





Visibility Report

- > As warmer and moist ocean air begins to move eastward towards the Houston area, very patchy fog may begin to develop especially in Western areas shortly after 11PM tonight. This does not look to become more widespread until the morning tomorrow.
- ➤ Areas that have stayed cooler today over water will likely see increased threats of fog tomorrow morning. Areas that can warm-up faster (inland) will see less threats into tomorrow morning. By 6-7AM tomorrow, Bravo 1&2 up to 51/52 start to see fog threats. The app is currently seeing the threats for ½ and 11/12, but will likely begin to trend upward tonight for other areas over the Bay (especially for 51/52 and points south).
 - Confidence with the patchy fog threats into mid-day tomorrow are lower than normal given big model discrepancies with higher confidence of growing fog tomorrow night.







- ➤ Data has been speeding up and increasing the potential for fog as we work into the day tomorrow over water (especially late morning and beyond). Areas inland (Morgan's Point and points north/west) likely stay clear. Increased risks for visibilities below a half mile exist from station 75/76 and points south. The highest probabilities for persistent dense fog will be from Bravo ½ to station 51/52 throughout the day tomorrow. There may be times where fog can relax, but it will likely be a lingering threat throughout the day tomorrow and intensifying into Wednesday night.
- Fog likely spreads as we touched on in the morning update on Wednesday night with all stations likely becoming consumed with dense fog by Thursday morning.








- > As we have touched on, fog is likely to expand as we work into Thursday morning with all stations under the risk very dense fog and visibilities less than 0.25 of a mile.
 - > This fog can likely linger for much of the day on Thursday, with fog being a risk especially over water all day Thursday. As winds shift Thursday afternoon, fog may try to become more patchy in nature and dissipate inland, but we'll need to fine tune this as we get closer with higher resolution data.






Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Not favoring precip today.
- ➤ Today our winds will be primarily out of the South, sustained 5 – 10 MPH with a few gusts higher at 15-20 MPH will be possible. Winds look to increase to 10-15 MPH sustained after 6/7 PM tonight.
- Lows tonight will fall into the mid-50s with upper-50s in the city.


Wind Gusts (5 PM CT)

Low Temperatures Tonight









Short-Term Forecast Discussion


Wednesday is anticipated to still be an overall drier day, with an isolated 10/20% chance for a light shower after noon through the evening hours. Mist may also develop at times especially over water where fog risks exist.

- Winds stay out of the South on Wednesday, sustained around 10-15 MPH, with a gust possible up to 15-20 MPH.
 - Highs on Wednesday look to rise into the lower 70s with 60s over water.


Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)

High Temperatures Wednesday









Short-Term Forecast Discussion


Through the first half of the day on Thursday we think the light rain coverage can be more focused over the Houston metro, increasing slightly over the Bay after noon through sunset.

- ➤ Winds shift from the South to southeast on Wednesday, sustained around 10-15 MPH, with a gust possible up to 15-20 MPH.
- Highs on Thursday look to be in the mid to upper 60s due to precipitation in the area, cooler over water.


Simulated Radar Snapshot (6 PM CT)

High Temperatures Thursday











Long-Range Forecast Discussion


- We are anticipating temps ahead to transition right back into a spring-like nature, with many of the days well into the 70s to be expected. Light rain chances will return mid to late week along and north of the Boarding Stations.
- Week 2 we are expecting to be right around normal to slightly above normal temp wise, with moisture chances on the rise to seasonable to above normal.
- Into mid-March we are favoring above normal temps for Texas and below normal precip as the upper air pattern does not look super favorable for precip.
