

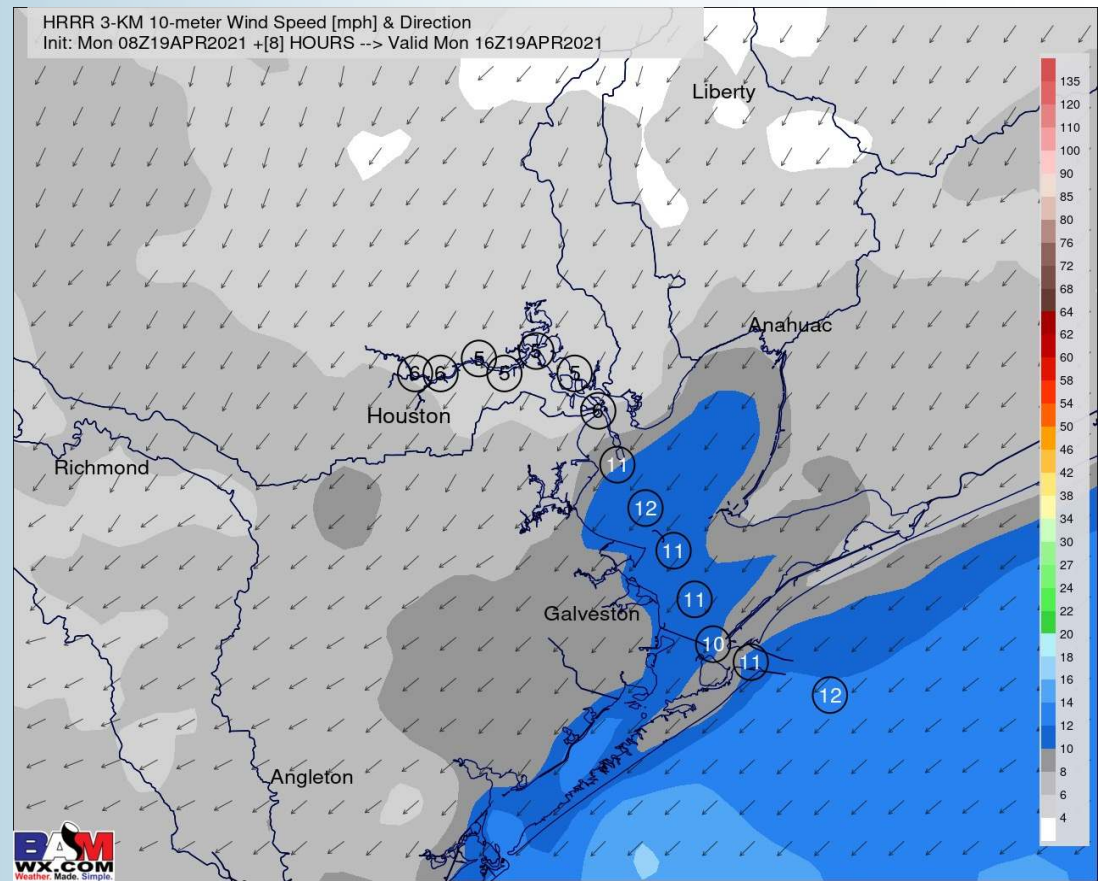

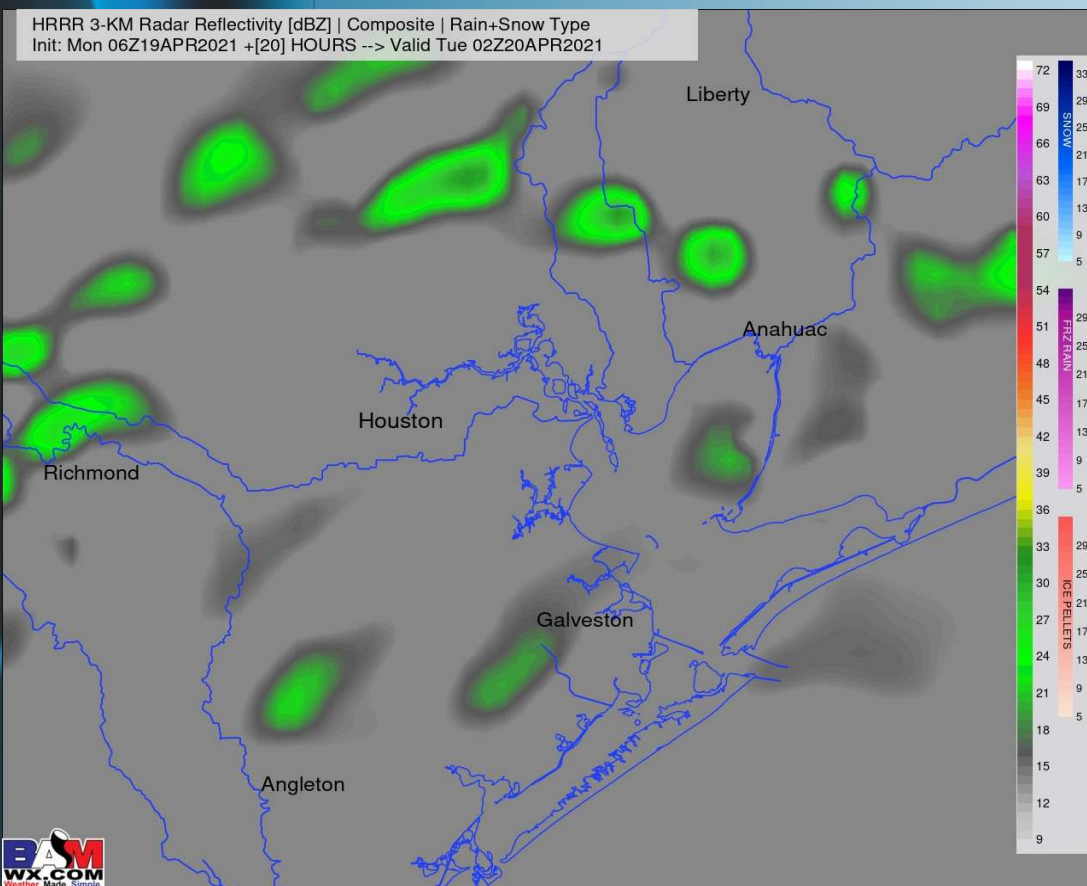
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Much of the day today should stay dry, however a weak area of energy moving in may introduce some very light and isolated rain chances after 6-7 PM (10-20%), and into the early overnight, but