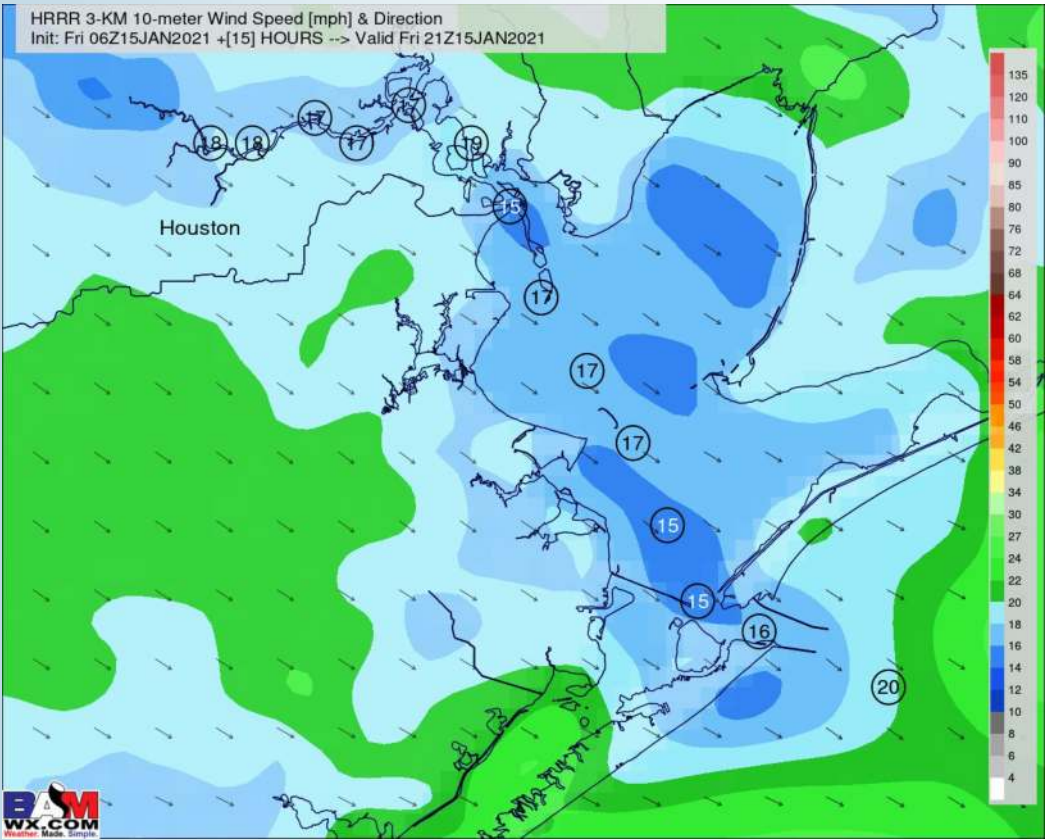

Short-Term Forecast Discussion

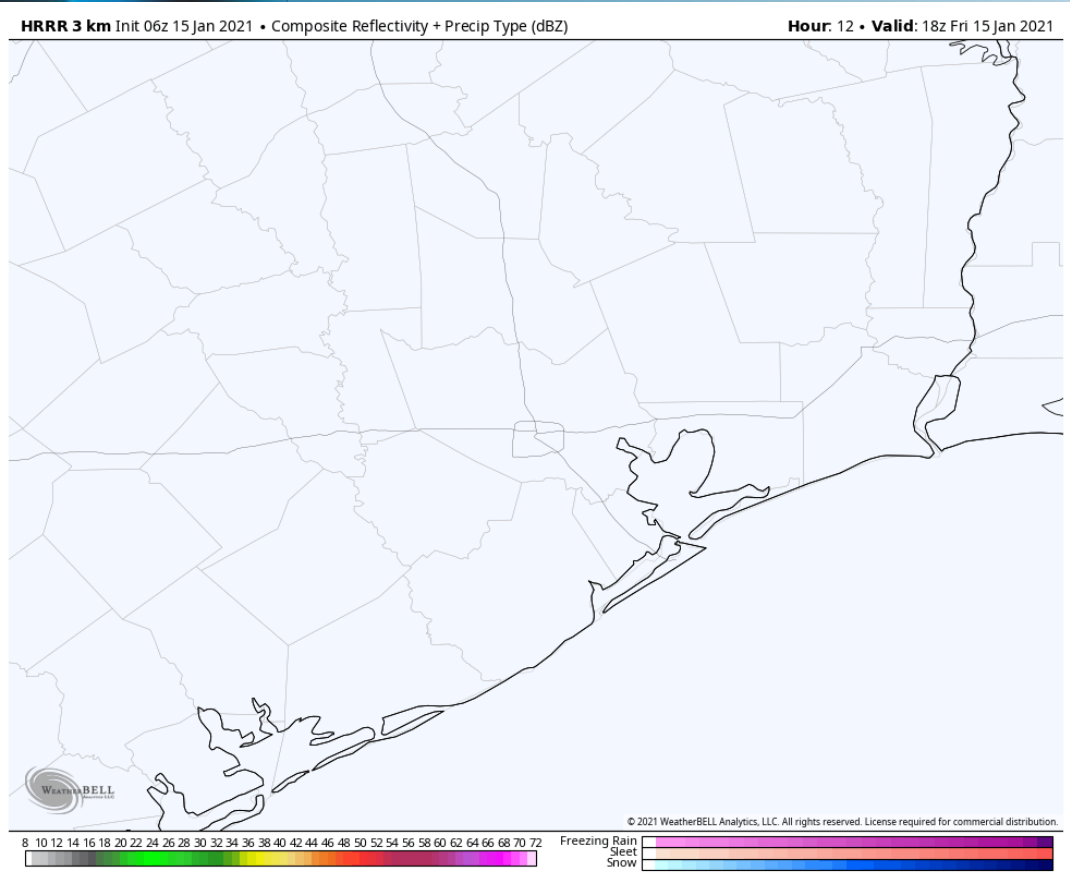
- Today looks to be a dry day
- Winds will come from the NW sustained at 5-10 MPH north of Morgan's Point with 10-20 MPH winds to the south. Around 9-10 AM winds will increase to 15-25 MPH for all stations. About 20-30 