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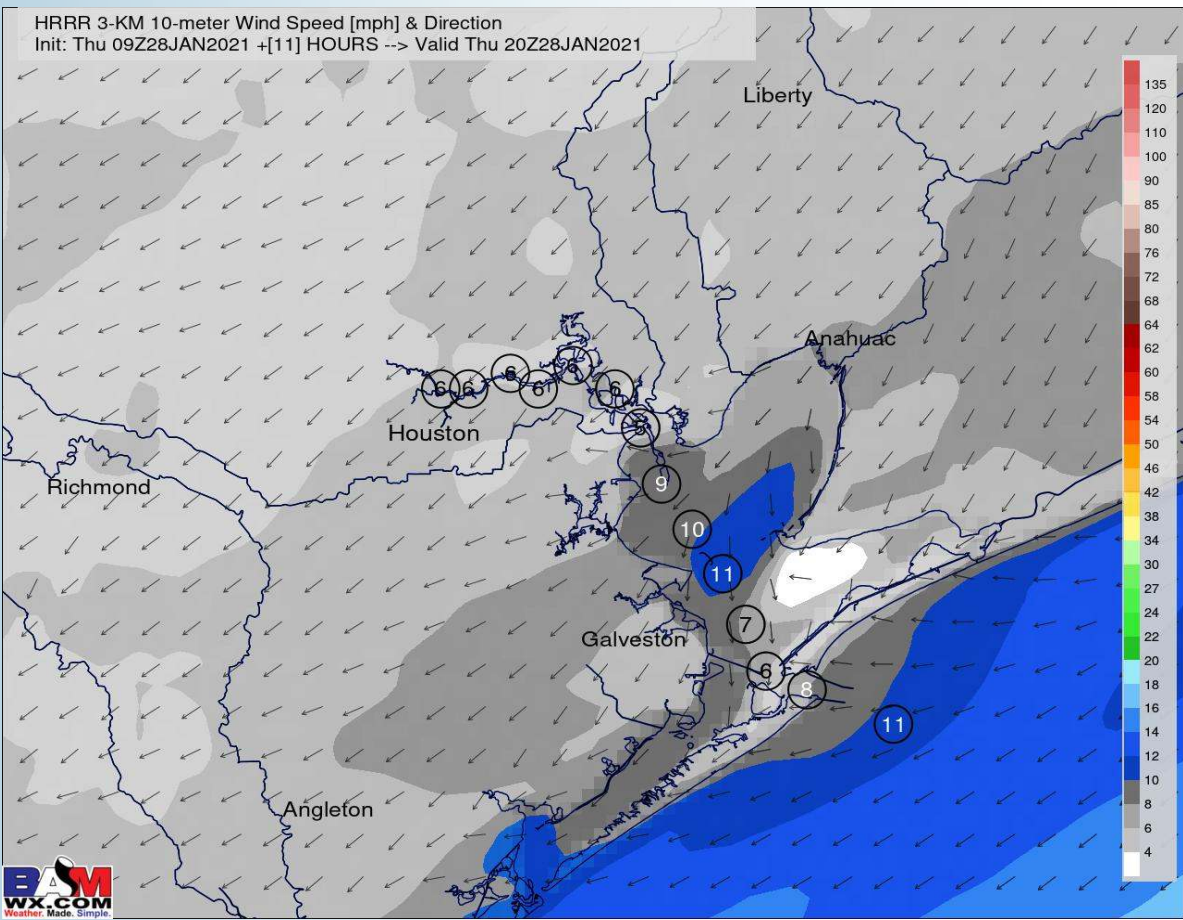


## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

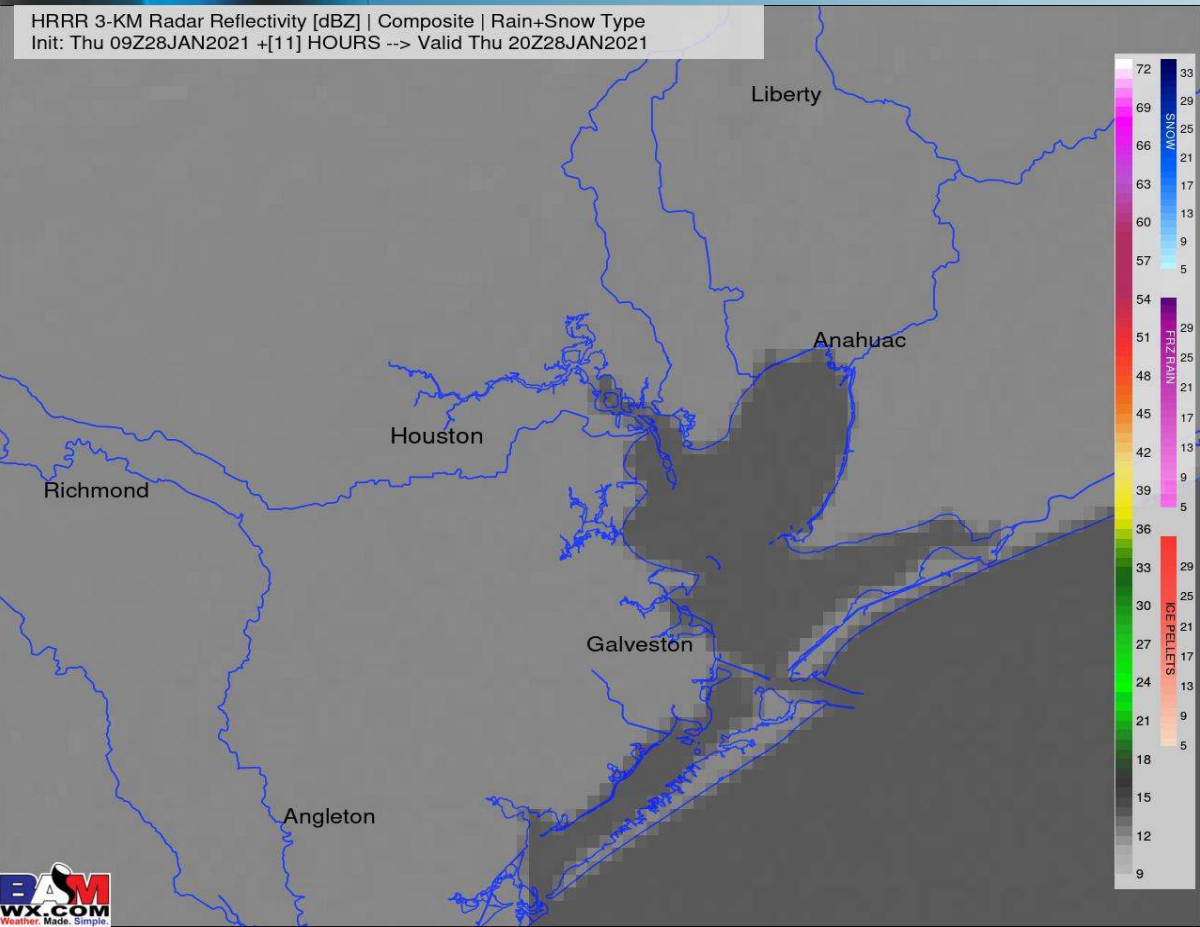
- Today we are favoring quieter weather with no precipitation expected.
- Winds this morning will be gusty through the early afternoon out of the Northeast at 15-25 MPH sustained. Winds this afternoon to