

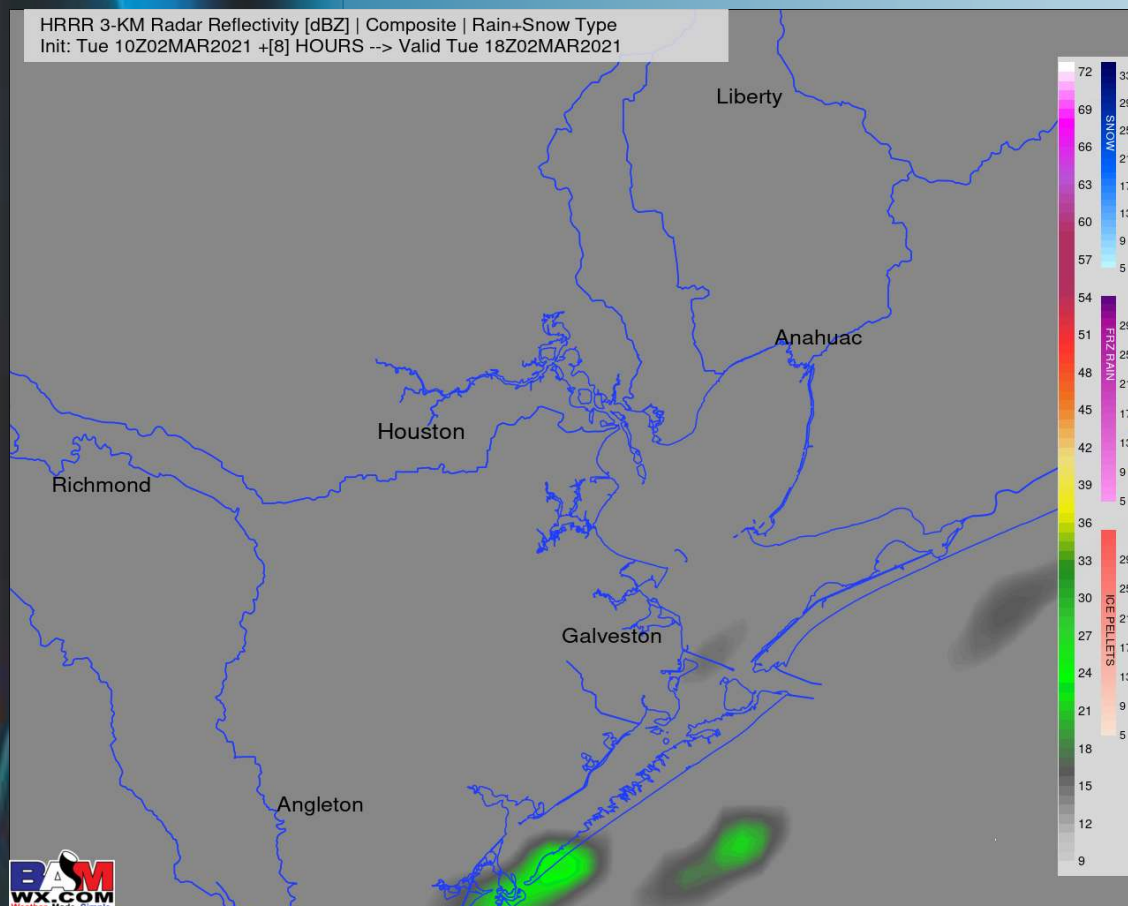

Short-Term Forecast Discussion

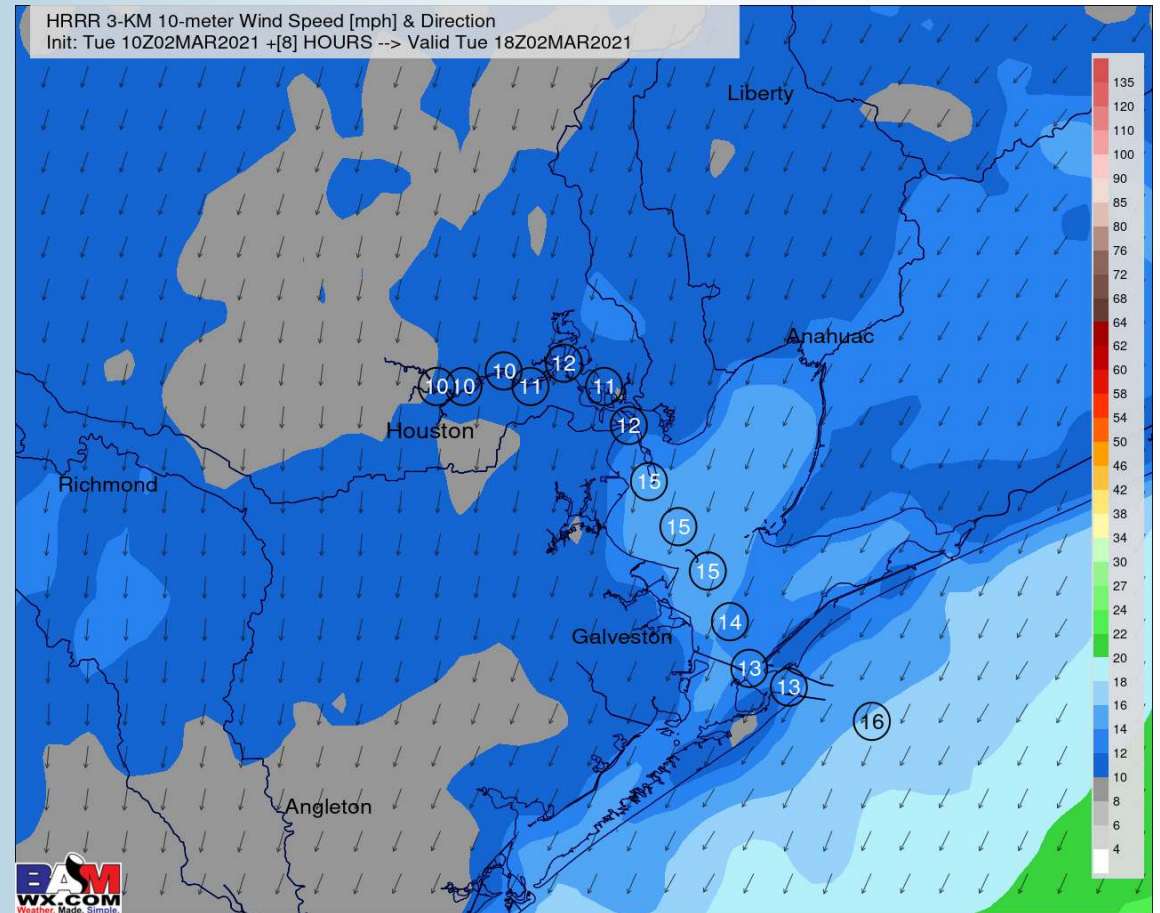
- A few scattered leftover showers/mist will be possible out through about mid-morning, but the later into today we work, the drier we will be.
- Winds will be primarily out of the North at the boarding stations through much of the day, and will be 17-23 MPH sustained with gusts 23-28 MPH. Winds may be locally higher as the winds shift direction in the morning hours.
- Highs temps across the area will be in the upper 50s / lower 60s with the passing of the front.
- *No fog is anticipated for this morning.*

Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)

