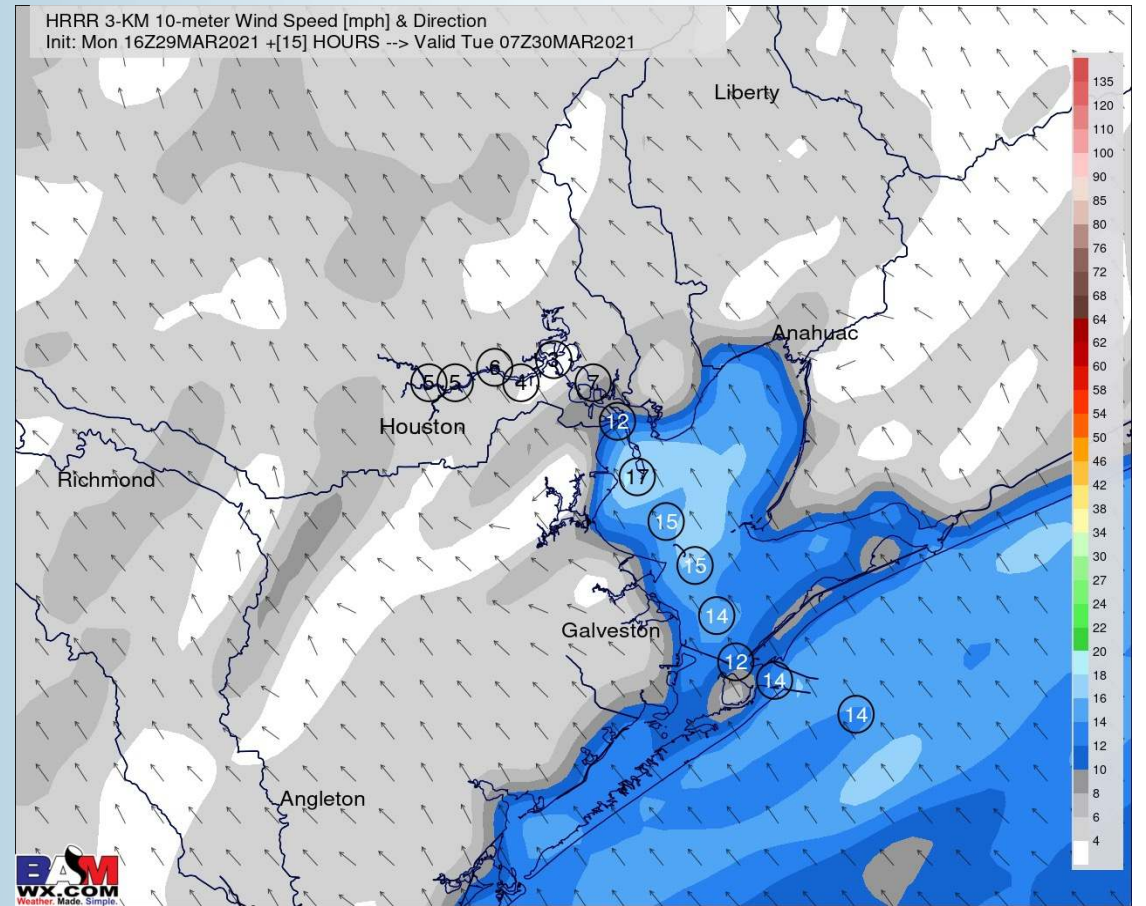

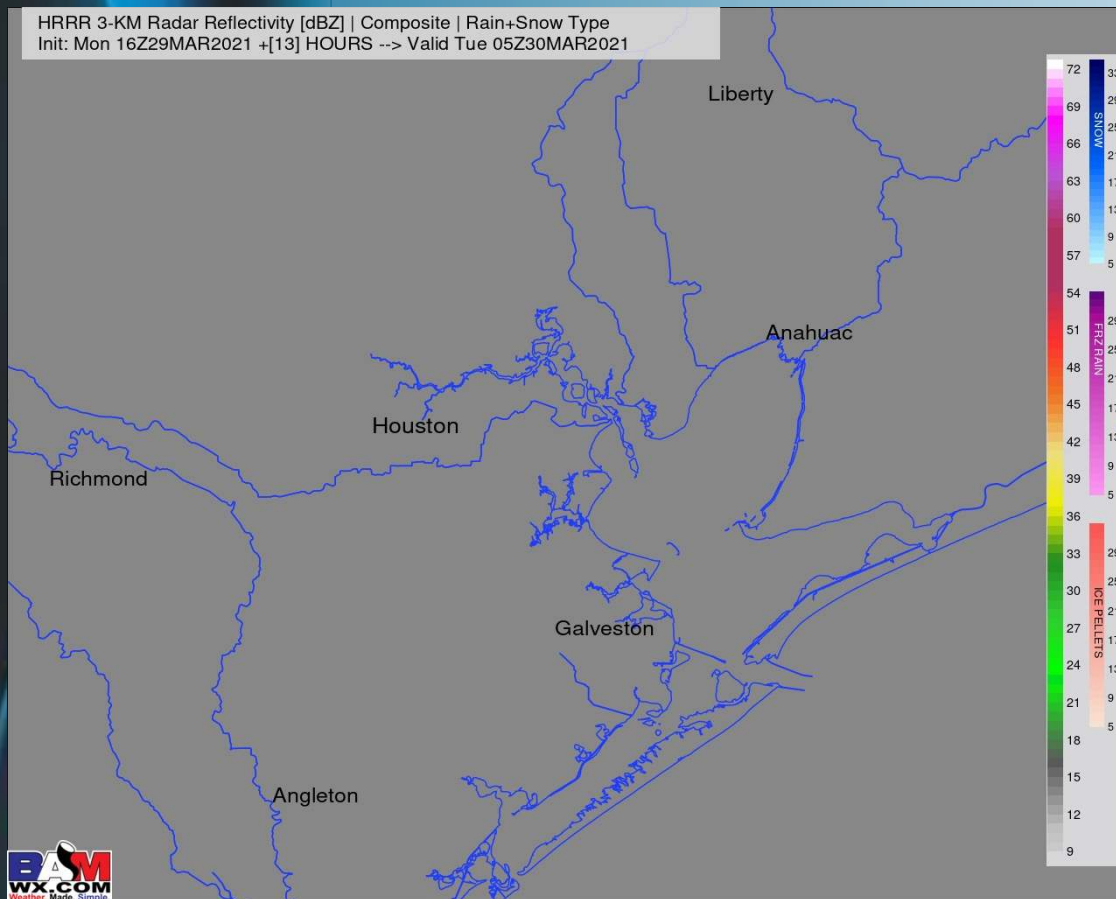
## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- An isolated shower is possible into this evening to early overnight hours, however, dry conditions are expected into the near-dawn hours across our locations.