moisture looks mostly north and overall limited with this.
- Winds will gradually shift from NE to SE during the day today. Expecting a NE wind to turn more E by ~1 PM and then more SE by ~5 PM. Winds for much of the day will be 8 – 13 MPH sustained with gusts locally higher, but are expecting calmer winds into the afternoon to evening hours, closer to 5-10 MPH.
 - Highs will be hovering near 70F.
 - *Fog is not favored for tonight into Tues AM.*

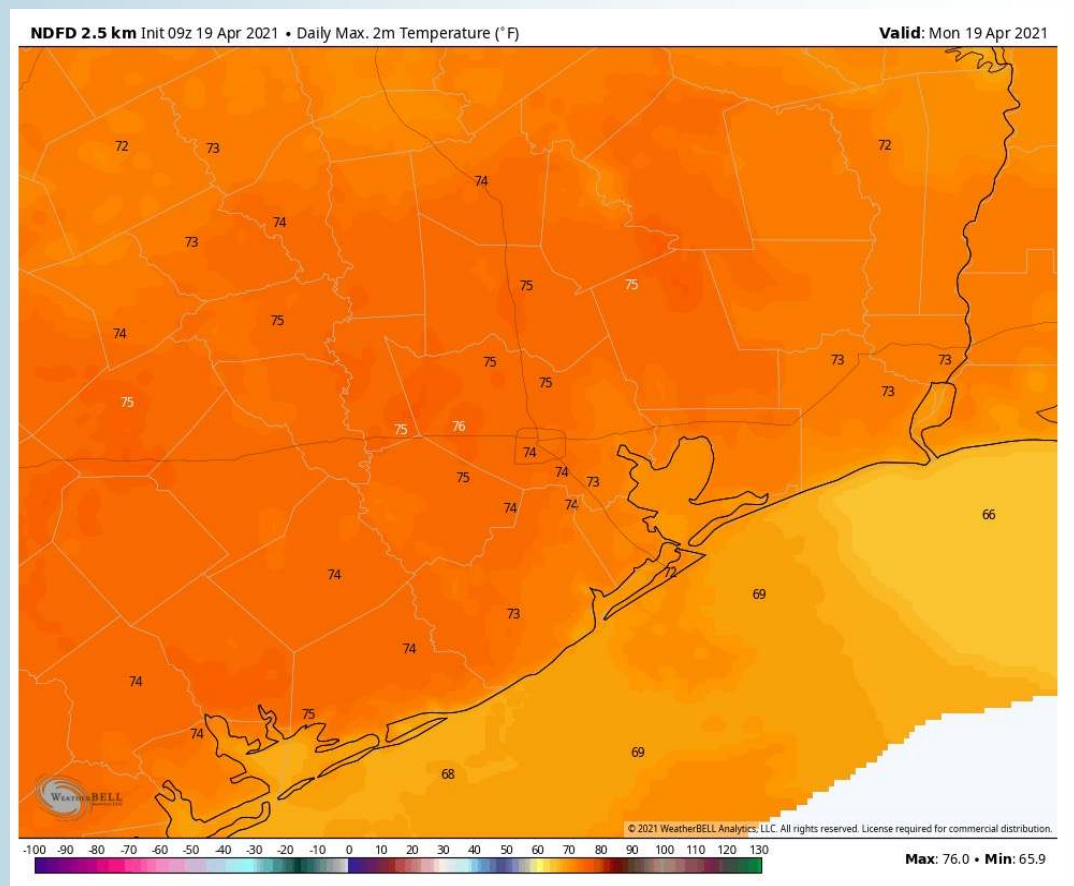
Sustained Winds (11 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (9 PM CT)



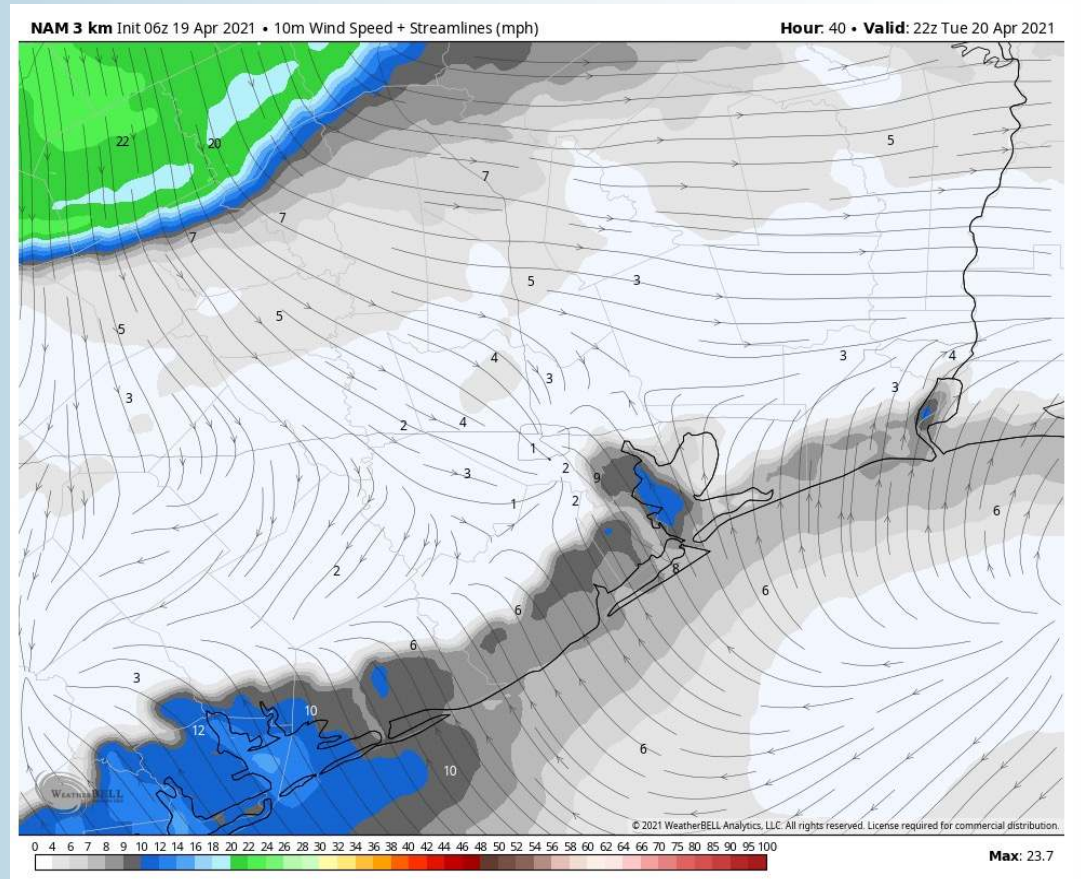
High Temperatures Monday



