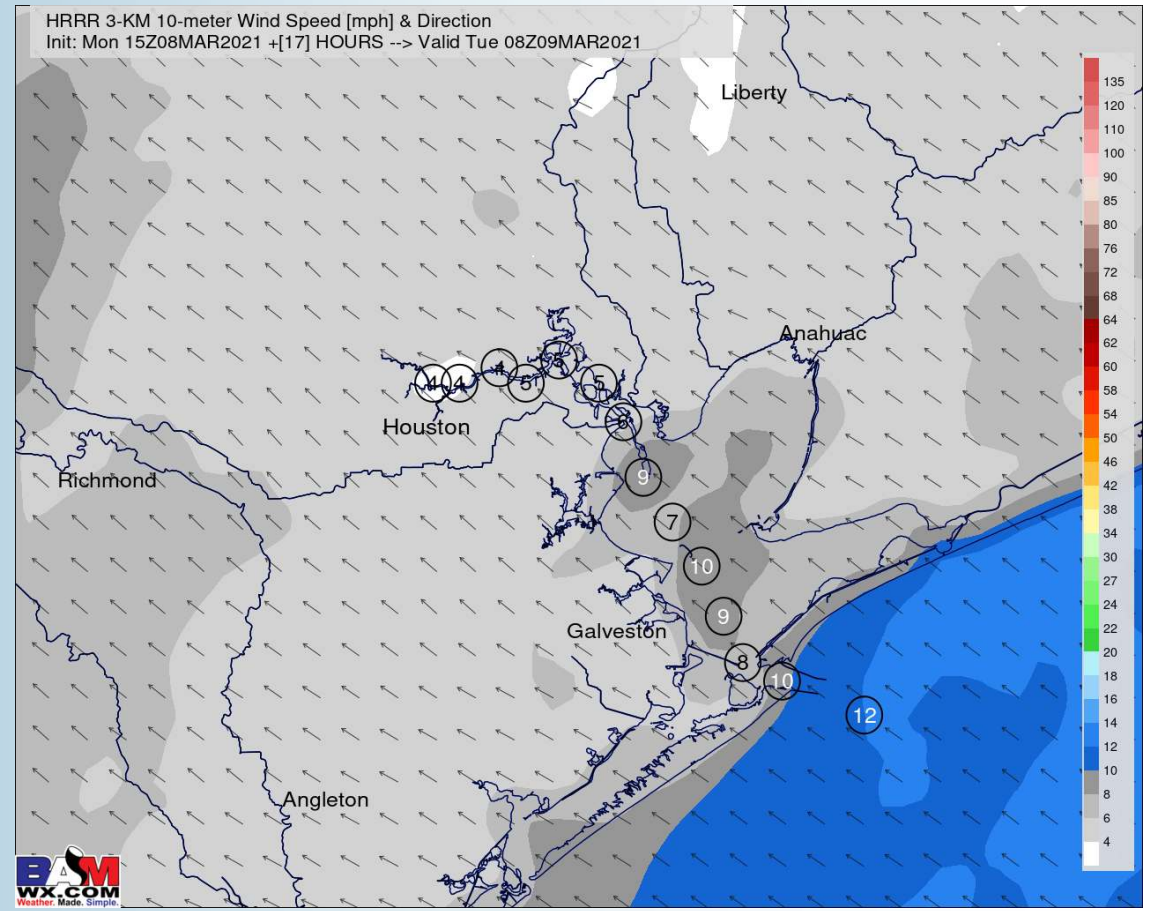

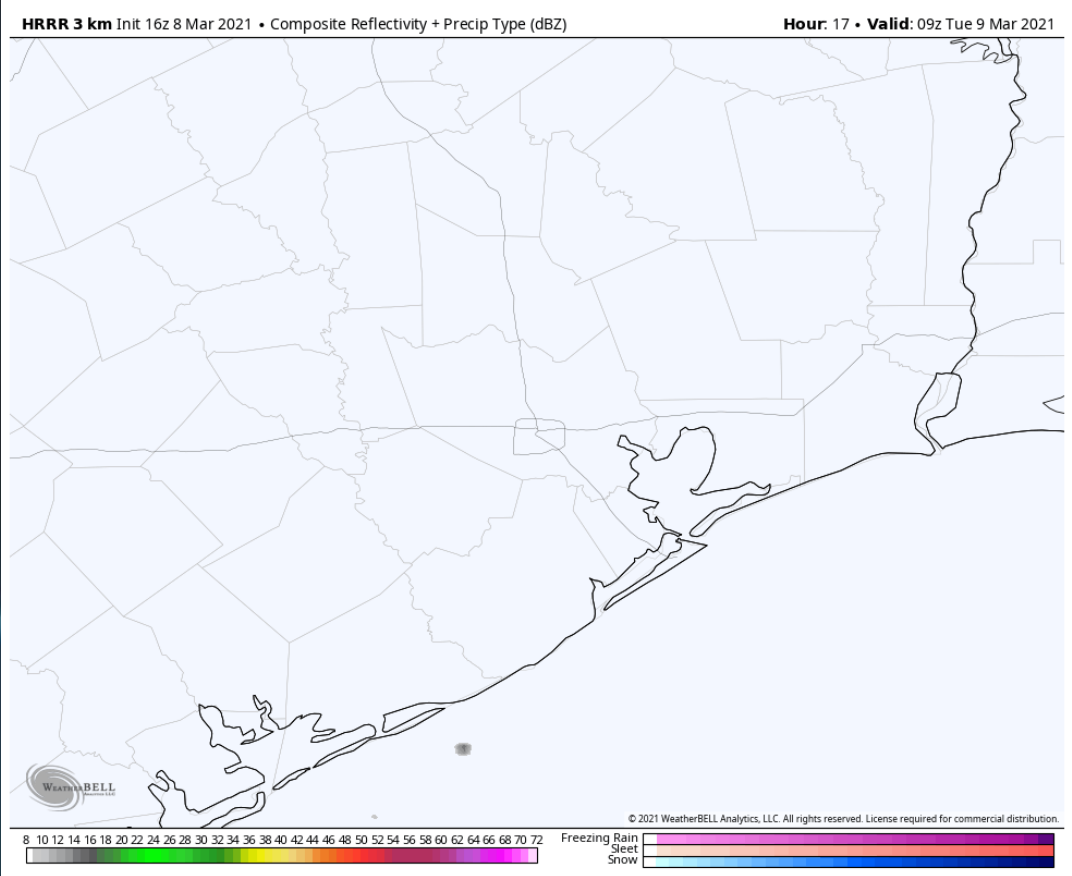
## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- *Currently not favoring fog for tonight.*

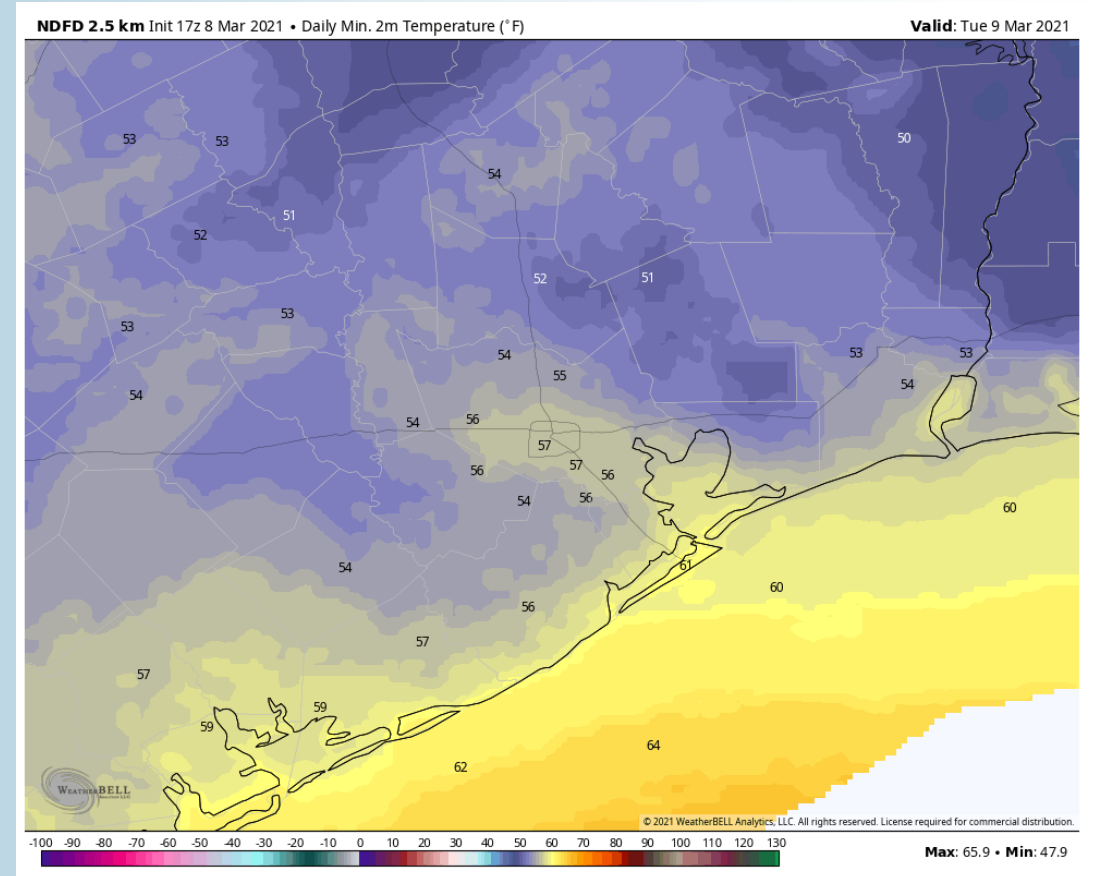
