

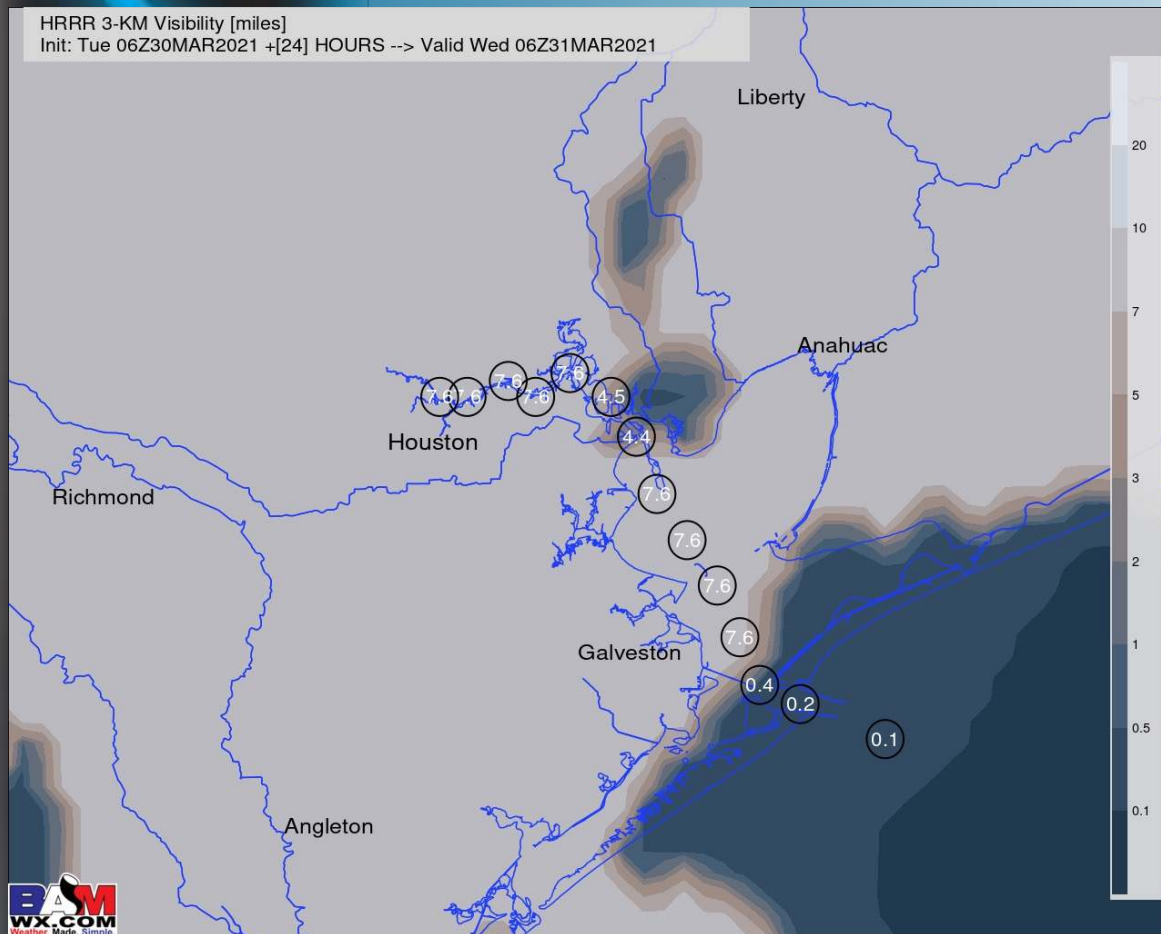

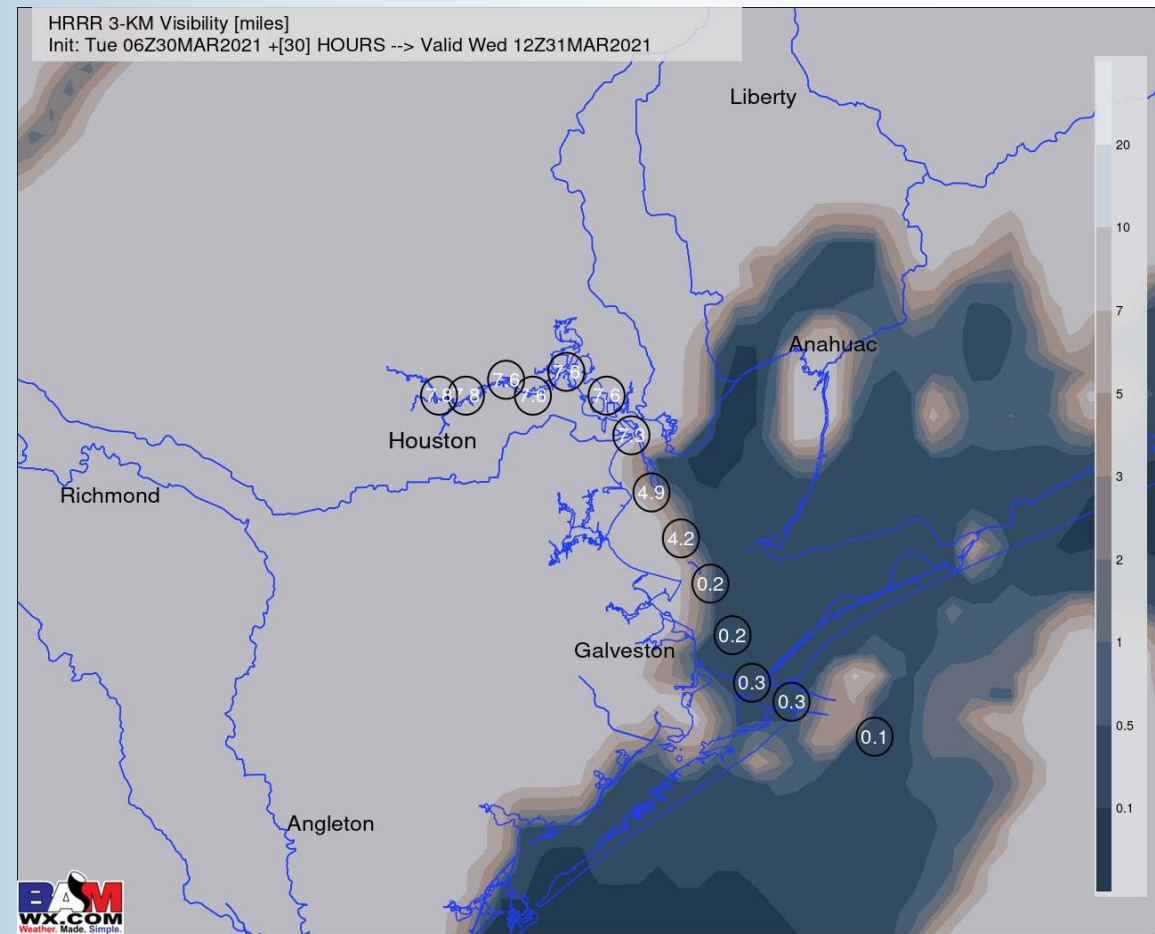
Fog Report

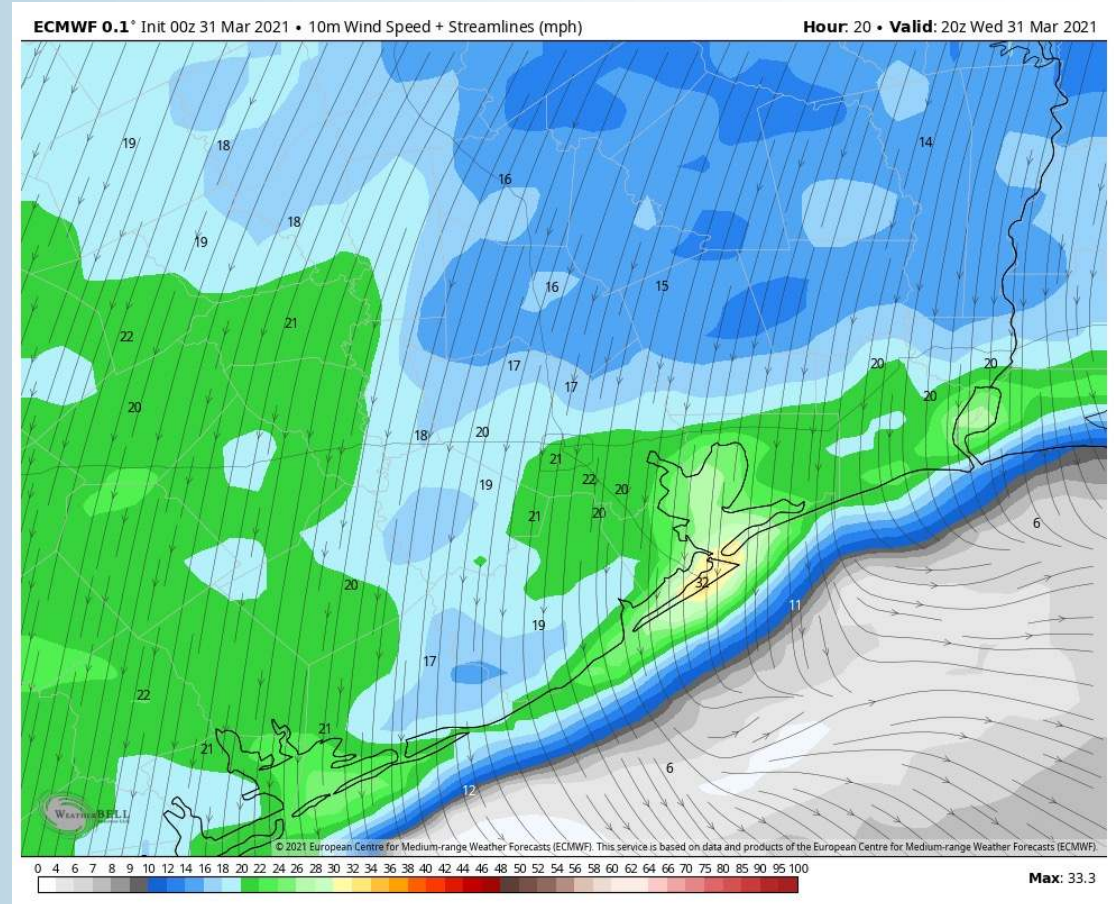

- **Mist / sea fog will likely be present along and south of Morgans Point to the Boarding Stations / Channel this morning through 10-11am CT. We anticipate after this timeframe, the threat to diminish quickly with the approaching cold front to the north.**
