

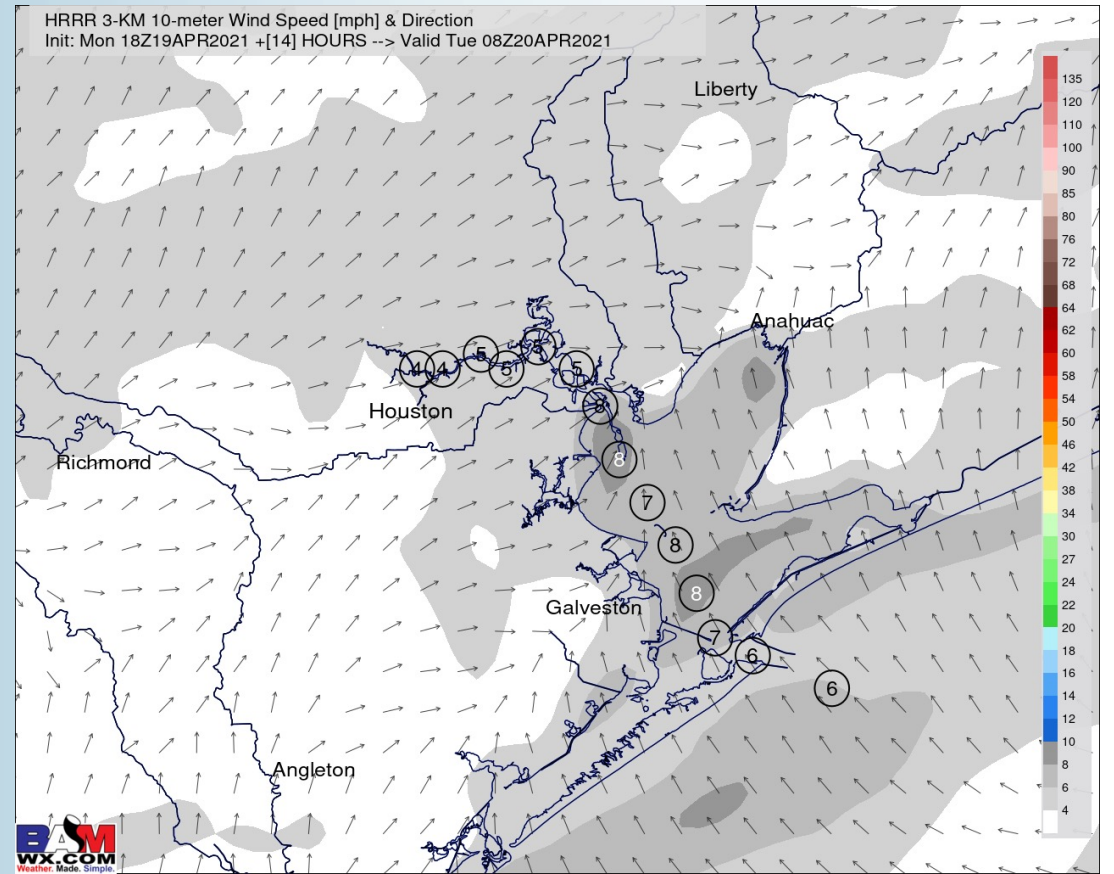

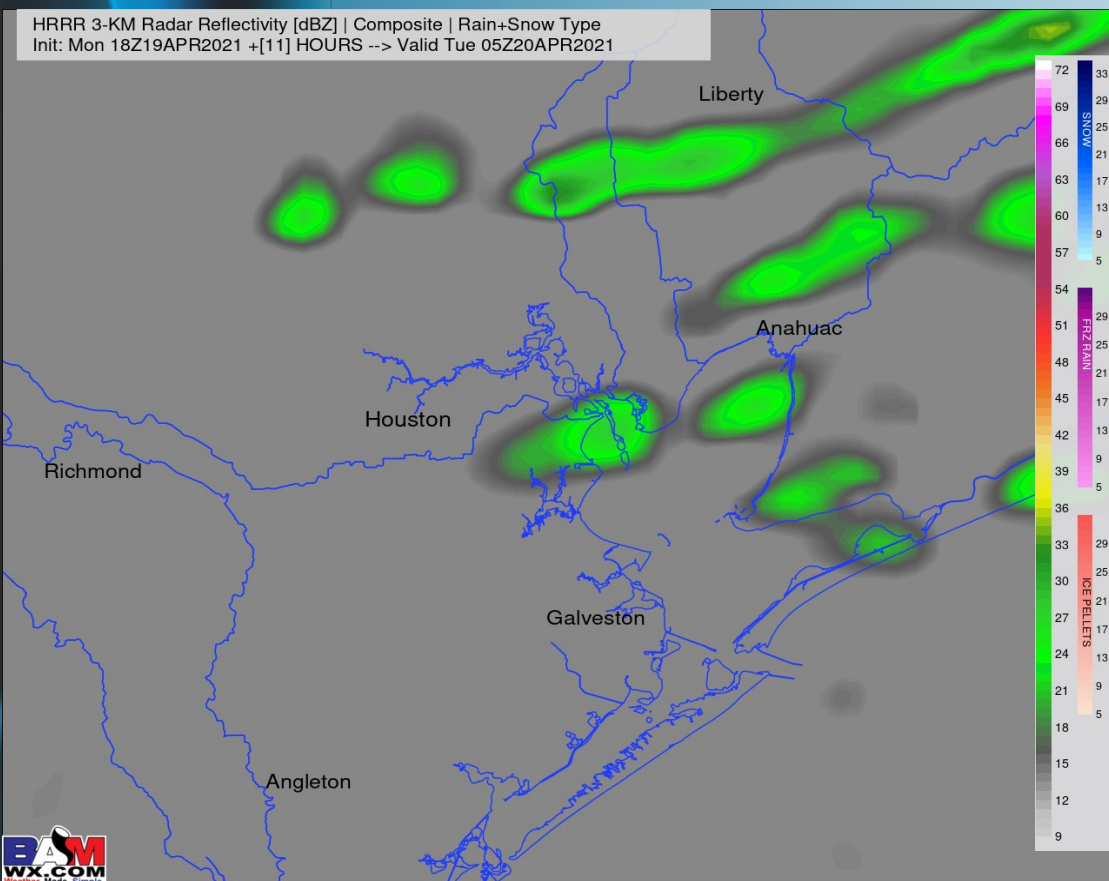
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- As discussed this AM, a weak area of energy moving in will introduce some very light and isolated rain chances after 6-7 PM (10-20%), and into ~2am CT Tuesday, but