




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Today will be dry
- Winds today will generally be 10 – 20 MPH sustained out of the North. Localized stronger gust approaching 25 mph will be possible. As the sun sets, stations near the Buffalo Bayou likely see winds drop below 10 MPH.
- Lows tomorrow morning are anticipated to be in the lower 50's F over open waters.
- *Fog is not favored*


Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (9 PM CT)




Low temperatures into tomorrow morning




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Saturday is looking at another dry day
 - Winds in the AM slowly start to weaken into the PM hours. Afternoon winds are anticipated to be from the NE around 5 – 10 MPH with gust around 15 MPH. Winds gradually shift more east later into the evening.
- Highs in the lower-to-mid 60's F will be possible over open waters.
 - *No fog is expected for Saturday*


Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)




High Temperatures Saturday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Another dry day is anticipated on Sunday.
- Winds on Sunday morning will be shifting out of the SE and will remain so throughout the remainder of the day. Weak winds in the AM increase into the afternoon hours sustained around 8 – 13 MPH with gust around 20 MPH possible.
- Highs should sit in in the upper 60's F over open waters on Sunday.
 - *No fog expected on Sunday.*


Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)

High Temperatures Sunday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Cooler temperatures this weekend moderate on Monday with temperatures near normal. Monday – Wednesday will offer up the best shots of moisture this week with with heavier downpours/ storms possible.



- Temperatures likely average out to near normal for the week 2 timeframe with warmer weather out ahead of a system on Mar 29 – 31 and cooler temps in behind. Precipitation should run near normal as well with better moisture chances with the storm system around Mar 29 – 31.

- The end of March/ early April will feature a more active subtropical jet with increased moisture risk. Temperatures are expected to be near normal and likely fluctuate between warmer and cooler pending passages of systems.