- **Additional fog risks are not anticipated for tonight into Thursday morning, with strong northeast winds present across the Bay.**

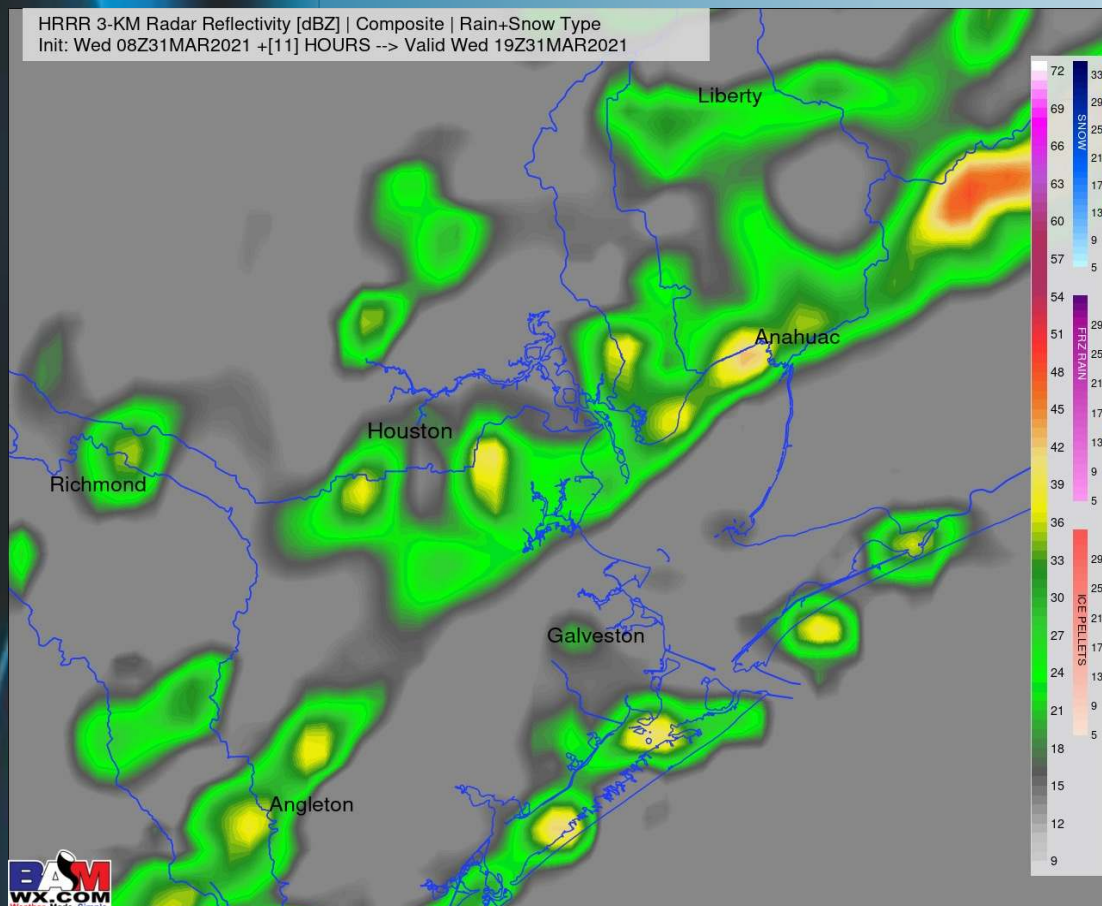
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- A cold front is anticipated to sweep north to south today, with a scattered shower / thunderstorm chance increasing from ~2pm – 7pm CT as it stands right now.
- Winds are weak out of the South through late morning today around 4-8 MPH. Winds shift out of