


## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Pockets of mist/ isolated showers will continue out through mid-morning ~10 AM, before the front finally pushes out of the area and takes any precip chances with it along with most of the clouds. The rest of the day will be dry
- Winds at the boarding station will continue to stay calm out through about that ~10 AM window when the front works through and will shift our winds to Northerly. Sustained winds of 13-18 MPH are expected behind the front, but as the front itself passes there may be a brief period of sustained winds 15-20 MPH with locally higher gusts.
- Temps look to sit in the mid to upper 70s for our stations, warmer inland.
- *Any ongoing reduced visibility is favored to end this morning, near 8 AM for our N stations, closer to 10 AM for the boarding station.*


## Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (10 AM CT)






## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Favoring a drier day Sunday
- Winds will slowly turn from N to SE during the day. From Midnight to ~9 AM, winds will be out of the NE. Winds will be more E out through ~2 PM where a more SE wind is favored, and then SE through the evening hours. The first half of the day, winds of 15-20 MPH sustained look possible, gradually weakening to 8-13 MPH with gusts 13-18 MPH possible in the PM.
- Temps once again sit in the upper 70s for the stations, mid 80s inland.
  - *No fog expected Sunday*


## Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)






## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Expecting much of Monday to feature drier weather, but think a very low end chance of some isolated showers will be possible beyond sundown Monday (~20%)
- Winds much of Monday will be coming from the SE at 10-15 MPH with a few gusts higher.
- Temps will be in the mid 70s for most of our stations and mid 80s further inland.
  - *No fog favored for Monday.*


## Sustained Winds (6 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)








## Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Precipitation chances remain hit and miss over the next several days across the area, mainly north to northeast.
- Temperatures will look to continue to be on the rise ahead, anticipating above normal warmth to be consistent.
- Precipitation looks to continue to on the increase in week 2 across the area, while temps look to stay below normal.
- Expectations are for a below normal pattern for precipitation risk for the Houston area for weeks 3 + 4.
- Temperatures are anticipated to average out to near normal for this time frame.
