


## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- For the rest of the afternoon and evening, there will be a 20-30% of some light, hit and miss scattered showers around our stations, however this will not be a widespread, nonstop rain. Overall highest chances coming out through the 6 PM window
- In the 3-6 PM window, winds shift more ENE and gradually weaken, sustained 13-18 MPH with gusts 15-25 MPH. Winds likely die down below 15 MPH after the midnight timeframe tonight.
- Lows tonight will drop back into the upper 40s across the area.
- No fog anticipated for the rest of the day.


## Sustained Winds (9 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (8 PM CT)




## Low Temperatures Tonight




## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Watching for a 10-20% chance of a very isolated sprinkle from the 3 AM – 12 PM window. Any precipitation would be rather light (few hundredths of an inch), however quieter weather is expected in the PM hours.**
- **Winds will stay coming out of the ENE on Saturday, 8-13 MPH with gusts 13-18 MPH. In the Noon – 3 PM, we are anticipating another wind shift to out of the NW with winds of 5-10 MPH.**
- **Highs on Saturday will be in the lower to mid 60s across the area.**
- **While areas of slightly reduced visibility will be possible thanks to the light precip/ mist, fog is not favored for the Sat AM hours**


## Sustained Winds (6 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (9 AM CT)




## High Temperatures Saturday




## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Right now favoring a drier Sunday across the area
- Winds on Sunday will likely be strongest in the morning before weakening. A NE wind to start the day sustained 8-13 MPH will shift to more Easterly by the mid morning hours and then turn more onshore (Southeasterly) by around the Noon timeframe at 5-10 MPH. A few gusts 10-15 MPH at the boarding station cannot be ruled out.
- Highs on Sunday will be in the upper 50s to lower 60s
- Currently not anticipating fog on Sunday, however we need to keep an eye on Sunday evening with the return of onshore flow


## Sustained Winds (7 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)








## Week 1 Forecast

### Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Expecting the next 7 days to be right around normal for this time of year. Friday will feature what looks like the best shot at precip over the next 7 days .
- The pattern turns colder than normal for week 2 here...with a bit more influential jet stream we think the pattern can grow a bit wetter here as well vs week 1.
