




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Today is expected to be a quieter day
- Winds this morning will be very light. Winds will turn more more to the E by ~8 AM and then more onshore (from SE) by ~12 PM at 5-10 MPH with gusts 10-15 MPH the first half of the day, sustained winds 10-15 MPH the back half of the day.
- Highs today are looking to push into the mid 50s
- *While a few ***very isolated*** spots of very low clouds/ isolated patchy fog cannot be ruled out in the 7-9 AM window for our stations, we continue not to favor fog for this morning.*


Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)




High Temperatures Saturday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- While a very isolated (10%) sprinkle cannot be ruled out in the 1 PM – 6 PM window, the better opportunity for some light and scattered rain chances come Sunday evening out ahead of our next front. Overall intensity expected to be light to at times moderate
- Winds will stay coming of the south/ southeast with sustained winds 10-15 MPH with gusts 15-20 MPH. Winds with the upcoming cold front likely don't flip to the N until early Monday AM
- Highs on Sunday should climb back into the middle 60s
 - *****Currently not favoring fog for Sunday Morning, however this continues to be a window to monitor given the onshore flow. Check slide below for fog potential Sunday evening out ahead of the next cold front*****


Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (7 PM CT)




High Temperatures Sunday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- After our cold front passes in the early AM hours Monday (2-5 AM), Monday will be dry
- Winds with the front will flip to back Northerly, sustained 10-20 MPH with gusts 20-25 MPH as the front passes and then will gradually diminish as the day goes on.
- Highs on Monday look to sit in the lower 60s
- *No fog is anticipated on the day Monday.*


Sustained Winds (8 AM CT)





Simulated Radar Snapshot (9 AM CT)

Long-Range Forecast Discussion



➤ The next best chance for precipitation looks to come on Monday, however at this distance these chances look rather weak.

Temps will stay below average over the next 7 days, however temps will gradually increase moving forward

➤ Week 2 we are expecting to right around normal temp wise but also drier than normal. The cooler than normal temps will not be what temps over the past few days have been like.

➤ Into March we are favoring near normal temps for Texas and below normal precip as the upper air pattern does not look favorable for precip.