MPH wind gusts can be expected throughout the day with an isolated higher. Around 5-6 PM winds will drop to 10-15 MPH for stations north of Morgan's Point.
- High temperatures will be in the upper 50s.
 - No fog is expected for Today.

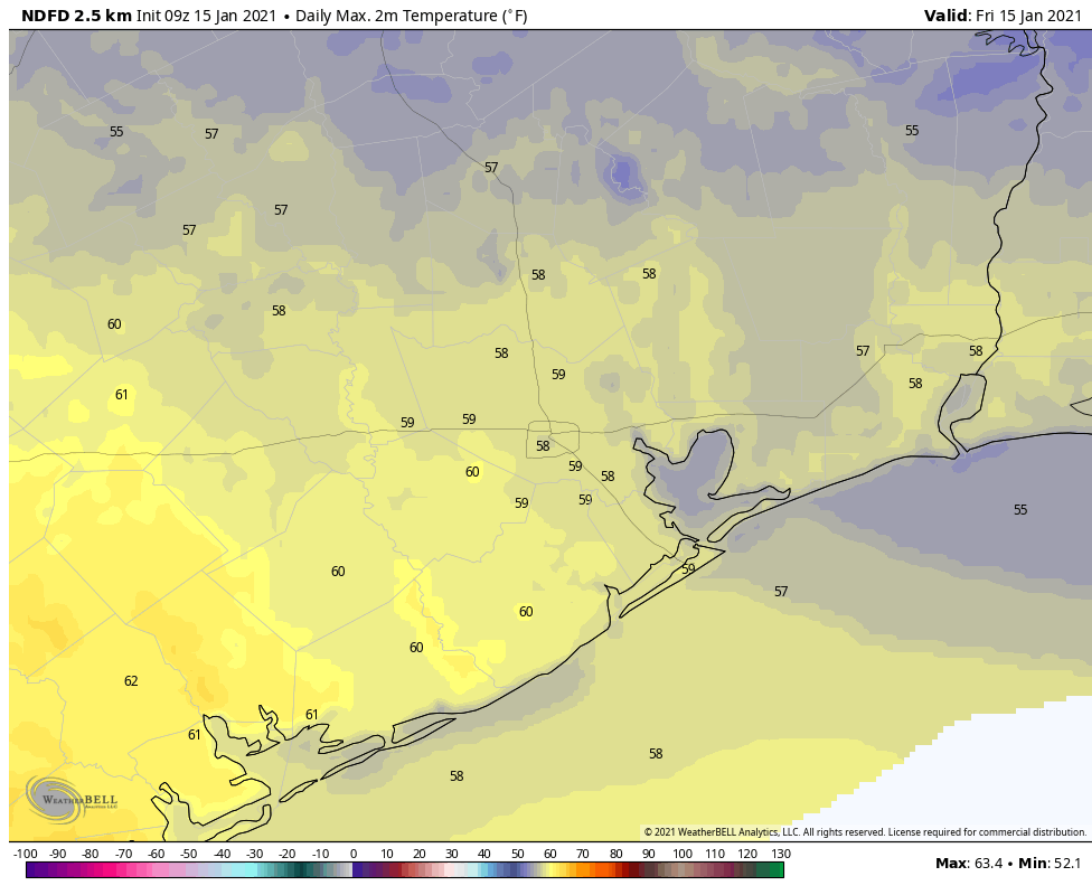
Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)



