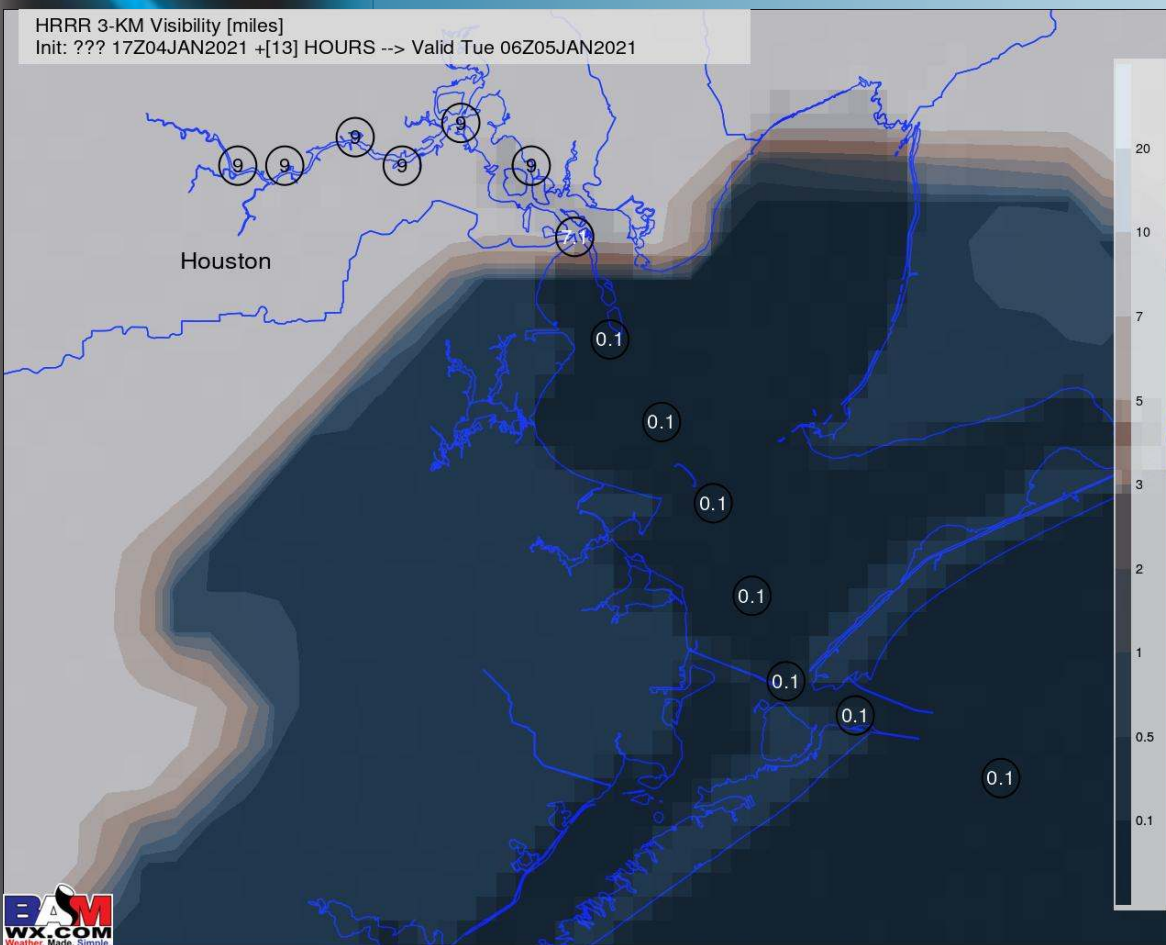

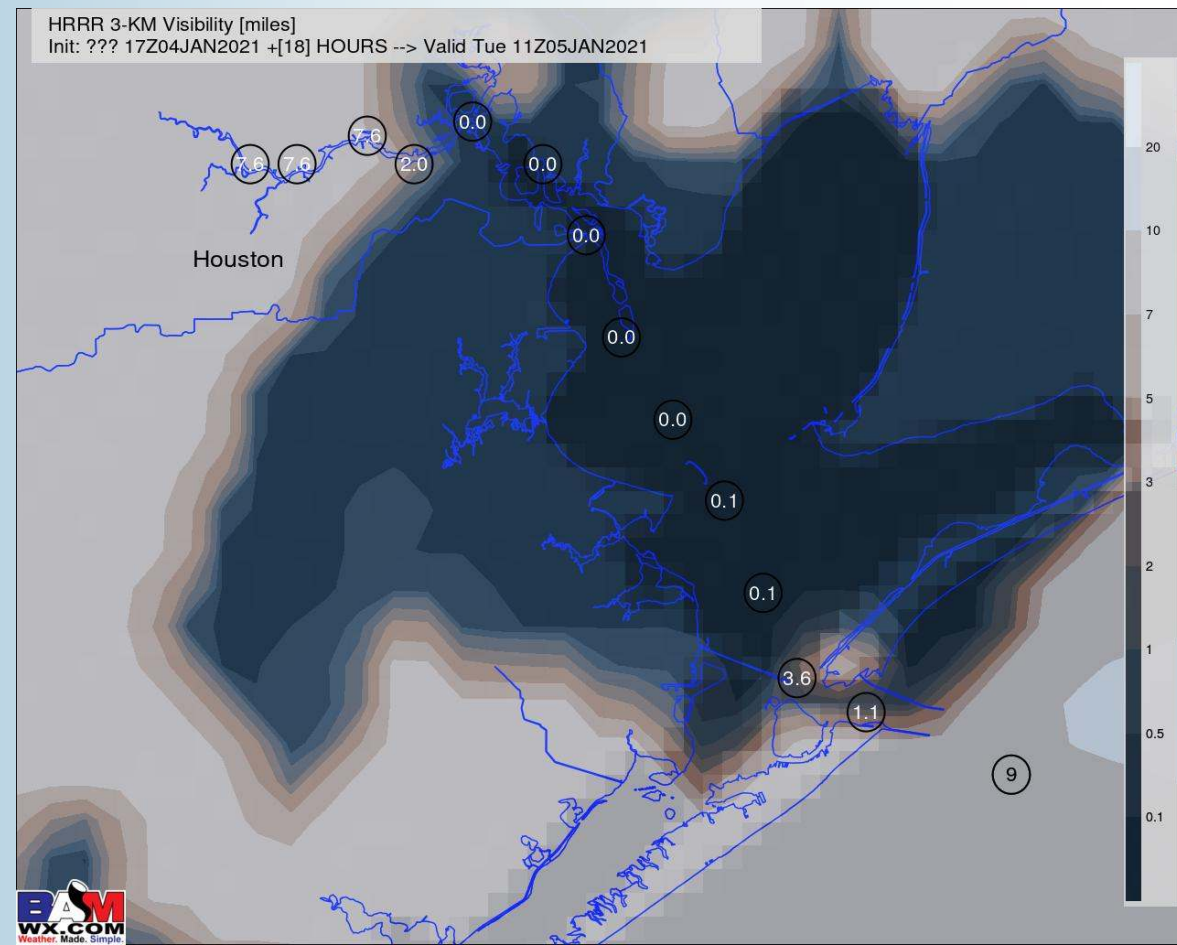

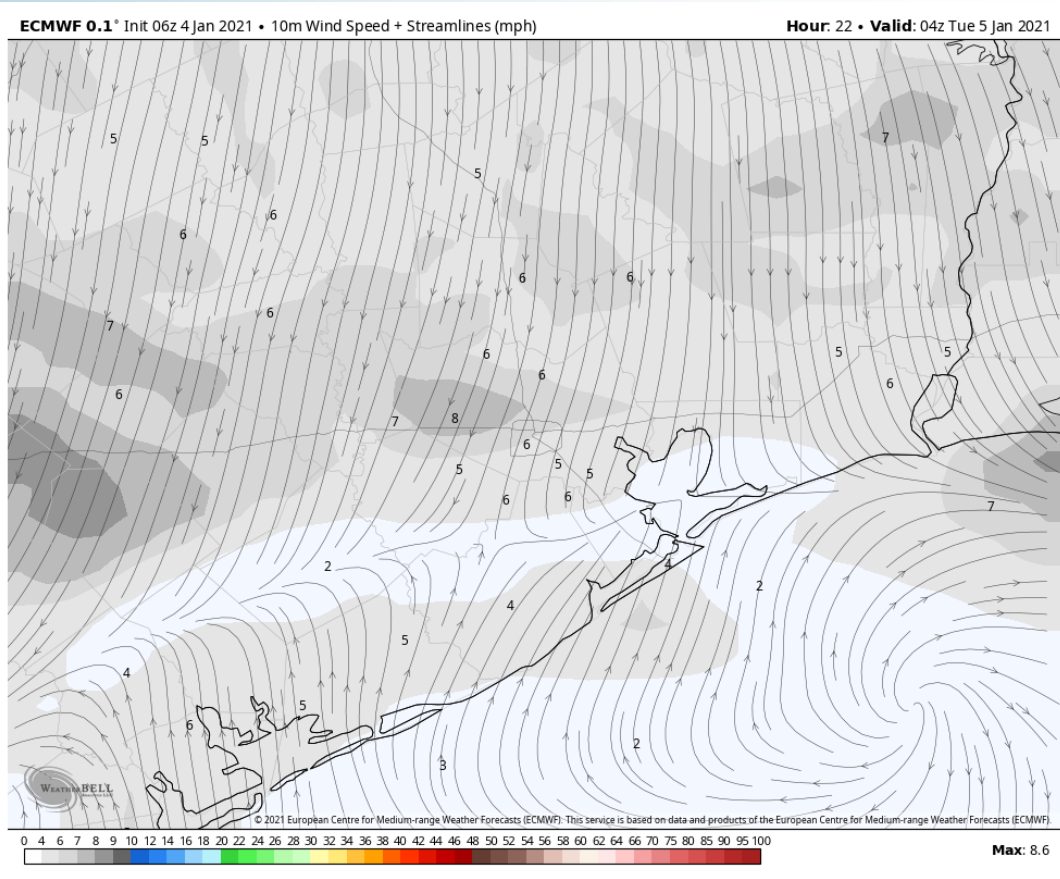
- Latest Hi-res model guidance is in fairly good agreement with some fog potential starting this evening, mainly in the bay area.
- The greatest risk for fog will be from 7 PM MON through 6 AM TUE morning. Stations H and locations to the south will have the greatest potential.

