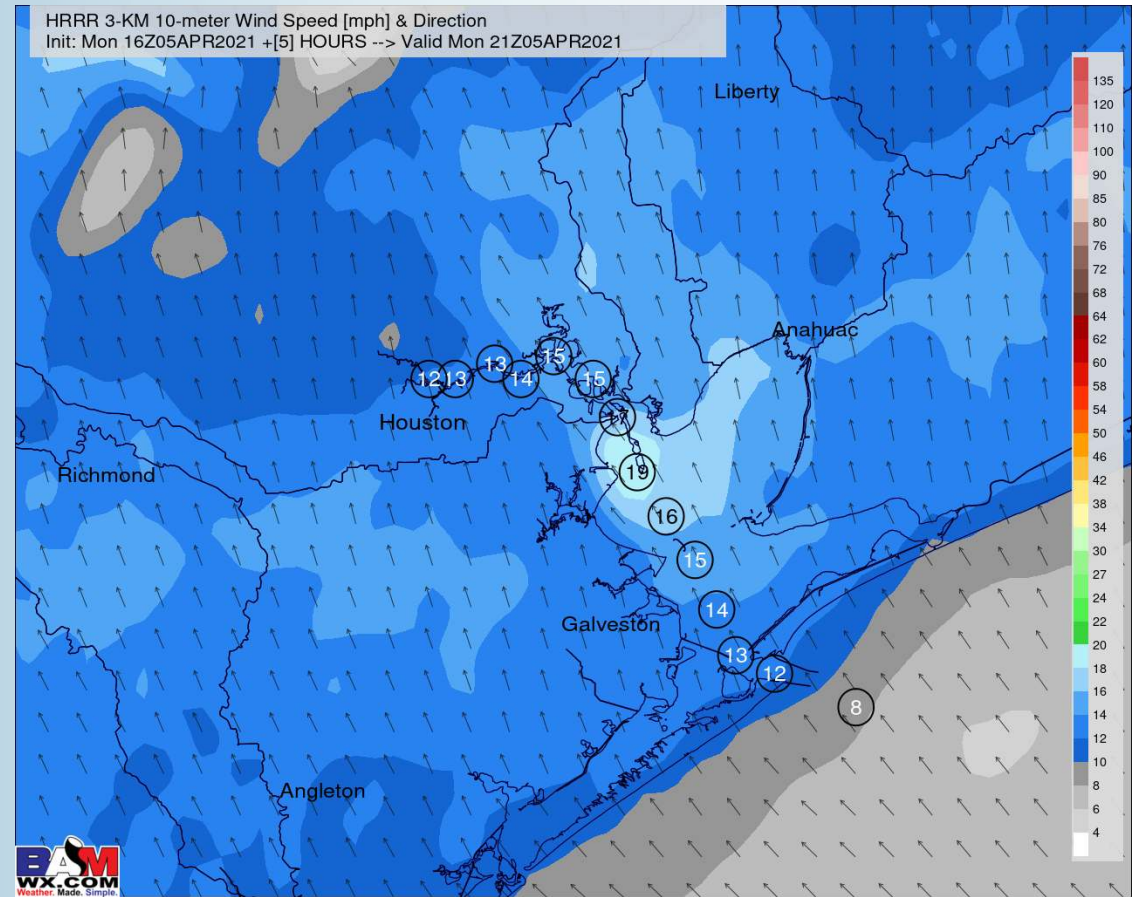
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Short-Term Forecast Discussion

