




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- While more dry time is favored today more than time seeing precipitation, we are continuing to favor a 10-20% of an isolated light sprinkle/shower across the area. Highest chances today look to come after sundown but again, favoring rather a low end chance. Any precipitation would be rather brief, light, and isolated.
- Today we are expecting winds to continue coming out of the N/NNE with a sustained 15-20 MPH with gusts 20-30 MPH being possible.
- Highs likely reach the lower to middle 40s for highs
 - *No fog is anticipated today*


Sustained Winds (11 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (11 PM CT)




High Temperatures Today




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Scattered shower chances will be present Sunday in once again a hit and miss, on/off nature. We currently favor temperatures on Sunday to still be warm enough for all rain.
- Favoring winds out of the Northeast for Sunday, sustained 13-18 MPH with gusts 18-23 MPH possible
- Highs on Sunday are likely sitting in the lower 40s
- *No fog will be favored on Sunday, however reduced visibility will still be possible in the form of rain/mist.*


Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (10 AM CT)




High Temperatures Sunday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- We need to keep a *very* close eye on very late Sunday night/ and through the day on Monday for freezing rain/ sleet to work through our area. While the locally warmer air over the water may help things stay as rain for a bit longer vs over land, Monday looks favorable for ice accumulation. Lower confidence on how much can accrete given the stronger winds, but Monday looks to be a rather hazardous weather day.
- Winds Monday will be the strongest of the next several days, gradually shifting NE to NW during the day. We are expecting a sustained wind of 15-25 MPH with gusts 25-35 MPH expected. Gusts to 40 MPH cannot be eliminated at this distance
- Highs on Monday are expected to only reach the upper 20s near the HOU metro, mid 30s likely closer to the boarding station
- *Fog is not favored, bur reduced visibility can come in the form of rain/ freezing rain/ sleet.*


Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (6 AM CT)





High Temperatures Monday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Much below normal temps will be the theme over the next 7 days with a rather active pattern. Guidance keeps several rain/mixed precip chances around in the coming days.
- The pattern turns much colder than normal for week 2 here...with a bit more influential jet stream we think the pattern can continue to grow wetter vs normal.
- “Normal” conditions regarding temps vs normal look in store for the 2nd half of February to early March...we think precipitation may still stay on the active side of things.