Short-Term Forecast Discussion

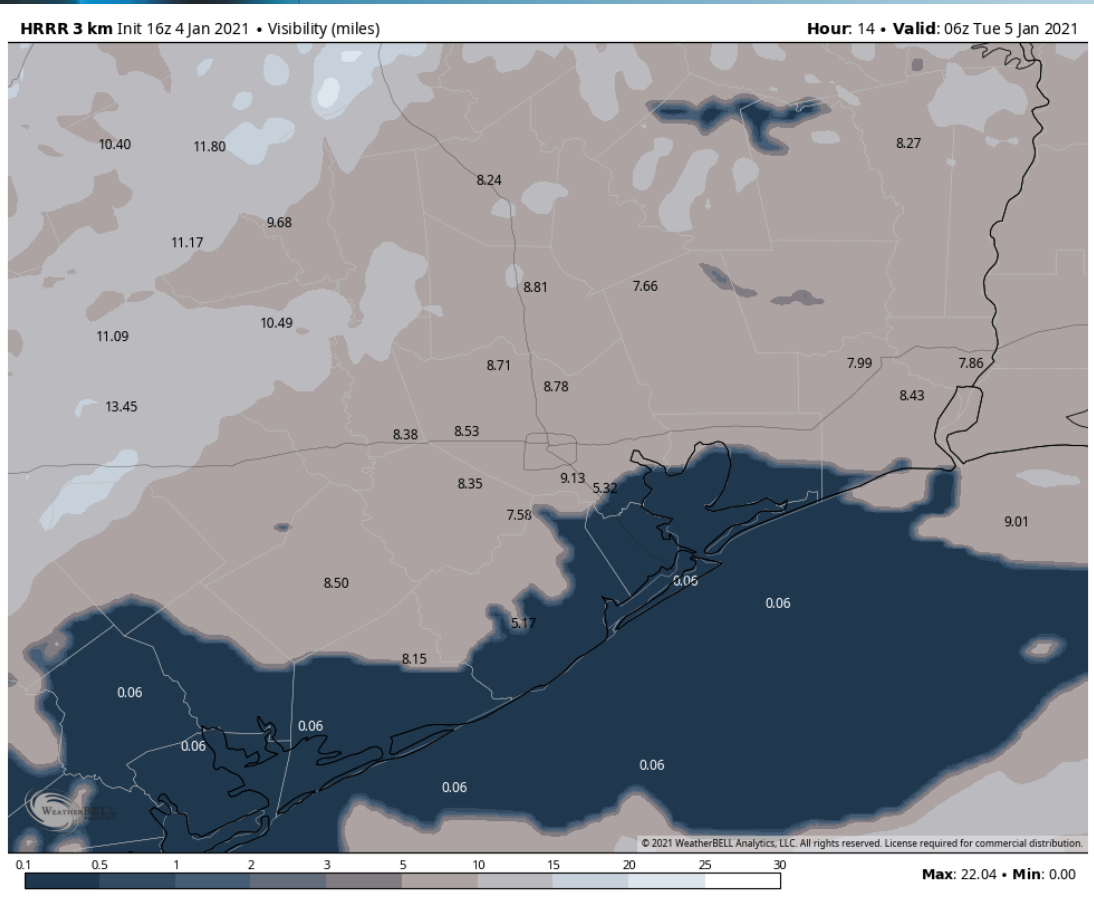
- Today is looking to be a dry day.
- Winds will be out of the SW sustained at 4-8 MPH with 15 MPH gusts. Around 5-9 PM a high pressure system will pass over head bringing calm winds out of the NW. After the passage, around 11PM, N/ NE winds will be established.
- Low temperatures tonight will be in the upper 40's and mid 50's for the boarding station.
- As the high pressure system moves through the area the calmer winds presented allow for some fog potential. Potential for fog is in the late evening and overnight hours (Check above slide).

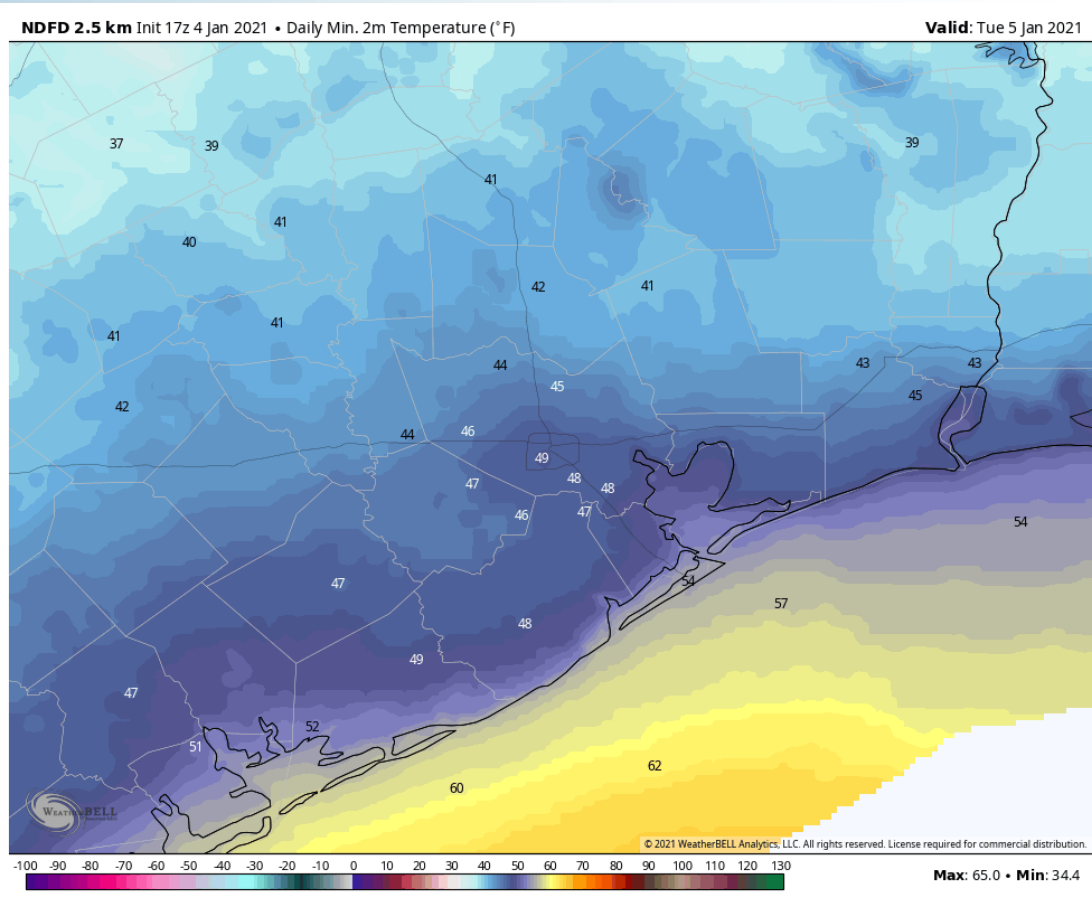
Sustained Winds (10 PM CT)

