




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- We are expecting drier weather the rest of the day today.
 - Winds will continue out of the NW today sustained 15-20 MPH and a few gusts 20-30 MPH possible mainly at the boarding station. Winds will diminish some once the sun goes down, for stations N of Morgan's Point, 8-13 MPH with gusts 13- 18 MPH likely. S of Morgan's Point, winds likely stay slightly elevated into the overnight (13-18 MPH sustained).
- Lows tonight likely drop back into the upper 40s / low 50s
- No fog is expected the rest of the day today


Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (5 PM CT)




Temperatures (11 PM CT)




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- We continue to expect MON to be a drier day.
- Winds Monday will continue to come out of the NW, however we expect gradual weakening of the winds during the day. Winds at the boarding station likely start out the day sustained 13-18 MPH with gusts 18-23 MPH. By Noon and through the PM hours, winds calm to 10-15 MPH with gusts 15-20 MPH. Winds will be calmer for our stations closer to the HOU metro
- Expected highs on Monday look to reach the upper 50s for our stations, lower 60s inland
- Fog is not anticipated for the day on Monday


Sustained Winds (10 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)




High Temperatures Monday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Tuesday looks to stay quiet regarding precipitation
- Winds on TUE start shifting from N to more NE, sustained 5-10 MPH near daybreak. Winds will then turn more easterly by mid-day and will become onshore (southeasterly) by the late afternoon hours. Sustained winds of 5-10 MPH and a few gusts 10-15 MPH are expected.
- High temperatures again on Tuesday likely reach the upper 50s for the stations, lower 60s inland
 - No fog expected Tuesday


Sustained Winds (10 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)





High Temperatures Tuesday




Week 1 Forecast

Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- An overall dry and warm week are in store for the Houston area. Next best chance for precipitation looks to come Friday with another front that will work through the area
- Overall we remain slightly warmer here vs normal in week 2, continuing to be drier as well. Cooler shots of air will be possible behind storm systems that push primarily to the north.
- The overall pattern looks to persist for the weeks 3/4 timeframe as well. Drier and warmer conditions expected.