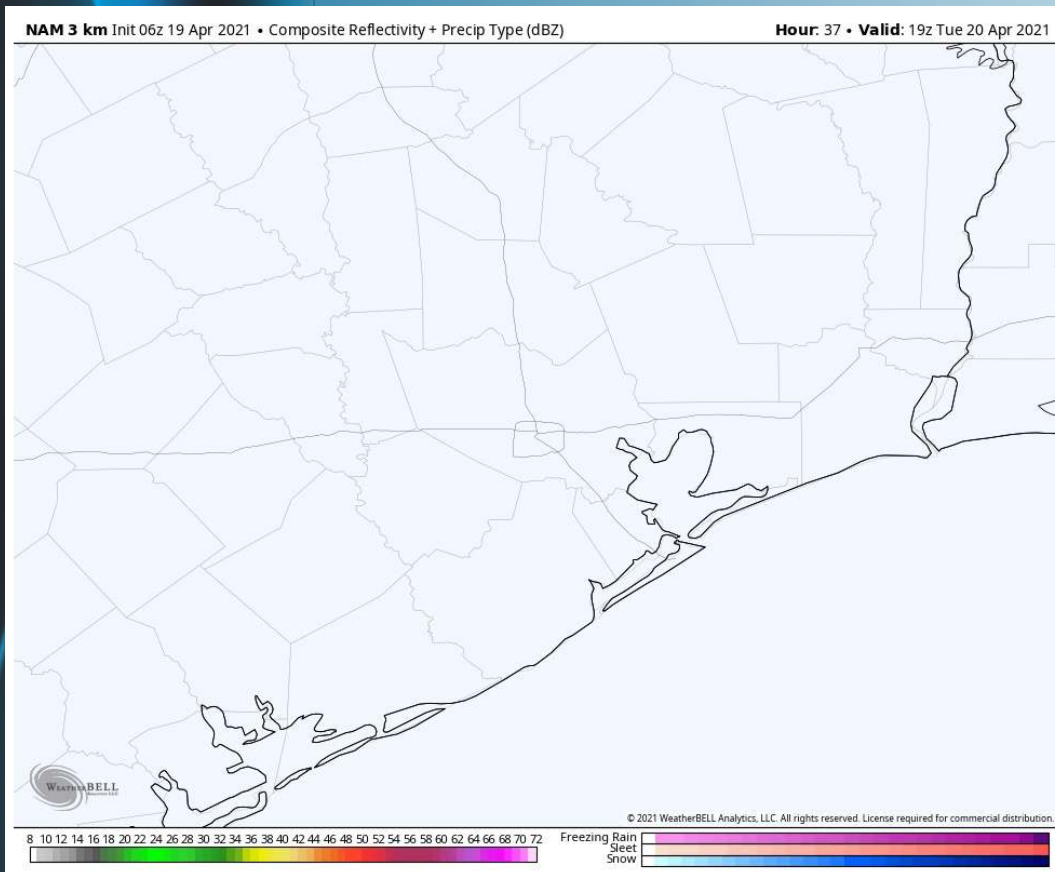
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Drier conditions expected to continue Tuesday.
- Calm and variable winds expected for much of the day. Timing of the front will be key, but eyeing our next front to move into the area in the 11 PM Tue – 2 AM Wed timeframe, shifting winds more out of the north at 8-13 MPH.