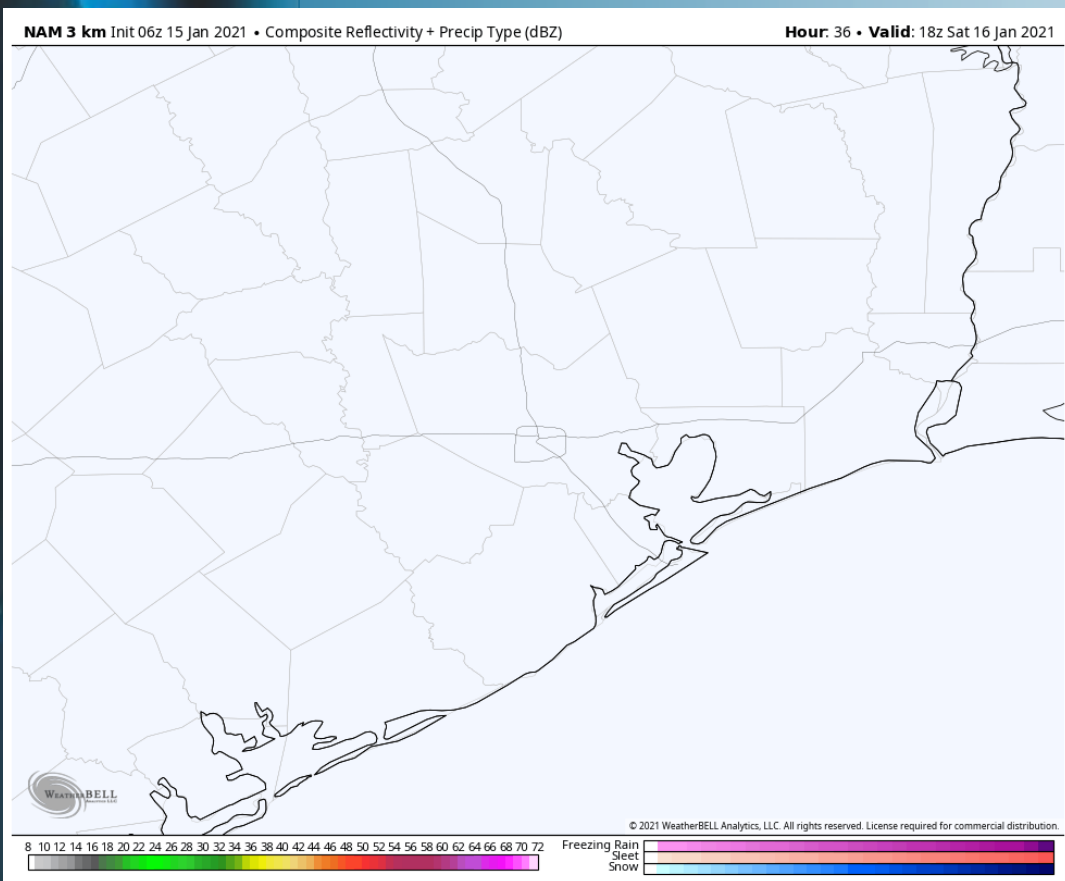

Short-Term Forecast Discussion

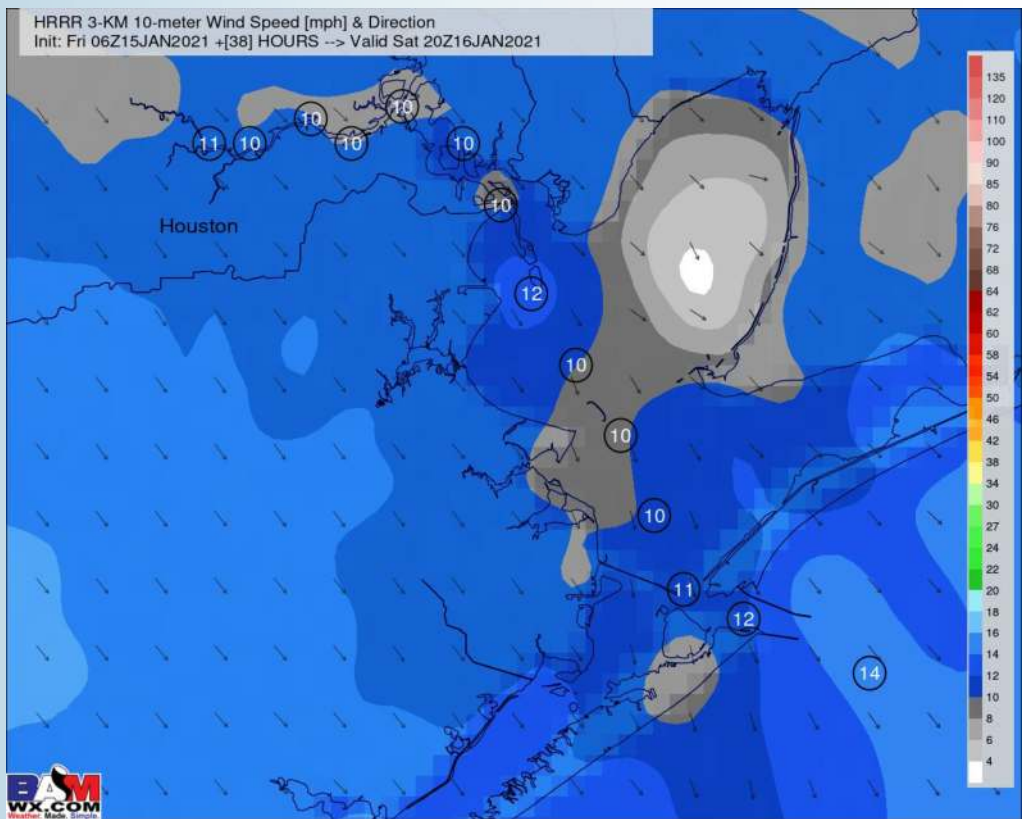
- Saturday will be a dry day.
- Winds will be out of the NW 5-10 MPH north of Morgan's Point with winds 10-15 MPH to its south. Boarding station gusts will be 15-25 MPH until about 2-4 PM timeframe. Around 2-4 PM winds will drop to 5-10 MPH for all stations.
- High Temperatures will be in the upper 50s.
 - Fog is not anticipated

Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)