the North as a cold front sweeps through after 12/1pm CT, increasing to winds sustained ~18-25 MPH (gusts up to 25-35 MPH, isolated higher possible).
- High temperatures look to get near 70 F today over the Boarding Stations.
- *Please reference the fog slide above for fog risks into this AM. No fog is anticipated for tonight.*

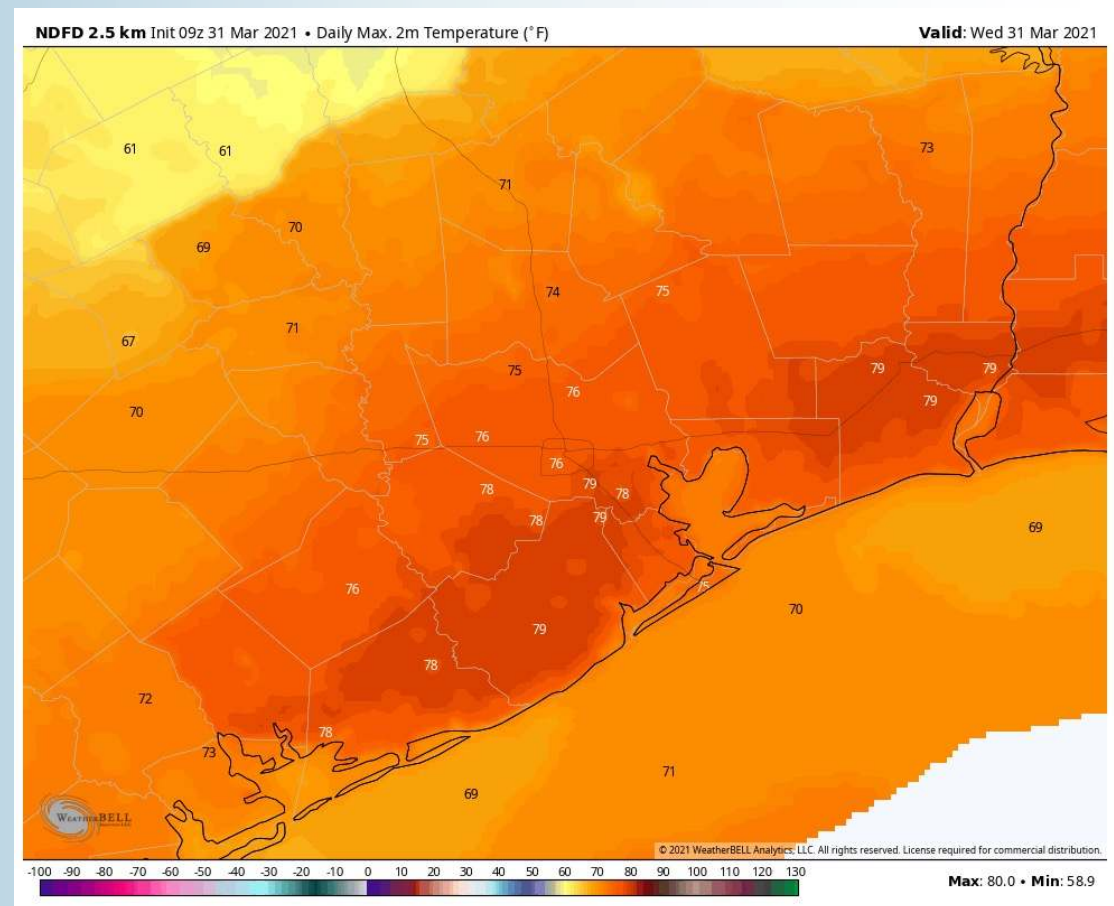
Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (1-2 PM CT)