- Tuesday's temps will be on the increase out ahead of the front, rising into the lower to mid 70s.
 - *No fog expected Tuesday night.*

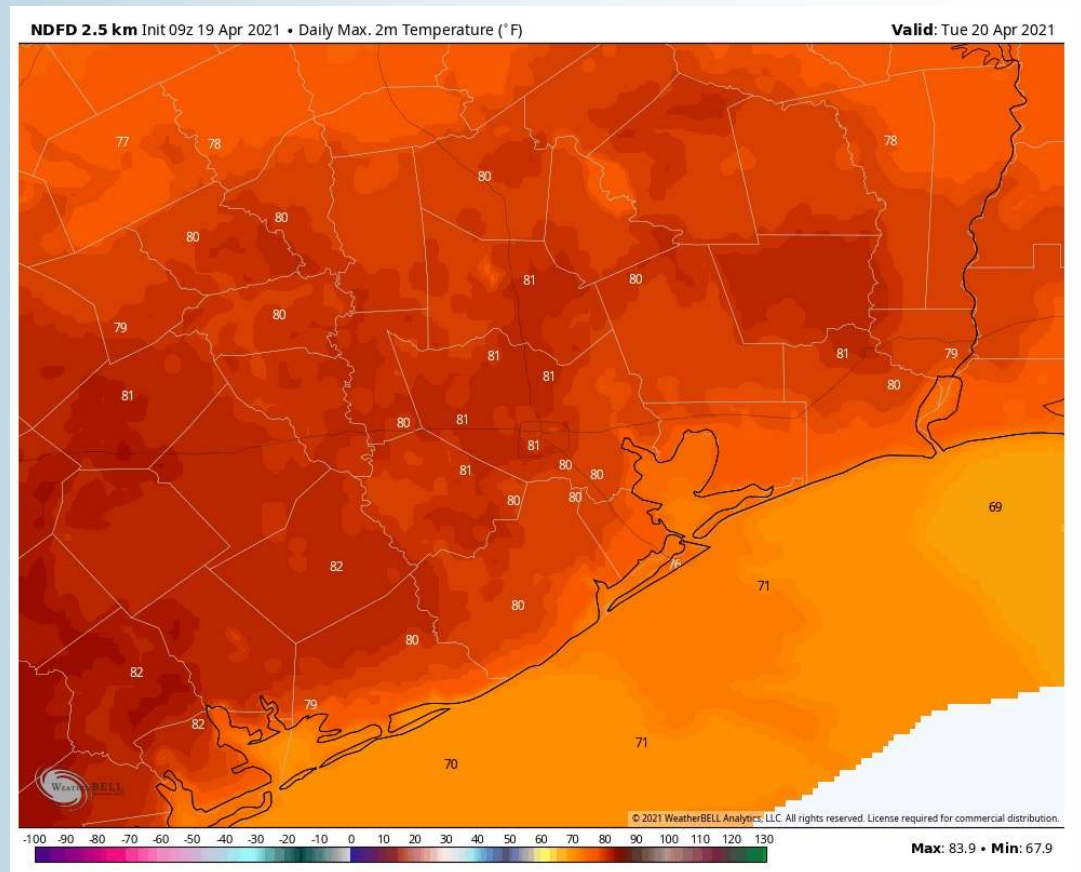
Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)



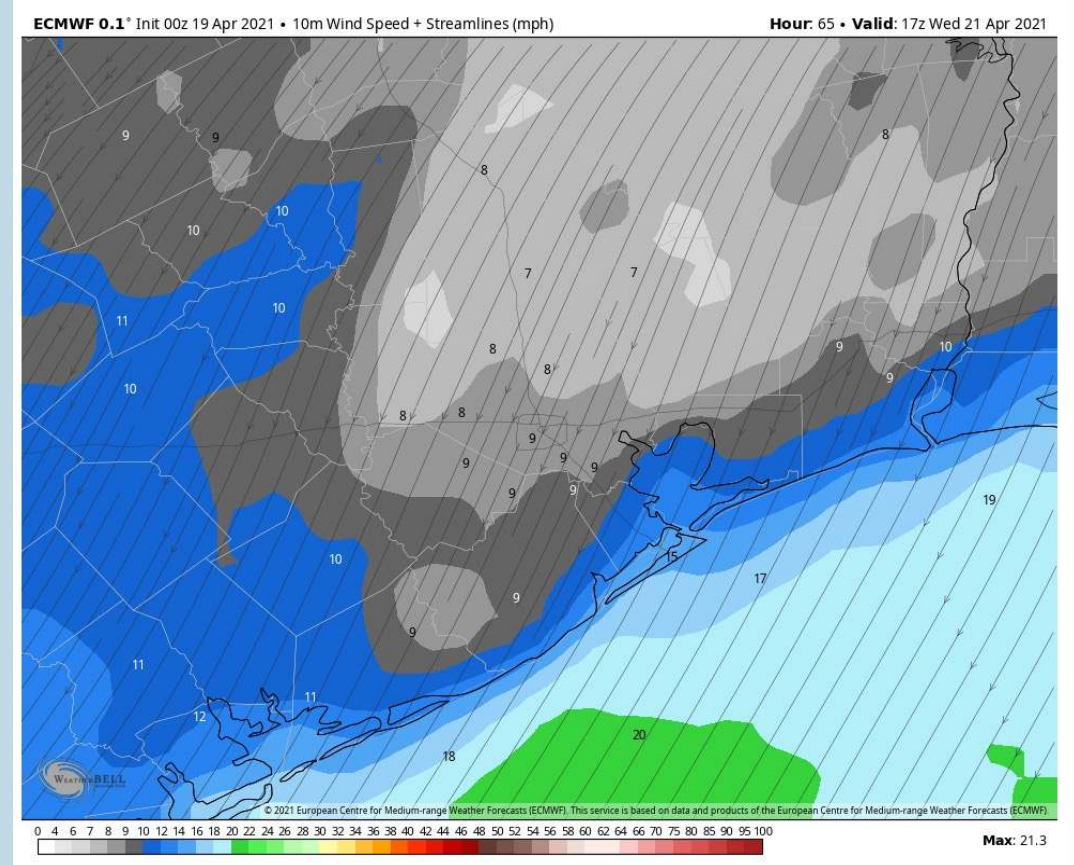
High Temperatures Tuesday