moisture looks mostly north and overall limited with this.
- Winds will be quite weak tonight, expected out of the Southeast at 4-8 MPH sustained.
- Low temps tonight will drop down into the low to mid 60s.
- *Fog is not favored for tonight into Tues AM.*

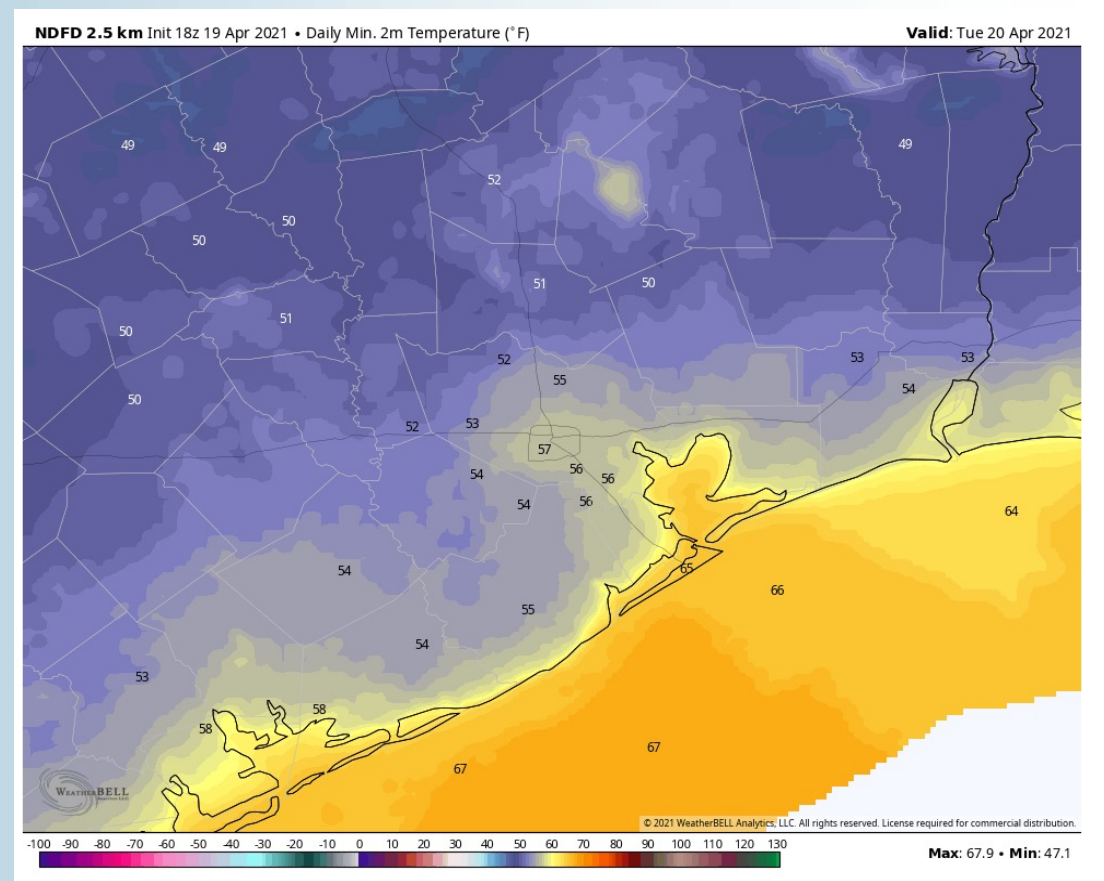
