




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Expecting quieter weather the rest of the day
- For the boarding station we continue to favor 20-30 MPH with gusts 25-35 MPH coming from the NW. Winds will gradually wind down late evening closer to 15-25 MPH sustained.
- Low temps tonight will drop to the mid teens inland, lower to mid 20s closer to the boarding station
- *Fog is not anticipated today*


Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)




Low Temps 11 PM




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- We are favoring Tuesday to be a drier day
 - Winds will become much weaker for Tuesday, a sustained 8-13 MPH with gusts 13-18 possible. Winds will be out of the N but will shift to the NE ~Noon, E by ~2 PM, and E by ~5 PM. Winds then pick up late in the evening hours.
 - Temps on Tuesday continue to remain quite cool, likely in the mid 30s across most of our stations, upper 30s closer to the boarding station.
- *No fog is anticipated Tuesday*


Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (10 AM CT)




High Temperatures Tuesday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Rain chances will increase throughout the morning before yet another cold front sweeps across the Houston area, providing the opportunity for moderate-to-heavy rainfall and a few rumbles of thunder.
- Out ahead of this cold front, winds will be from the SE with a shift of winds to the north in behind. Right now would favor this shift around ~ the 12 PM timeframe. Winds likely remain breezy both out ahead and behind this system as well sustained around 15 – 25 MPH with gust of 35 MPH possible.
- Temperatures into the low-to-mid 50's F will be possible out ahead of this front before cooler temperatures are ushered in its wake.
- *No fog is expected Wednesday*


Sustained Winds (11 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (11 AM CT)




- Much below normal temps will be the theme over the next 7 days with a rather active pattern. After precip today and tomorrow (Mon), another system looks to move through the area Wed/ Thu
- The pattern turns much colder than normal for week 2 here...with a bit more influential jet stream we think the pattern can continue to grow wetter vs normal.

- "Normal" conditions regarding temps vs normal look in store for the 2nd half of February to early March...we think precipitation may still stay on the active side of things.
