


## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Expecting quieter conditions out through about ~Noon when our precipitation chances will be on the increase and hang around the area until about ~10 PM. Precipitation will be generally light to at times moderate in a scattered nature, and the highest chances/ most areal coverage looks to come in the ~3-7 PM window. While lightning can't be ruled out, the threat for severe weather is not expected.
- Now that the front has passed, winds will continue coming out of the N. Sustained winds of 20-25 MPH with gusts 25-30+ MPH possible for much of the day
  - Highs will sit in the upper 60s.
  - *No fog today, however reduced visibility will continue to remain possible given the lingering precipitation risks.*


## Sustained Winds (11 AM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)




## High Temperatures Saturday




## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Drier conditions expected Sunday**
- **Winds will continue coming out of the N/ NNE and will be 18-23 MPH sustained in the morning hours before gradually calming to 13-18 MPH with gusts 18-23 MPH into the afternoon. Near sundown winds turn to more NE**
- **Temps look to sit near 70 across our stations.**
  - ***No fog expected for Sunday***


## Sustained Winds (10 AM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (10 AM CT)




## High Temperatures Sunday




## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Dry weather favored for Monday
- Winds will gradually shift from NE to SE during the day Monday. Expecting a NE wind to turn more E by ~2 PM and then more SE by ~6 PM. Winds for much of the day will be 8-13 MPH sustained with gusts locally higher, but are expecting calmer winds into the evening, closer to 5-10 MPH
- Highs will be hovering in the lower 70s
  - *Fog is not favored for Monday*


## Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)







## Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temperatures will be well below normal over the next week. Some additional chances over the next few days through Saturday evening before becoming less active into next week.
- The week 2 period should feature cooler air to start and then moderating temperatures as time progresses. The pattern may start to become more active in this period as the pattern warms up.
- We expect that a warmer pattern develops as we work into May with the potential for drier risks to re-establish under a ridge of high pressure.