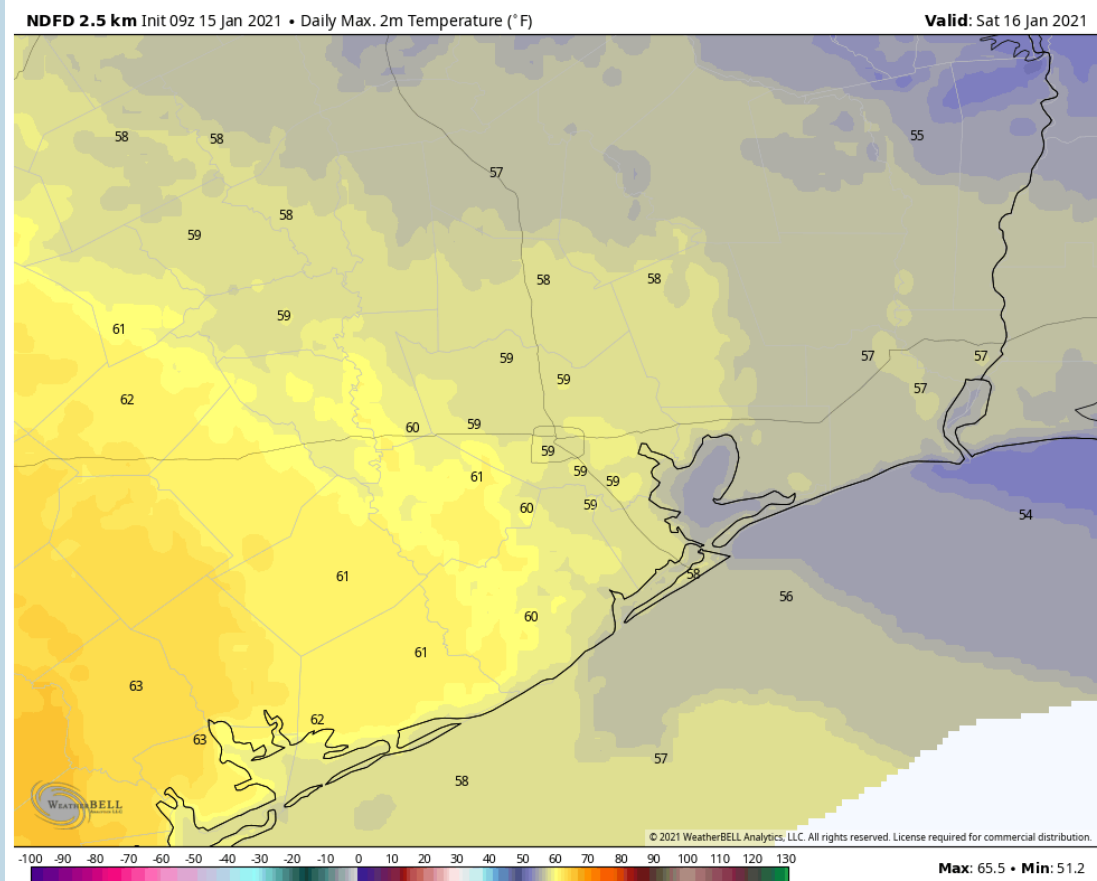


Saturday, January 16th, 2021

Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



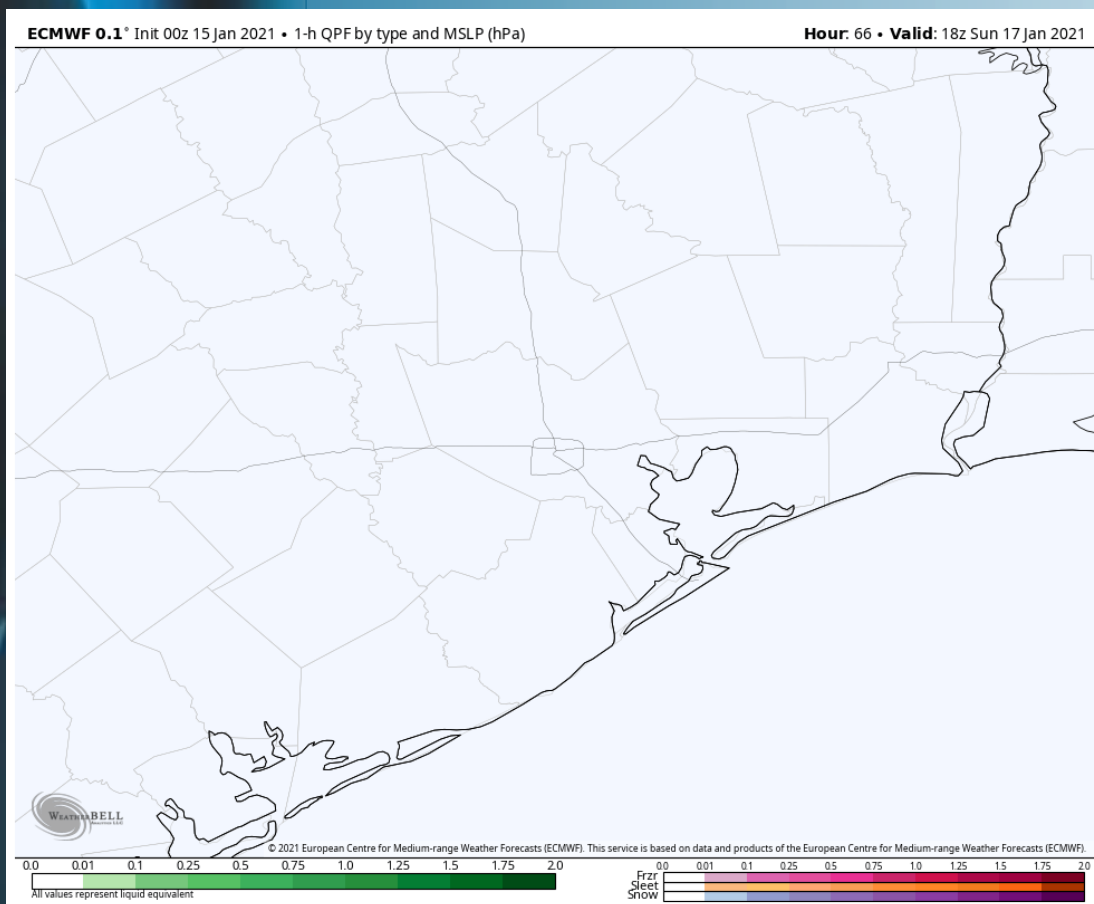