evening calm down to a more sustained 5-10 MPH out of the Northeast.
- High temps across the area likely sit in the upper 50s to near 60F towards the Houston Metro.
  - No fog anticipated for this morning.

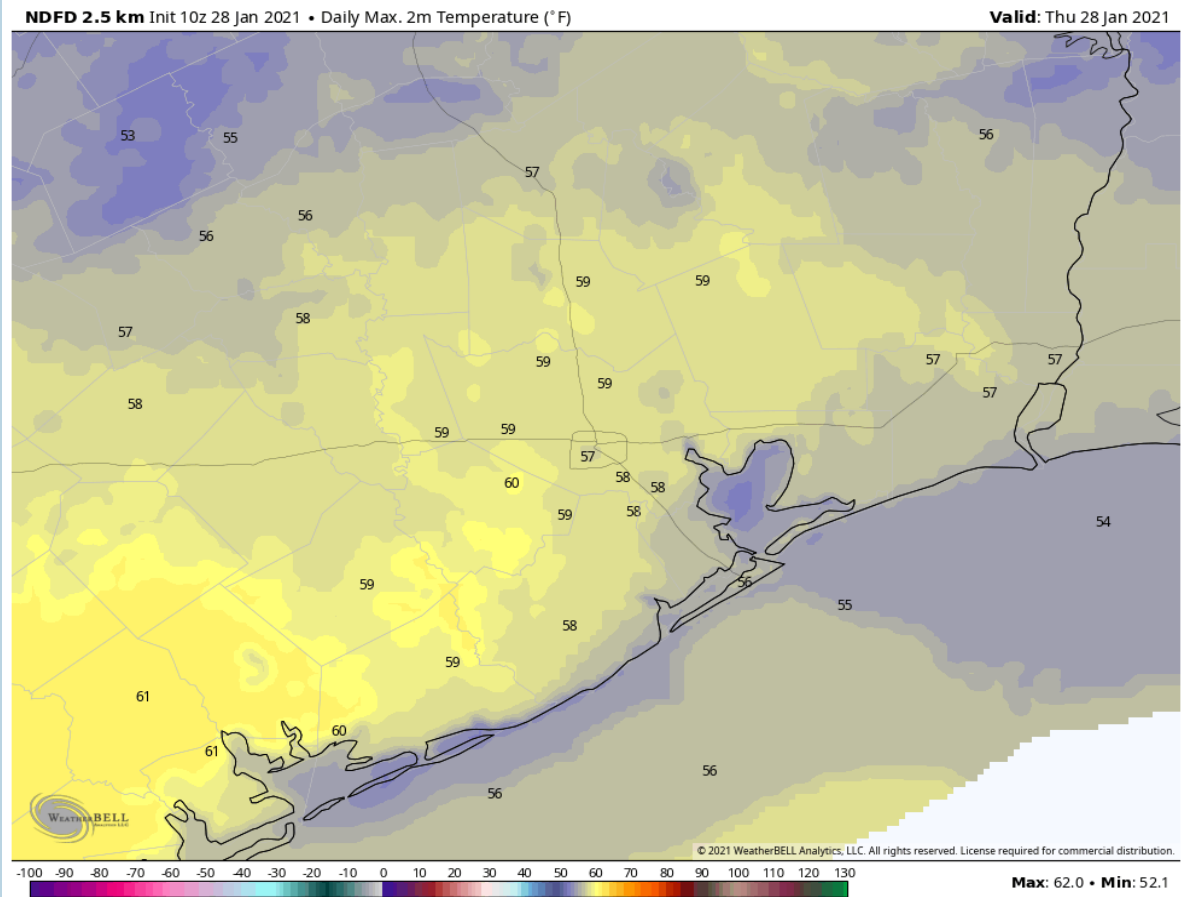
## Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)