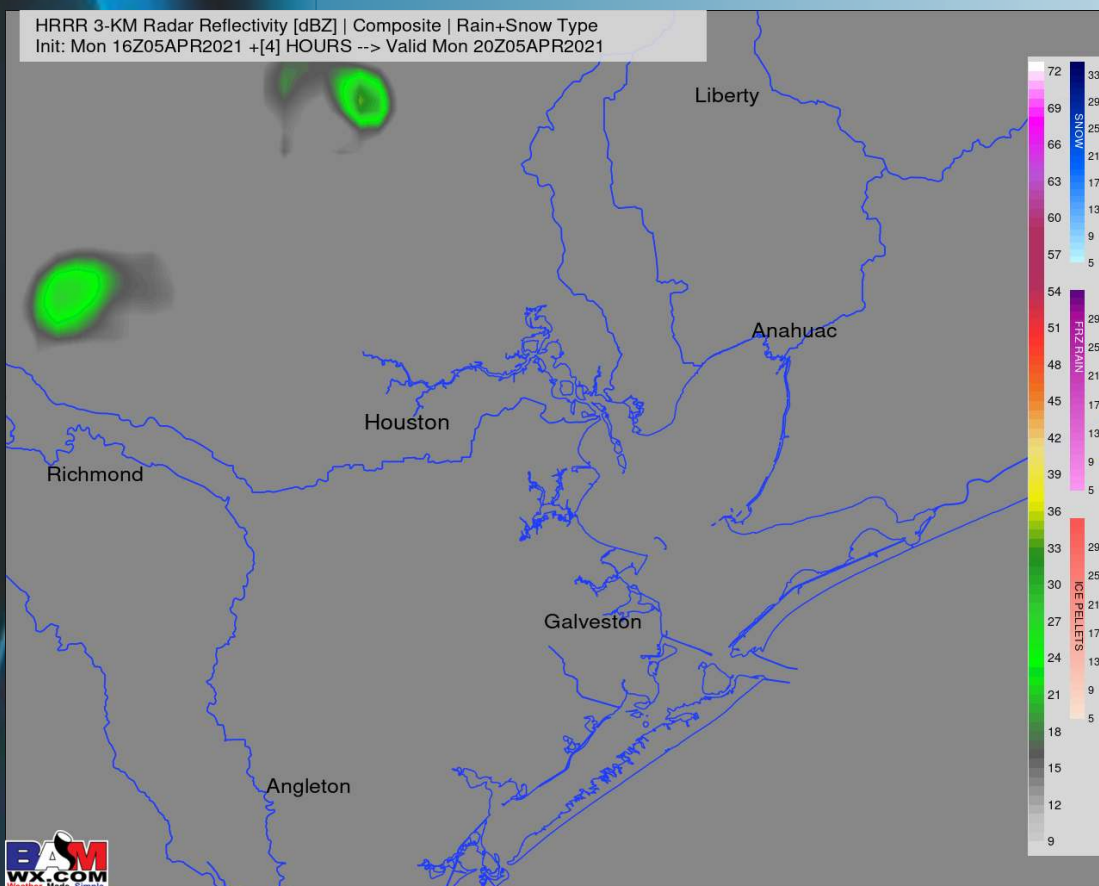
- Overall we anticipate the day to be dry with an isolated passing shower mainly to the north and west of the area based on where a few showers have developed mid-days.
- Wind should remain out of the SE at 10 – 15 MPH with gusts 15-20 MPH possible for the rest of this afternoon and evening. Winds at 10-15 MPH may linger into the overnight over water (Morgan's Point and areas south).
- Low temperatures should linger in the mid-60s over land and upper-60s over water.
- *Fog is not favored for tonight into Tuesday AM.*

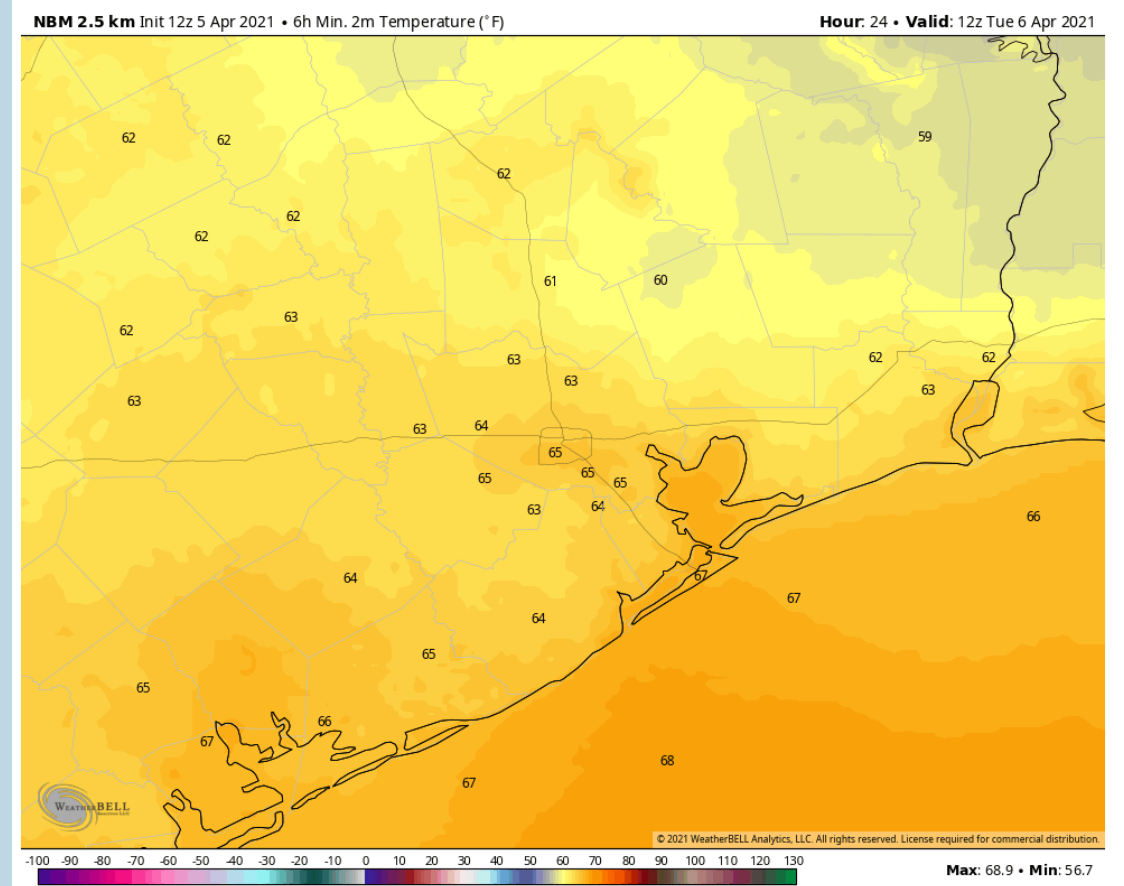
Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)



