




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- We need to keep an eye on the evening hours for a few isolated showers. A thunderstorm or two cannot be ruled out through the evening, but currently favor the better precipitation chances to primarily stay north of the area.
- Expecting the winds to continue coming out of the NE at 15-20 MPH sustained for much of the day, gusting at times up to 23-28 MPH. Expecting a more Easterly wind near ~6 PM.
- Temps tonight look to sit in the upper 60s to lower 70s across our stations.
- *Continuing not to favor fog, but mist/reduced visibility/ low cloud deck will be possible with precipitation around.*


Sustained Winds (8 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (9 PM CT)




Low Temps this Evening




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- A bit lower confidence on exact timing of when precip chances work through the area. With that said, we are in favor of an isolated shower/t-storm out through mid-AM, generally quieter weather during the middle portion of the day, and then slightly better chances for scattered storms come back into the picture mid-late afternoon and in the evening.
- Winds very early Fri AM (~2 AM) will turn from the E to more SE. Sustained winds of 13-18 MPH with gusts 15-20 MPH. Winds then shift to Southerly near ~7 PM and eventually SW late evening. Our next front will work through early Saturday AM
- Highs on Friday will be similar, into the mid 70s for most of our stations, near 80 inland.
- *No fog currently expected for Friday, but reduced visibility will be possible within any precipitation.*


Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)




High Temperatures Friday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- After the front passes, our precipitation chances look to continue with scattered shower chances in the morning. As we work into the late afternoon, may need to watch for some re-development especially from the Boarding Station and points south of the area.
- The cold front looks to pass pre-dawn and will shift our winds to the N. A but of uncertainty regarding when exactly the front passes, but favoring it in the 1-4 AM window. A sustained wind of 18-23 MPH with gusts 25-30 MPH possible. Winds **slowly** weaken during the day.
 - Highs Saturday sit in the upper 60s.
 - ***No fog expected on Saturday.***


Sustained Winds (11 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (7 PM CT)





High Temperatures Saturday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temperatures will run well below normal over the next 7 days with the pattern starting to get a little bit less active, though we need to watch another chance into the weekend especially north of the area.
- Week 2 still looks to average out slightly below normal, but moderation is likely to come late in the period to close out April. Expect the pattern to be active with a few systems capable of producing rain risks.
- For week's 3/4, expect the pattern to continue to warm with near normal temperatures (if there's a risk, it's on the warmer side). Expect bouts of dryness and periods of more active weather.