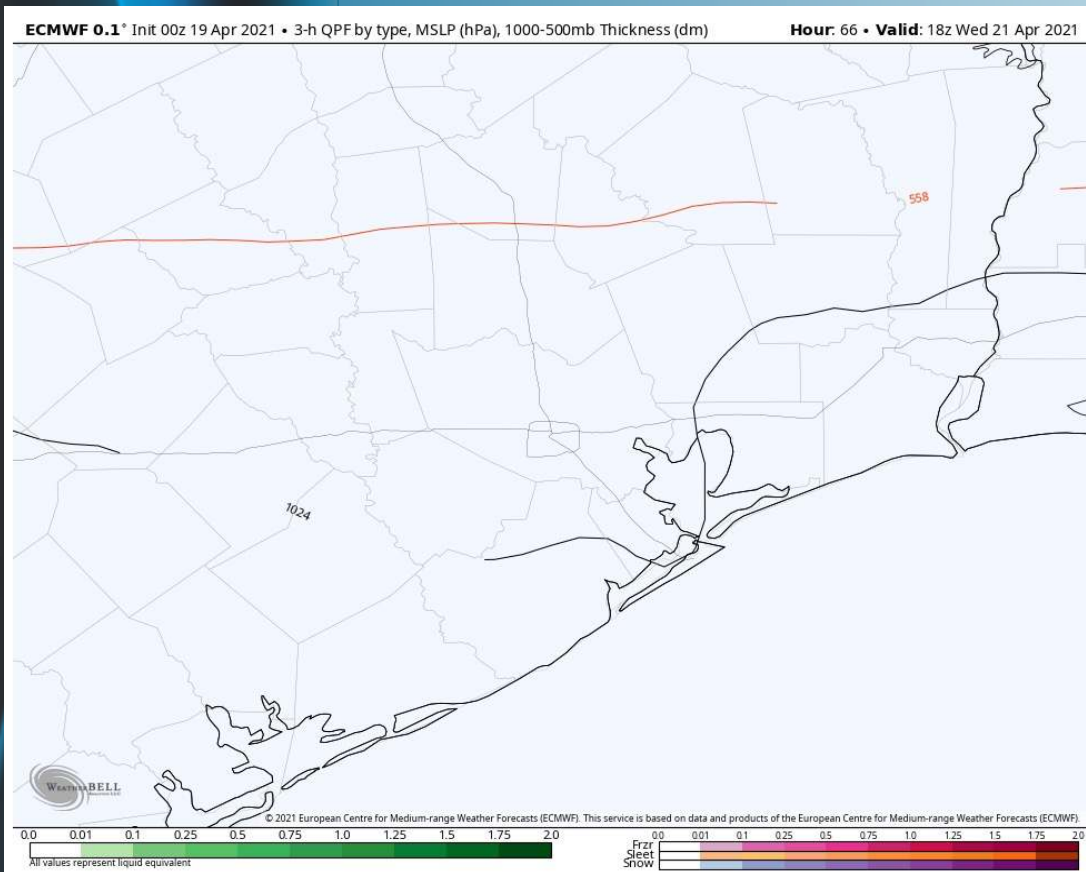
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Drier conditions expected to continue Wednesday.
- Winds will be out of the NE, 15-20 MPH sustained through noon, dropping to 8-13 MPH into the afternoon to evening hours.
- Wednesday's temps will drop down to the upper 60s to near 70 for a high.
