




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- ***No fog expected this evening***


Sustained Winds (8 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (7 PM CT)




Low Temps This Evening




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Expecting much of Monday to feature drier weather, but think a very low end chance of some isolated showers will be possible beyond sundown Monday (~20%)
- Winds much of Monday will be coming from the SE at 13-18 MPH with a few gusts higher.
- Temps will be in the mid 70s for most of our stations and mid 80s further inland.
 - *No fog favored for Monday.*


Sustained Winds (6 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)




High Temperatures Monday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- With a front approaching the area on Tuesday, we are watching for isolated shower/thunderstorm chances (~20-30%) during the daytime hours.
- Winds are favored to come out of the SE at 8-13 MPH for much of the day on Tuesday.
- Highs once again should sit in the mid to upper 70s for our stations, warmer further inland
- *No fog expected for Tuesday*


Sustained Winds (10 AM CT)

➤ Precipitation chances remain hit and miss over the next several days across the area, mainly north to northeast.



Temperatures will look to continue to be on the rise ahead, anticipating above normal warmth to be consistent.

➤ Precipitation looks to continue to on the increase in week 2 across the area, while temps look to stay below normal.



➤ Expectations are for a below normal pattern for precipitation risk for the Houston area for weeks 3 + 4.