- Winds tonight look sustained at 12-17 MPH out of the SE, with gusts possible up to 20-25 MPH.
- Low temperatures tonight look to drop down into the mid 60s across the Boarding Stations.
- *As slide 2 shows, no fog is anticipated across our stations overnight.*

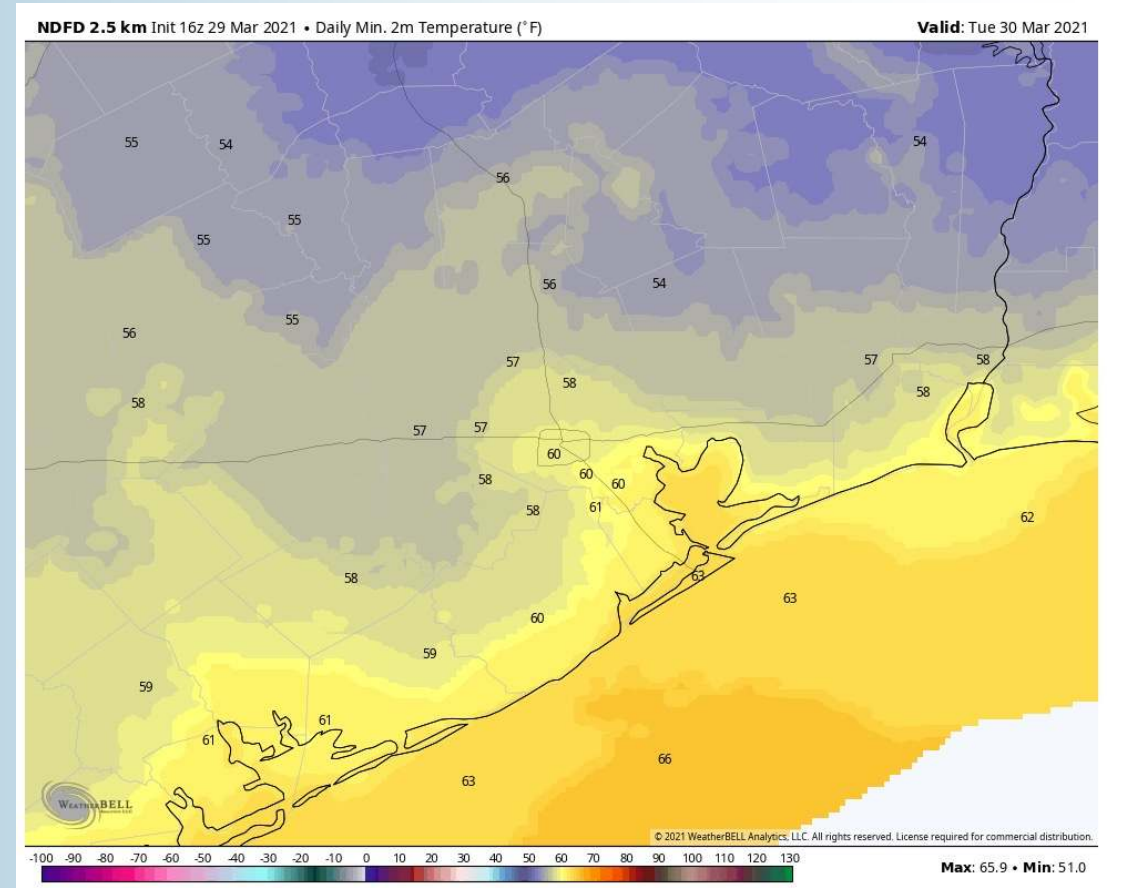
