


## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Watching for a very low end isolated sprinkle (~10%) through the afternoon hours out ahead of the cold front. The cold front will provide better opportunities for light and scattered showers (30-40%) to be around in the 6 PM Sun – 3 AM Mon window.**
- **Winds will stay coming of the south/ southeast with sustained winds 10-15 MPH with gusts 15-20 MPH. Winds with the upcoming cold front likely don't flip to the N until early Monday AM**
- **Highs today should climb back into the middle 60s**
- **\*\*\*\*Check slide below for fog potential this evening out ahead of the next cold front\*\*\*\***


## Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (6 PM CT)









- We continue to favor fog this evening with onshore flow out ahead of our cold front. We are favoring Morgan's Point to the boarding station as the stations to have the best chance to be impacted by fog, a touch lower confidence on impacts from Morgan's Point to 610 bridge.
- The current favored start time of any fog would likely be in the 8-10 PM window tonight and then wind down in the 2- 4 AM window Monday as the front passes (Morgan's Point likely closer to ~2 AM, boarding station likely closer to ~4 AM). Exact timing of the front will have a big impact on when any fog actually lifts.


## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- After our cold front passes in the early AM hours Monday (2 - 4 AM), Monday will be dry
- Winds with the front will flip back to Northerly, sustained 10-20 MPH with gusts 20-25 MPH as the front passes and then will gradually diminish as the day goes on.
- Highs on Monday look to sit in the lower 60s
- *No fog is anticipated on the day Monday.*


## Sustained Winds (4 AM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 AM CT)






## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Not favoring precip on Tuesday**
  
- **Early Tuesday morning our winds will shift back SE and continue onshore throughout the day. Sustained winds 5 – 10 MPH with a few gusts higher**
  
- **Highs on Tuesday look to be in the lower 60s across the area**
  
- ***Not anticipating fog for Tuesday.***


## Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)



## Long-Range Forecast Discussion

➤ The coldest days of the winter are behind us as we are anticipating the next several days to feature highs in the upper 50s / lower 60s and lows in the mid 50s. Rain chances will return mid to late week



➤ Week 2 we are expecting to right around normal temp wise but also drier than normal. The cooler than normal temps will not be what temps over the past few days have been like.

➤ Into March we are favoring near normal temps for Texas and below normal precip as the upper air pattern does not look favorable for precip.