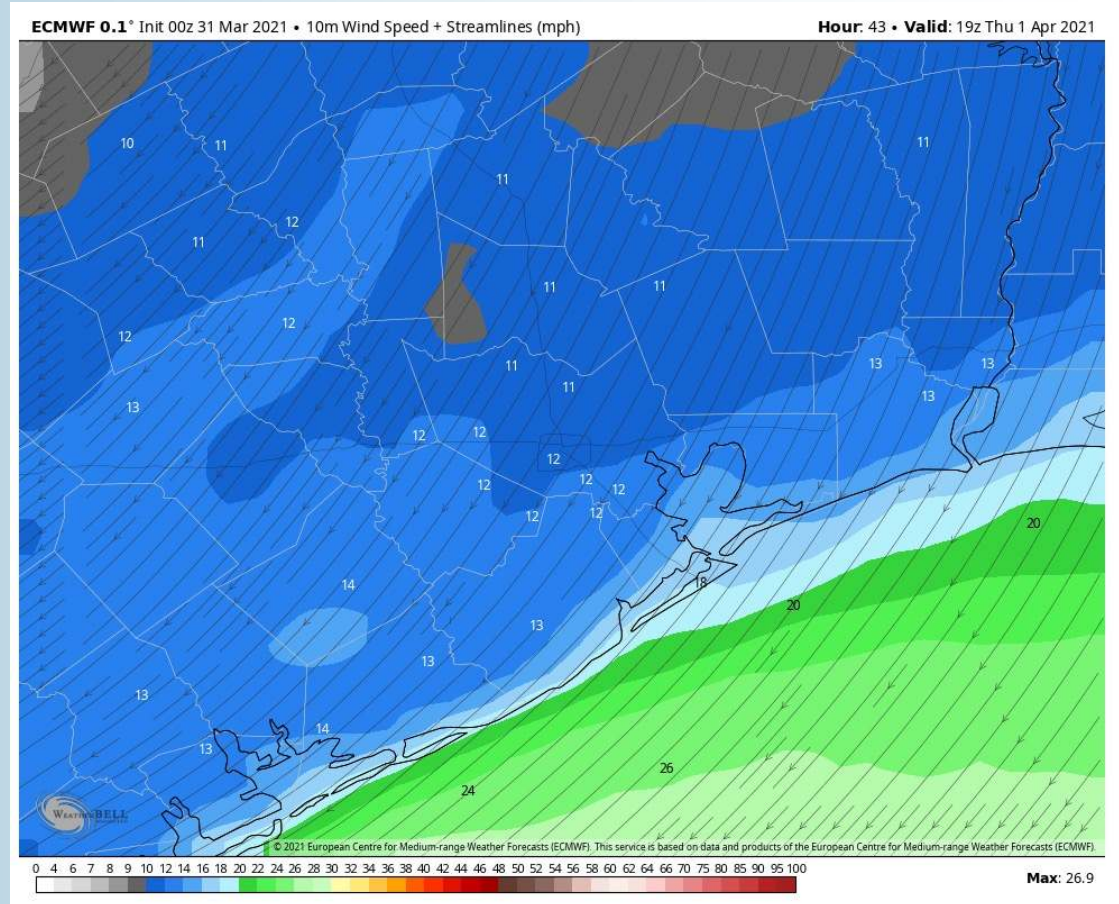
High Temperatures Today



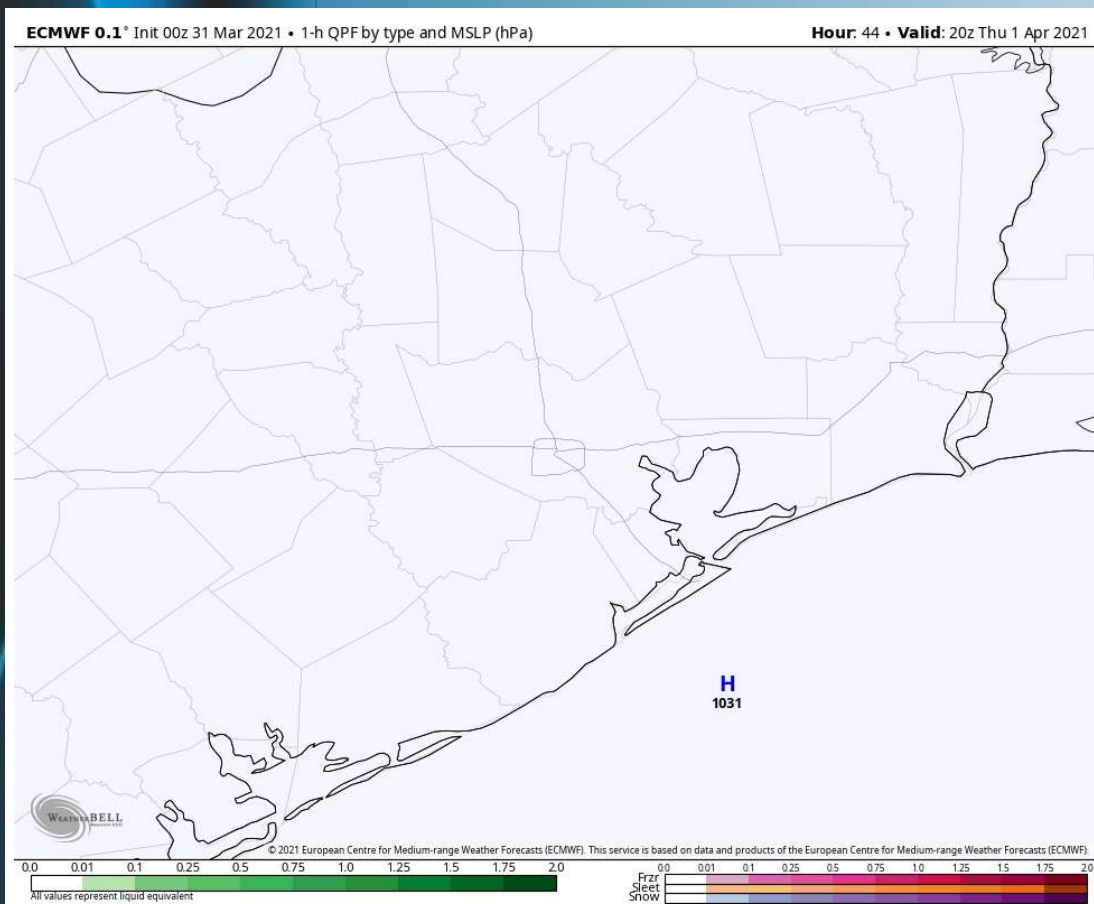
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Thursday is anticipated to be a dry day, with high pressure overhead. The forecast, overall, into the weekend looks to remain dry for the area as well.
- Winds stay out of the Northeast through the morning hours at 15-20 MPH, weakening after lunch through the evening to 10-15 MPH sustained; gusts up to 20-25 MPH will be possible at times.