Low Temperatures Tonight

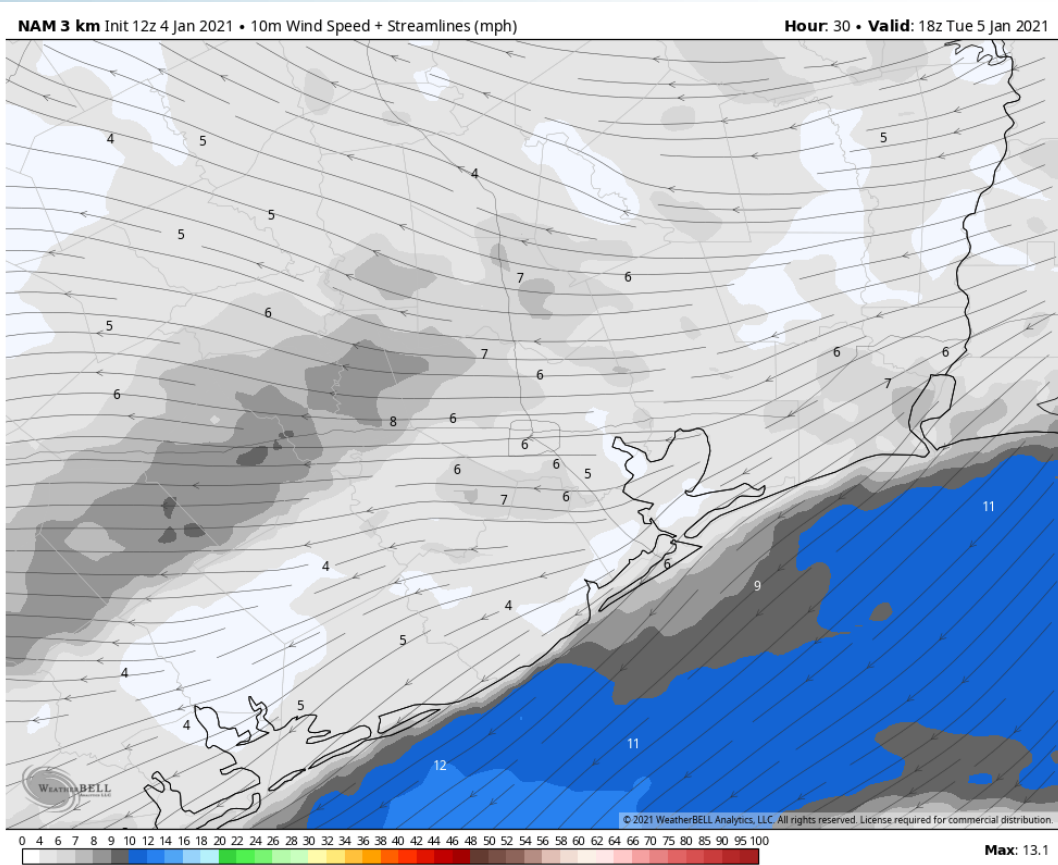


Short-Term Forecast Discussion

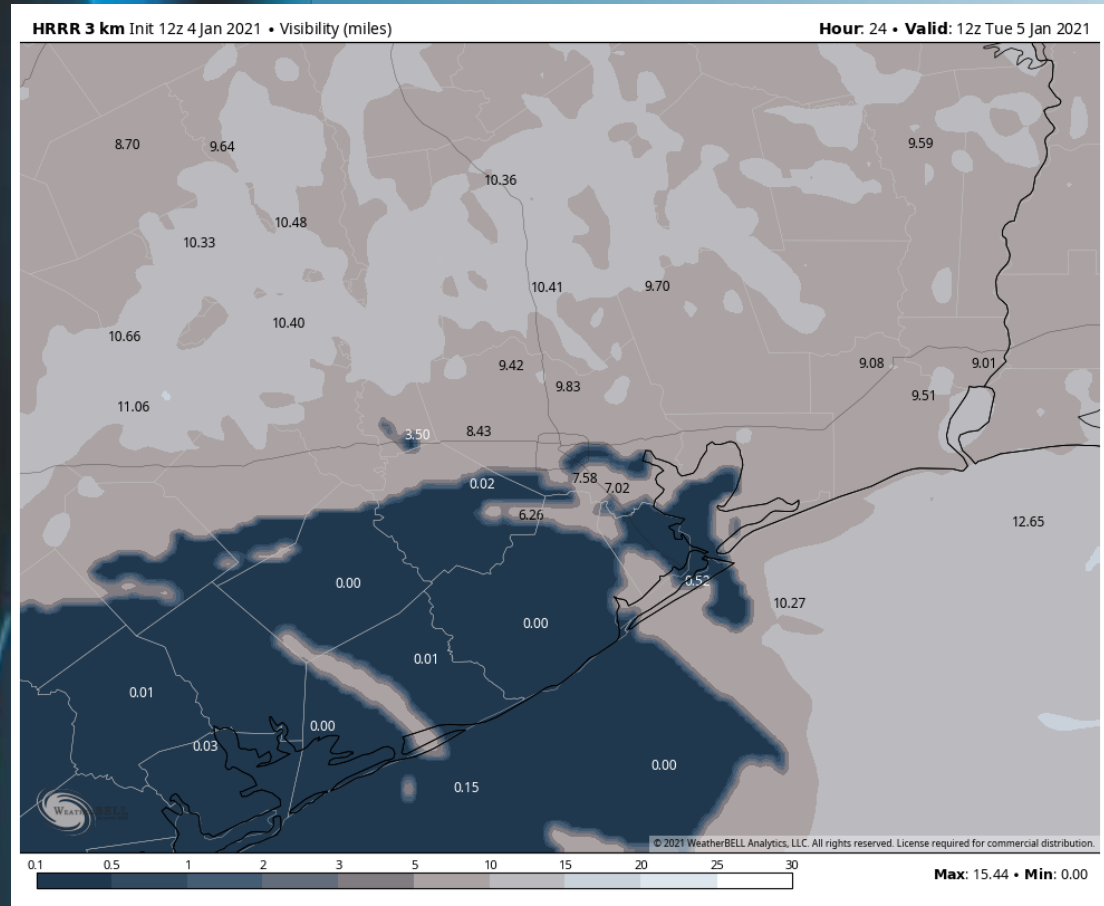
- Tuesday is also looking to be another dry day.
- Winds will start out of the NE and eventually work their way out of the SE after noon...generally they will be sustained 5-10 MPH, with a gust up to 10-15 MPH not impossible over the open water.
- High temperatures for Tuesday will be in the upper 60's inland and low 60's for the boarding station.
- Tuesday morning has some fog potential that will be updated again this evening. For more info check the fog report slide.