Sustained Winds (3 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (12 AM CT)



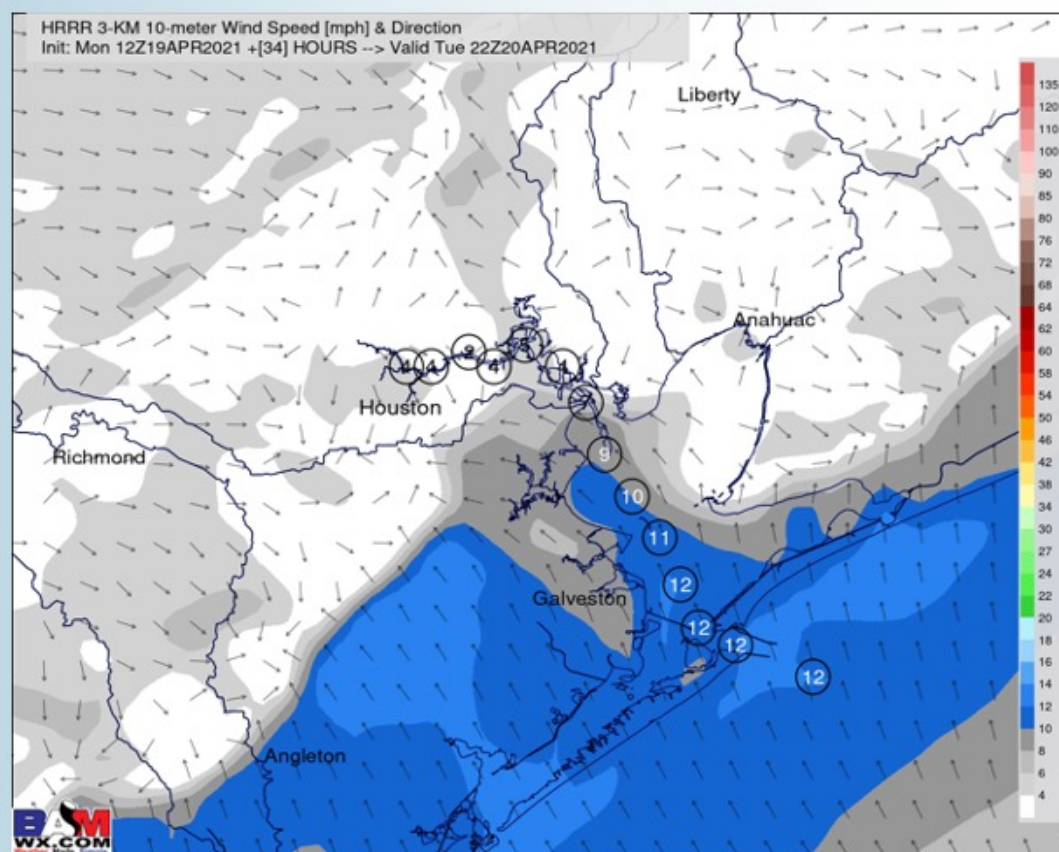
Low Temperatures Tonight



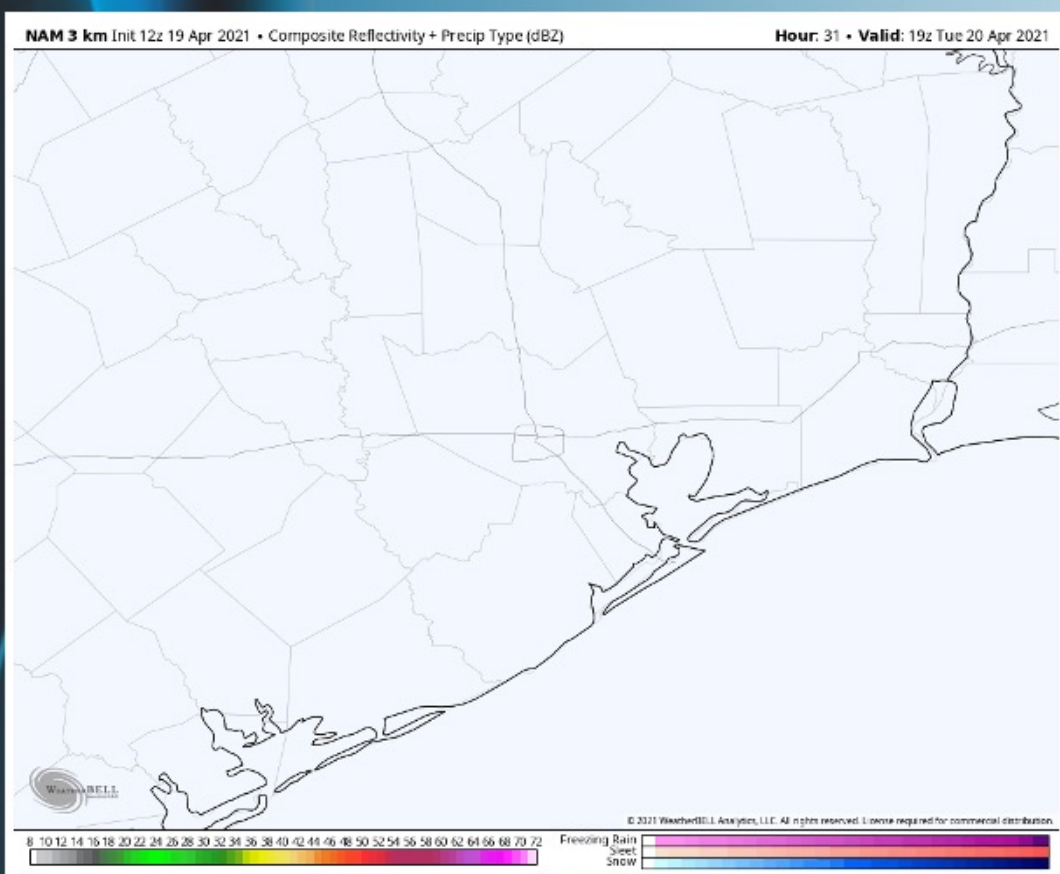
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Drier conditions expected Tuesday after our wave of energy exits in the pre-dawn hours.
