




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- The rest of the day should be dry.
- Winds for the rest of the daytime hours look to come sustained at 5-10 MPH with a few gusts higher. Latest guidance is picking up on the ~9P – 1AM window where some sustained winds of 13-18 may be possible as the winds shift. Winds will continue coming out of the NE until ~8-9 PM when a more ENE wind is expected.
- Lows tonight should stay in the upper 50s to lower 60s over the open waters.
- *No fog is expected today*


Sustained Winds (11 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (9 PM CT)




Lows into Sunday AM




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Another dry day is anticipated on Sunday.
- Winds for much of the day will be coming from the E at 8-13 MPH with gusts to 15 MPH. Expecting a wind shift to more SE near the sundown hours (4-6 PM). Winds will then be out of the SE for the remainder of the day and increase to 10-15 MPH.
- Highs should sit in in the upper 60's/ lower 70s F over open waters on Sunday.
 - *No fog expected on Sunday.*


Sustained Winds (6 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)




High Temperatures Sunday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- With the return of onshore flow (SE winds), a few isolated showers beginning mid-morning cannot be ruled out across the area.
- Winds across the area will continue coming out of the SE, but will increase. Into the afternoon hours of Monday, sustained winds of 13-18 MPH with gusts 18-23 MPH will be possible.
- Highs Monday should be sitting in the lower 70s
- *Fog is currently not favored for Monday.*


Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)

High Temperatures Monday





Week 1 Forecast

Long-Range Forecast Discussion



➤ Cooler temperatures this weekend moderate on Monday with temperatures near normal. Monday – Wednesday will offer up the best shots of moisture this week with with heavier downpours/ storms possible.

➤ Temperatures likely average out to near normal for the week 2 timeframe with warmer weather out ahead of a system on Mar 29 – 31 and cooler temps in behind. Precipitation should run near normal as well with better moisture chances with the storm system around Mar 29 – 31.

➤ The end of March/ early April will feature a more active subtropical jet with increased moisture risk. Temperatures are expected to be near normal and likely fluctuate between warmer and cooler pending passages of systems.