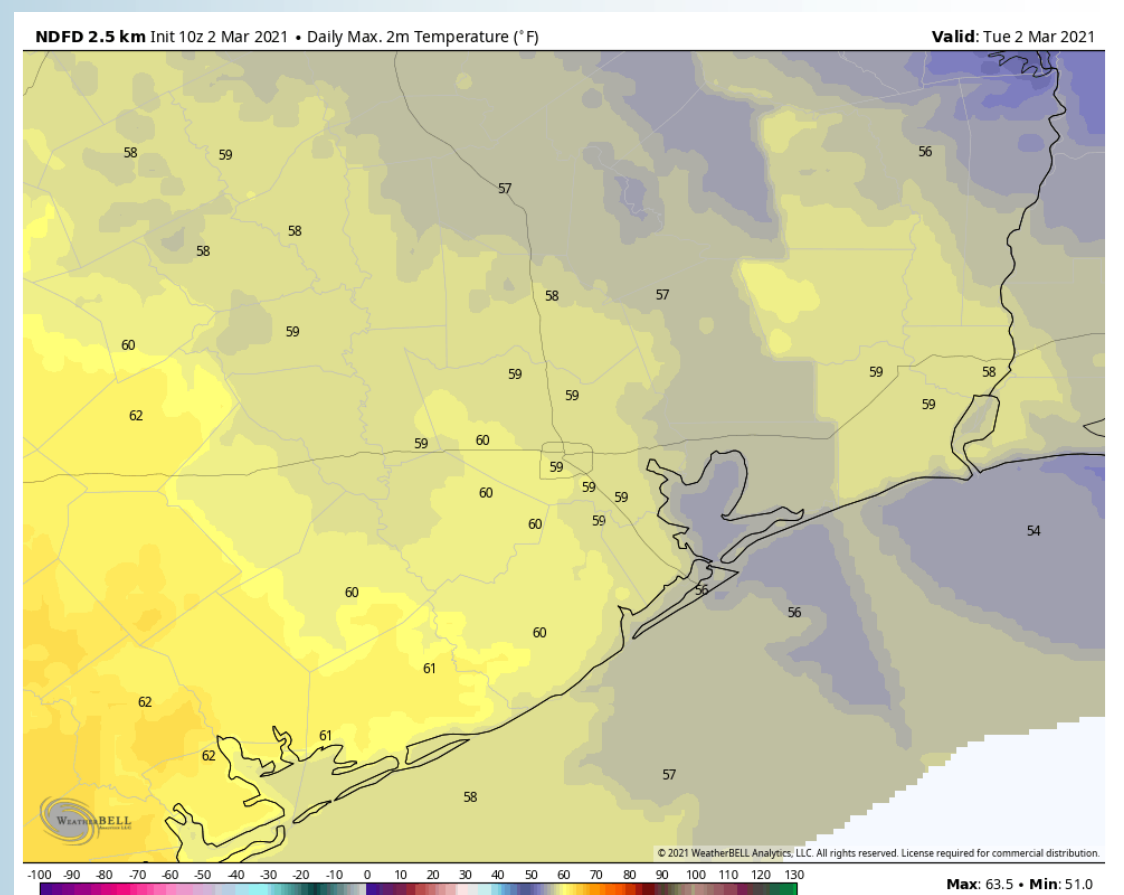


Tuesday, March 2nd, 2021

High Temperatures Today

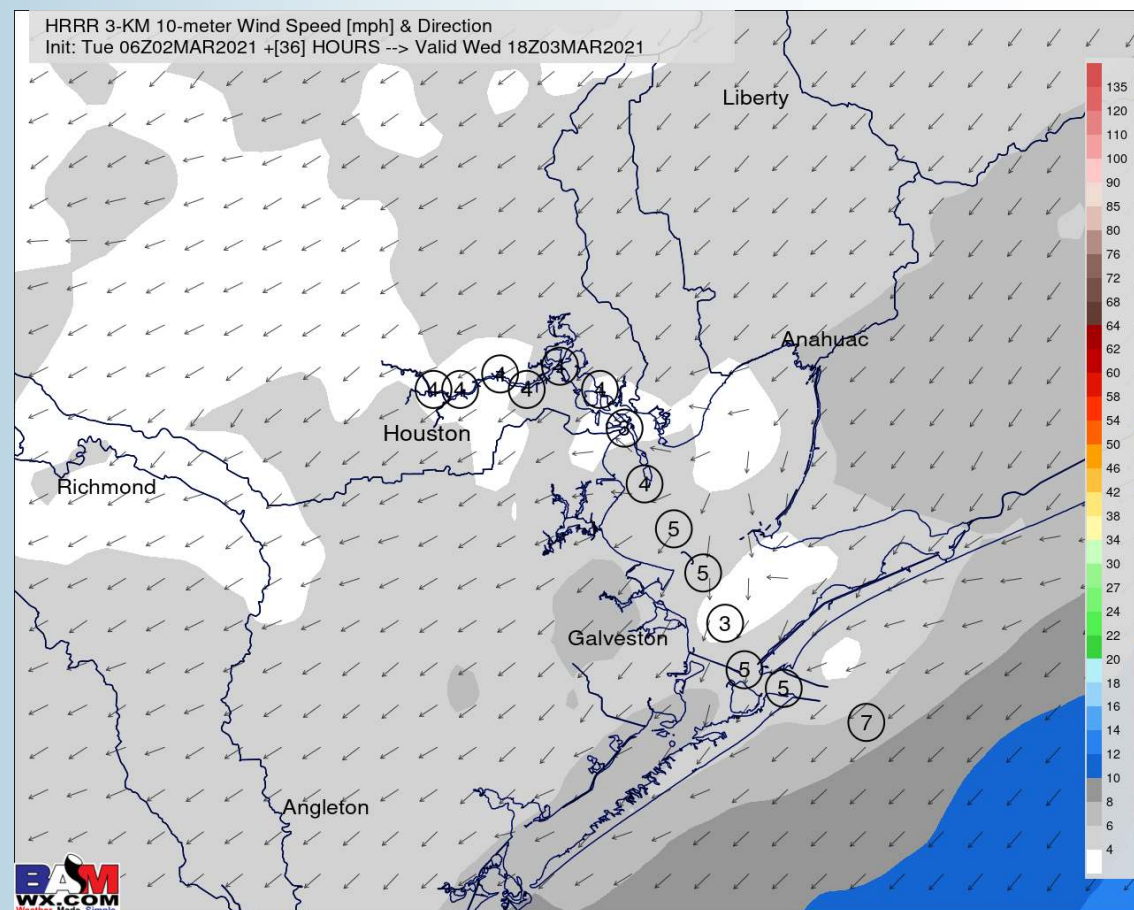


Short-Term Forecast Discussion

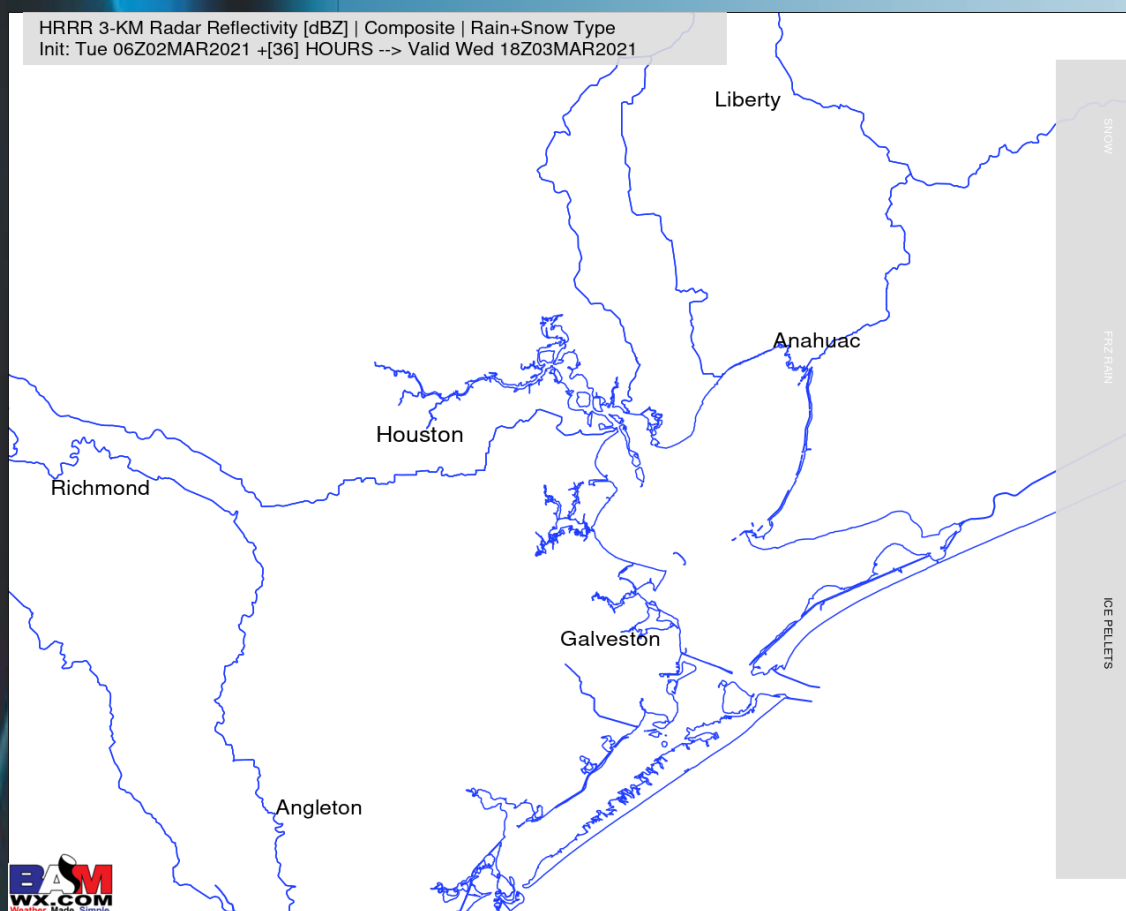
- Wednesday is expected to be a dry day across the area.
- Winds will start out of the Northeast at 5-10 MPH sustained, giving way to light, variable winds early to mid-afternoon to the evening hours.
- Highs temps across the area will climb back into the low to mid 60s across the area.
- *No fog is currently anticipated for Wednesday AM.*