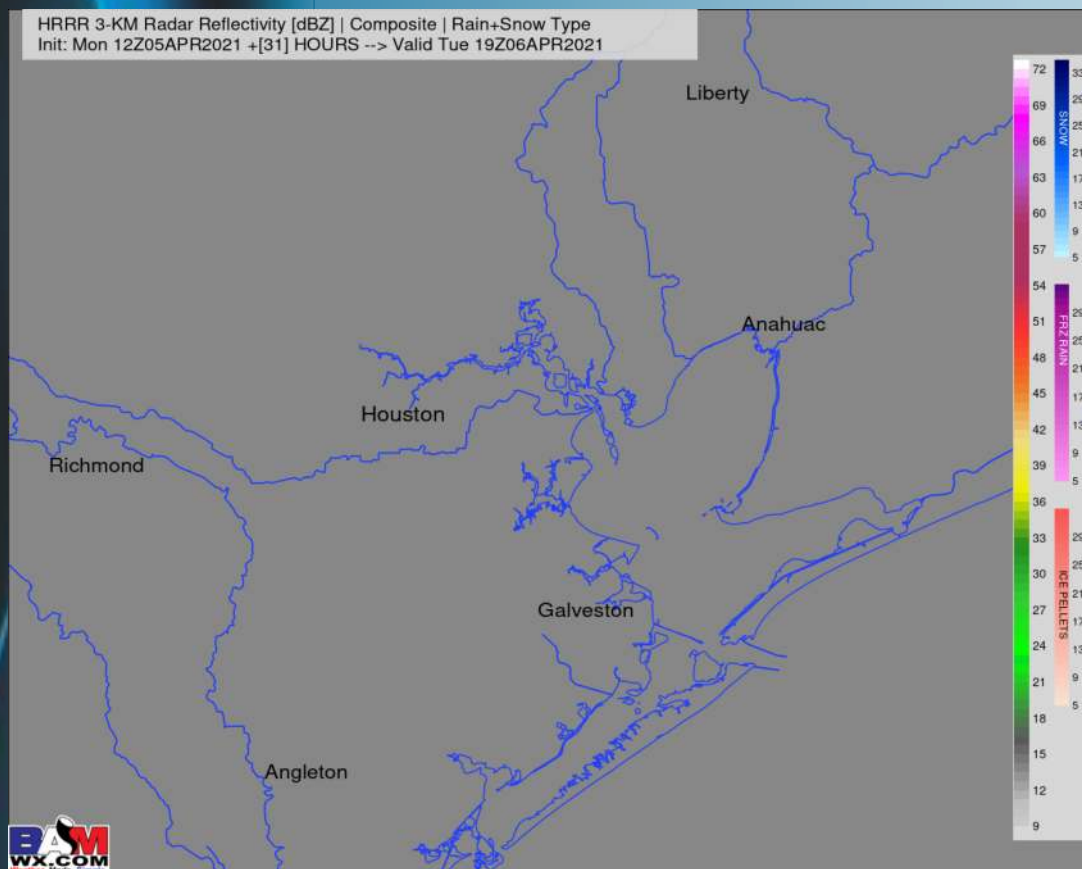
Low Temperatures Tonight



Short-Term Forecast Discussion

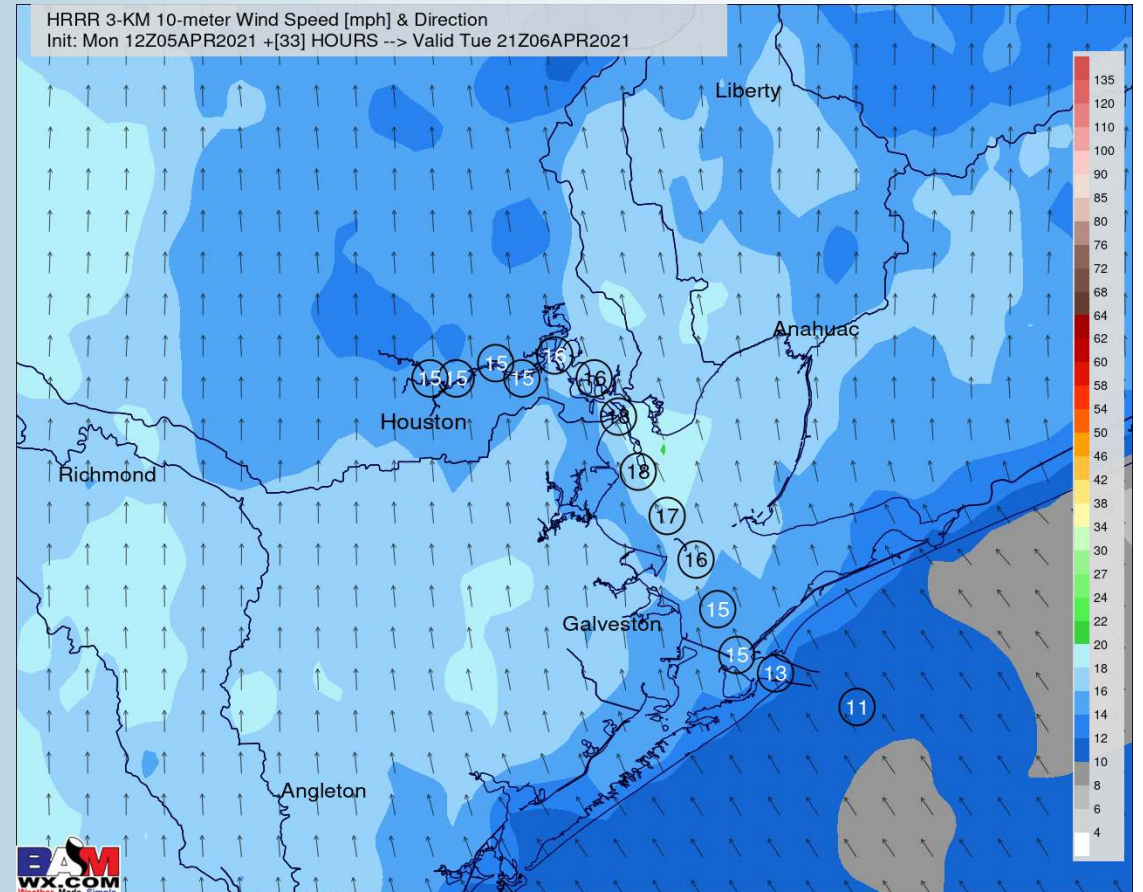
- Tuesday is also anticipated to be a dry day across the area.
- Winds likely start at 10-15 MPH sustained but will slowly increase throughout the day. By the afternoon, sustained winds of 15-20 MPH and gusts of 20-25 MPH will be possible. Winds will continue coming out of the SE.
- High temps for our Tuesday will reach the mid 70s for our stations, lower 80s inland.
- *No fog anticipated for Tuesday night.*

Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)

