




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Today is expected to be a dry day
- Winds at the boarding station will be quite strong through the day. Sustained winds the first half of the day look to be 23-28 MPH and gusts of 30-35+ MPH possible. After noon, winds of 18-23 MPH and gusts 25-30 MPH will be possible. Winds will be slightly calmer inland.
- High Temperatures look to get into the mid to upper 60s over the Boarding Stations.
 - *Fog is not favored today.*


Sustained Winds (10 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)






Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Friday is favored to be a dry day
- Winds at the boarding station will start out the day 18-23 MPH sustained, but then beyond ~8-11 AM will weaken to 13-18 MPH with gusts 18-23 MPH possible. Winds Friday gradually turn from NW to N throughout the day. Around ~7 PM, winds will have more of a NE component
- Friday will be another day with highs in the mid to upper 60s across much of the area
- *Fog is not favored for Friday*


Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)






Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Saturday is looking at another dry day**
- **Winds will continue with their Northeasterly component on Saturday, sustained 8-13 MPH with gusts 13-18 MPH**
- **Highs look to be slightly cooler on Saturday, lower 60s over the waters**
- ***No fog is expected for Saturday***


Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)

High Temperatures Saturday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Quiet weather is expected for the next several days. The next best chances for precipitation look to come on Tuesday. Temps expected to stay slightly below normal.



- The week 2 timeframe will offer up some precipitation risks across the area continuing, while keeping temps slightly below normal

- The end of March/early April will feature a more active subtropical jet with increased moisture risk. Temperatures are expected to be warmer than normal.