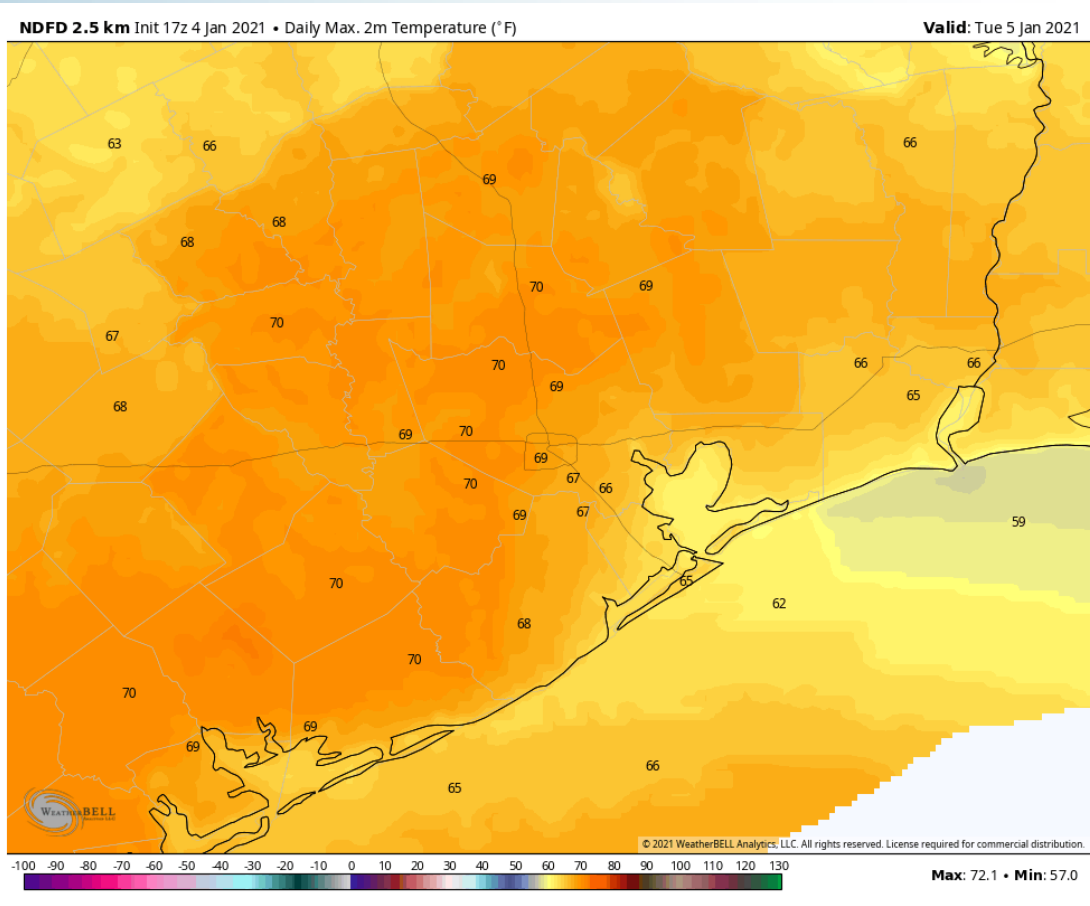
Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)

