


## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Our few isolated showers (10-20%) have worked into the area a bit earlier than anticipated, however we continue to favor this threat to remain rather low and isolated. Any precipitation would be short lived and not widespread.
- Expecting sustained winds around 15 - 20 MPH with gusts up to 25 MPH possible. Winds also shift towards the NE around sunset.
- Lows tonight inland drop down to the low 50s while temps over water likely stay elevated, closer to the lower 60s.
  - *No fog expected today*


## Sustained Winds (9 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)






## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Much of the day on Monday should stay dry, however a weak area of energy moving in may introduce some very light and isolated rain chances after 5 PM (10-20%) ,and into the evening but moisture looks quite limited with this.
- Winds will gradually shift from NE to SE during the day Monday. Expecting a NE wind to turn more E by ~1 PM and then more SE by ~5 PM. Winds for much of the day will be 8 – 13 MPH sustained with gusts locally higher, but are expecting calmer winds into the evening, closer to 5-10 MPH
- Highs will be hovering in the lower 70s
  - *Fog is not favored for Monday*


## Sustained Winds (10 AM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (8 PM CT)




## High Temperatures Monday




## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Drier conditions expected to continue Tuesday**
- **Calm and variable winds expected for much of the day. Timing of the front will be key, but eyeing our next front to move into the area in the 11 PM Tue – 2 AM Wed timeframe**
- **Tuesday's temps will be on the increase, rising into the lower to mid 70s**
  - ***No fog expected Tuesday***


## Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)







## Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temperatures will be well below normal over the next week. Some additional chances over the next few days through Saturday evening before becoming less active into next week.
- The week 2 period should feature cooler air to start and then moderating temperatures as time progresses. The pattern may start to become more active in this period as the pattern warms up.
- We expect that a warmer pattern develops as we work into May with the potential for drier risks to re-establish under a ridge of high pressure.