## Sustained Winds (2 AM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 AM CT)



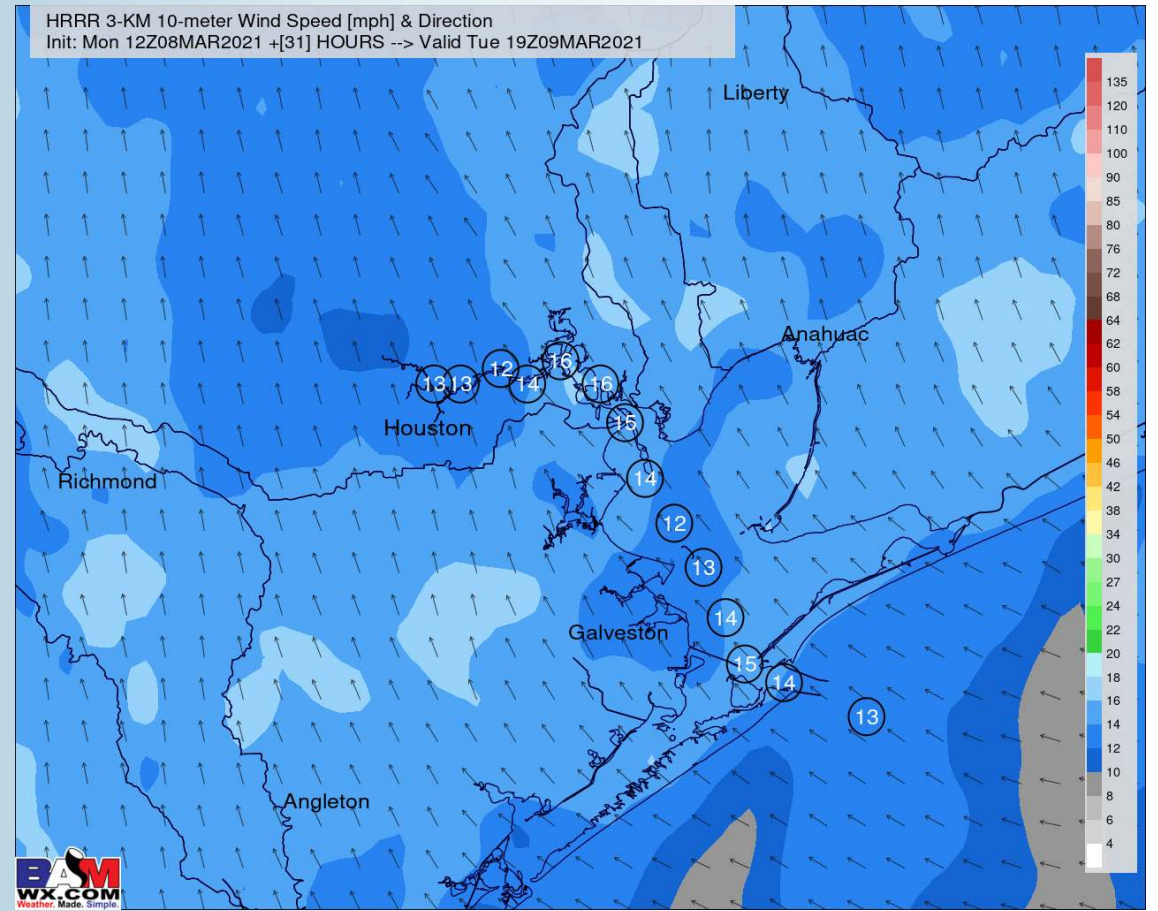
## Low Temperatures Monday



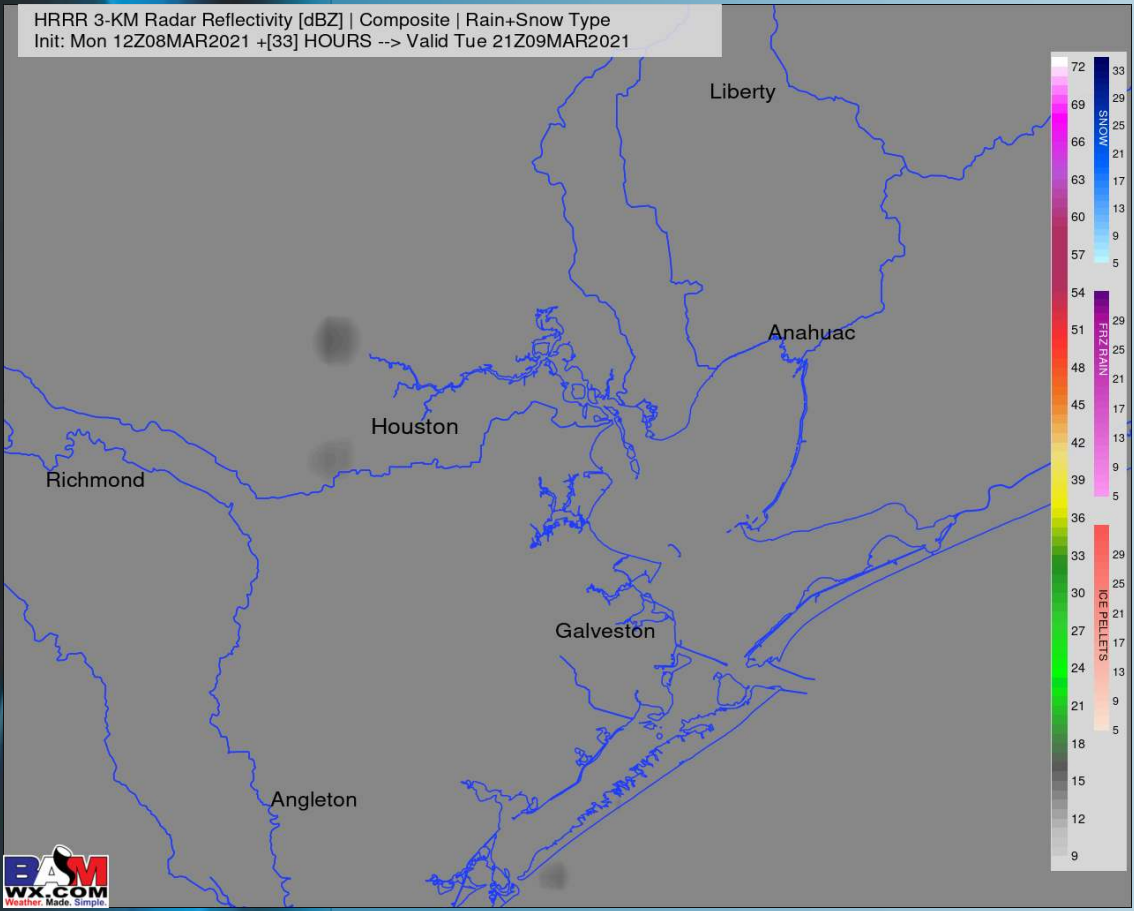
## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- We