## Sustained Winds (2 AM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 AM CT)



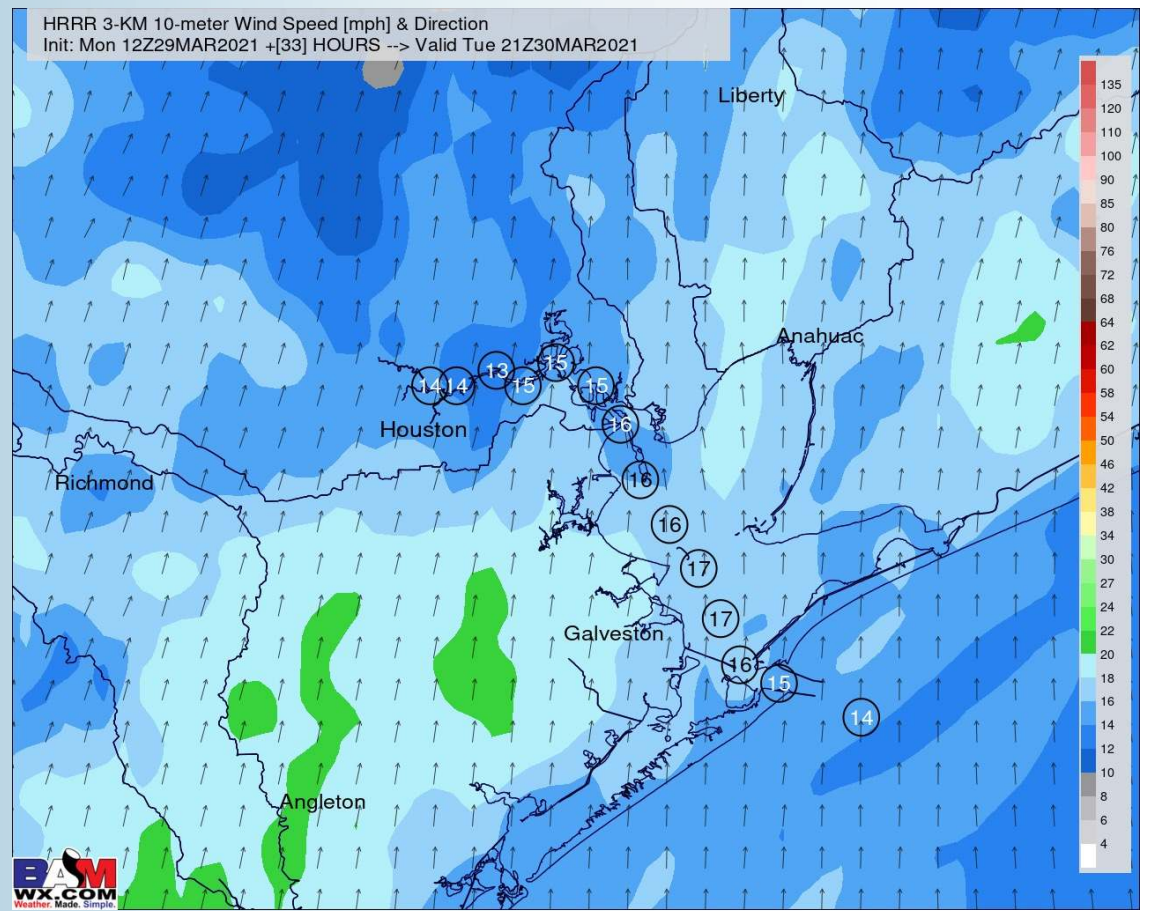

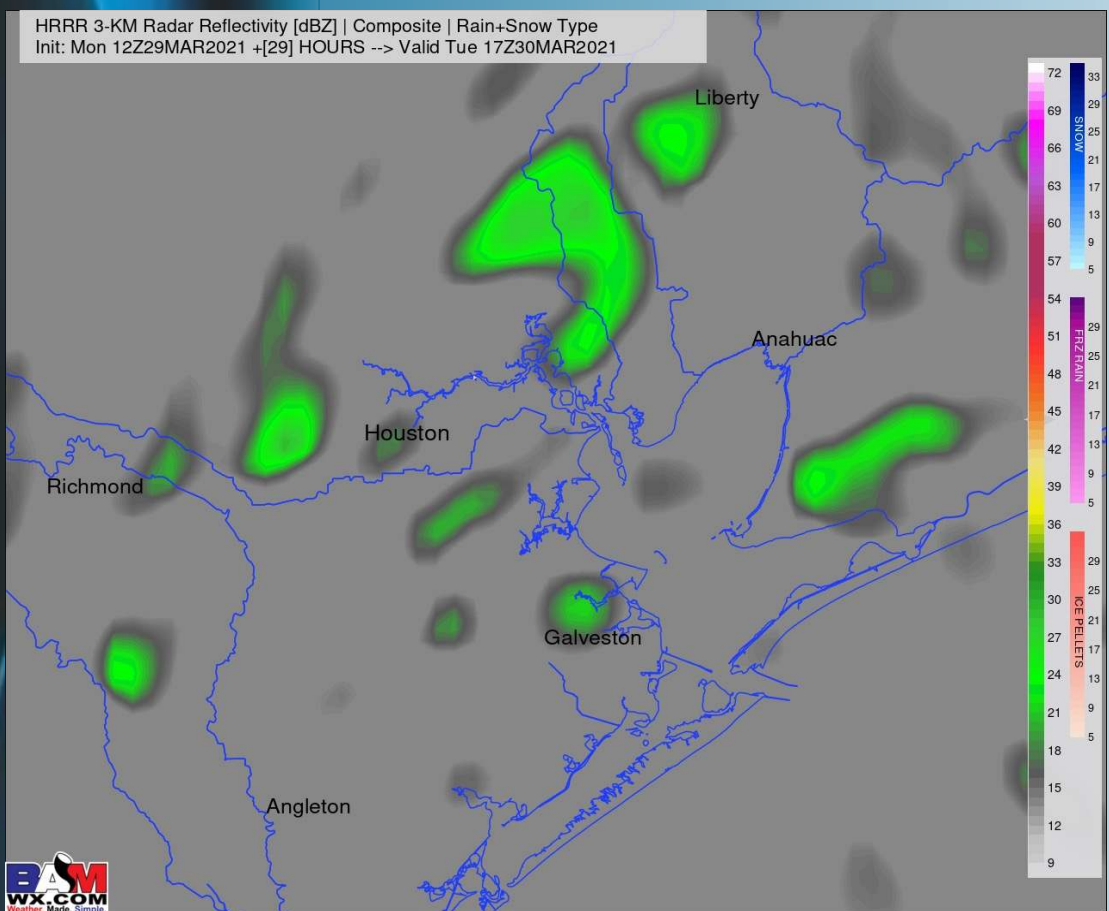
## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Spotty rain chances will be possible in the late AM hours of Tuesday into the early afternoon as a warm front moves through the Houston area...dry weather improves after 4-5pm CT.
- After the warm front passes in the AM, winds should begin to pick up into the PM. Winds look to be out of the South, sustained around 12 – 17 MPH with gusts of 20 - 25 MPH possible.
- High temperatures look to get into the mid to upper 70's F on Tuesday.