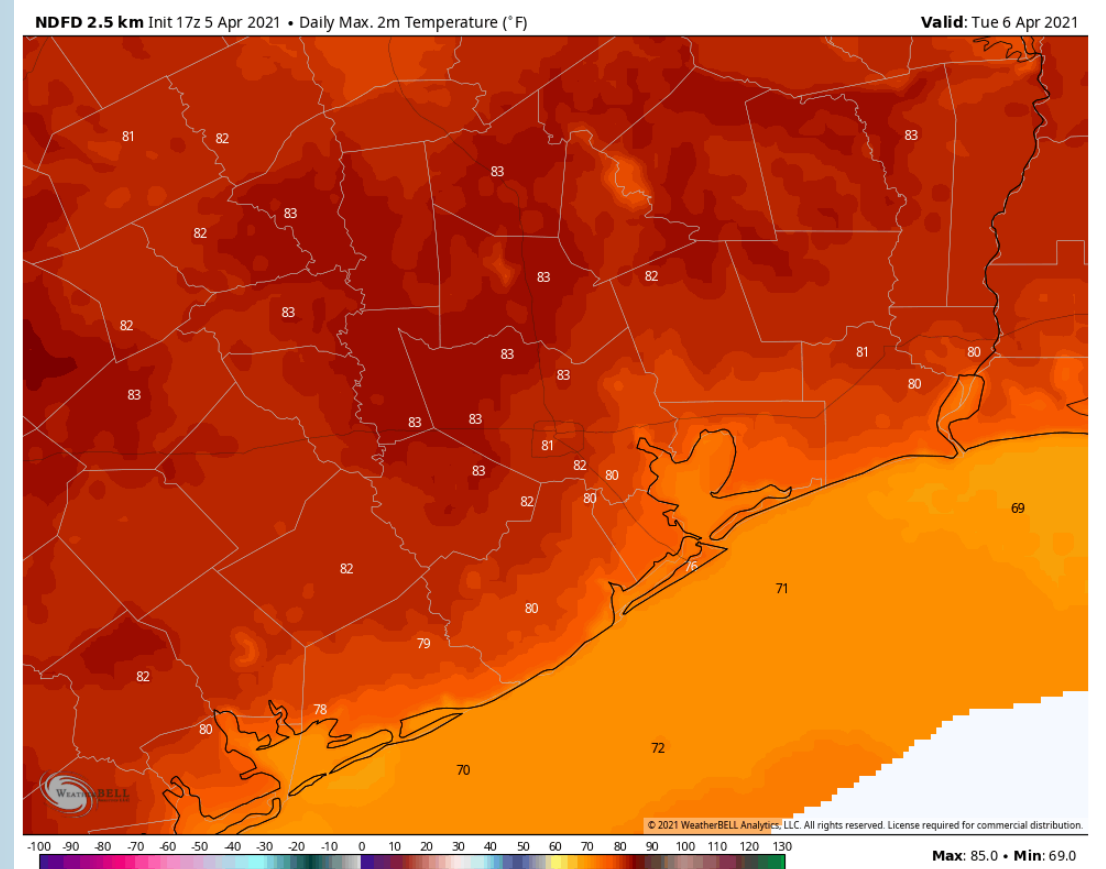


Tuesday, April 6th, 2021

Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)