Short-Term Forecast Discussion

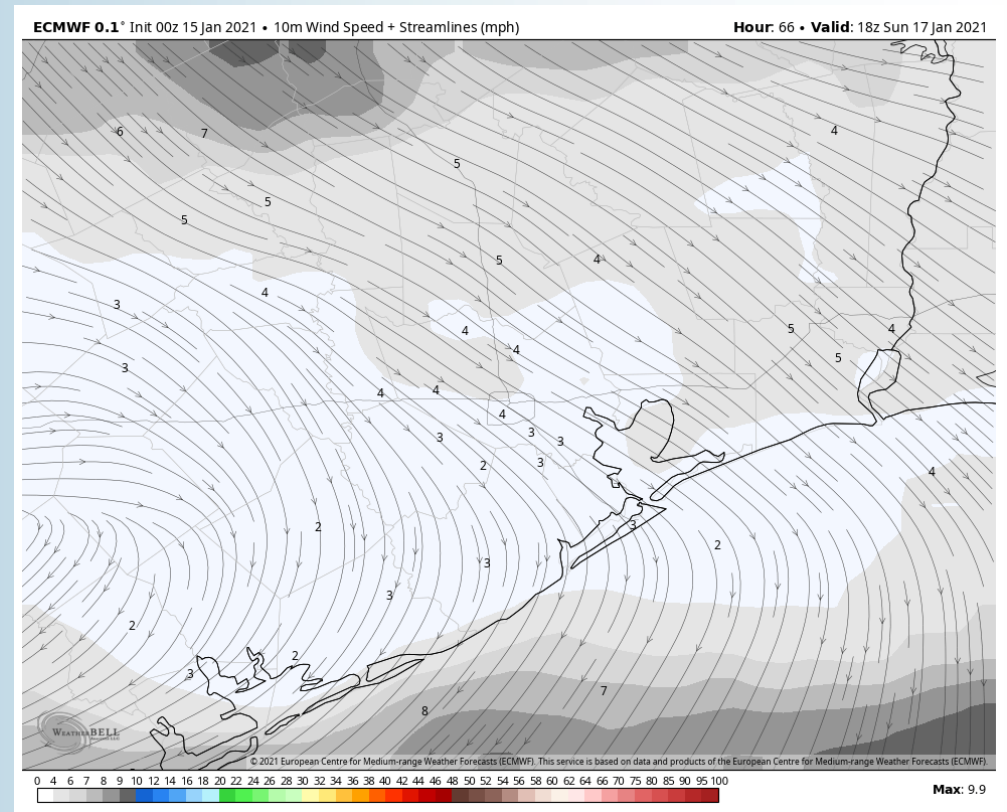
- Sunday will be a dry day.

Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)

