




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- It will remain dry for the rest of the day.
- This evening winds will be sustained around 5 – 10 MPH. Winds generally remain out of the SW with periods of southerly winds. Gust around 15 MPH will be possible.
- Low temps tonight will be in the upper 40's with upper 50's at the boarding station.
- No Fog is expected for the rest of the day


Sustained Winds (8 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (8 PM CT)




Low Temperatures Tonight




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Monday is also looking to be another dry day.
- Winds will be out of the SW sustained at 4-8 MPH with 15 MPH gusts. Around 3-6 PM a high pressure system will pass over head bringing calm winds out of the NW. After the passage N/ NE winds will be established early Tuesday.
- High temperatures for Monday will be in the upper 60's inland and low 60's for the boarding station.
- As the high pressure system moves through the area the calmer winds presented allow for some fog potential. We have some potential in the morning timeframe around 6-10 AM which is likely to stay to the north of stations. Another potential for fog is in the late evening and overnight hours.


Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



Forecast Visibility Monday (8 AM CT)




High Temps for Monday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Tuesday is also looking to be another dry day.
- Winds will start out of the NE and eventually work their way out of the SE after noon...generally they will be sustained 4-8 MPH, with a gust up to 10-15 MPH not impossible over the open water.
- High temperatures for Tuesday will be in the upper 60's inland and low 60's for the boarding station.
- Tuesday morning has some fog potential that will need further monitoring. The current guidance (shown below) is a bit more aggressive than others but exact specifics vary considerably.


Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)





Visibility Forecast Tuesday (3 AM CT)

Week 1 Forecast





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

➤ Above normal temperatures are expected Sunday through Wednesday. Temperatures begin to moderate with a frontal passage mid to late next week. An overall dry pattern is anticipated outside of a shot of moisture late WED into THU.

➤ Our latest favored week 2 guidance features the Houston area at about normal temps and about "normal" precipitation. Periodic shots of precipitation will be possible as these fronts pass the area.

➤ Our latest weeks 3/4 forecast features the Houston area at below normal temperatures and below normal precipitation. Long range guidance continues to favor more of a cooler pattern for the S US heading into the New Year.