may need to watch for a few iso sprinkles (~10-20%) near mid-day Tue, but at this distance favoring an overall drier day.
- Tuesday likely features sustained winds of 13-18 MPH and gusts 20-25 MPH coming from the SE at the boarding station.
- Highs will be in the upper 60s for our stations on Tuesday, warmer inland.
- *No fog is currently anticipated for Tuesday.*

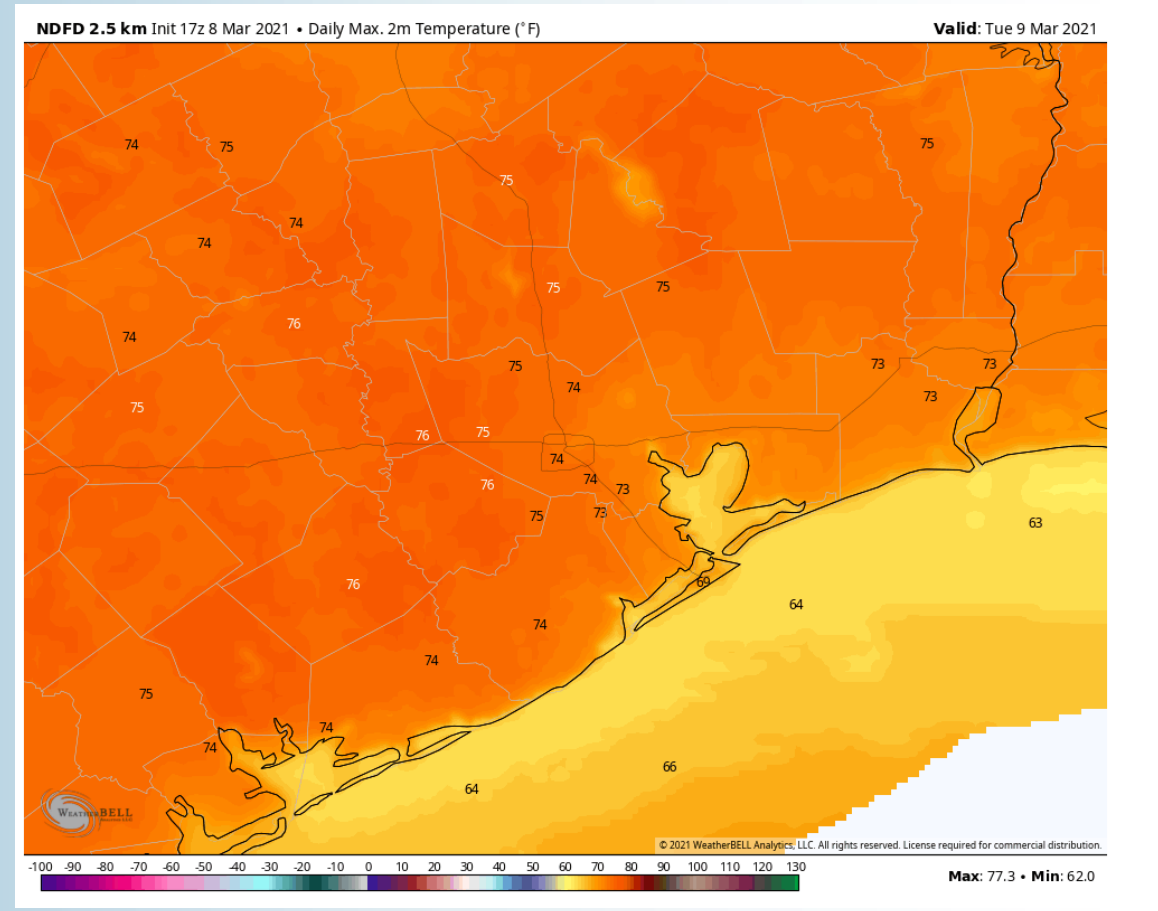
## Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)



