




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- We need to watch for a few rather isolated sprinkles (~10-20%) through the day given the onshore flow, but think any precipitation would be rather light and there would be much more dry time vs not.
- Anticipating sustained winds of 13-18 MPH and gusts 20-25 MPH coming from the SE at the boarding station.
- Highs will be in the upper 60s / lower 70s for our stations, warmer inland.
- *We continue not to favor fog today/ this evening thanks to winds looking to stay strong enough to limit development. A risk to watch for patchy fog is *if* winds end up being slightly weaker than what is modeled. Something we will monitor through the day*


Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (9 AM CT)




High Temperatures Wednesday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- We may need to watch for a few sprinkles again (~10-20%) for the day on Thursday, but similar to today this would be rather isolated and overall lighter.
- Thursday likely features sustained winds of 13-18 MPH and gusts 20-25 MPH coming from the SSE at the boarding station.
- Highs will be in the lower 70s for our stations on Thursday, warmer inland.
- *Check the slide below for fog risks on Thursday.*


Sustained Winds (7 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (6 PM CT)




High Temperatures Thursday






Above Normal

- ***A slight relax in the winds later on Thursday may lead to the potential of some patchy fog starting Thursday evening. Right now we are in favor of some patchy fog developing around sundown Thursday and pending exact wind speed, holds the potential to linger into Friday morning in a patchy nature. Slightly below normal confidence on the fog as the winds will really play a big role in determining how much fog can form. Stronger winds vs modeled = less fog , weaker winds = more fog***
- ***Best opportunities for fog would likely begin closer to the boarding station Thursday evening and then work its way further north into the overnight. One risk is that some guidance develops fog closer to mid Thu-PM. Exact timing and details with this will be updated in the coming reports.***


Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Expecting Friday at this distance to be on the drier side, but would not be surprised to introduce a sprinkle chance as we work into the range of hi-resolution guidance.**
- **Winds look to be very similar to the past few days, coming from the SE at 13-18 MPH with gusts 20-25 MPH possible at the boarding station.**
- **Temperatures will continue to sit in the lower 70s over the waters, closer to 80 inland.**
- ***Watching Fri AM fog potential as touched on in the slide above.***


Sustained Winds (6 PM CT)

High Temperatures Friday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temps are expected to rise above normal temperatures today through Saturday, dropping cooler late weekend to early next week. Precipitation chances look to be mainly north over the next week.



- The week 2 timeframe will offer up some better precipitation risks with the best potential just North / East of the Houston area. Temperatures will likely drop below normal for this period.

- The end of March and open to early April is expected to have near below normal precipitation risks with slightly above normal temperature risks.