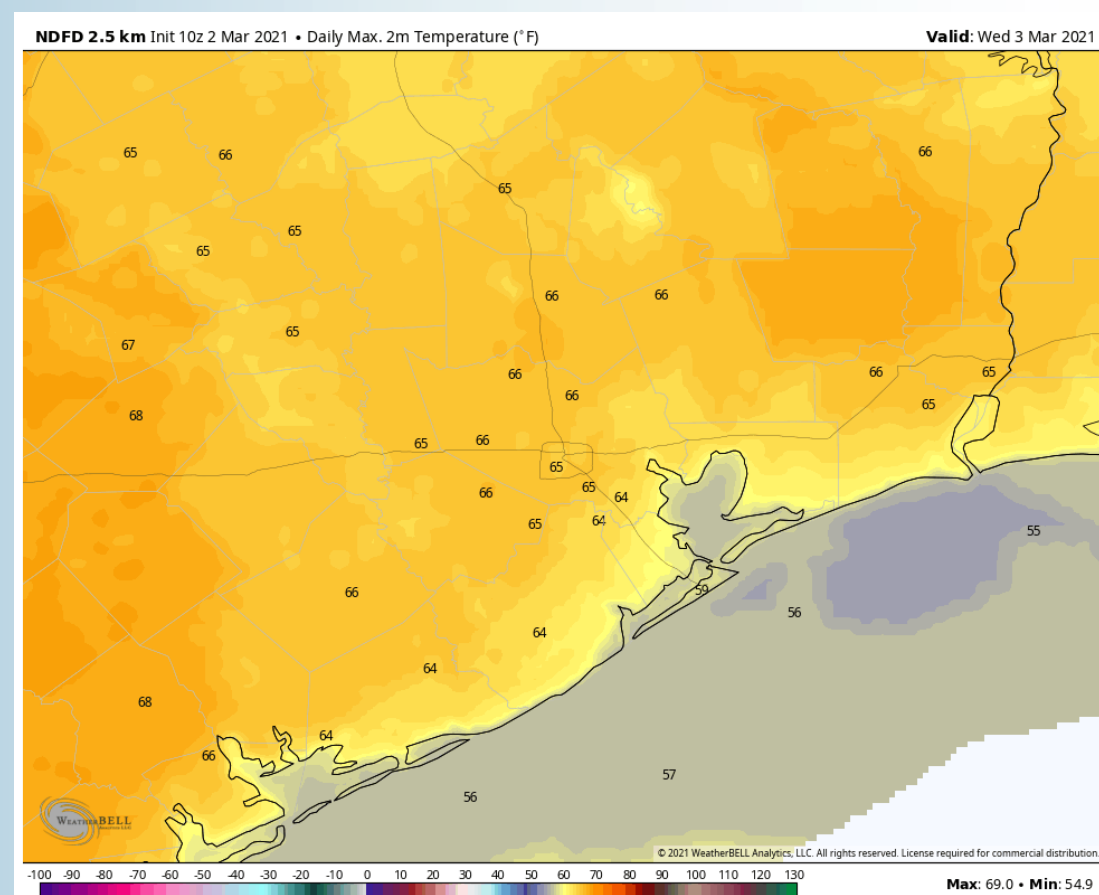
Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)