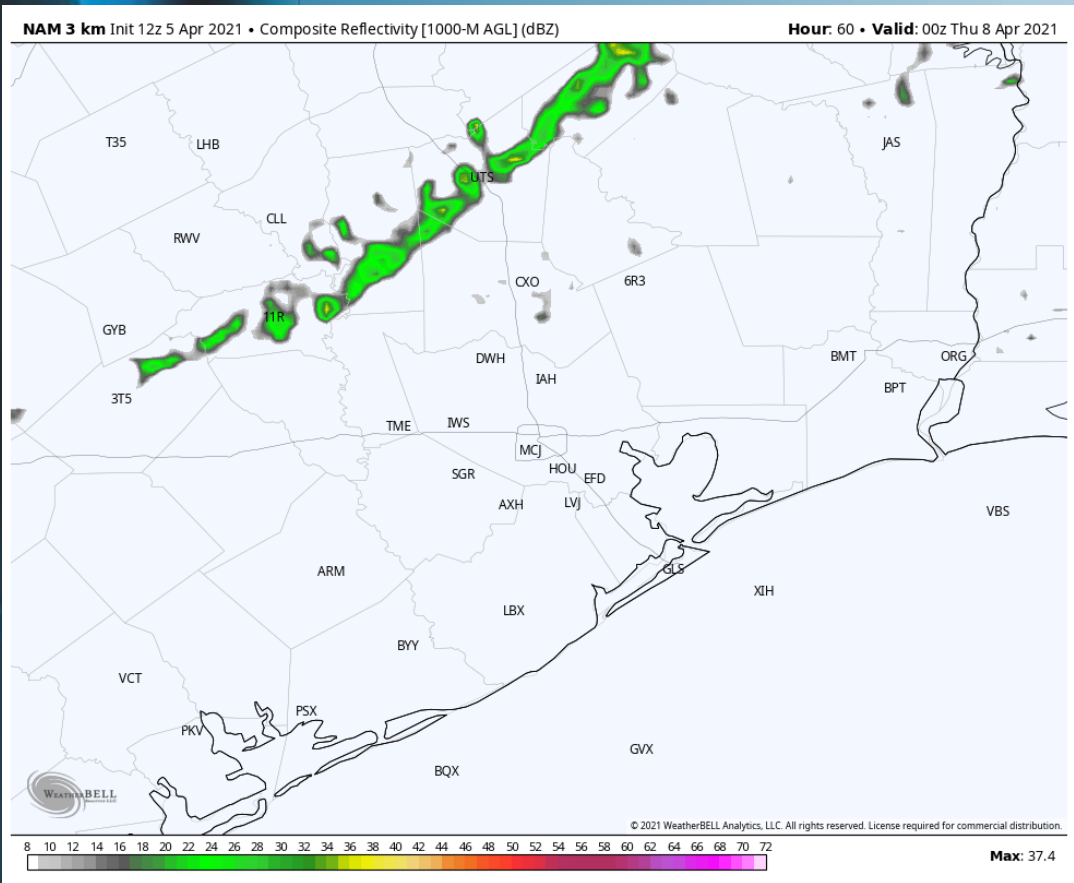
High Temperatures Tuesday



Short-Term Forecast Discussion

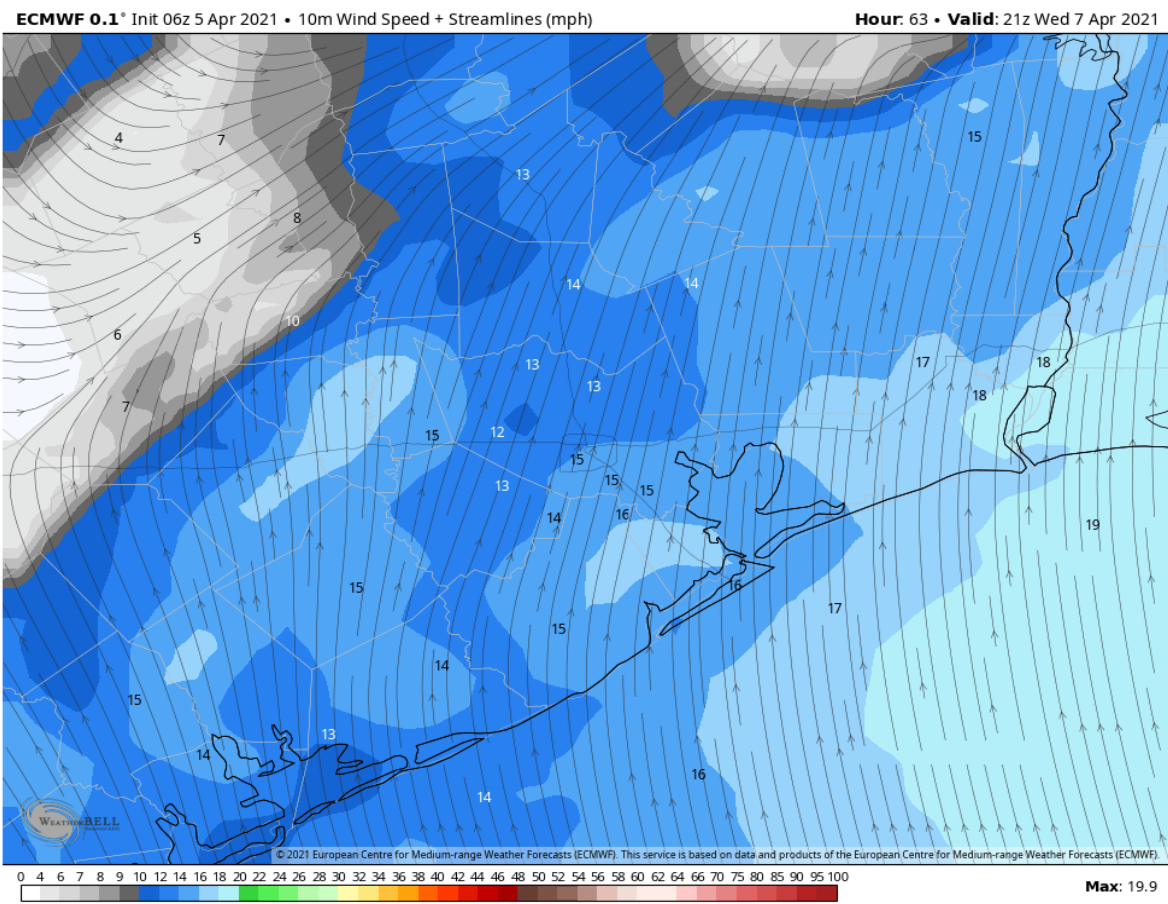
- An isolated shower / thunderstorm will be possible after 3PM CT to sunset on Wednesday (~20%)...at this distance it looks like the main chances will remain to the north.
- Winds will continue to be breezy on Wednesday out of the South, sustained at 13-18 MPH, gusting at times to 20-30 MPH.
- High temps for our Wednesday will reach into the mid to upper 70s for our stations, lower to mid 80s inland.
- *Confidence on fog Wed. night is low; most data is clear however, the European model does suggest this being possible after midnight with winds weakening...a risk to watch in future updates but the signal at this distance is not all that impressive.*

Simulated Radar Snapshot (3PM CT)

