




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Rain and a few rumbles of thunder will be on the increase into this afternoon. Highest coverage is anticipated to be around 3 – 8 PM. At times, rainfall can come down at a moderate rate. Chances will continue through the overnight becoming increasingly spotty 8 PM - midnight.
- Winds will continue from the north today with sustained winds of 20-25 MPH with gusts 25-30+ MPH possible for much of the day
- Low temperatures into tomorrow morning look to get into the upper 50's F to lower 60's F
- *No fog today, however reduced visibility will be possible under heavier pockets of rain that can form.*


Sustained Winds (10 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (5 PM CT)




Low Temperatures into Tomorrow Morning




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Mostly dry conditions are anticipated on Sunday.**
- **Winds will continue from the north tomorrow morning around 20 – 25 MPH with gust of 25 – 30 MPH out through 11 AM. Winds gradually weaken into the afternoon/evening, sustained around 18 – 23 MPH with gust up to 25 MPH possible. Winds also shift towards the NE around sunset.**
- **Temps look to sit near 70 across our stations.**
- ***No fog expected for Sunday***


Sustained Winds (9 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (10 AM CT)




High Temperatures Sunday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Mostly dry conditions are anticipated at this moment on Monday. A front moving in from south to north may introduce some light rain chances, but moisture looks quite limited with this.
- Winds will gradually shift from NE to SE during the day Monday. Expecting a NE wind to turn more E by ~2 PM and then more SE by ~7 PM. Winds for much of the day will be 10-15 MPH sustained with gusts locally higher, but are expecting calmer winds into the evening, closer to 5-10 MPH
- Highs will be hovering in the lower 70s
- *Fog is not favored for Monday*


Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)

High Temperatures Monday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- **Temperatures will be well below normal over the next week. Some additional chances over the next few days through Saturday evening before becoming less active into next week.**


- **The week 2 period should feature cooler air to start and then moderating temperatures as time progresses. The pattern may start to become more active in this period as the pattern warms up.**

- **We expect that a warmer pattern develops as we work into May with the potential for drier risks to re-establish under a ridge of high pressure.**