- High temperatures look to dip down to the low to mid 60s F over the Boarding Stations on Thursday.
- *Not expecting fog on Thursday night at this time.*

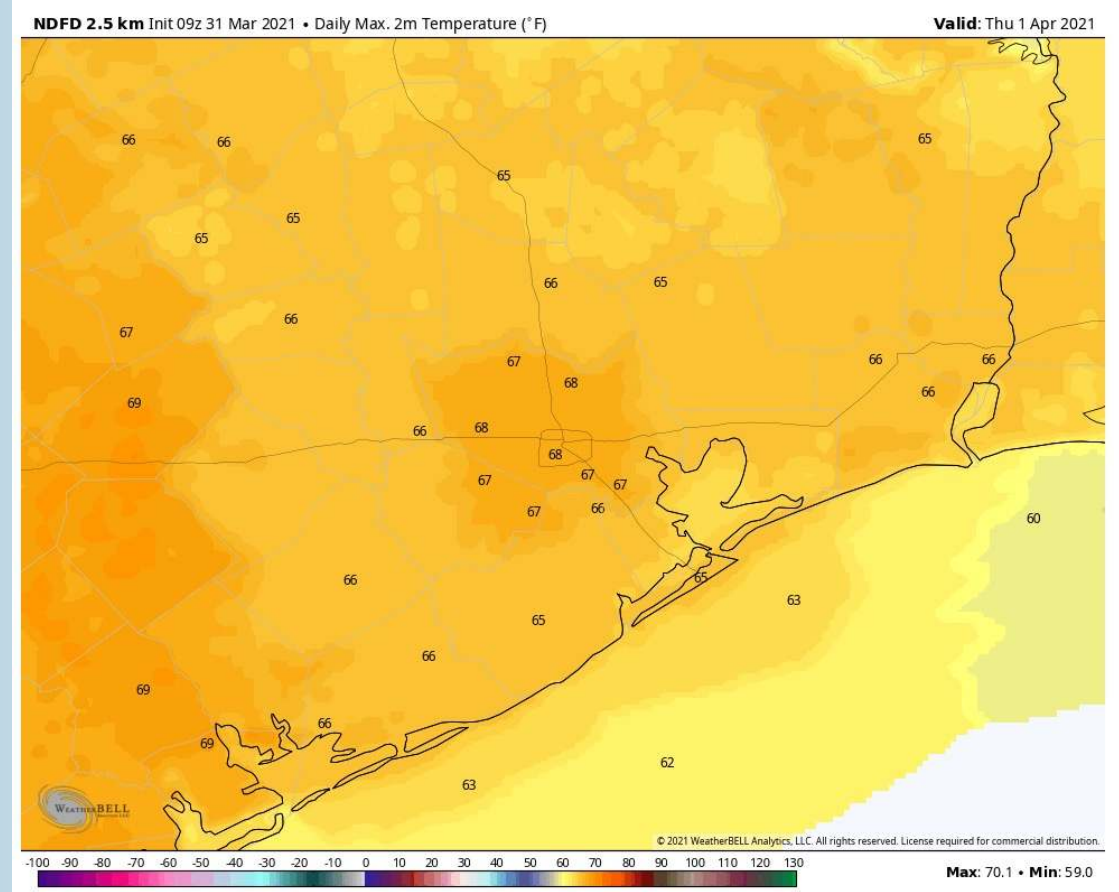
Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)



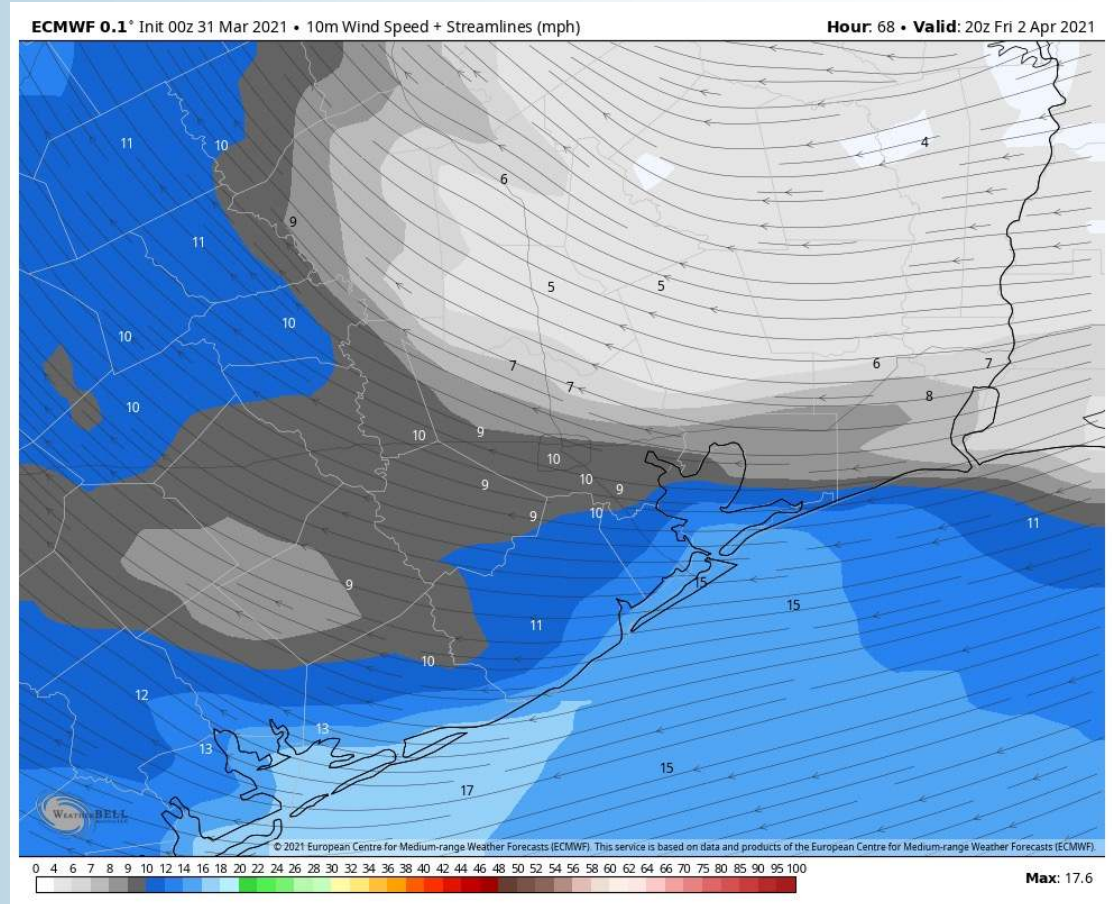
High Temperatures Thurs



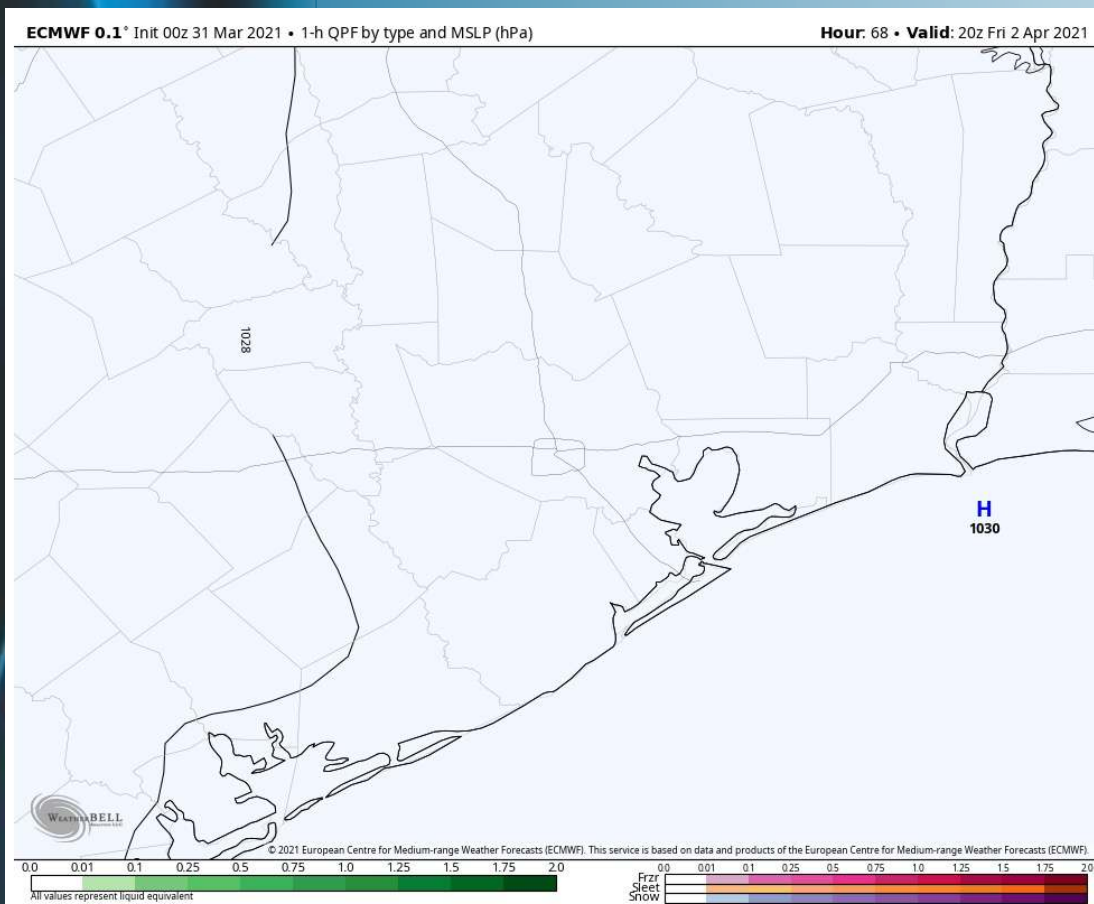