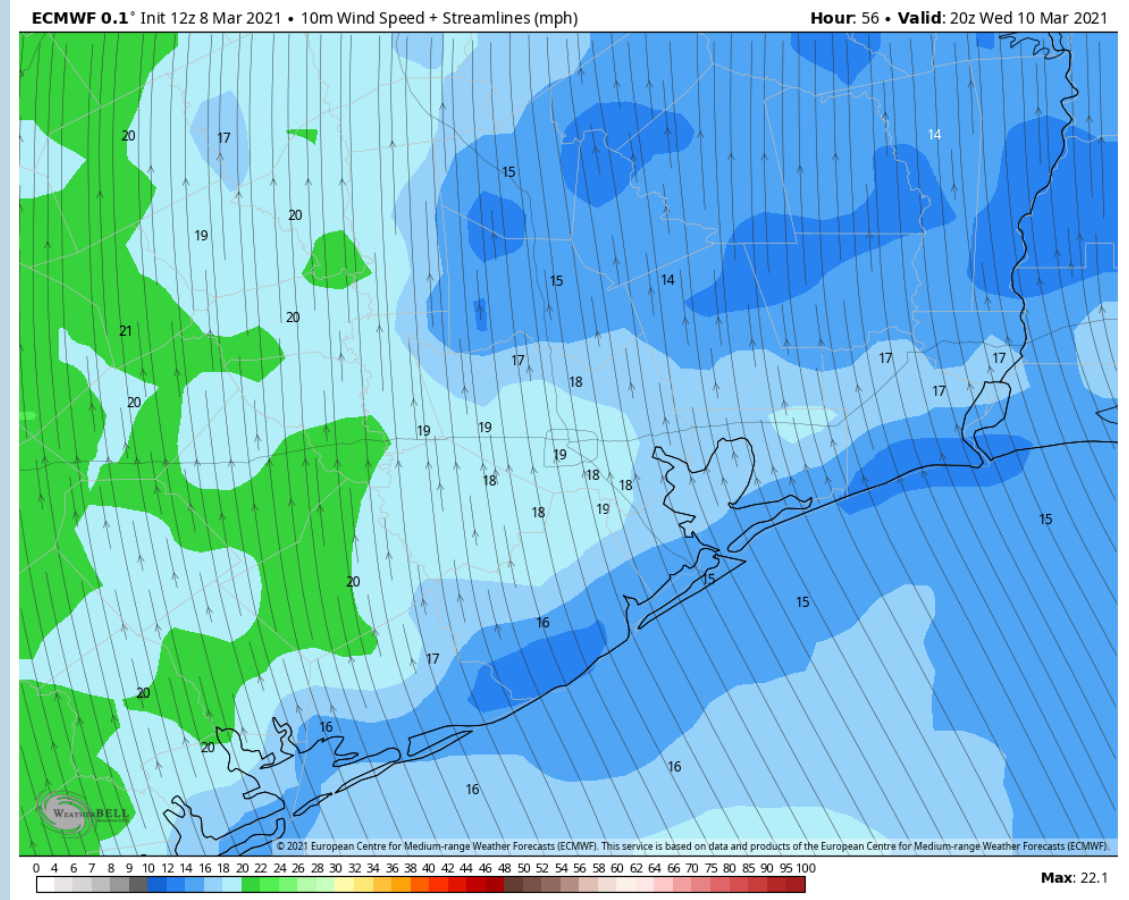

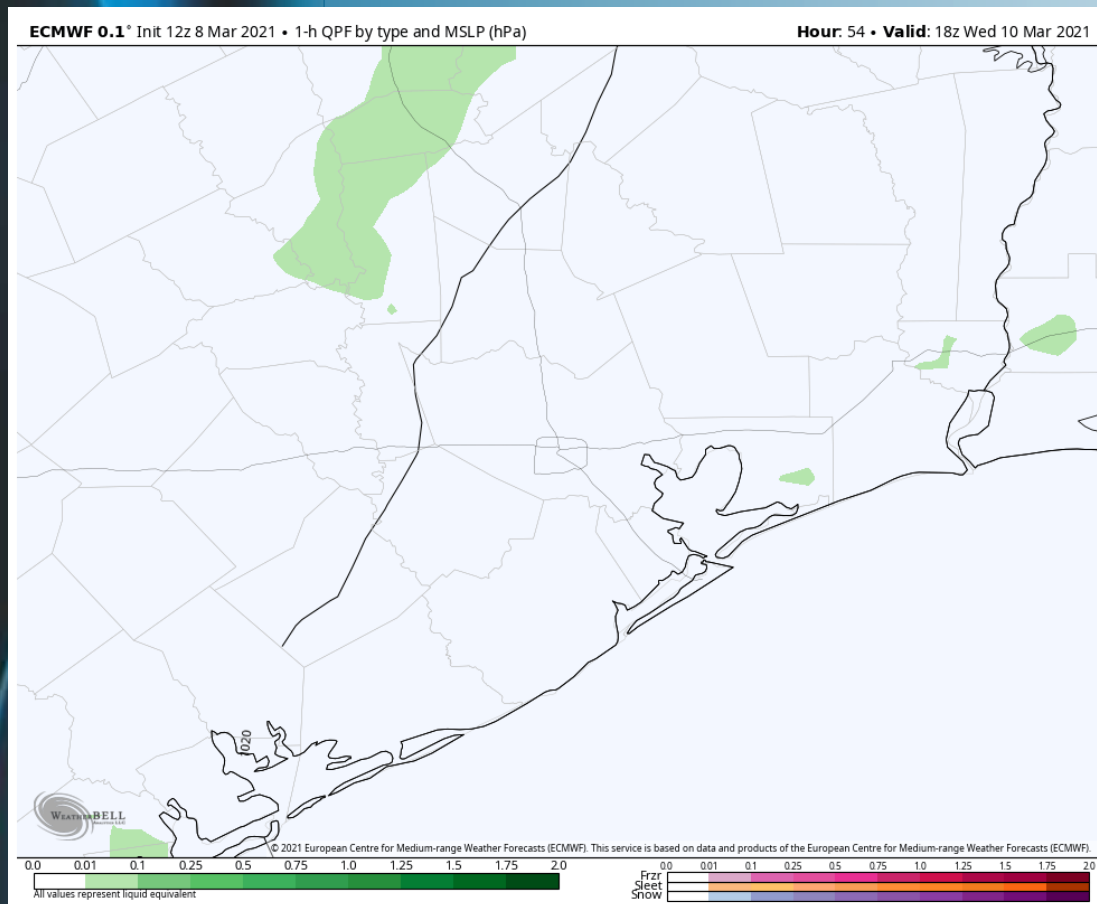
## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- We may need to watch for a few iso sprinkles again (~20%) near late morning to early PM Wed, but at this distance favoring an overall drier day.
- Wednesday likely features sustained winds of 15-20 MPH and gusts 20-25 MPH coming from the SSE at the boarding station.
- Highs will be in the lower 70s for our stations on Wednesday, warmer inland.