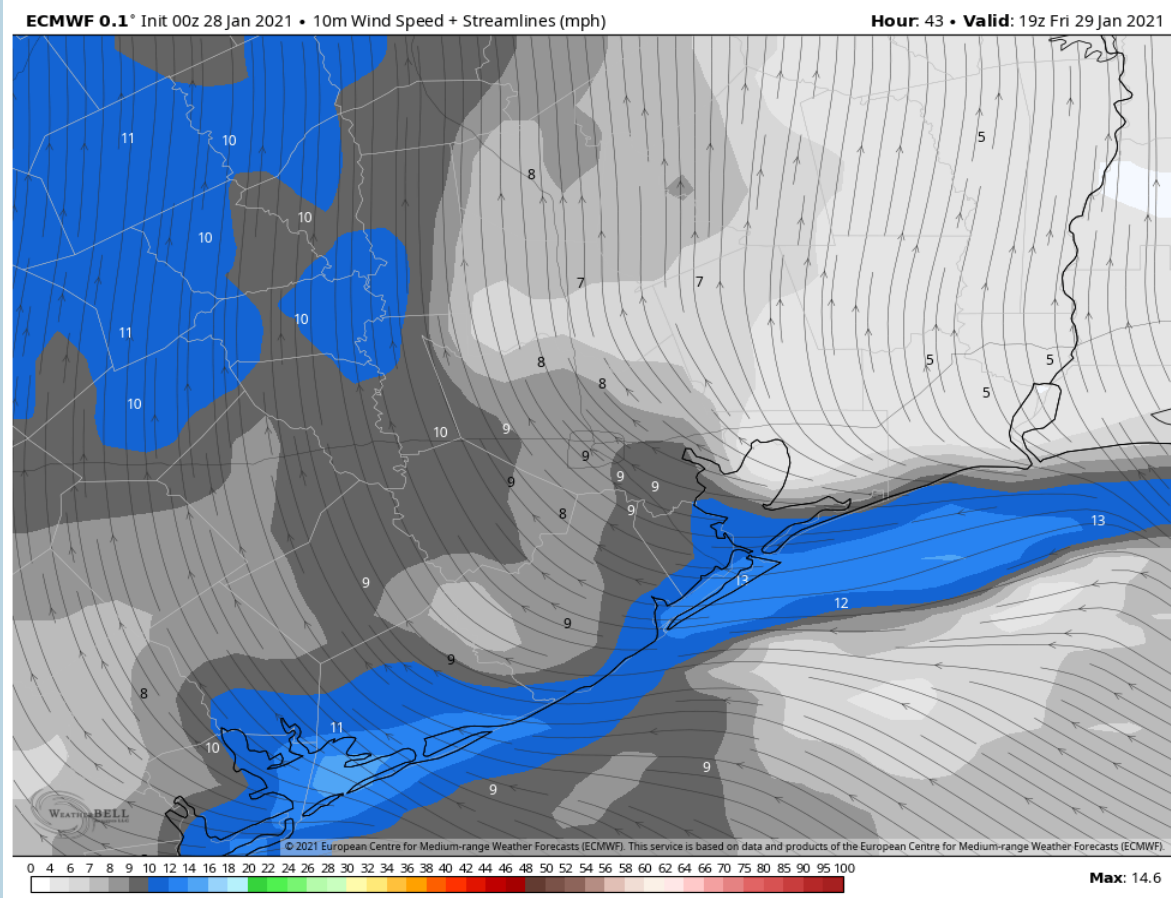


## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

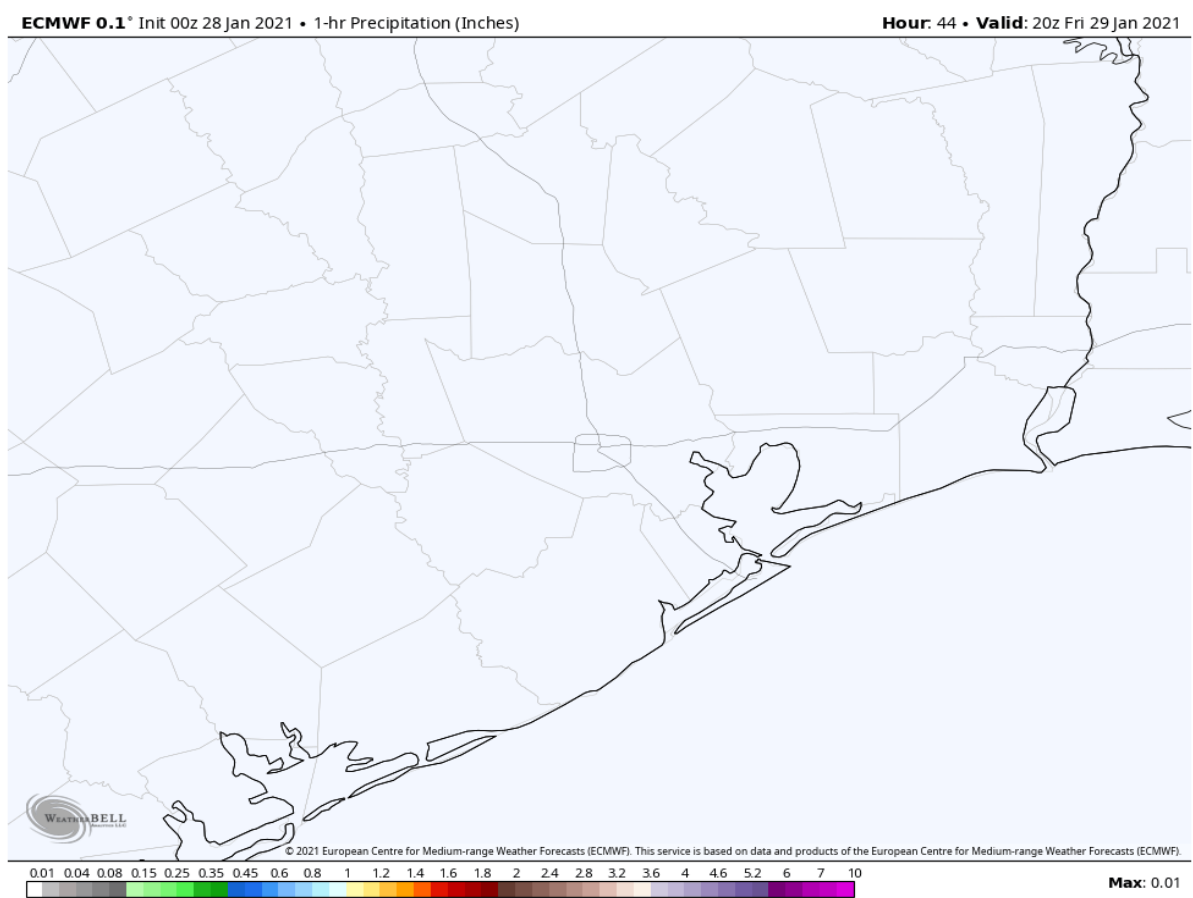
- Friday is anticipated to cap off the work-week with continued dry weather in the forecast.
- Winds will start the morning off out of the East at 5-10 MPH, veering out of the Southeast after noon on Friday, increasing to sustained winds of 8-13 MPH; gusts up to 15-20 MPH in the PM hours will be possible.
- No fog anticipated Friday morning at this time, as winds look to have increased slightly on the data overnight tonight vs yesterday.