High Temps for Tuesday

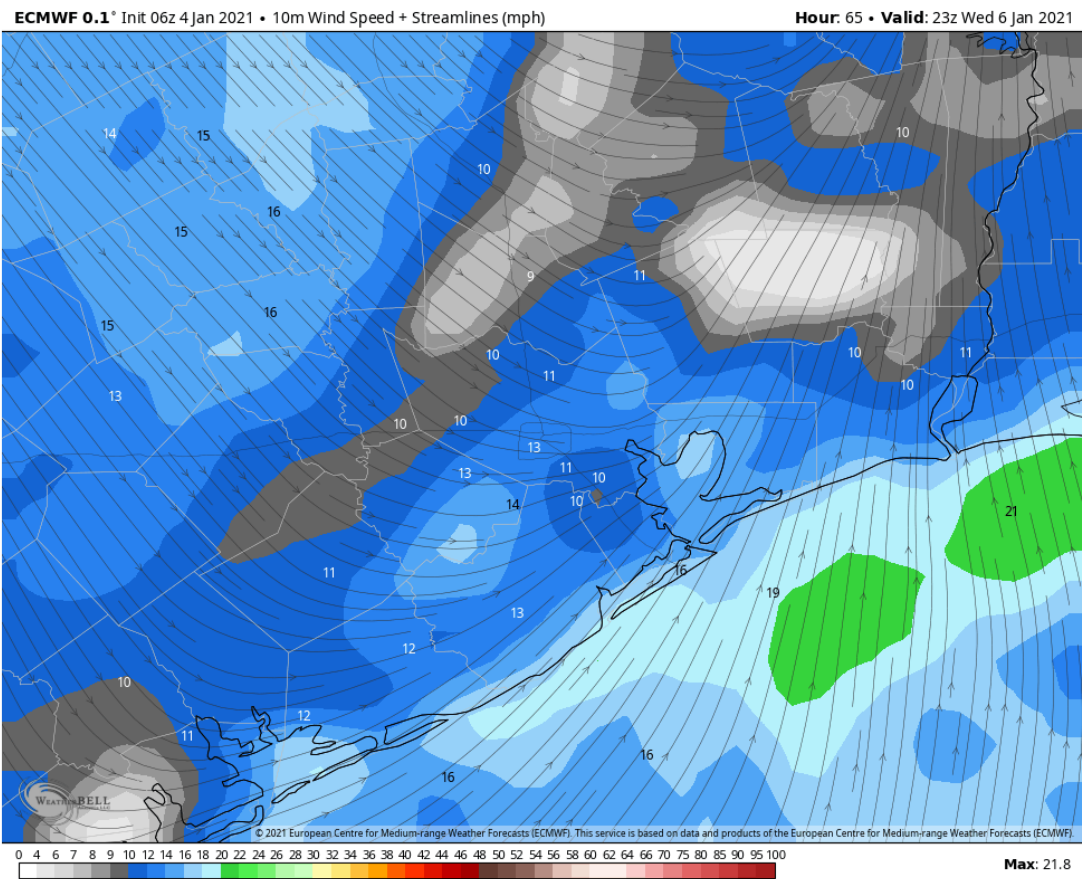


Short-Term Forecast Discussion

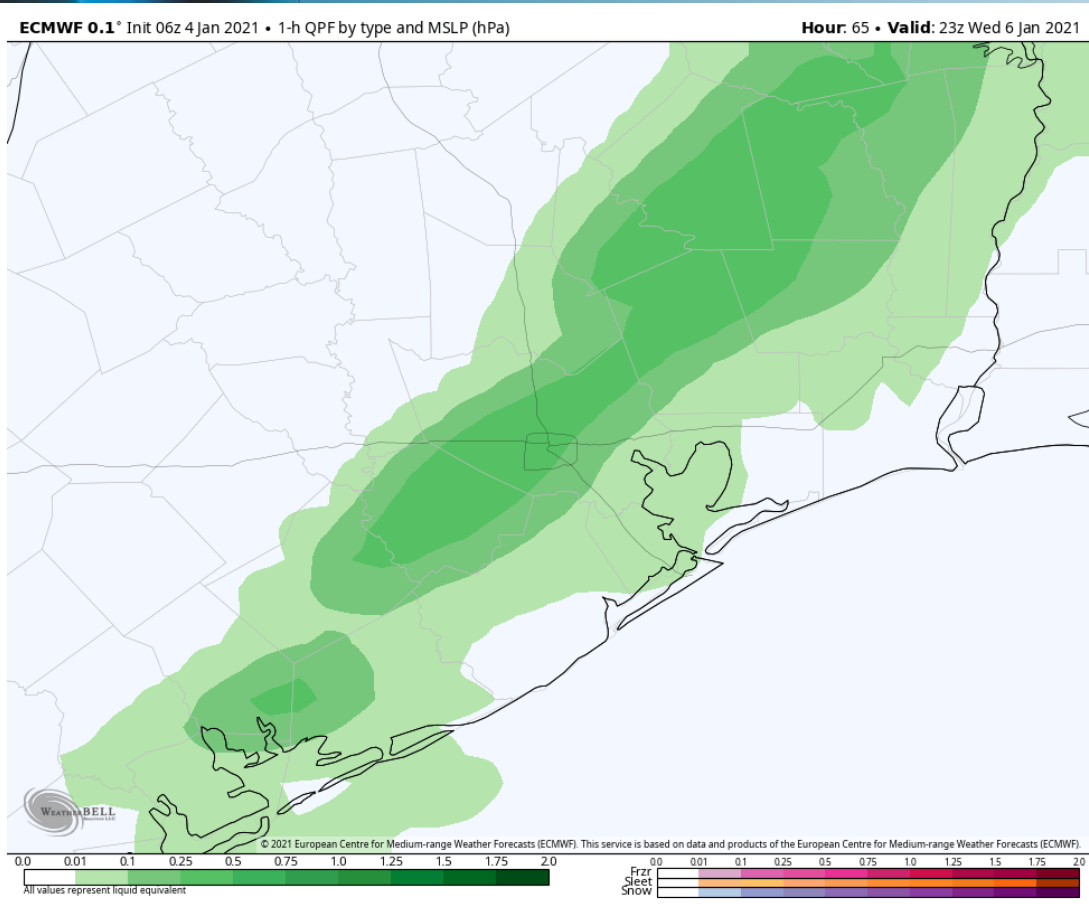
- Wednesday a front will move through during afternoon evening timeframe. This will bring a 0.5-1" of rain. A locally stronger storm could be possible with higher rain amounts
- Winds will be out of the SE with sustained winds at 10-15 MPH with gust up to 20 MPH. After noon when the front passes winds will be sustained at 15-20 MPH with gusts up to 30 MPH. A stronger wind gust could be possible.
- High temps Wednesday will be in the upper 60's with mid 60's at the boarding station.
- No Fog is expected at this distance but rain will bring reduced visibility.

