




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Any freezing drizzle this morning looks to stay just North of our stations. We will favor a drier rest of the day today.
- For the boarding station we continue to favor 15-25 MPH sustained winds, with gusts 25-35 MPH coming from the North for most of the day.
- Temps today will be into the lower 40s across the area.
 - *Fog is not anticipated today.*


Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (9 AM CT)




High Temperatures Today




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Dry weather is anticipated into Friday
- Winds will continue to come offshore (out of the N), however decreasing through the day. The first half of the day features sustained winds 10-20 MPH with gusts locally higher, while the back half of the day will have sustained winds 8-13 MPH with a few isolated gusts to 15 MPH.
- Highs on Friday look to reach the mid 40s across the area
 - *No fog is anticipated Friday.*


Sustained Winds (6 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)




High Temperatures Friday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Saturday is expected to be a quieter day
- Winds Friday night and into the AM Sat will be very light. During the day, winds will turn more onshore (from SE) at 8-13 MPH with gusts 13-18 MPH
- Temps on Saturday are looking to push into the mid 50s.
- *No fog is expected Saturday*


Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)





High Temperatures Saturday





Week 1 Forecast

Long-Range Forecast Discussion



- As our precip moves out of the area today, the next best chance for precipitation looks to come on Monday. Temps will stay below average over the next 7 days, however temps will gradually increase
- Week 2 we are expecting to be slightly cooler than normal but also drier than normal. The cooler than normal temps will not be what temps over the past few days have been like.