- *TUE night into WED morning may offer up a better potential for fog as winds relax WED morning out ahead of another boundary. Data is not picking up on this yet very well, but will need to be monitored.*

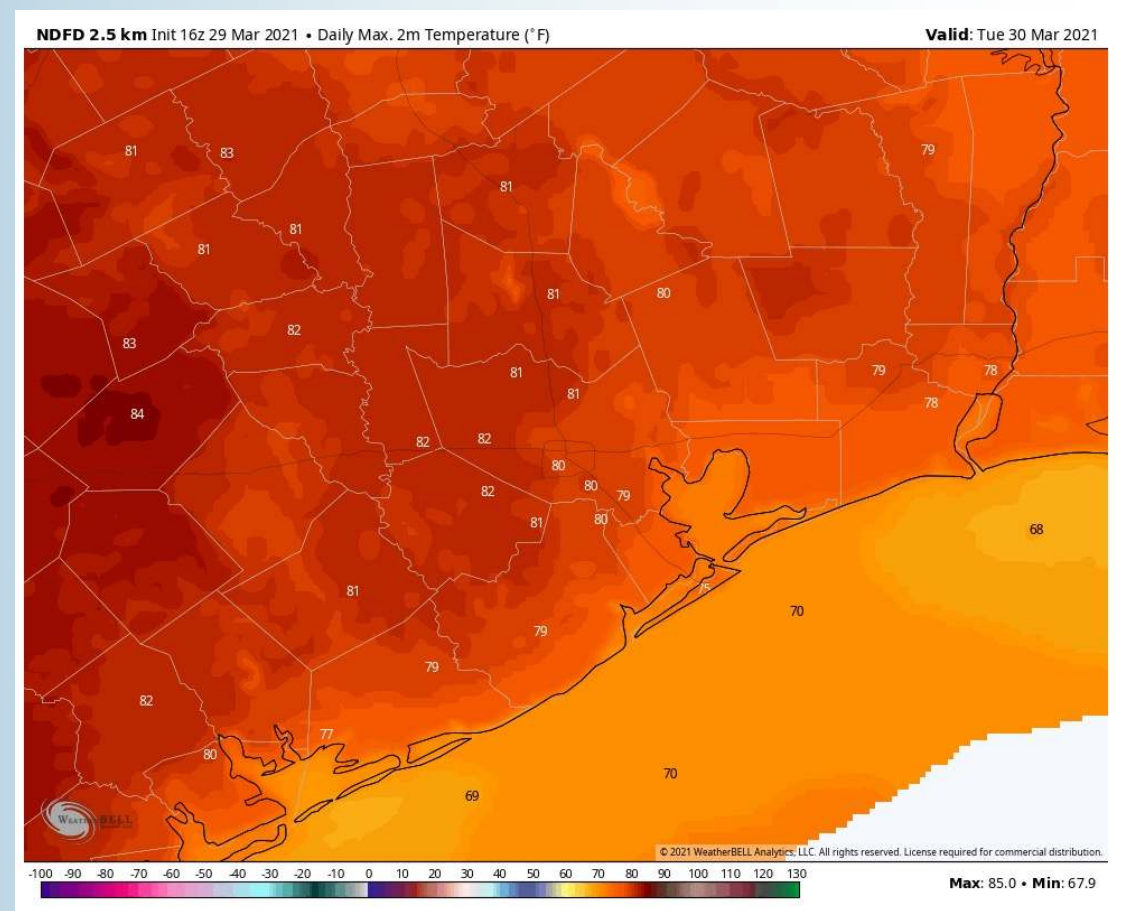
## Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 PM CT)



