




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- The rest of the day is anticipated to be quiet
- Winds will continue coming out of the SE today at 5-10 MPH with locally higher winds at the boarding station
- Temps will drop back into the lower 50s across the area.
- *No fog is currently anticipated the rest of the day.*


Sustained Winds (9 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (8 PM CT)




Low Temps 11 PM CT




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Thursday is expected to be a dry day across the area.
- Winds early Thursday morning will be rather calm and while variable, generally coming from the NE. Expecting winds during the afternoon hours (~12-2 PM) to shift coming out of the SE at 8-13 MPH, a few localized gusts higher possible at the boarding station into the afternoon.
- Highs temps look to climb into the upper 60s for the area.
- *We continue not to favor fog into the morning hours of Thursday. However, ****IF**** fog were to develop, it would likely be in the 5-9 AM window, it would occur North of Exxon, and come in a rather patchy nature. Trends will be monitored into the overnight.*


Sustained Winds (6 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)




High Temperatures Thursday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Lower end scattered rain chances will come back into the picture for Friday as we are watching for another weaker low pressure system to move through the area.
- Winds on the day Friday will continue coming out of the SE at 5-10 MPH. We are then watching for a wind shift late Friday night that will turn winds more offshore into Saturday.
- Highs on Friday look to be in the upper 60s once again for the stations/ warmer inland.
 - *No anticipating fog for Friday.*


Sustained Winds (11 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)








Week 1 Forecast

Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temps will start to turn more “average” over the next week. Expecting quieter weather moving forward with the next chance for precipitation then coming on Friday.
- Early-Mid March we continue to favor slightly above normal temps with about average precipitation for this time of year
- Into mid-late March we are favoring above normal temps for Texas and right around average precip for this time of year.