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Friday is anticipated to be a dry day, with high pressure overhead. The forecast, overall, into the weekend looks to remain dry for the area as well.
- Winds shift from out of the ENE in the morning to the ESE into the PM hours on Friday at 13-18 MPH sustained, gusting at times up to 20-25 MPH.
- High temperatures look to dip down to the low 60s F over the Boarding Stations on Friday.
- *Not expecting fog on Friday night at this time.*

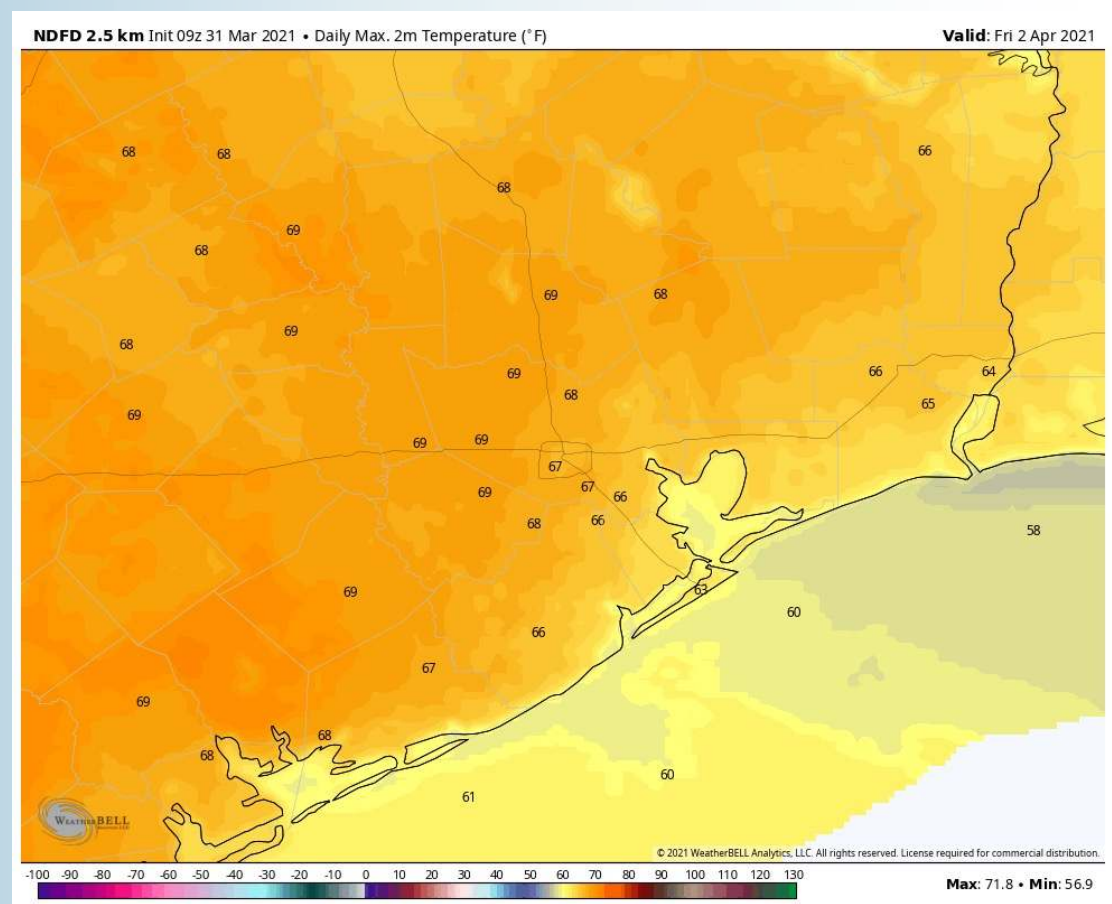
Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)



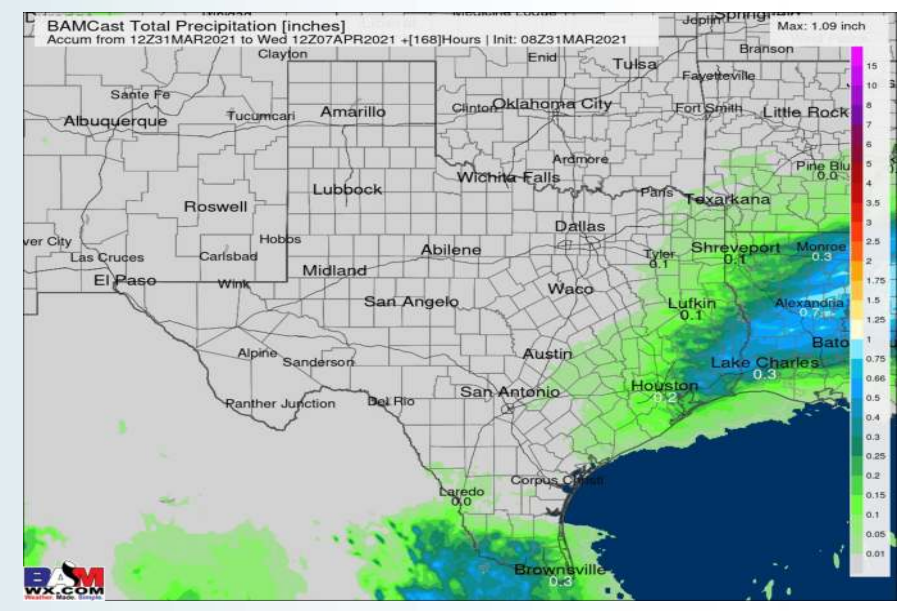
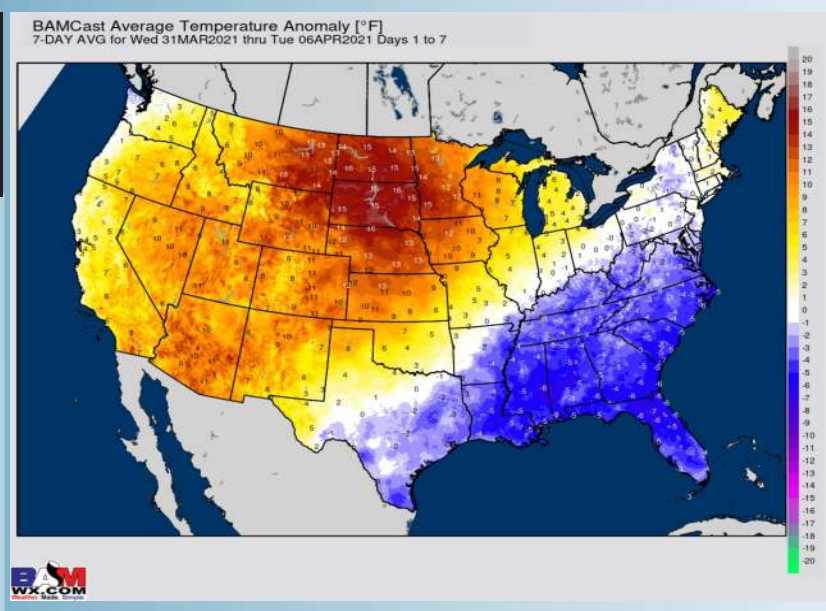

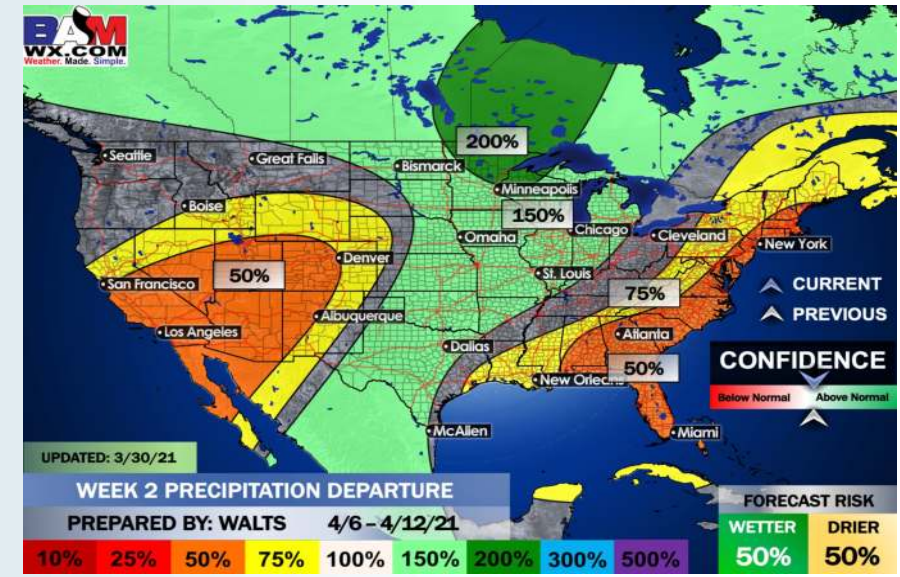
Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Precipitation chances will be spotty at best in the short-term, turning rather dry late week into the weekend. Temperatures will average out slightly below normal as a whole over the next week as well, but nothing notable.
- We are continue to eye increasing rainfall potential vs normal in the HOU area for week 2, temps are still anticipated to be slightly above normal as well.
- Expectations are for a below normal pattern for precipitation risk for the Houston area for weeks 3 + 4. Temperatures are anticipated to average out to near normal for this time frame.
