




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Today will be dry
- Winds at the boarding station will start out the day 18-23 MPH sustained with gusts 23-28 MPH, but then beyond ~9 AM-12 PM winds will weaken a bit to 15-20 MPH with gusts 20-25 MPH possible. Around ~7 PM, winds will have more of a NNE component
- Highs in the mid to upper 60s across much of the area
- *Fog is not favored*


Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (5 PM CT)




High Temperatures Today




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Saturday is looking at another dry day
- Winds will turn more Northeasterly in the early AM hours of Saturday, sustained 13-18 MPH with gusts of 18-23 MPH for much of the day
- Highs look to be in the mid 60s over the waters, warmer inland
 - *No fog is expected for Saturday*


Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)




High Temperatures Saturday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- No precip in the forecast for Sunday
- Winds early Sun AM will begin turning more onshore (out of the SE) as we head through the day. Expecting a sustained wind 10-15 MPH with gusts 15-20 MPH.
- Highs should sit in in the upper 60s / lower 70s on Sunday
 - *No fog expected on Sunday.*


Sustained Winds (11 AM CT)

High Temperatures Sunday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Quiet weather is expected for the next several days. The next best chances for precipitation look to come on Tuesday. Temps expected to stay slightly below normal.



- The week 2 timeframe will offer up some precipitation risks across the area continuing, while keeping temps slightly below normal
