




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Expecting the rest of the day to be on the drier side
- Winds the rest of the day are coming from the N/NNE at 10-15 MPH with gusts locally higher
- Lows this evening over the open waters will sit into the mid to upper 60s
- *No fog expected this evening*


Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (7 PM CT)




Low Temps this Evening




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Favoring a drier day Sunday
- Winds will slowly turn from N to SE during the day. From Midnight to ~9 AM, winds will be out of the NE. Winds will be more E out through ~2 PM where a more SE wind is favored, and then SE through the evening hours. The first half of the day, winds of 15-20 MPH sustained look possible, gradually weakening to 8-13 MPH with gusts 13-18 MPH possible in the PM.
- Temps once again sit in the upper 70s for the stations, mid 80s inland.
 - *No fog expected Sunday*


Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)




High Temperatures Sunday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Expecting much of Monday to feature drier weather, but think a very low end chance of some isolated showers will be possible beyond sundown Monday (~20%)
- Winds much of Monday will be coming from the SE at 10-15 MPH with a few gusts higher.
- Temps will be in the mid 70s for most of our stations and mid 80s further inland.
 - *No fog favored for Monday.*


Sustained Winds (6 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)





High Temperatures Monday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Precipitation chances remain hit and miss over the next several days across the area, mainly north to northeast.
- Temperatures will look to continue to be on the rise ahead, anticipating above normal warmth to be consistent.
- Precipitation looks to continue to on the increase in week 2 across the area, while temps look to stay below normal.
- Expectations are for a below normal pattern for precipitation risk for the Houston area for weeks 3 + 4.
- Temperatures are anticipated to average out to near normal for this time frame.
