




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- With the precipitation moving out of the area now, we are anticipating drier weather the rest of the afternoon and evening.
- Winds will continue coming out of the NW at the boarding station. Out through about ~8-10 PM winds will be 8-13 MPH. Winds beyond this window will turn stronger, sustained 18-25 with gusts 25-35 MPH possible
- Lows tonight across the area will be in the lower to mid 50s over the water.
 - *No fog is expected*


Sustained Winds (10 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)




Low Temperatures Tomorrow Morning




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Thursday is expected to be a dry day
- Winds at the boarding station will be quite strong through our Thursday. Sustained winds the first half of the day look to be 20-25 MPH and gusts of 25-35 MPH possible. After noon, winds of 18-23 MPH and gusts 25-30 MPH possible. Winds will be slightly calmer inland.
- High Temperatures look to get into the mid to upper 60s over the Boarding Stations, near 70F towards the HOU Metro.
 - *Fog is not favored for Thursday.*


Sustained Winds (10 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)




High Temperatures Thursday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Friday is favored to be a dry day
- Winds at the boarding station will start out the day 18-23 MPH sustained, but then beyond ~8-11 AM will weaken to 13-18 MPH with gusts 18-23 MPH possible. Winds Friday gradually turn from NW to N throughout the day.
- Friday will be another day with highs in the mid 60s across much of the area
 - *Fog is not favored for Friday*


Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)





Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)

Week 1 Forecast





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Quiet weather is expected for the next several days. The next best chances for precipitation look to come on Tuesday. Temps expected to stay slightly below normal.

- The week 2 timeframe will offer up some precipitation risks across the area continuing, while keeping temps slightly below normal

- The end of March/early April will feature a more active subtropical jet with increased moisture risk. Temperatures are expected to be warmer than normal.