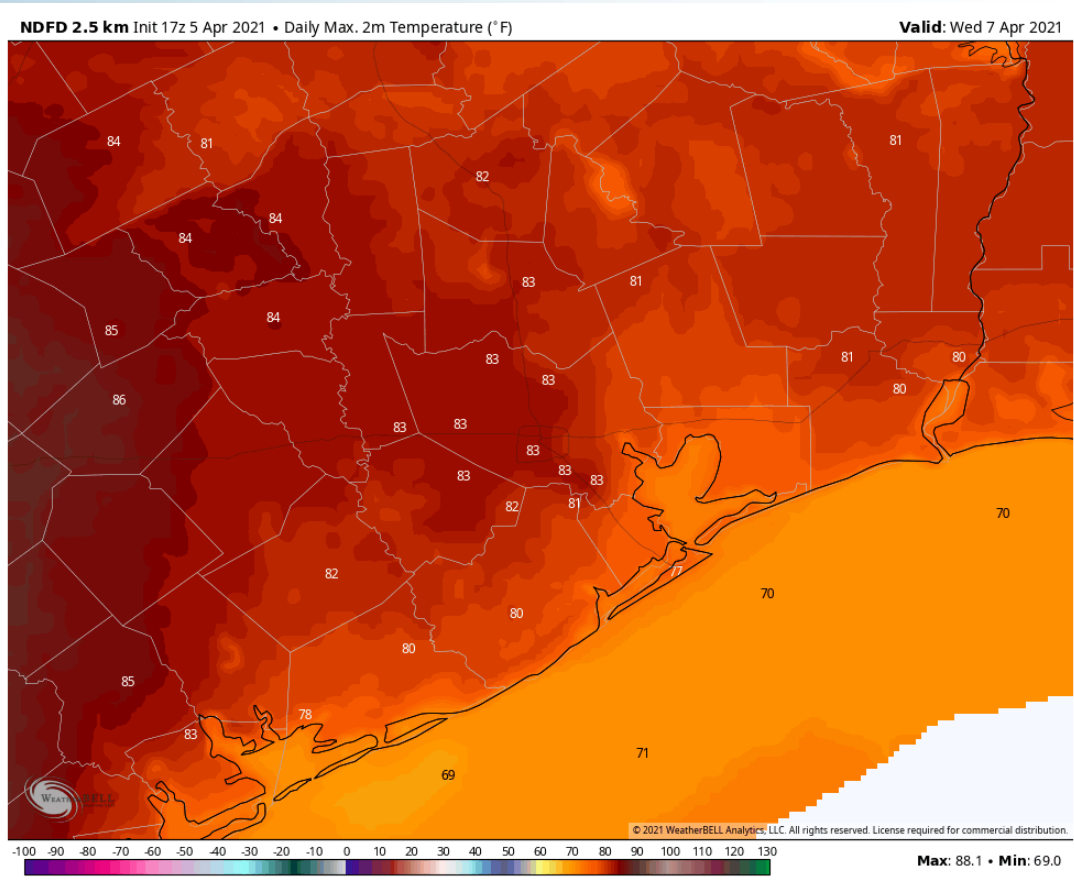


Wednesday, April 7th, 2021

Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



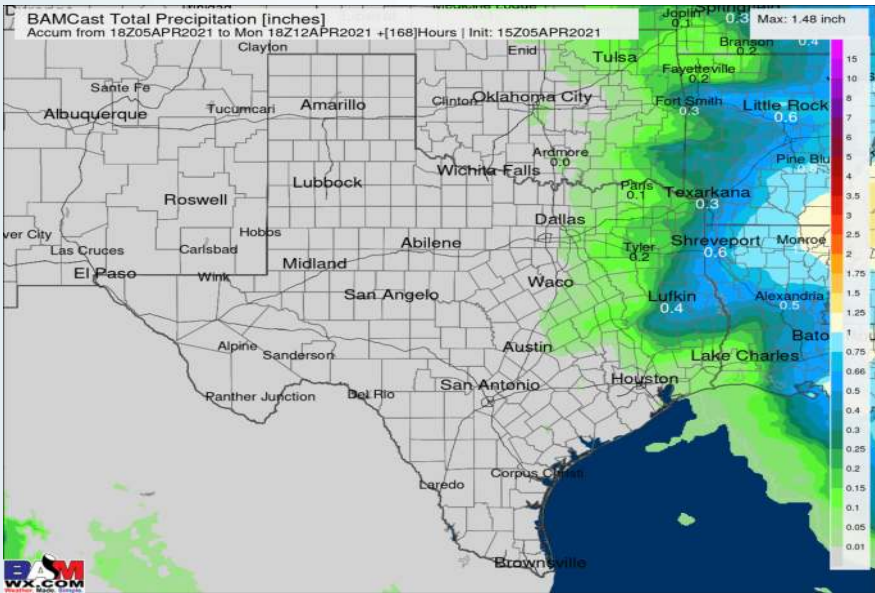
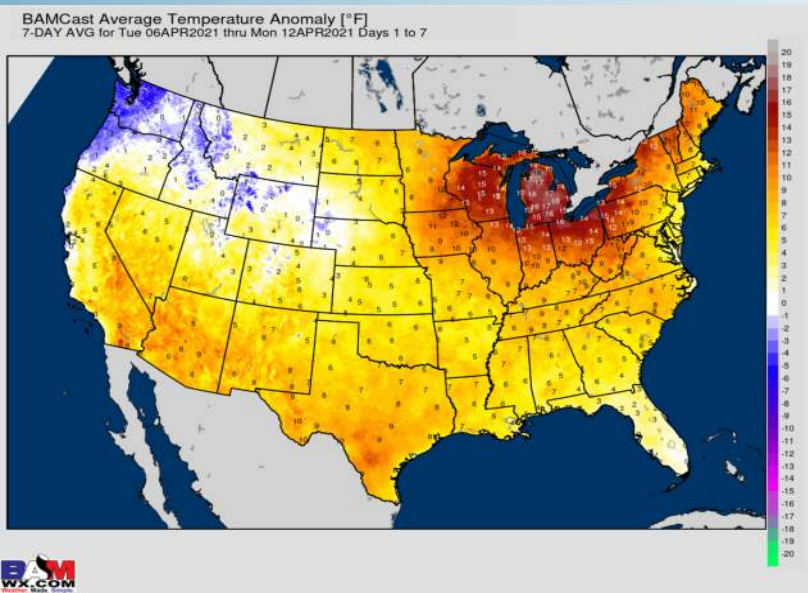
High Temperatures Wednesday



