




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Expecting the rest of the day today to remain on the quiet and dry side.
- Winds will start the morning off out of the East at 5-10 MPH sustained, veering out of the Southeast after noon on Friday, increasing to sustained winds of 10-15 MPH; gusts up to 15-20 MPH in the PM hours will be possible.
- High temps are expected to rise into the low to mid 60s.
- Fog is not anticipated though the day today


Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)




High Temperatures Today



Short-Term Forecast Discussion



- While a very light and isolated sprinkle cannot be ruled out in the 10 A – 3 P window (~10-20%), most of Saturday is expected to be dry. Isolated showers (rumble of thunder possible too) work back into the picture late afternoon and into the evening hours with the arrival of our next front.
- Winds will be gusty here mainly sustained out of the South at 10-20 MPH, gusts 20-30 MPH with isolated higher gusts to 35 MPH possible near the boarding station. We will then watch a front pass through the area late Sat. evening/ early Sun AM that will take winds out of the Northwest
- High temperatures Saturday will be quite warm vs mid-week, reaching into the low 70s.
- While fog is not favored for the first half of the day, we will need to keep an eye on the late afternoon/ early evening hours of Saturday for potential fog development out before the next front moves through. Most likely time period would be 6 PM to 12 AM Sun for patchy fog, however this development is current not preferred given the stronger wind speeds. The threat is not 0, but not favored at this time.

Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)


High Temperatures Saturday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- After the early morning passing of our front, we are favoring drier weather for the rest of the day on Sunday.
- Currently favoring the front to pass in the 12AM - 3 AM window of Sunday. In the morning hours, we are favoring sustained winds of 8-13 MPH with gusts of 13-18 MPH possible. Into the afternoon (~2 PM and beyond), winds will increased to sustained out of the NW at 13-18 MPH with gusts of 18-23 MPH possible, locally higher at the boarding station.
- High temperatures on Sunday will likely be in the mid to upper 60s
- The front shifting winds from onshore to offshore will eliminate any threat of fog on Sunday


Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)

High Temperatures Sunday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Above normal temperatures are expected this week with very dry weather as well.



- Overall we remain slightly warmer here vs normal in week 2, continuing to be drier as well. Cooler shots of air will be possible behind storm systems that push primarily to the north.

- The overall pattern looks to persist for the weeks 3/4 timeframe as well. Drier and warmer conditions expected.