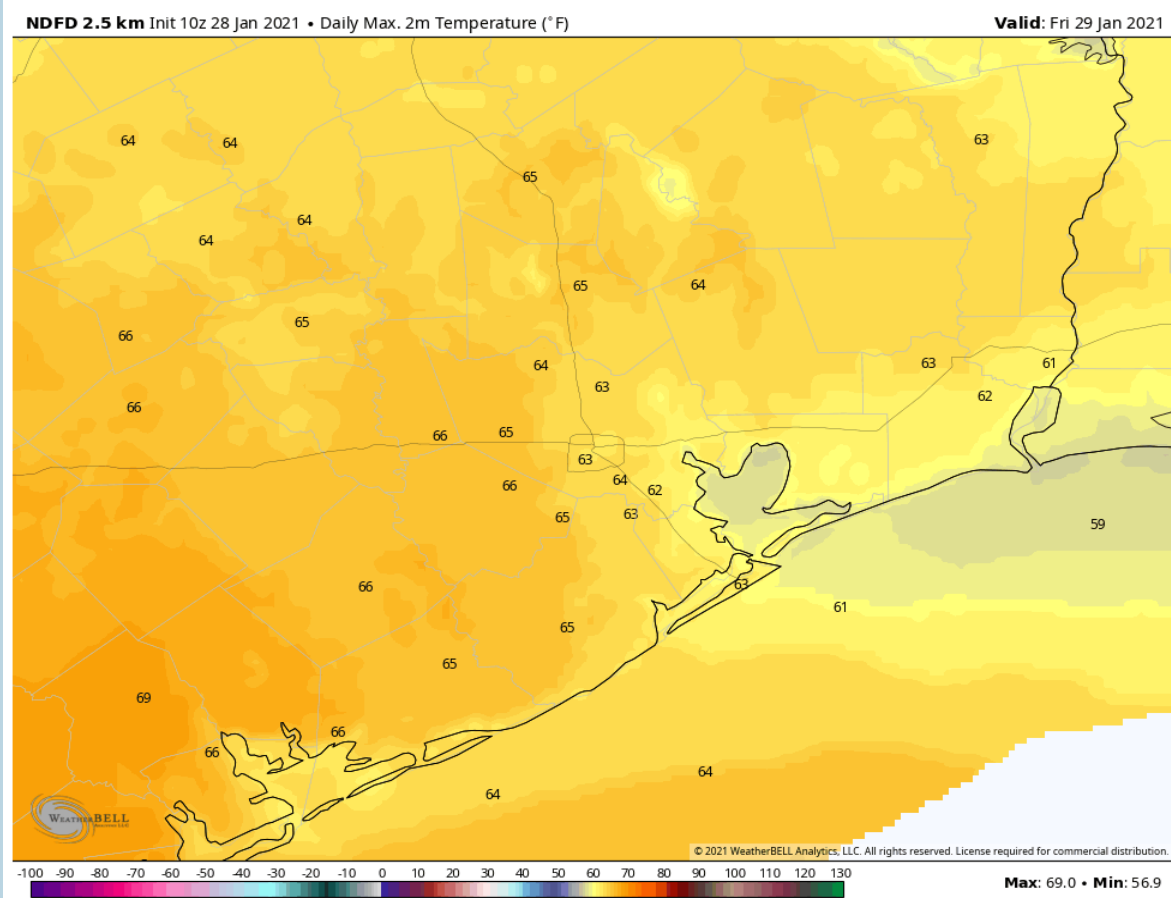
## Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)



