




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Scattered shower chances will continue into the afternoon before the best chances for precipitation present themselves in the 9 PM to 3 AM Friday window. Moderate rain will be possible with locally heavier downpours so reduced visibility will continue to be possible with precipitation. An iso rumble of thunder will continue to be possible**
- **We favor winds to continue coming out of the N at 15-25 MPH with gusts 25-30 MPH the rest of the day today.**
- **Low temps likely drop into the ~mid 40s**
- ***Any reduced visibility will continue to come in the form of rain/ mist vs fog. Low cloud decks of a few hundred feet will continue into tomorrow***


Sustained Winds (8 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (9 PM CT)




Temperatures 10 PM CT




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Friday will be another day of scattered showers with a few iso rumbles of thunder possible. We continue to favor the first half of the day (1 AM Fri out through Noon) for the best precip opportunities with rain chances slowly tapering off as we work later into the evening. A stray leftover sprinkle or two will still be possible into the nighttime hours.
- Winds on Friday will continue coming out of the N/ NE on Friday and rather strong. Sustained winds at the boarding station will likely be 15-25 MPH with gusts of 20-30 MPH. An iso gust to 35 MPH at this distance looks possible at the boarding station.
- High temps on Friday will be much cooler with the passing of our front, likely only reaching the upper 40s / low 50s.
- *Fog is not favored into Friday, but similar to Thursday (today), rain showers can bring reduced visibility down to a few miles across the area. Low cloud deck likely continues*


Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (8 AM CT)




High Temperatures Friday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Into the day on Saturday, a few lower end chances of some isolated sprinkles/ mist cannot be ruled out at this distance. Some moisture looks to be squeezed out by some passing upper level energy, however details are rather uncertain this far out.
- On Saturday we are expecting winds to continue to come out of the NE with a sustained 10-20 MPH with gusts 20-30 MPH being possible.
- Highs on Saturday likely do not reach 50 as we are expecting temps in the middle 40s for highs
 - *No fog is anticipated for Saturday*


Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (11 AM CT)





High Temperatures Saturday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Much below normal temps will be the theme over the next 7 days with a rather active pattern. Today & Fri will continue periods of precip before next Mon brings another shot of rain for the area.
- The pattern turns much colder than normal for week 2 here...with a bit more influential jet stream we think the pattern can continue to grow wetter vs normal.
- “Normal” conditions regarding temps vs normal look in store for the 2nd half of February to early March...we think precipitation may still stay on the active side of things.
