


## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Quieter weather is expected today, however we need to watch the evening hours (10 PM – 1 AM Fri) for our front to bring scattered shower chances. This looks to generally bring less than 0.1” of rain.
- Winds will continue coming out of the SW at 15-20 MPH with gusts 20-30 MPH. As the front works its way into the area, winds in the 11 PM – 2 AM Fri window will shift out of the N/ NE and weaken to 13-18 MPH sustained.
- Temps right before the front works through will be in the mid to upper 50s
- **\*\*\*We continue to not favor fog in the afternoon and evening hours out ahead of this front\*\***


## Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (10 PM CT)




## Temperatures (11 PM CT)




## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Currently favoring a 20-30% chance during the day on Friday for light scattered showers across the area. Slightly lower confidence on this given how guidance has continued to trend stronger as we get closer. Any shower chances look to be rather scattered.
- The frontal passage early Friday will bring an increase in winds, the peak of winds look to come 6 AM – 12 PM, sustained 15-25 MPH with gusts 25-30 MPH out of the NE at the boarding station. In the 3-6 PM window, winds shift more ENE and gradually weaken, sustained 10-15 MPH with gusts 15-25 MPH.
- High temps across the area are likely in the upper 50s / lower 60s for Friday.
  - No fog expected into Friday.


## Sustained Winds (8 AM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)






## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **At this distance we are favoring a drier day on Saturday with any precip right now just offshore, however we may need to watch the morning hours for wetter trends in the coming reports.**
  
- **Winds will stay coming out of the ENE on Saturday, 8-13 MPH with gusts 13-18 MPH. By the late afternoon/ evening hours, we are anticipating another wind shift to out of the NW with winds of 8-13 MPH.**
  
- **Highs on Saturday will be in the lower to mid 60s across the area.**
  
- **No fog is anticipated for Saturday.**


## Sustained Winds (10 AM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)








## Week 1 Forecast

### Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Expecting the next 7 days to be right around normal for this time of year. Friday will feature what looks like the best shot at precip over the next 7 days .
- The pattern turns colder than normal for week 2 here...with a bit more influential jet stream we think the pattern can grow a bit wetter here as well vs week 1.