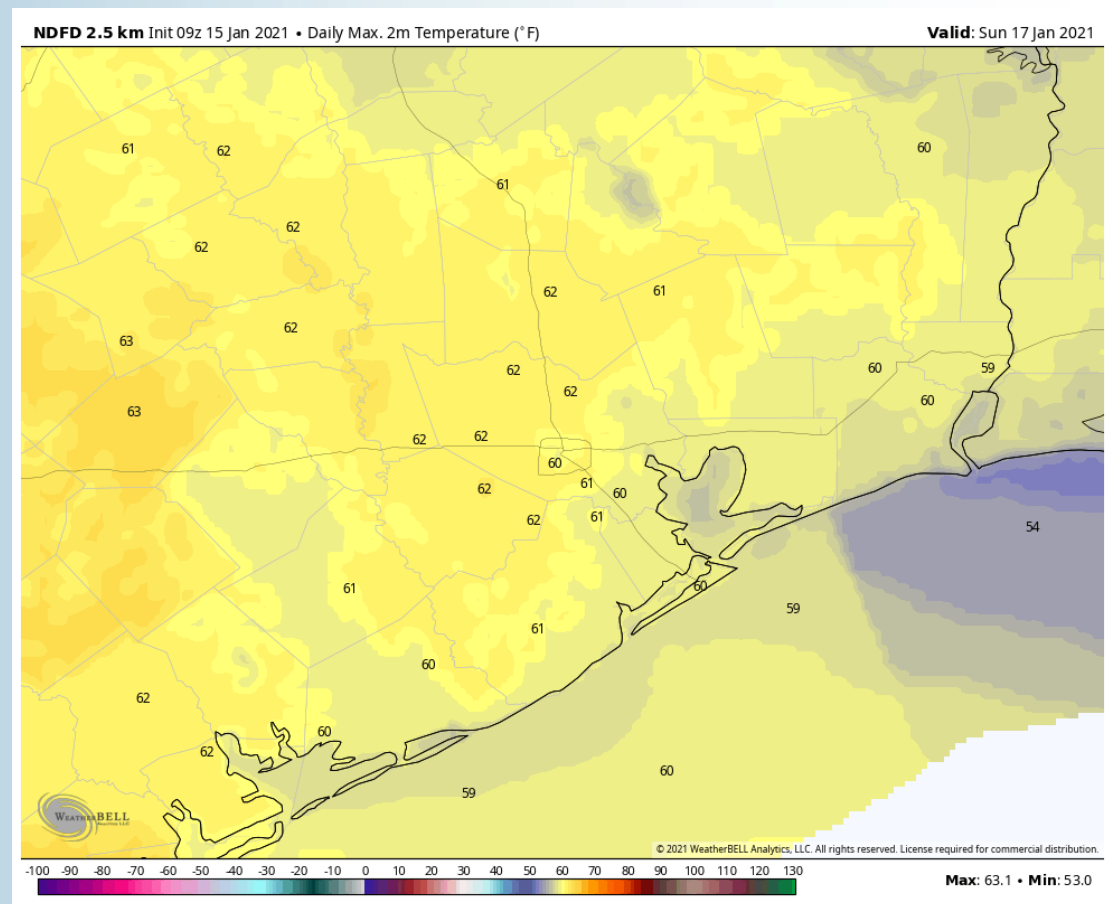


Sunday, January 17th, 2021

High Temperatures Sunday



