




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Expecting very little sunshine today as a lower cloud deck will be in place until our front passes early tomorrow AM. Periods of mist/ light scattered rain showers will continue in an on/off nature through the morning hours (20-30%). The best chance for drier time comes in the middle of the day (11 A – 3 P) before higher chances increase from mid-afternoon and into the evening. An isolated thunderstorm will be possible, but strong storms are not expected.
- Winds over the next 1-2 hours will turn more SE. Sustained winds of 10-15 MPH with gusts 15-20 MPH possible out through sundown. Winds then shift to Southerly near ~5 PM and eventually SW late evening. Winds calm beyond sundown.
- Highs will be in the mid 70s for most of our stations, upper 70s inland.
- *No fog currently expected today, but reduced visibility via mist/low cloud deck/ precipitation will be certainly be possible*


Sustained Winds (9 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (10 AM CT)




High Temperatures Friday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- After the front passes in the very early AM hours, our precipitation chances look to be lacking from sunrise out through mid-day (10-20%). Guidance has trended later with the secondary wave, with better precipitation chances increasing (~40%) come mid-late afternoon and winding down in the 7-9 PM window. Favoring showers vs thunderstorms
- The cold front looks to pass early and will shift our winds to the N. Currently targeting the 11 PM Fri – 2 AM Sat for the passage and wind shift. A sustained wind of 18-23 MPH with gusts 25-30 MPH possible for much of the day
 - Highs Saturday sit in the upper 60s.
 - *No fog expected on Saturday.*


Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)




High Temperatures Saturday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Drier conditions expected Sunday**
- **Winds will continue coming out of the N/ NW Sunday and will be 15-20 MPH sustained in the morning hours before gradually calming to 10-15 MPH with gusts 15-20 MPH into the afternoon.**
- **Temps tonight look to sit in the upper 60s across our stations.**
 - ***No fog expected for Sunday***


Sustained Winds (10 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (7 PM CT)





High Temperatures Sunday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temperatures will run well below normal over the next 7 days with the pattern starting to get a little bit less active, though we need to watch another chance into the weekend especially north of the area.
- Week 2 still looks to average out slightly below normal, but moderation is likely to come late in the period to close out April. Expect the pattern to be active with a few systems capable of producing rain risks.
- For week's 3/4, expect the pattern to continue to warm with near normal temperatures (if there's a risk, it's on the warmer side). Expect bouts of dryness and periods of more active weather.