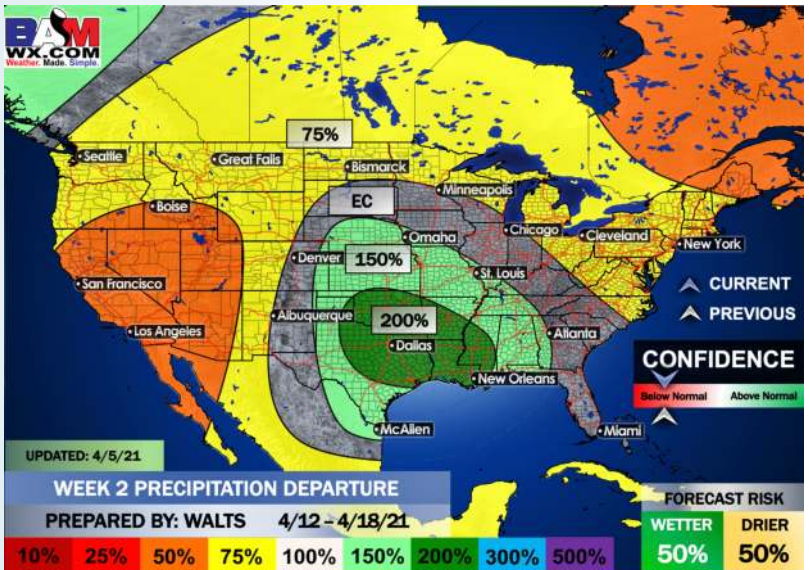
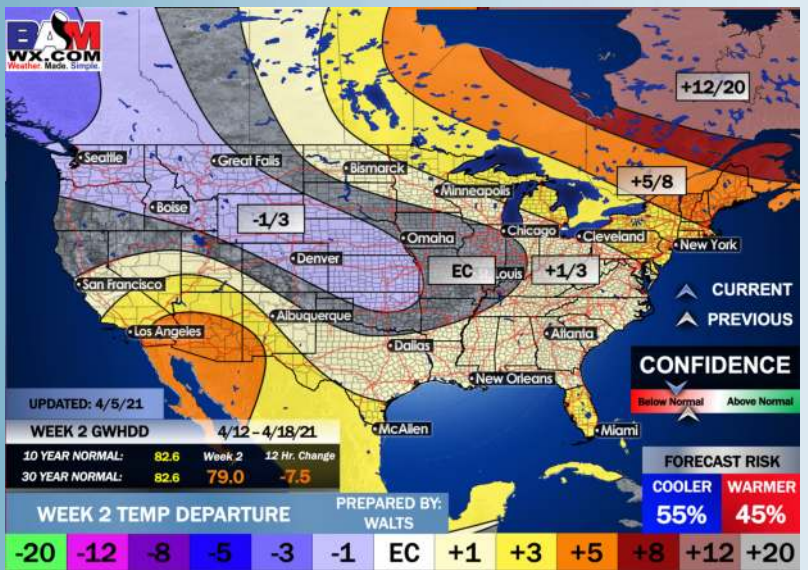
Week 1 Forecast

Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Precipitation chances will be little over the next several days across the area, mainly north to northeast. Temperatures will look to continue to be on the rise ahead, anticipating above normal warmth to be consistent.
- Favoring increased risks of rainfall in week 2, but confidence is quite low at this distance given meandering lows that tend to cause forecast volatility.
- Expectations are for a below normal pattern for precipitation risk for the Houston area for weeks 3 + 4. Temperatures are anticipated to average out to near normal for this time frame.