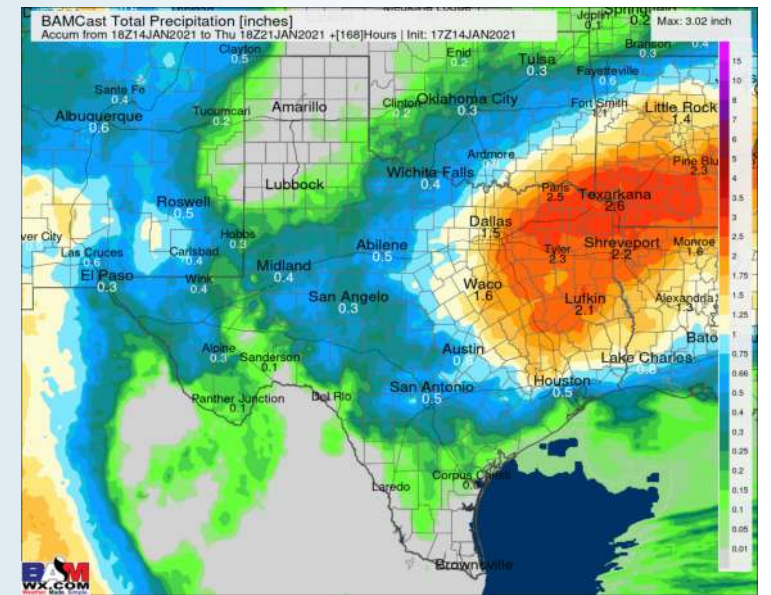
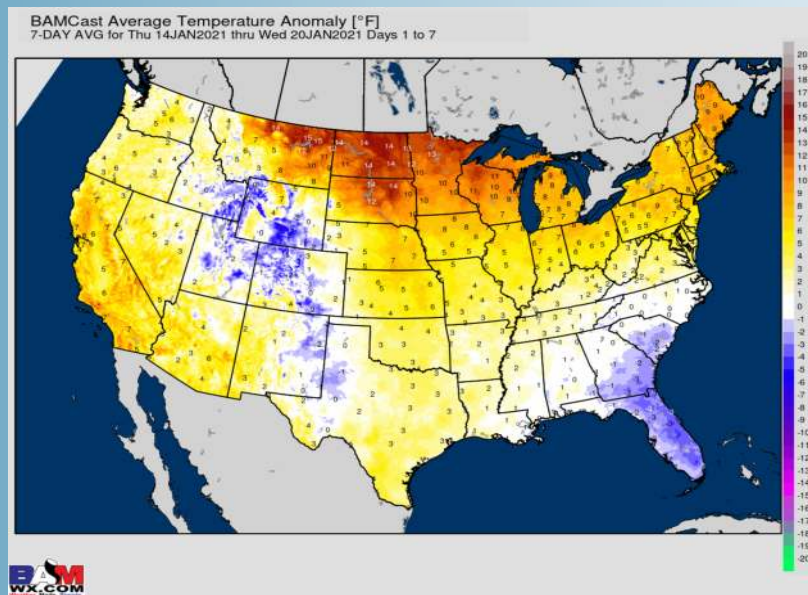
Week 1 Forecast

