




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Expecting drier weather through the rest of our Sunday.
- Winds will shift to the SE around 3-4 PM and will stay SE for the rest of the day. When winds shift SE, they will calm slightly to 8-13 MPH, gusts 13-18 MPH. Sustained winds a touch higher at the boarding station cannot be ruled out.
- Low likely drops back into the lower to mid 50s for our stations
- Fog is not anticipated for the rest of the day today.


Sustained Winds (8 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (9 PM CT)




Low Temps Tonight (11 PM CT)




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Monday we are currently favoring quieter weather with any sprinkles likely staying off to the W into the afternoon hours
- Winds will be out of the SE on Monday, sustained 10-15 MPH with gusts 15-20 MPH.
- High temps will be in the upper 60s, a few lower 70s closer to the HOU metro cannot be ruled out.
- We continue not to favor fog for Monday morning across our stations


Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)




High Temperatures Monday







- The middle portion of this week holds the potential to see some decent shots at fog in the Tuesday – Thursday timeframe. Onshore flow will be the theme for the next few days until Thursday evening when a cold front will swing through the area and take any fog chances out to sea.
- Higher than normal confidence at this distance that fog will be a concern Tuesday AM thanks to guidance showing a rather strong signal for fog, however we are leaving the confidence bar near normal simply because we are over 36 hours out from any potential development. We are currently favoring the 12-3 AM Tue window for best potential fog development across our stations. Some guidance suggests that this fog can linger around through much of the day on Tue, but this will be something we need to refine in future reports.


Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- At this distance Tuesday is expected to be drier, however an iso sprinkle or two (10-20%) looks possible in the afternoon hours
- Winds look to stay generally out of the SE on Tuesday and rather light, 5-10 MPH sustained.
- High temps for our stations look to be sitting in the upper 60s / lower 70s, locally higher inland
- **Check slides above for thoughts on fog for Tue.**


Sustained Winds (6 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)





High Temperatures Tuesday





Week 1 Forecast

Long-Range Forecast Discussion

➤ Chances for precipitation look to come back into the picture WED – FRI. Currently targeting THU evening for the best widespread rain chances. Temperatures largely stay above normal this week before a frontal passage THU evening, ushering in colder air into next weekend.



Week 2 Forecast



➤ The pattern turns colder than normal for week 2 here...with a bit more influential jet stream we think the pattern can grow a bit wetter here as well vs week 1.

Weeks 3/4 Forecast

➤ “Normal” conditions regarding temps vs normal look in store for the 2nd half of February...this may allow the pattern to get a bit more active as well similar to the week 2 period.