 - *No fog expected Wednesday night.*

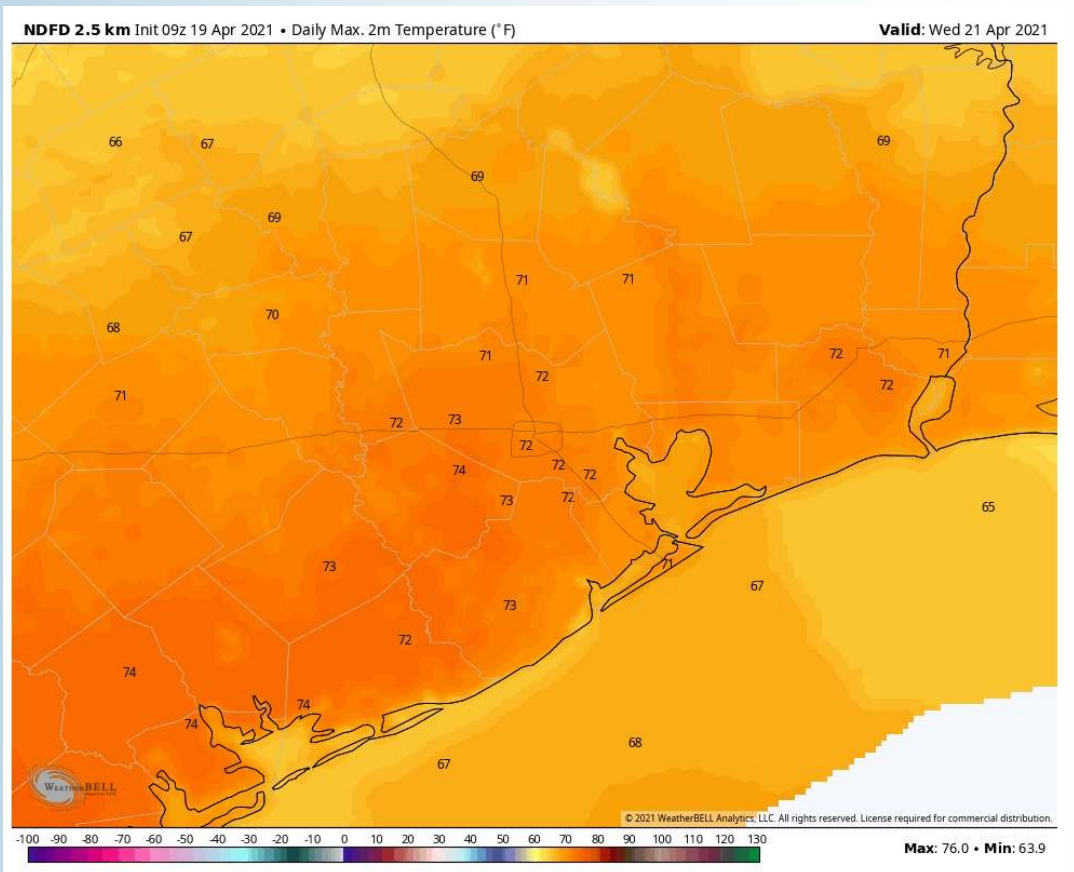
Sustained Winds (12 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)



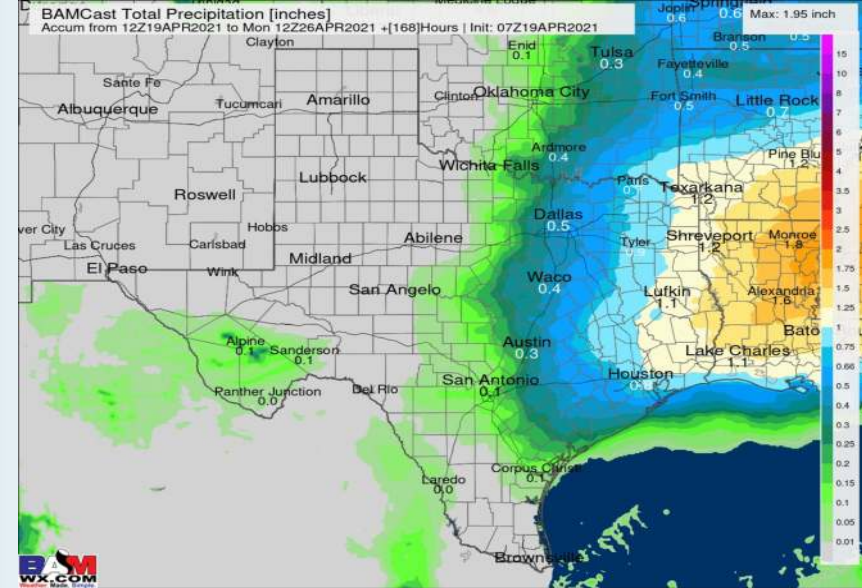
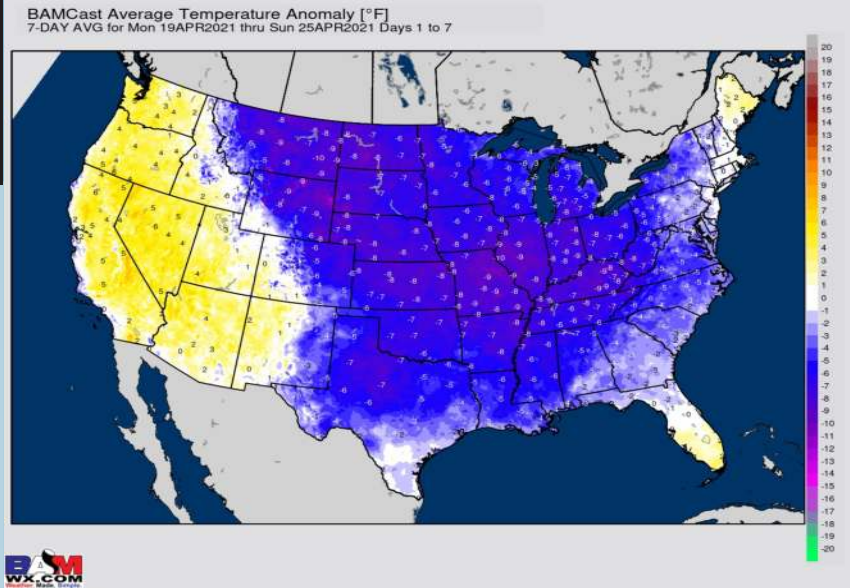
High Temperatures Tuesday



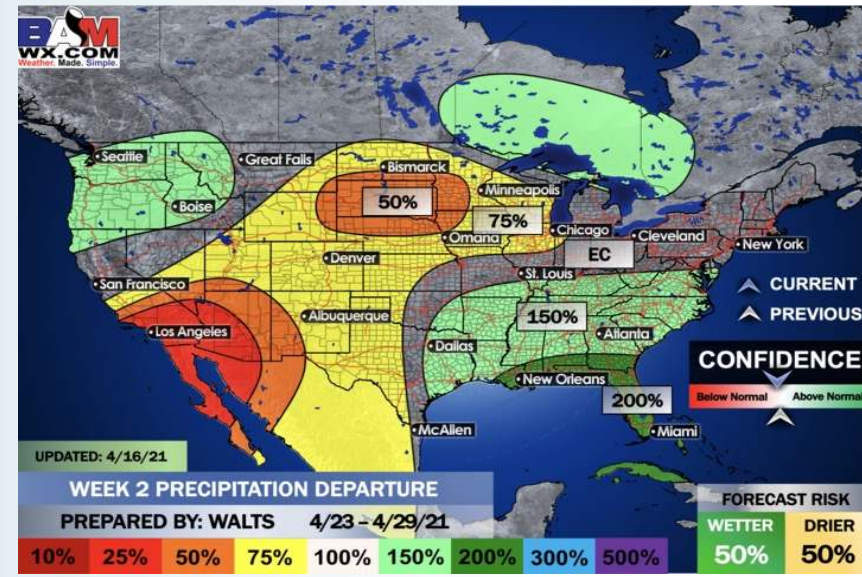
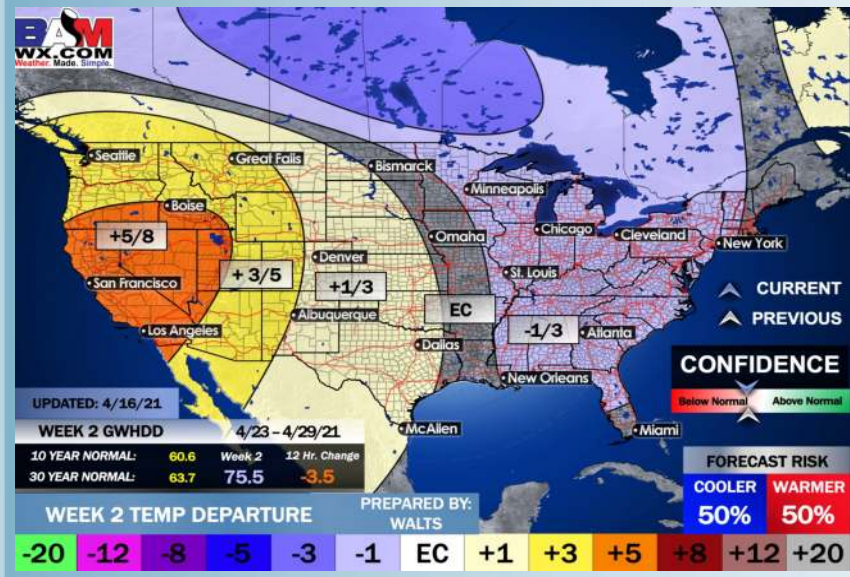
Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temperatures will be below normal over the next week. The week starts out quiet down here, eyeing our best precip chance come Friday later this week, turning drier into the week.
- The week 2 period should feature cooler air to start and then moderating temps as time progresses. The pattern may start to become more active in this period as the pattern warms up.
- We expect that a warmer pattern develops as we work into May with the potential for drier risks to re-establish under a ridge of high pressure.
