




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Dry weather is anticipated through today
- Expecting winds to shift to more NE around 9 PM this evening. Continuing to expect sustained winds 5-10 MPH as the winds turn this evening.
- Temps this evening likely drop back to near freezing inland, upper 30s/ lower 40s for air temps over the water
- *No fog is anticipated the rest of today.*


Sustained Winds (9 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (11 PM CT)




Temperatures (11 PM CT)




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Saturday is expected to be a quieter day
- Winds Sat AM will be very light. Winds will turn more more to the E by ~8 AM and then more onshore (from SE) by ~11 AM at 5-10 MPH with gusts 10-15 MPH the first half of the day, sustained winds 10-15 MPH the back half of the day.
- Temps on Saturday are looking to push into the mid 50s.
- *Guidance continues to suggest patchy fog to stay north of our stations for early Sat AM, so we will continue not to favor fog to impact our stations. Future updates will be sent if any forecast changes are necessary*


Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)




High Temperatures Saturday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Sunday should continue the quiet weather with any light showers staying away from the stations
- Winds will stay coming of the south with sustained winds 10-15 MPH with gusts 15-20 MPH. Winds with the upcoming cold front likely don't flip to the N until early Monday AM
- Highs on Sunday should climb back into the middle 60s
- *Sunday morning may have to be a period of *potential* fog to watch with warming temps and onshore winds. Guidance does not show fog, but it is something to watch nonetheless.*


Sustained Winds (11 AM CT)





Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)

Long-Range Forecast Discussion



➤ The next best chance for precipitation looks to come on Monday, however at this distance these chances look rather weak.

Temps will stay below average over the next 7 days, however temps will gradually increase moving forward

➤ Week 2 we are expecting to right around normal temp wise but also drier than normal. The cooler than normal temps will not be what temps over the past few days have been like.

➤ Into March we are favoring near normal temps for Texas and below normal precip as the upper air pattern does not look favorable for precip.