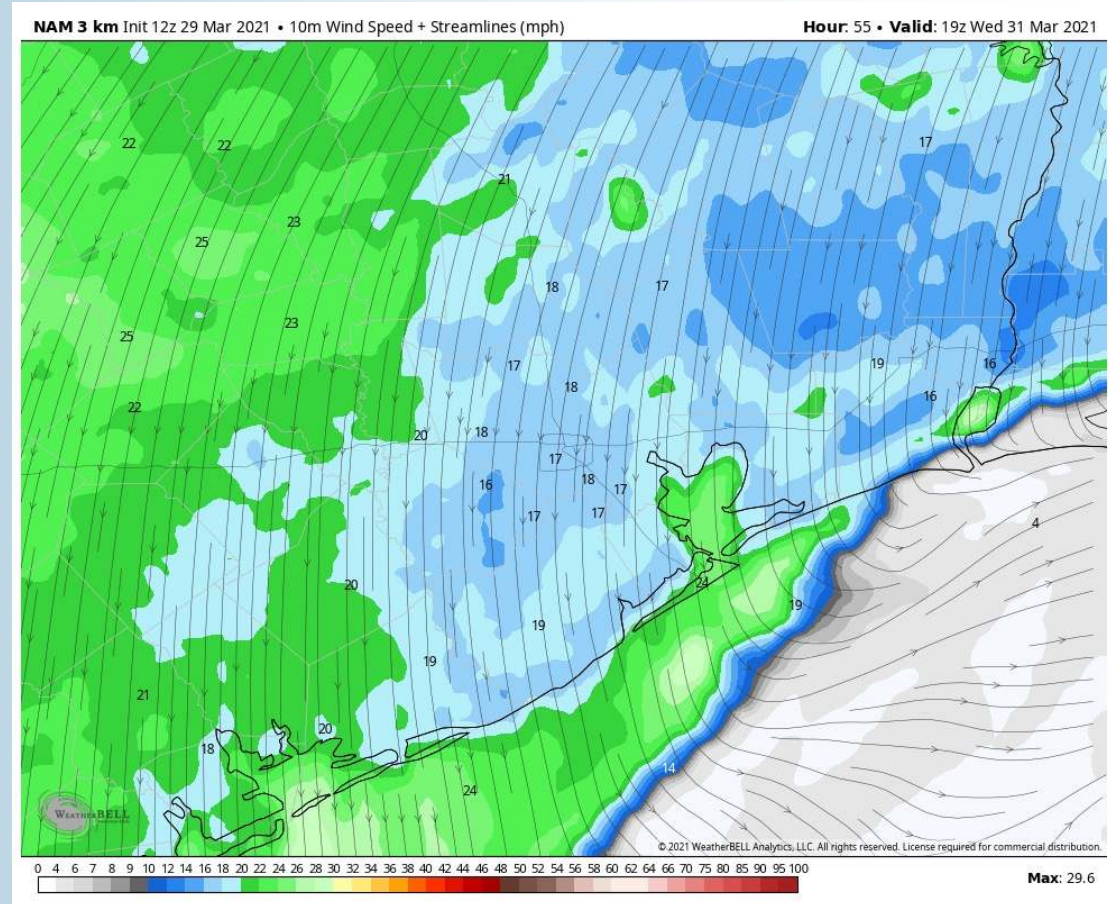
## High Temperatures Tues



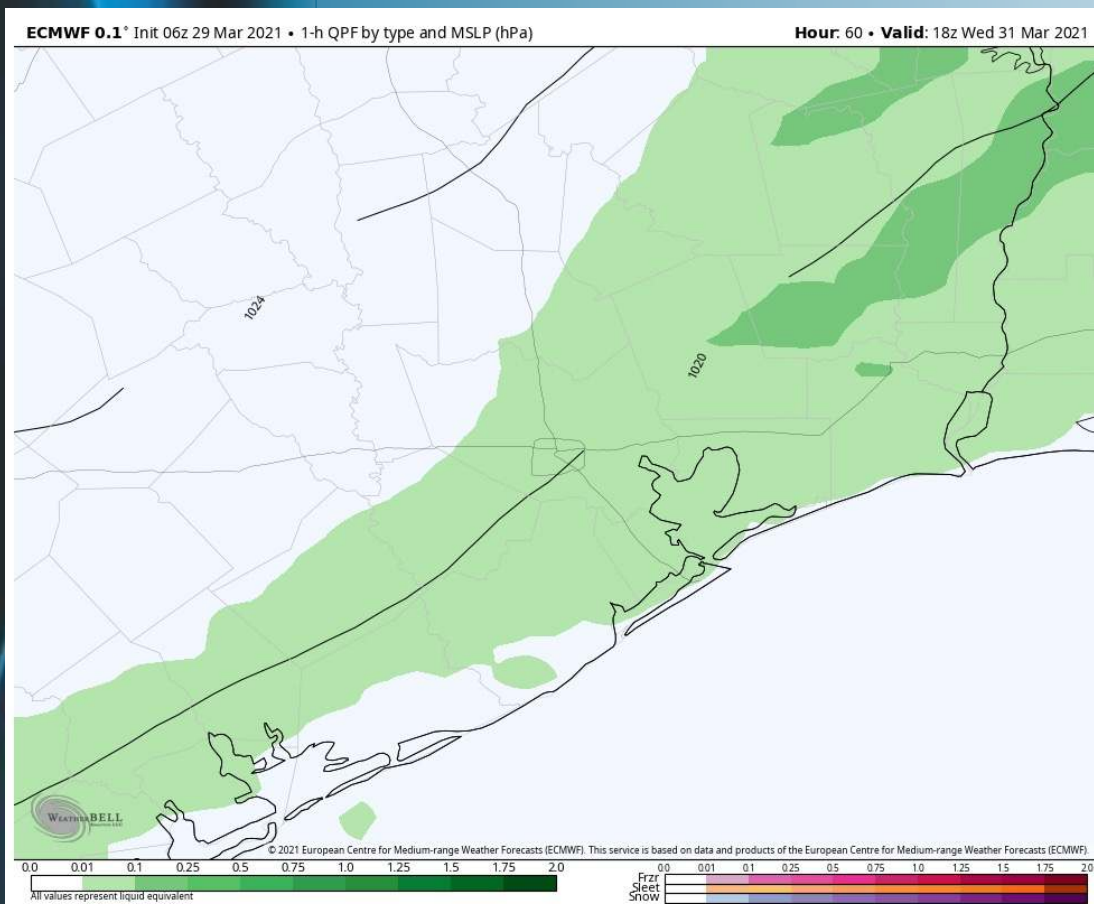
## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- A cold front is anticipated to sweep north to south on Wednesday, with a thunderstorm chance increasing from ~10am – 5pm CT as it stands right now.
