




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- A wintry mix will be possible out through the mid morning hours (~8-10 AM) before the precipitation will move northeast and lead to a quieter day.
- For the boarding station we continue to favor 20-30 MPH with gusts 30-40 MPH coming from the NE. Winds will gradually wind down late evening closer to 15-25 MPH sustained.
- Temperatures today will likely be in the mid to upper 20s for the boarding station
 - *Fog is not anticipated today*


Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (9 AM CT)




Temperatures 4 PM Monday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- We are favoring Tuesday to be a drier day
 - Winds will become much weaker for Tuesday, a sustained 8-13 MPH with gusts 13-18 possible. Winds will be out of the N but will shift to the NE ~Noon, E by ~2 PM, and SE by ~5 PM. Winds then pick up late in the evening hours.
 - Temps on Tuesday continue to remain quite cool, likely in the mid 30s across most of our stations, upper 30s closer to the boarding station.
- *No fog is anticipated Tuesday*


Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (10 AM CT)




High Temperatures Tuesday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Wednesday will introduce yet another chance of precipitation, at this distance looking to come as all rain. Best opportunities for rain coming in the mid-AM through mid-PM hours. Currently favoring light to at times moderate intensity
- Winds are a bit tricky on Wednesday as to when and where exactly the center of the low pressure system passes through the area. Favoring a SE (onshore) wind 15-25 MPH sustained with gusts 25-35 MPH before shifting back to the N as the low passes into the afternoon.
- Highs Wednesday will rebound a bit, expecting highs closer to the mid to upper 40s across the area
 - *No fog is expected Wednesday*


Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (9 AM CT)




- Much below normal temps will be the theme over the next 7 days with a rather active pattern. After precip today and tomorrow (Mon), another system looks to move through the area Wed/ Thu
- The pattern turns much colder than normal for week 2 here...with a bit more influential jet stream we think the pattern can continue to grow wetter vs normal.

➤ “Normal” conditions regarding temps vs normal look in store for the 2nd half of February to early March...we think precipitation may still stay on the active side of things.
