


## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Aside from an extremely isolated sprinkle this morning (~10%), today is expected to be a dry day across the area.
- Winds this morning will be rather calm and while variable, generally coming from the NE. Expecting winds during the afternoon hours (~1-3 PM) to shift coming out of the SE at 8-13 MPH, a few localized gusts higher possible at the boarding station into the afternoon.
- Highs temps look to climb into the upper 60s over the area
- *Continuing to monitor from now out through the 9 AM window for \*patchy\* fog potential for locations primarily North of 63/64. Beyond 9 AM, chances will diminish and reduced visibility will not be a concern for the rest of the day today.*


## Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (5 PM CT)






## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Continuing to favor scattered rain chances on Friday. While an isolated light shower cannot be ruled out in the morning hours, the overall best chances for precipitation is going to come in the Noon to 6 PM window. Precip is expected to stay lighter and we are not expecting severe weather with this round of precip.
- Winds on the day Friday will continue coming out of the SE at 5-10 MPH. We are then watching for a wind shift late Friday night (~8-11 PM) that will turn winds more offshore into Saturday.
- Highs on Friday look to be in the upper 60s once again for the stations, warmer inland.
  - *No anticipating fog for Friday.*


## Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)






## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- After precip moves out of the area Friday evening, Saturday is anticipated to be quiet.
- With the passing of the low, winds will be coming out of the N / NE. Winds through morning hours look to be sustained 15-20 MPH with gusts 20-25 MPH. Into the afternoon, winds calm to 8-13 MPH with gusts locally higher.
- Saturday's highs looks to sit a bit cooler, likely in the lower 60s
- *No fog is currently anticipated for Saturday given the offshore flow.*


## Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (9 AM CT)








## Week 1 Forecast

### Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temps will start to turn more “average” over the next week. Expecting quieter weather moving forward with the next chance for precipitation coming tomorrow (FRI), and then a return to quieter weather.
- Early-Mid March we continue to favor slightly above normal temps with about average precipitation for this time of year
- Into mid-late March we are favoring above normal temps for Texas and right around average precip for this time of year.
