


## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Scattered pockets of mist/ light drizzle looks possible out through the early PM hours (1-3 PM). Any precipitation would be rather light (few hundredths of an inch), however quieter weather is expected later in the PM hours once a weak front moves through.
- Winds will stay coming out of the ENE today, 8-13 MPH with gusts 13-18 MPH. In the 3-6 PM window, we are anticipating another wind shift to out of the NW with winds dropping to 5-10 MPH.
- Highs today will be in the lower to mid 60s across the area.
- **Reduced visibility will continue to be possible by means of mist rather than fog out through the late AM hours (~11 AM) before a weak front works through in the afternoon and limits the mist/drizzle threat**


## Sustained Winds (6 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (10 AM CT)




## High Temperatures Saturday




## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Right now favoring a drier Sunday across the area
- Winds on Sunday will likely be strongest in the morning before weakening. A NE wind to start the day sustained 13-18 MPH will shift to more Easterly by the mid morning hours (9-11 AM) and then turn more onshore (Southeasterly) by around the Noon-2 PM timeframe at 5-10 MPH. A few gusts 10-15 MPH at the boarding station cannot be ruled out.
- Highs on Sunday will be in the upper 50s to lower 60s
- While fog is not favored at this timeframe, Sunday evening is still a period to watch for fog given onshore flow


## Sustained Winds (8 AM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)




## High Temperatures Sunday




## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Monday we are currently favoring quieter weather
- Winds will be out of the SE on Monday, sustained 5-10 MPH with gusts 10-15 MPH.
- High temps will be in the mid to upper 60s, a few lower 70s closer to the HOU metro cannot be ruled out.
- We are not in favor of fog for Monday


## Sustained Winds (10 AM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)







## Week 1 Forecast