- *No fog is currently anticipated for Wednesday.*

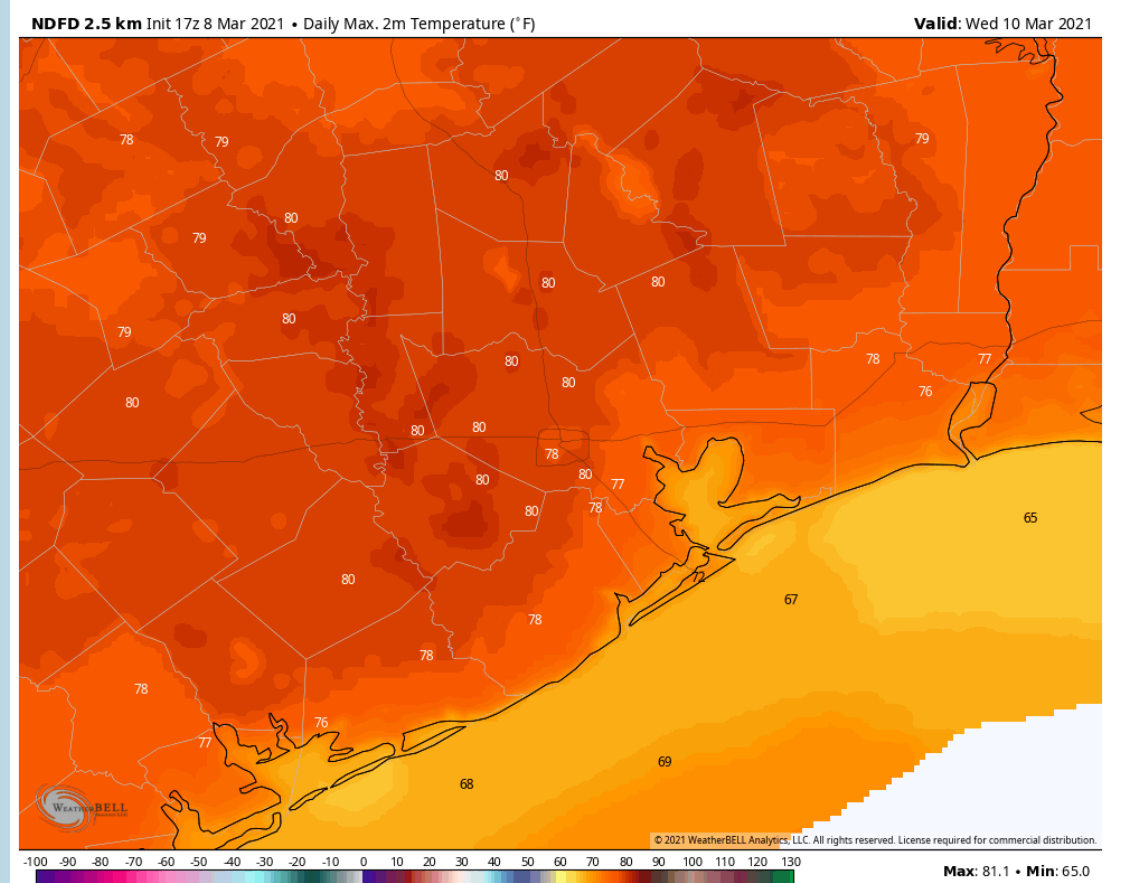
## Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)

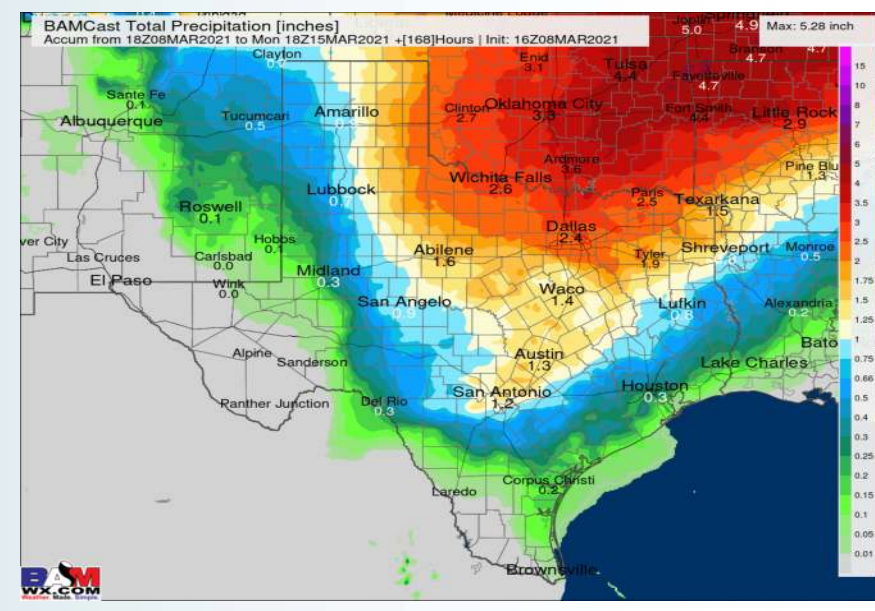
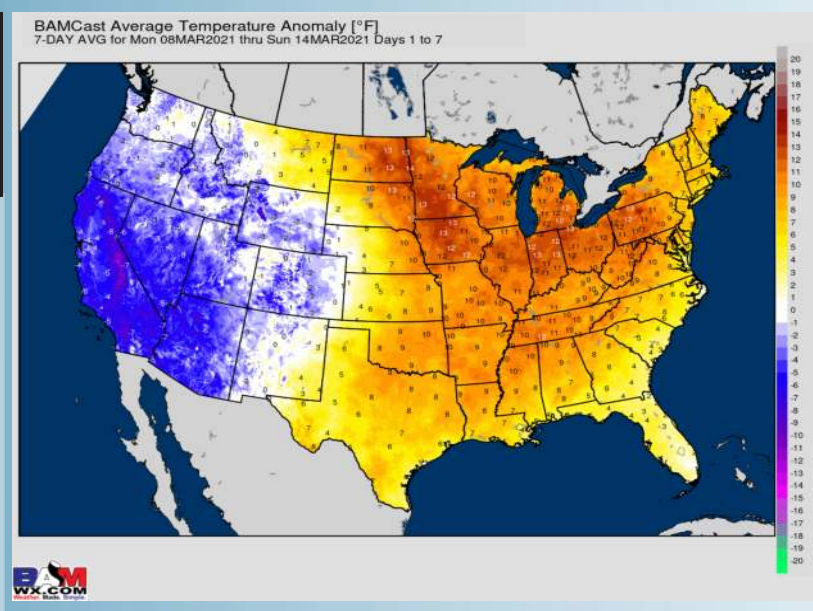

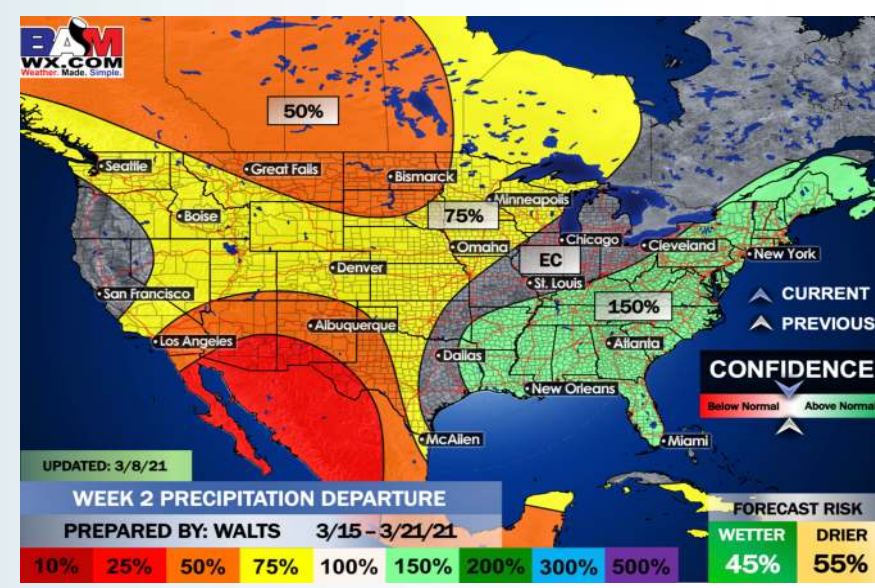
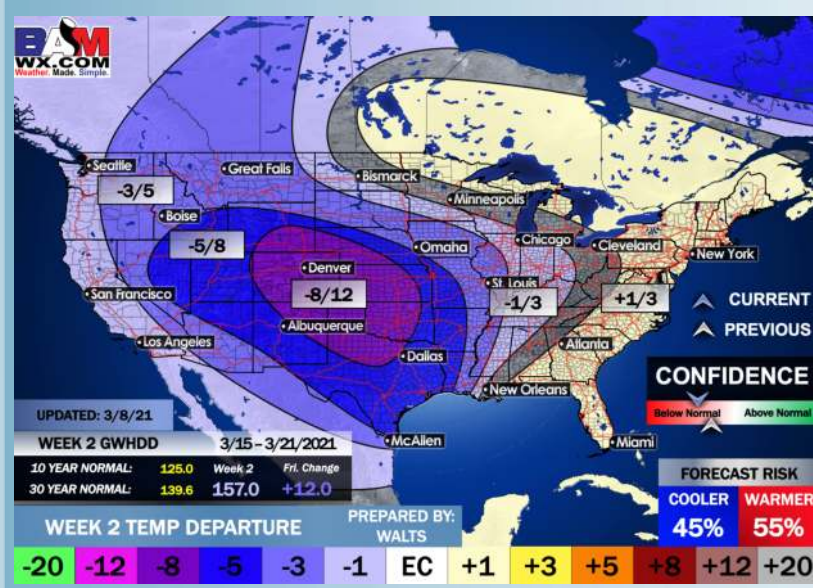
## Week 1 Forecast

### Long-Range Forecast Discussion



- Slightly cooler to near normal temps are expected today with above normal temperatures expected Tuesday through Friday. Precipitation chances look to be mainly north over the next week.
- The week 2 timeframe will offer up some better precipitation risks with the best potential just North / East of the Houston area. Temperatures will likely drop below normal for this period.
- The end of March is expected to have near normal precipitation risks with slightly above normal temperature risks. The last week of MAR can see some periods of drier weather with better opportunity for more active weather coming the first week of APR.