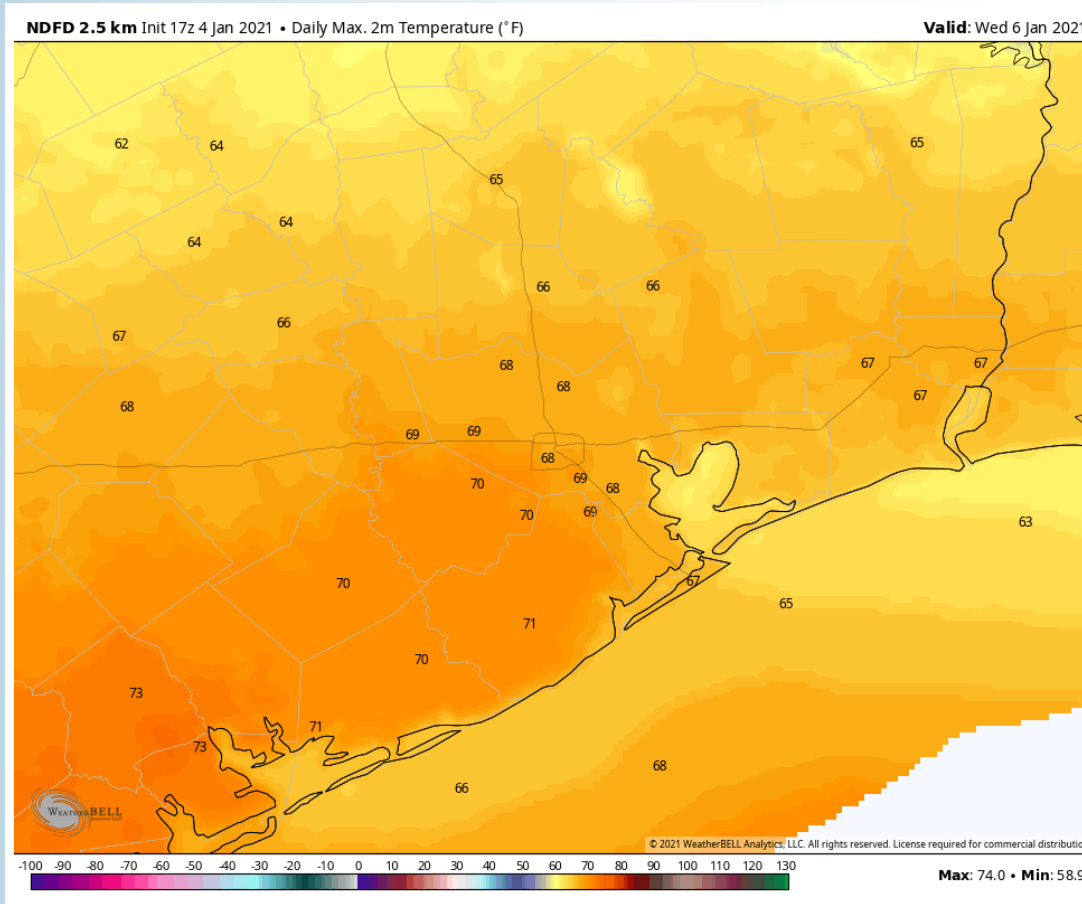
Sustained Winds (8 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (5 PM CT)