High Temperatures Wednesday

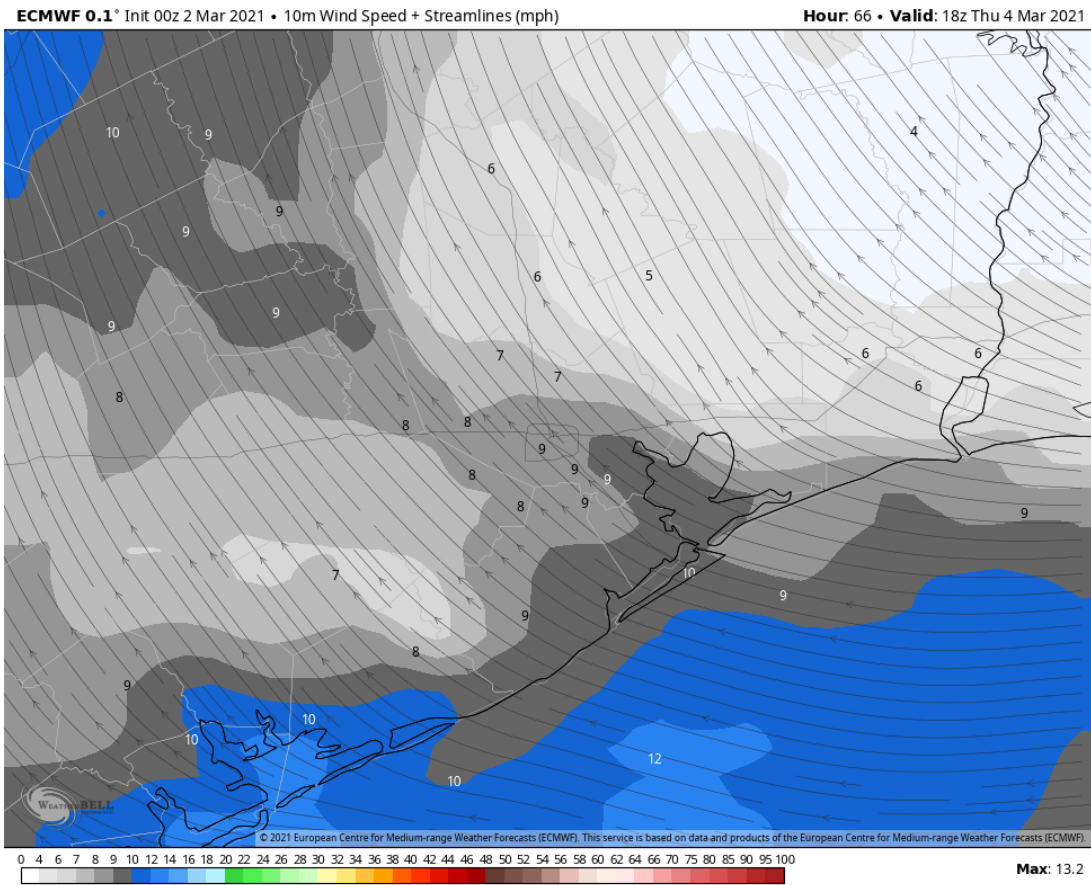


Short-Term Forecast Discussion

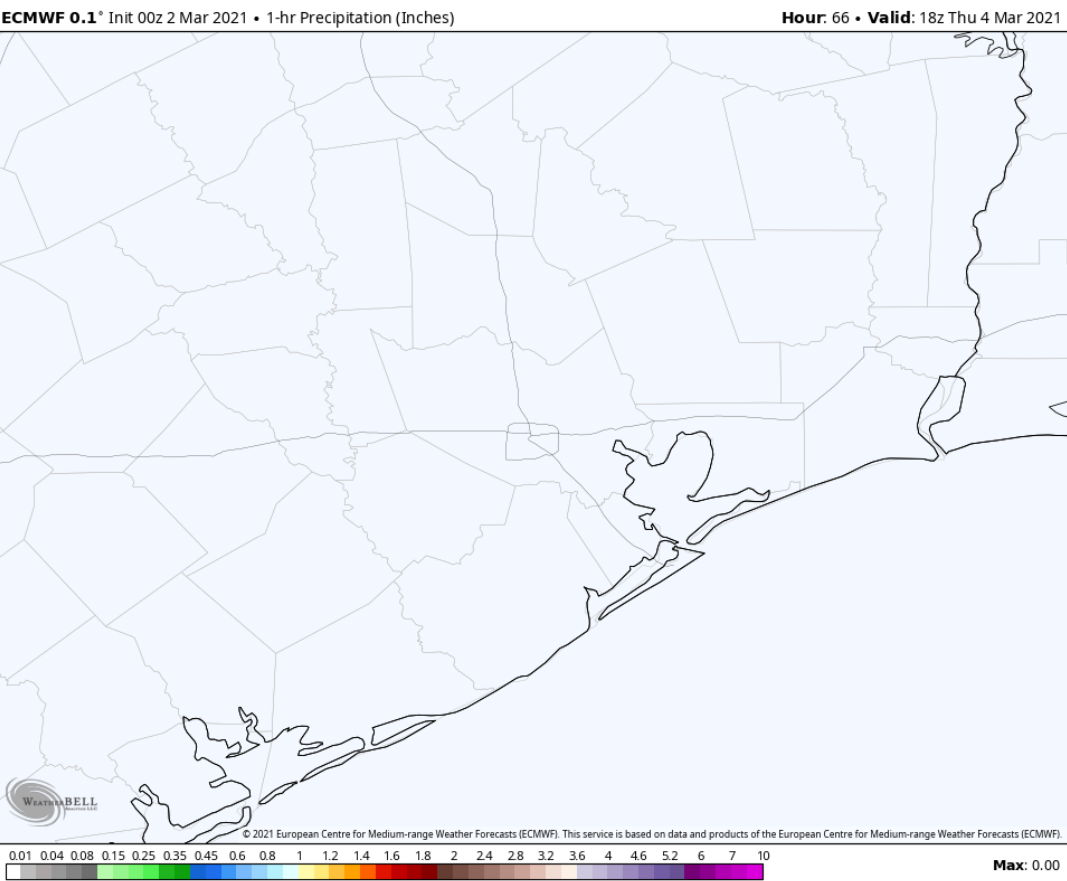
- Thursday is expected to be a dry day across the area.
- Winds will shift out of the Southeast mid to late morning here, continuing into the afternoon / evening at 5-10 MPH sustained.
- Highs temps across the area will climb even higher, into the mid to upper 60s widespread.
- *Right now data is divided on Fog risks Thursday AM. With the winds being weak, we need to be on alert for the risk after midnight into daybreak here.*