- Winds stay out of the South through late morning on Wednesday around 4-8 MPH. Winds shift out of the North as a cold front sweeps through after 12/1pm CT, increasing to winds sustained ~13-18 MPH (gusts up to 25-35 MPH possible).
- High temperatures look to get near 70 F on Wednesday over open waters.
- *Not expecting fog on Wednesday night at this time.*

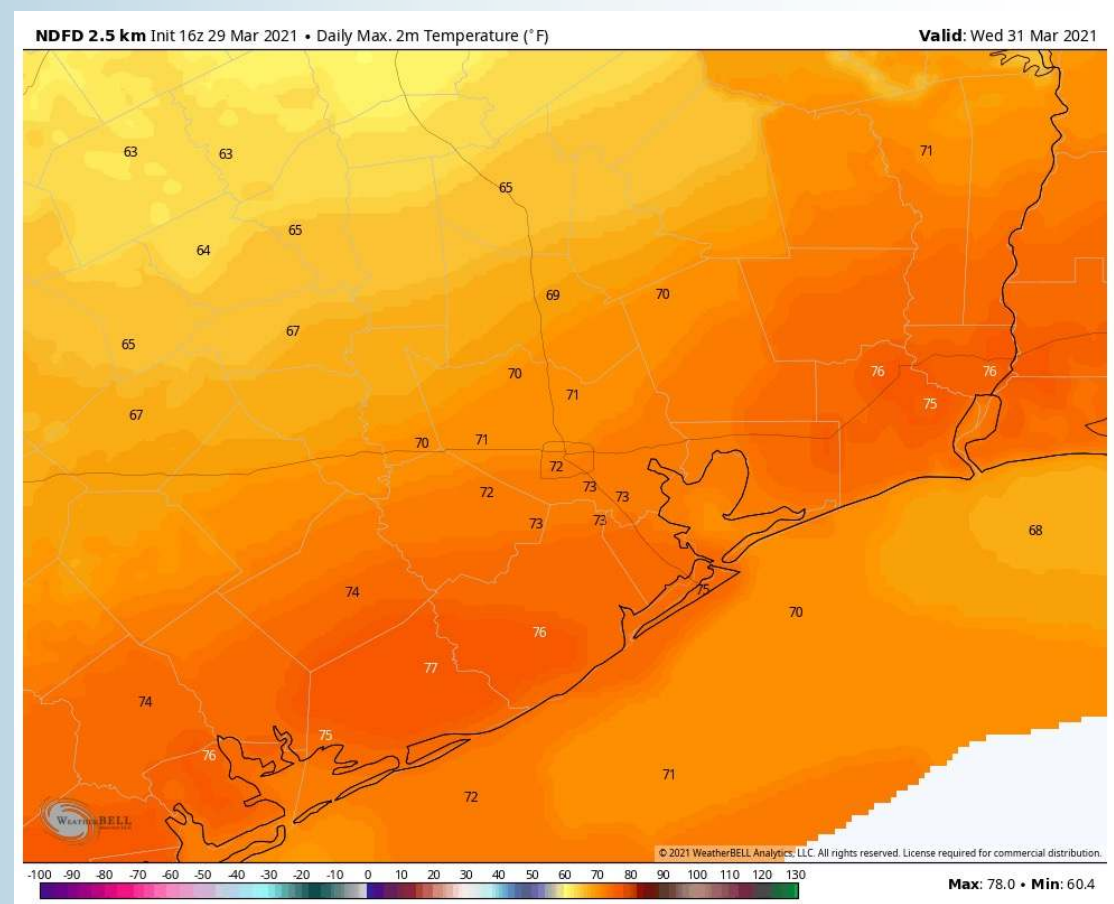
## Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)

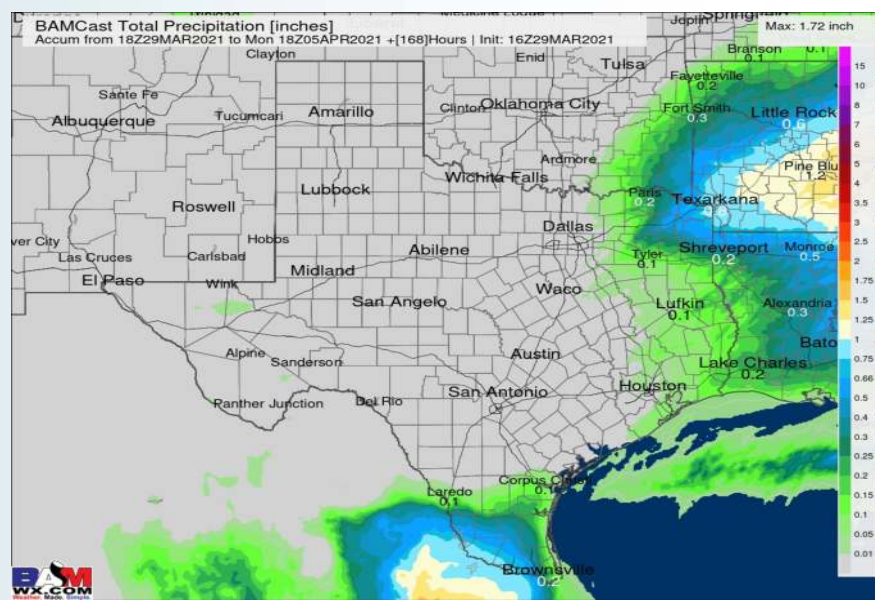
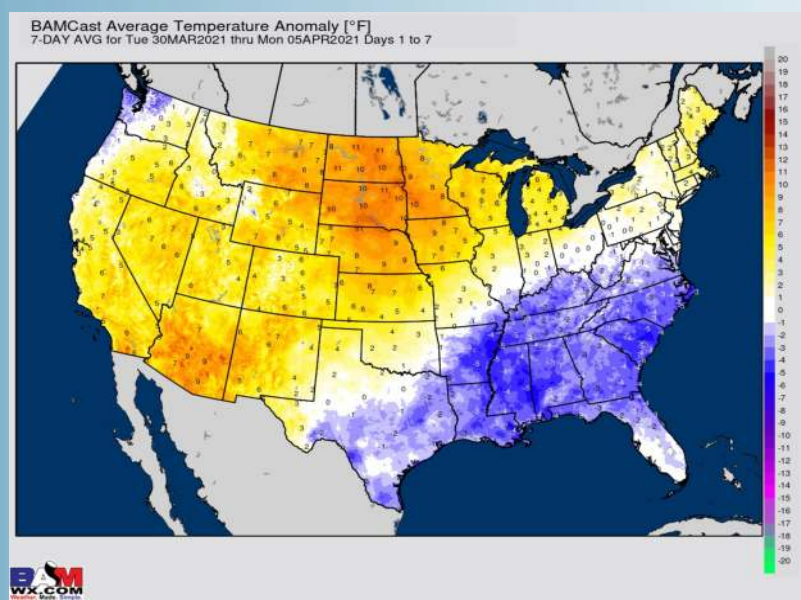


## Long-Range Forecast Discussion

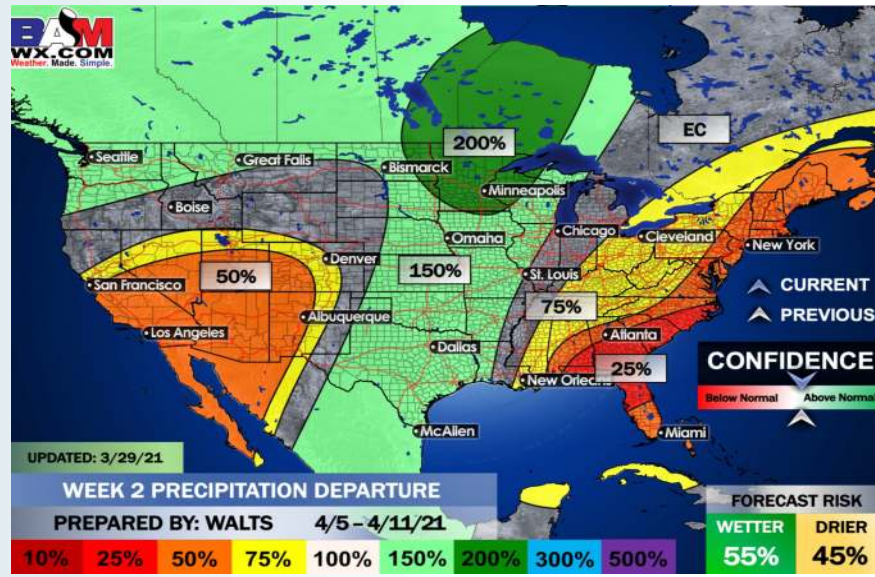
- Precipitation chances this week will be spotty at best, looking to be quite below the “normal” for this time of year. Temperatures will average out slightly below normal as a whole over the next week as well, but nothing notable.
- We are starting to eye increasing rainfall potential vs normal in the HOU area for week 2, temps are still anticipated to be slightly above normal as well.

- Expectations are for a more favorable pattern for precipitation risk for the Houston area for weeks 3 + 4. Temperatures are anticipated to average out to near normal for this time frame.