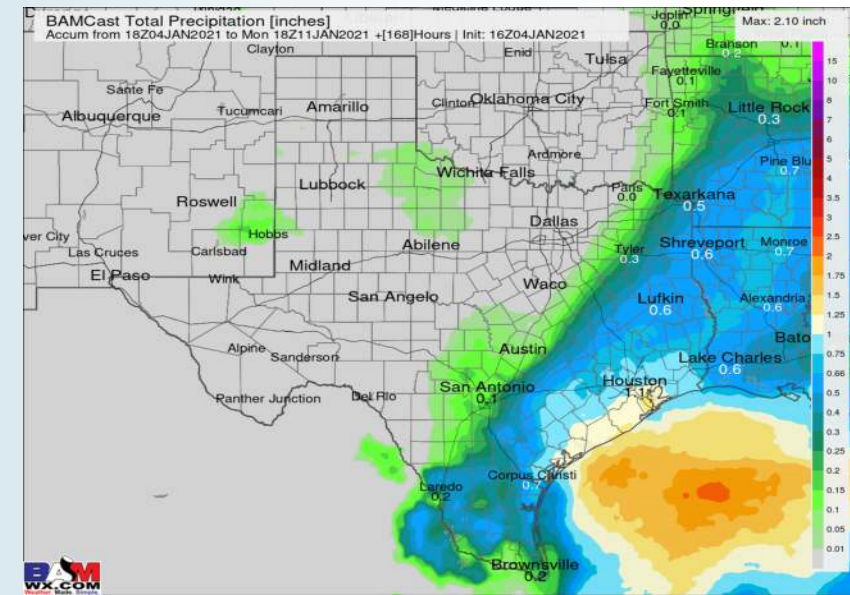
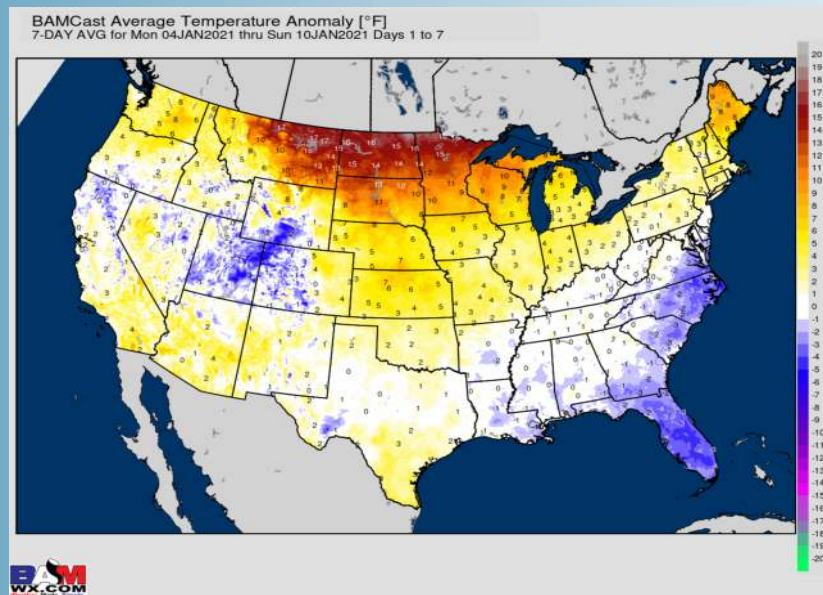
High Temperatures Wednesday



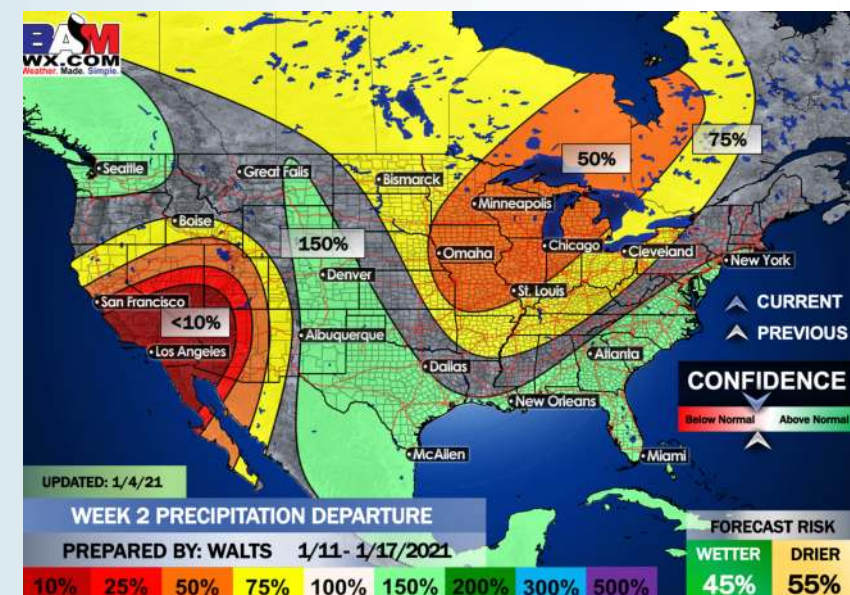
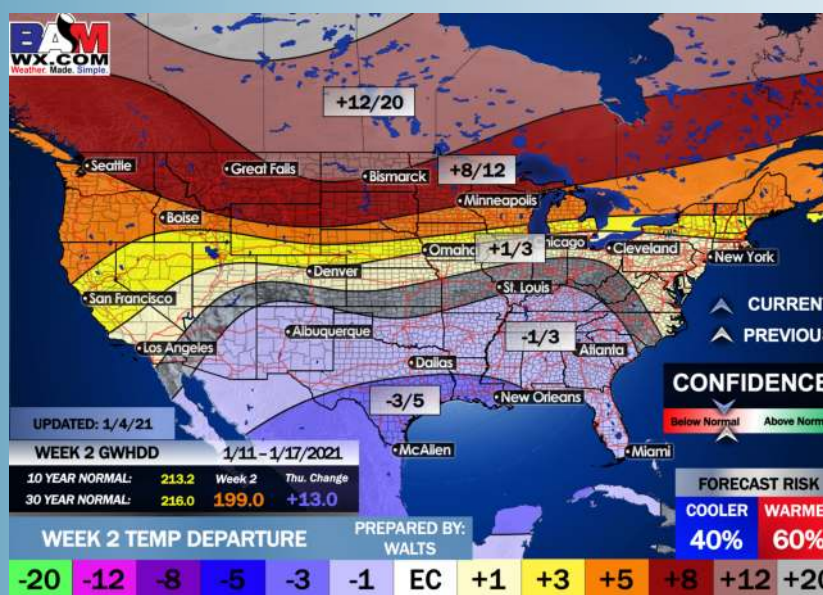
Week 1 Forecast

Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Above normal temperatures are expected Monday through Wednesday. Temperatures begin to moderate with a frontal passage mid to late next week. An overall dry pattern is anticipated outside of a shot of moisture late WED into THU.
- Our latest favored week 2 guidance features the Houston area at below normal temps and above normal precipitation. Periodic shots of precipitation will be possible as these fronts pass the area.
- Our latest weeks $\frac{3}{4}$ forecast features the Houston area at below normal temperatures and below normal precipitation. Long range guidance continues to favor more of a cooler pattern for the S US heading into the New Year.
