




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Dry weather expected again for today.**
- **Winds during the daytime hours will increase out of the Southeast, sustained at 12-17 MPH, gusting at times up to 20-25 MPH.**
- **High temperatures today reach into the low to mid 60s across the boarding stations, near 70F more inland.**
- **No fog is anticipated today**


Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)




High Temperatures Wednesday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **The quiet weather looks to continue into Thursday, however we need to watch the evening hours (10 PM – 1 AM Fri) for our front to bring scattered shower chances.**
- **Around daybreak, winds will shift more out of the Southwest, looking to be sustained at 15-20 MPH, gusting at times up to 25-30 MPH at this distance seems reasonable. Winds in the 11 PM – 2 AM Fri window will shift out of the north with the next front moving through**
- **High temperatures on Thursday look to reach in the lower 70s over the boarding stations, in the mid 70s near the Houston metro.**
- **At this time, no fog risk seems present on Thursday due to gusty conditions + cold front passing.**


Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (11 PM CT)




High Temperatures Thursday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Once the front and associated showers pass off in the early morning hours, precip is not favored for the rest of the day Friday**
- **The frontal passage early Friday will bring an increase in winds, the peak of winds look to come 6 AM – 3 PM, sustained 15-25 MPH with gusts 25-35 MPH out of the NE. Beyond 3 PM, winds shift more ENE and gradually weaken, sustained 8-13 with gusts 13-18 MPH.**
- **High temps across the area are likely in the upper 50s / lower 60s for Friday.**
 - **No fog expected into Friday.**


Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)








Week 1 Forecast

Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- An overall very dry and slightly warmer than normal week are in store for the Houston area. Next best chance for precipitation looks to come Friday with another front that will work through the area.
- The pattern turns colder than normal for week 2 here...with a bit more influential jet stream we think the pattern can grow a bit wetter here as well vs week 1.
