




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- The rest of the day will feature lower end (10-20%) isolated shower chances out through the day today. Any precipitation is expected to stay rather light and certainly in a hit/miss nature.
- Winds the rest of the day will continue coming out of the N/ NE, sustained winds at the boarding station will likely be 15-25 MPH with gusts of 25-35 MPH.
- Lows around the area tonight likely drop back into the lower 40s.
- *Fog is not favored today, but rain showers can bring reduced visibility. Low cloud deck likely continues*


Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (5 PM CT)




Temperatures 8 PM Tonight




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Guidance has trended a bit stronger with precipitation chances and we think Saturday will feature isolated (10-20%) on / off sprinkle to light shower chances. There does not look to be one “window” for the best opportunity.
- On Saturday we are expecting winds to continue to come out of the NE with a sustained 15-20 MPH with gusts 20-30 MPH being possible.
- Highs on Saturday likely reach the lower to middle 40s for highs
 - *No fog is anticipated for Saturday*


Sustained Winds (10 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)




High Temperatures Saturday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Scattered shower chances will continue into Sunday in once again a hit and miss, on/off nature. Temps at this point will still be warm enough for all rain.
- Winds will be slightly weaker on Sunday but still coming out of the Northeast, sustained 10-15 MPH with gusts 15-20 MPH possible
- Highs on Sunday are likely sitting in the mid to upper 40s
- *No fog will be favored on Sunday, however reduced visibility will still come in the form of rain/mist.*


Sustained Winds (6 PM CT)





Simulated Radar Snapshot (6 AM CT)



High Temperatures Sunday





Week 1 Forecast



Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Much below normal temps will be the theme over the next 7 days with a rather active pattern. Guidance keeps several rain chances around in the coming days.
- The pattern turns much colder than normal for week 2 here...with a bit more influential jet stream we think the pattern can continue to grow wetter vs normal.
- “Normal” conditions regarding temps vs normal look in store for the 2nd half of February to early March...we think precipitation may still stay on the active side of things.