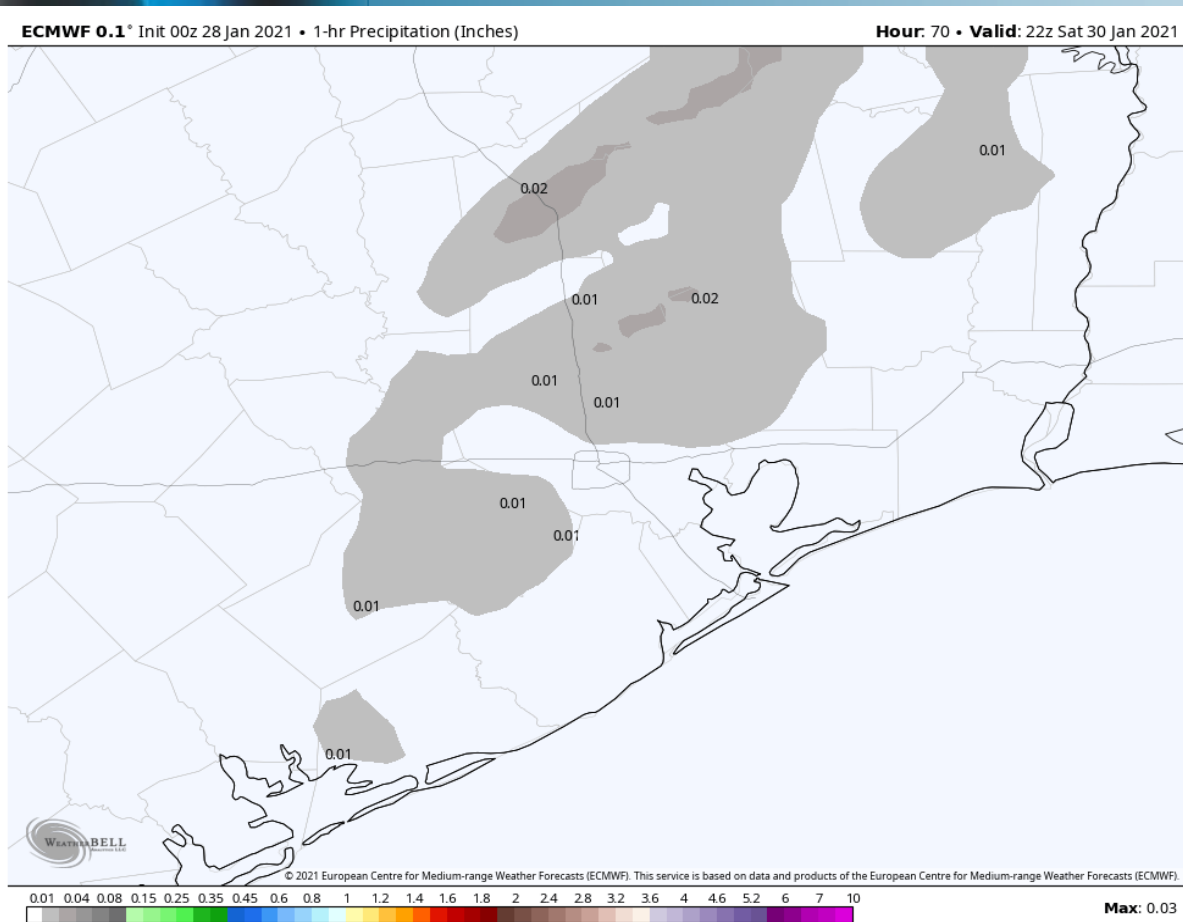

## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

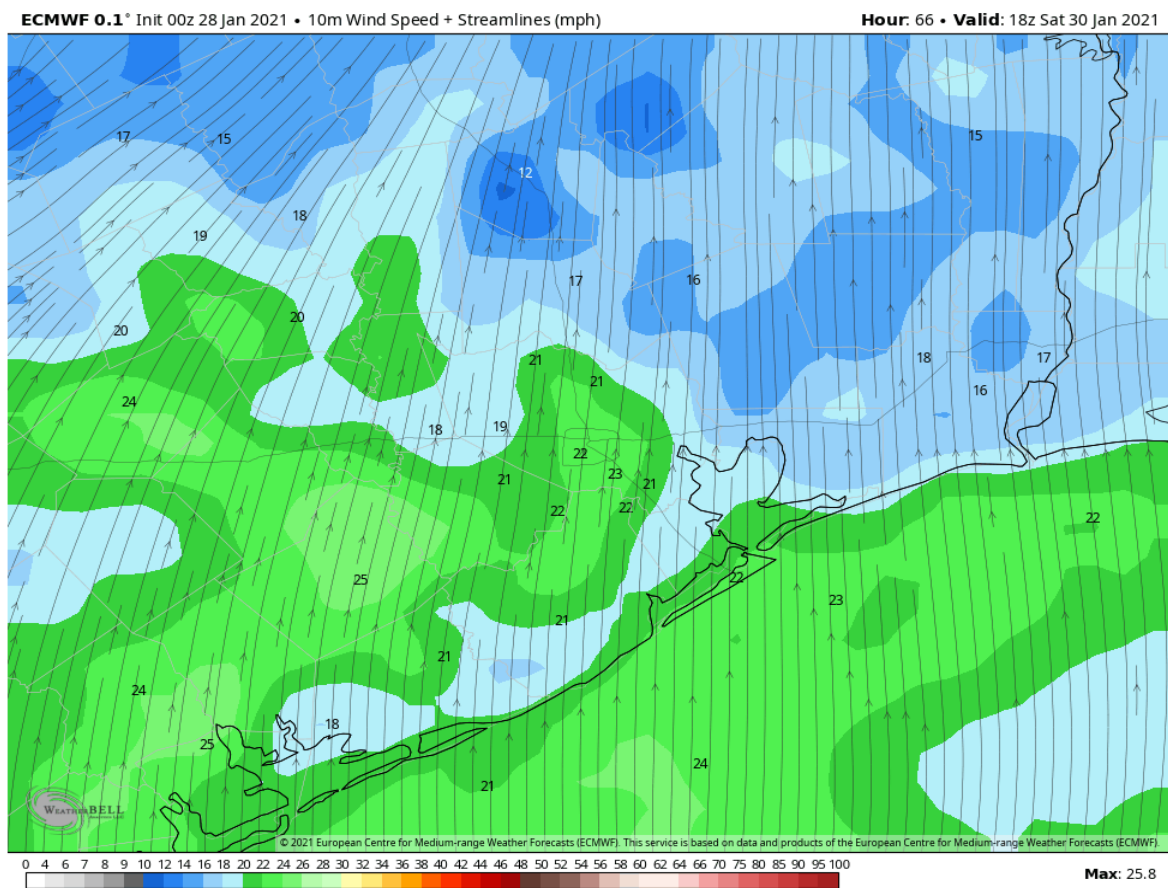
- Most of Saturday is expected to be dry, with isolated showers (rumble of thunder possible too) on the table late afternoon to the evening hours.
- Winds will be gusty here mainly out of the South at 15-20 MPH, gusting at times to 25-35 MPH (isolated higher possible at this distance).
- High temperatures Saturday will be quite warm vs mid-week, reaching into the low to mid 70s.
- Fog is not favored here due to elevated winds.

## Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)

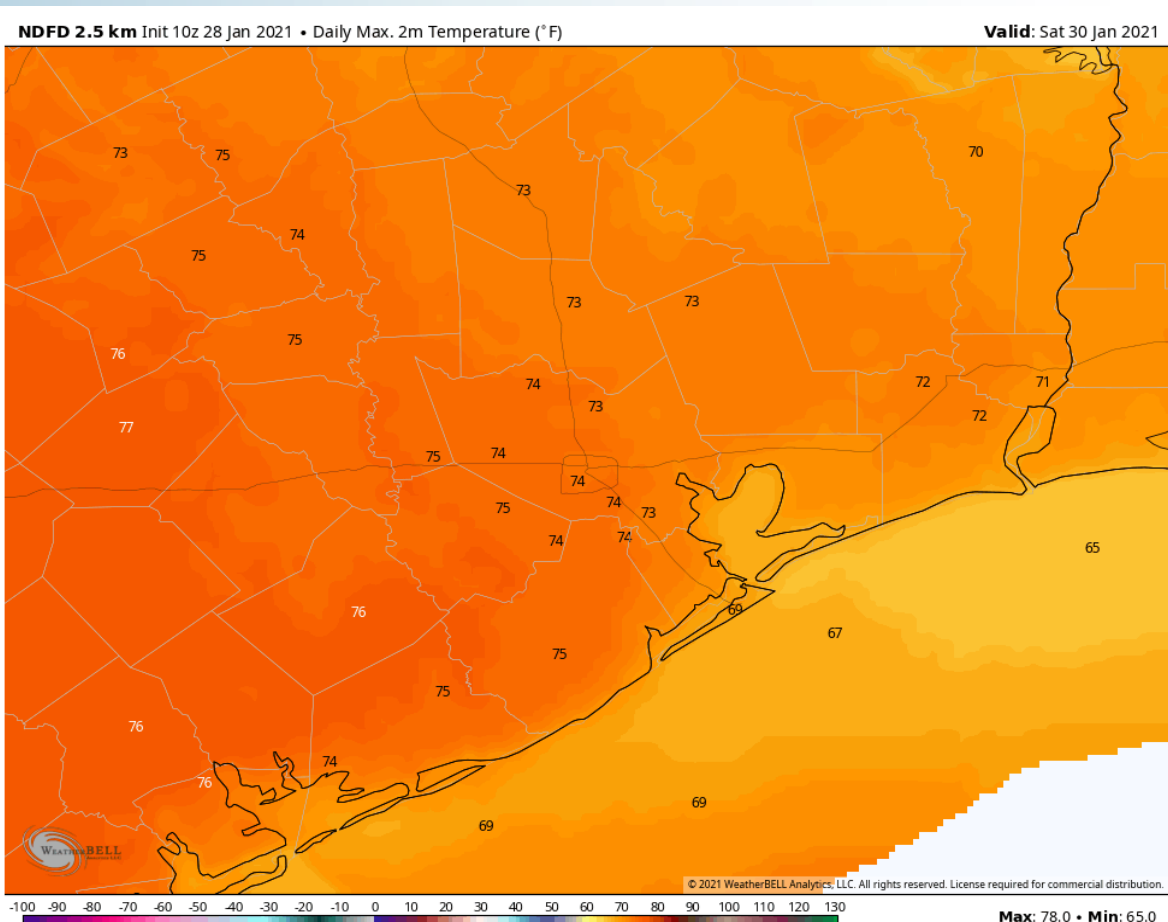

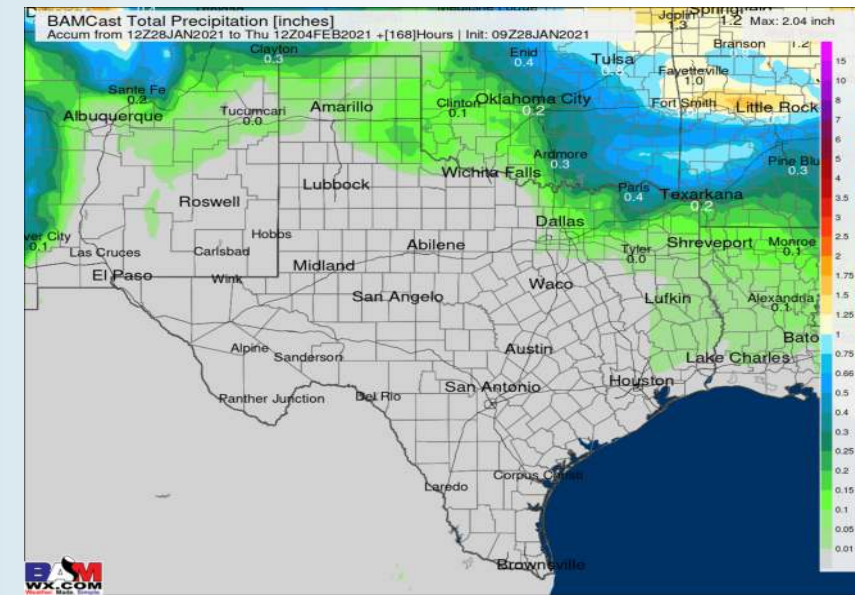
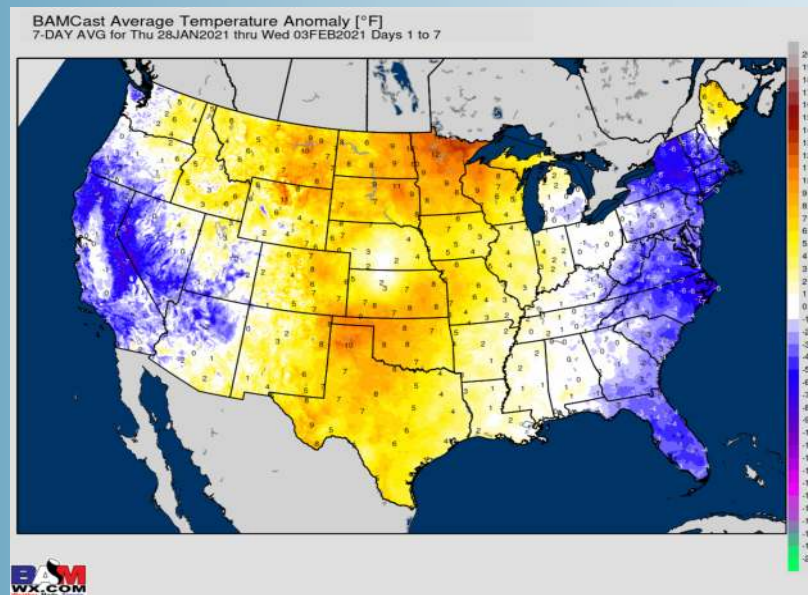




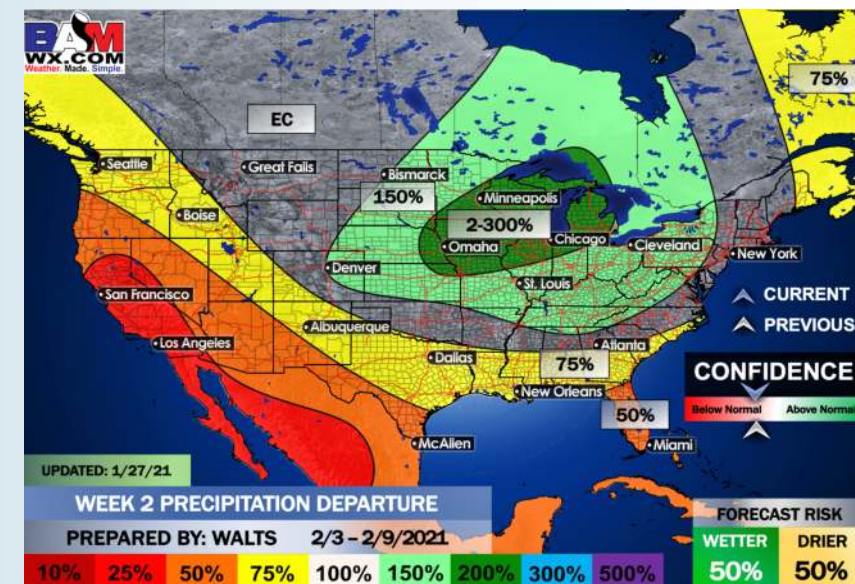
## Week 1 Forecast

### Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Above normal temperatures are expected this week with very dry weather as well.
- Overall we remain slightly warmer here vs normal in week 2, continuing to be drier as well. Cooler shots of air possible behind storms systems that push primarily to the north.