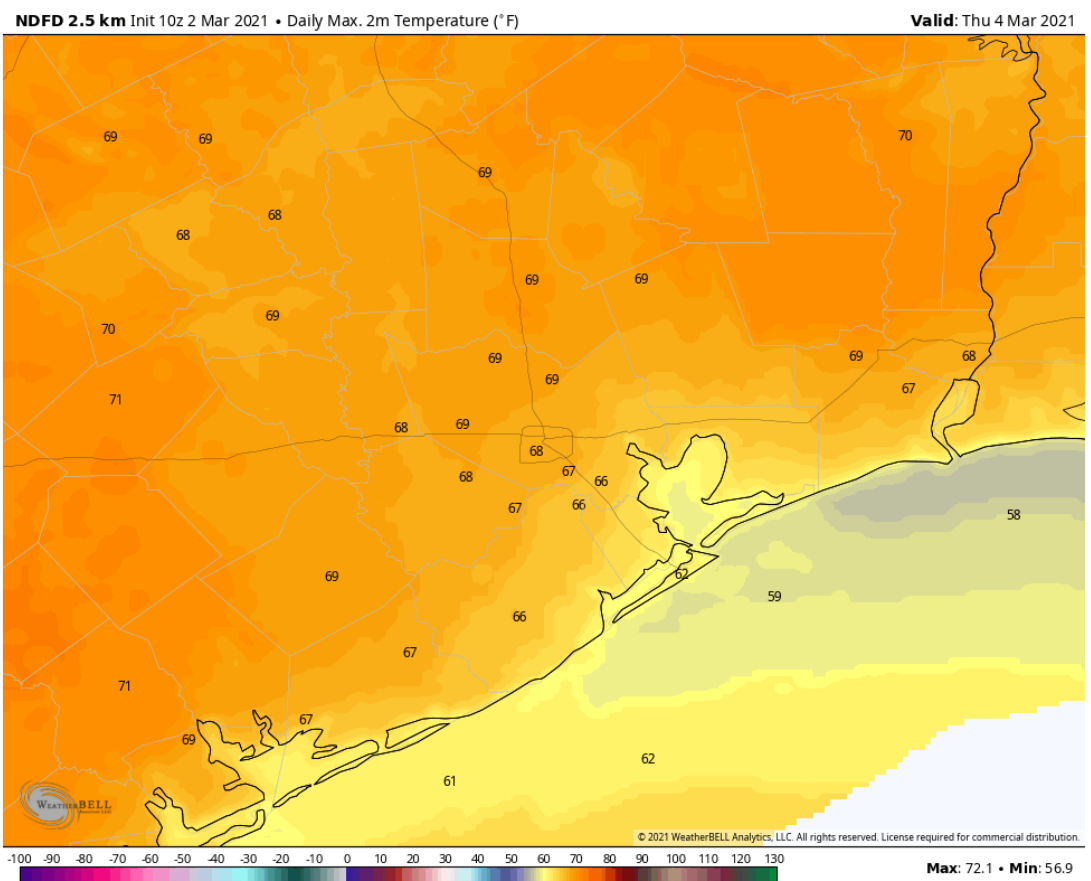
Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)

High Temperatures Thursday

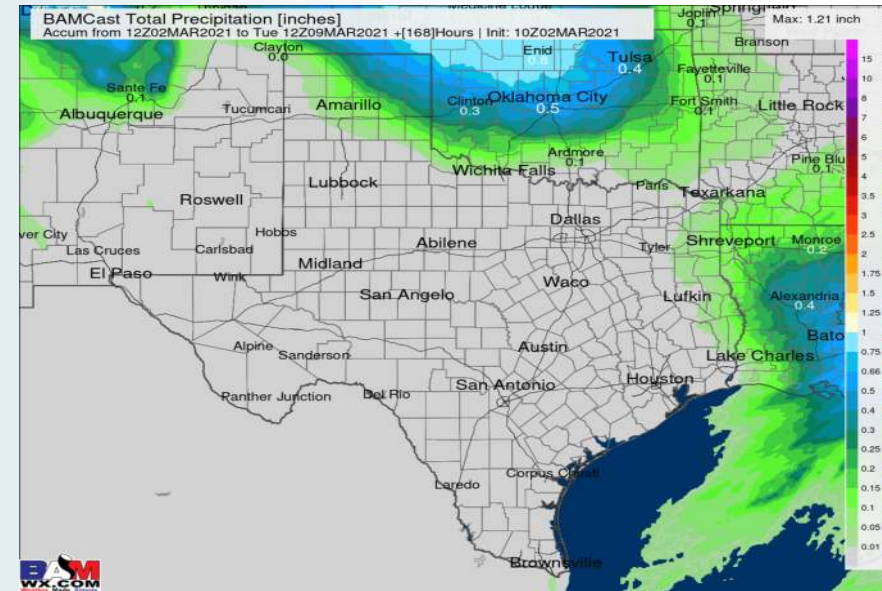
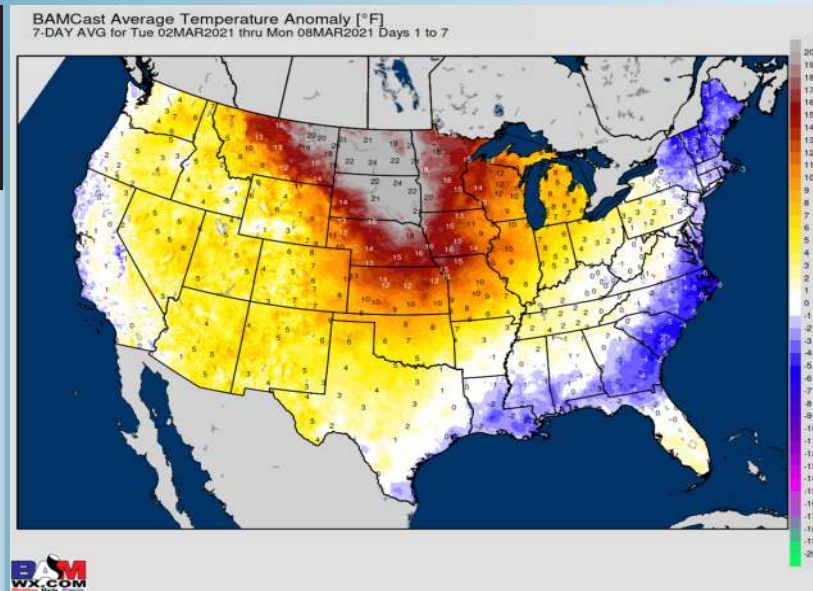