Long-Range Forecast Discussion

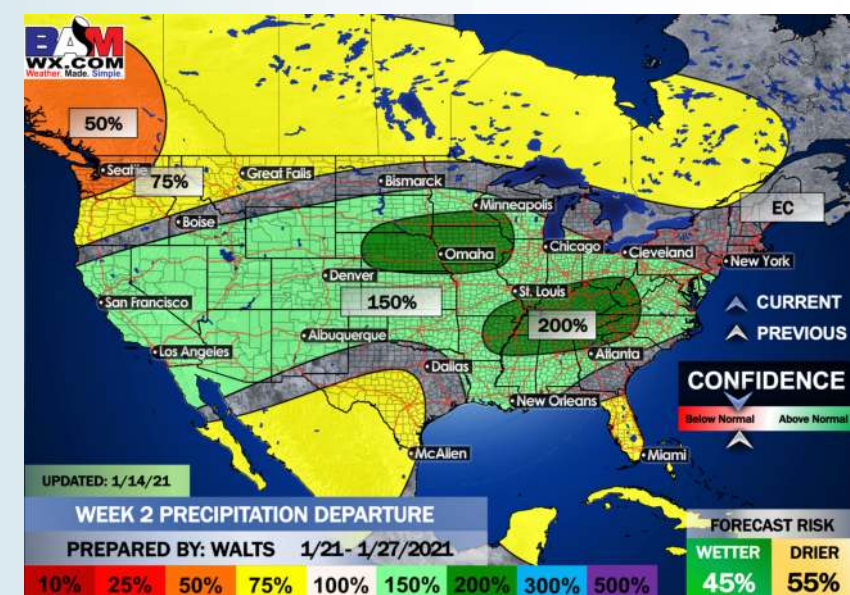
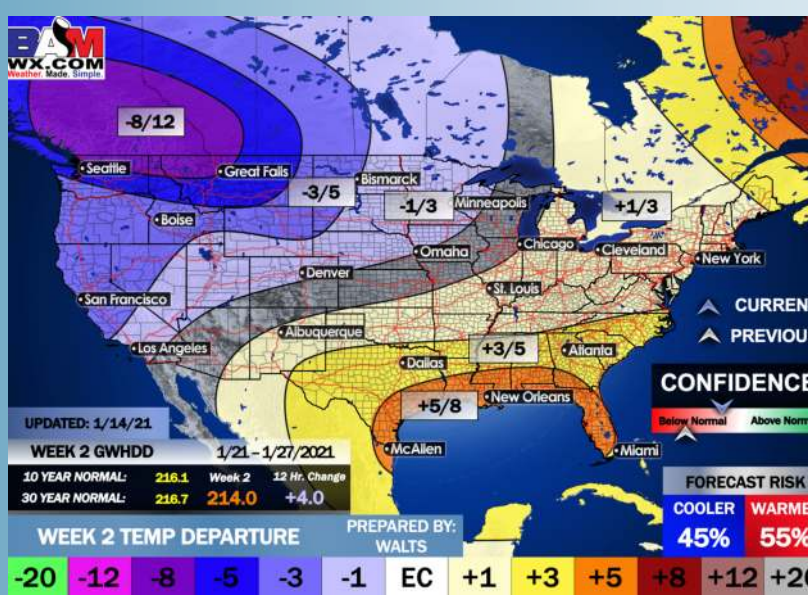
➤ Above normal temperatures in the wake of last weekend's low pressure system are anticipated for most of the week. Mostly dry conditions are anticipated this week with chances near the WED-THUR timeframe.

➤ Our latest favored week 2 guidance features the Houston area at above normal temps and about normal precipitation.

➤ Our latest weeks $\frac{3}{4}$ outlooks feature the Houston area with above normal temperatures and slightly below normal precipitation. Periodic frontal passages will offer up some moisture with longer stretches of drier weather in between.