Week 1 Forecast

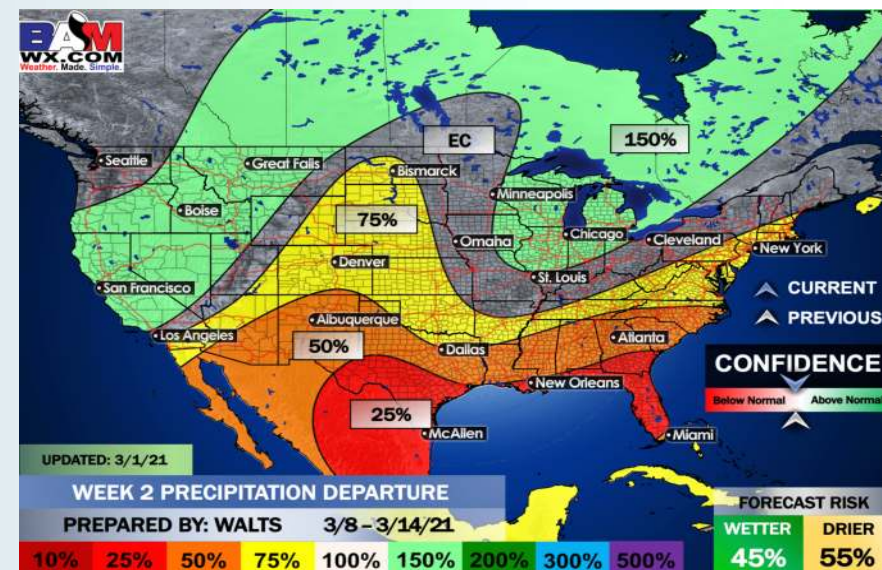
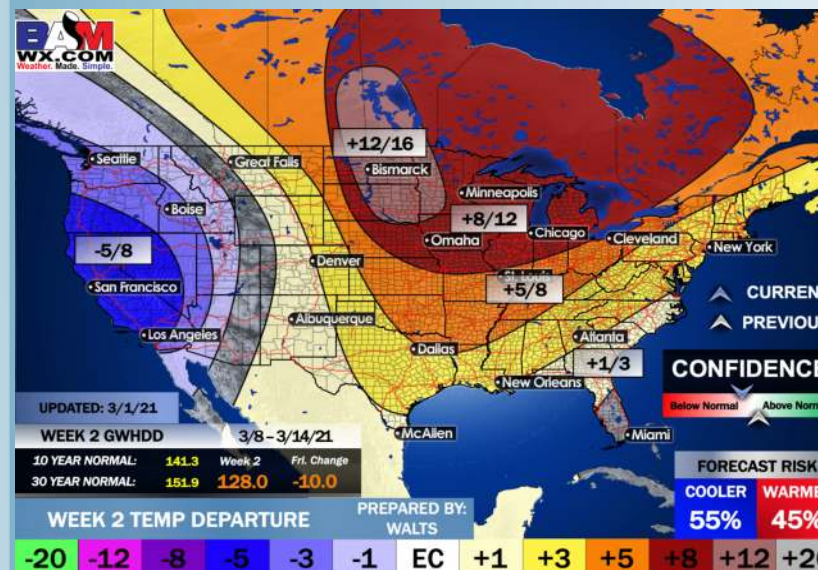
Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temps will start to turn more “average” over the next week. Expecting quieter weather moving forward with the next chance then coming on Friday.
- Early March we continue to favor slightly above normal temps with below normal precipitation for this time of year.

- Into mid-late March we are favoring above normal temps for Texas and below normal precip as the upper air pattern does not look favorable for precip.