- Calm and variable winds expected for much of the day, increasing to 8-13 MPH out of the S/SW in the evening hours. Timing of the front will be key, but eyeing our next front to move into the area in the 11 PM Tue – 2 AM Wed timeframe, shifting winds more out of the north at 10 – 20 MPH.
- Tuesday's temps will be on the increase out ahead of the front, rising into the lower to mid 70s.
 - *No fog expected Tuesday night.*

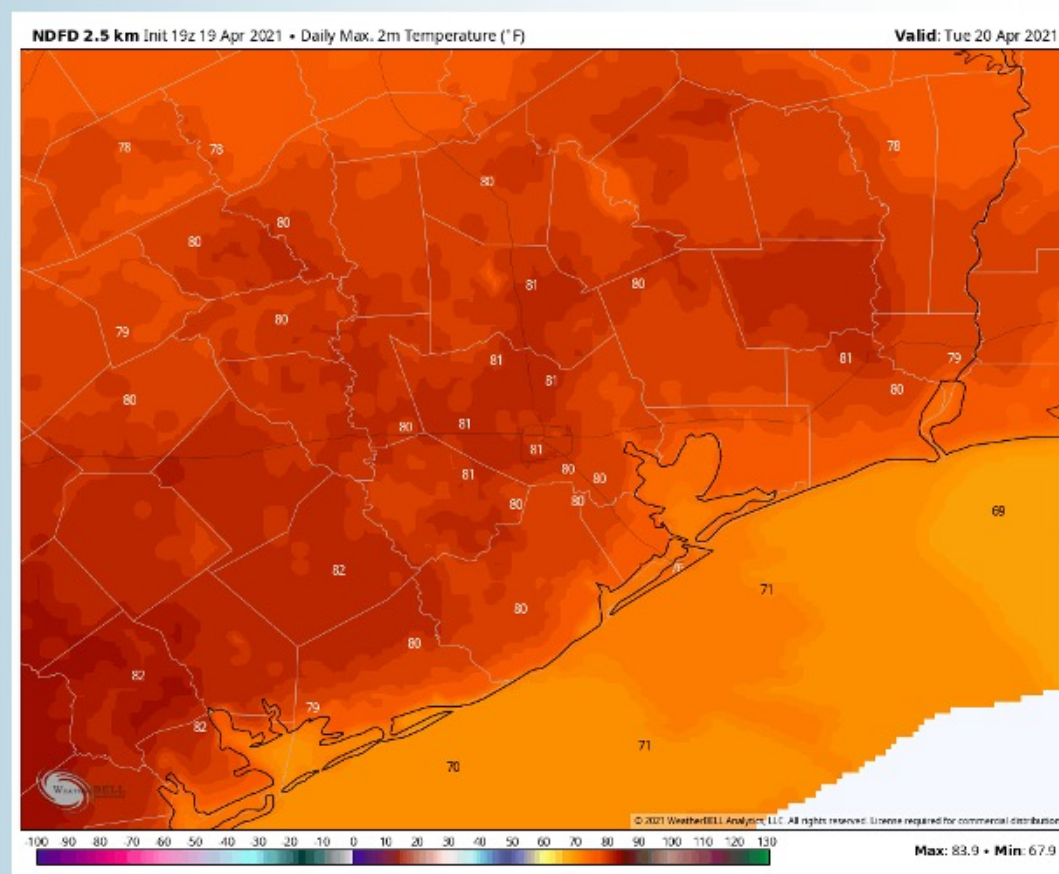
Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)



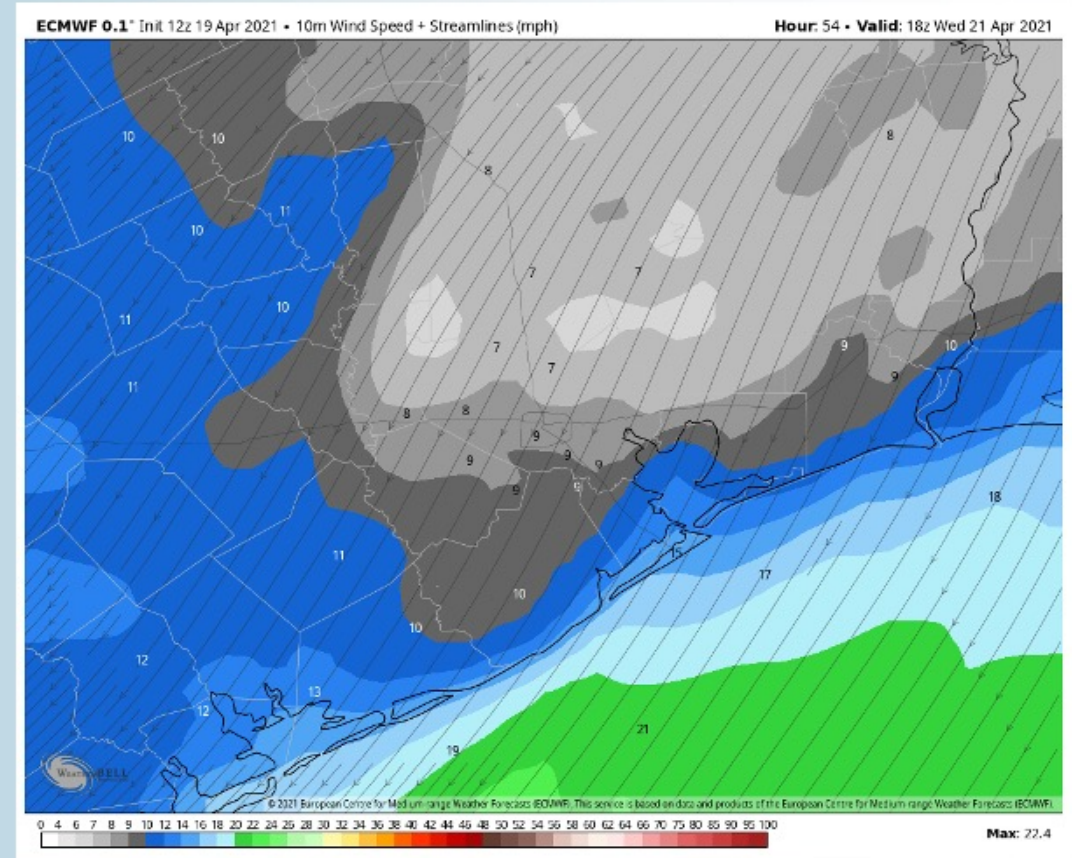
High Temperatures Tuesday



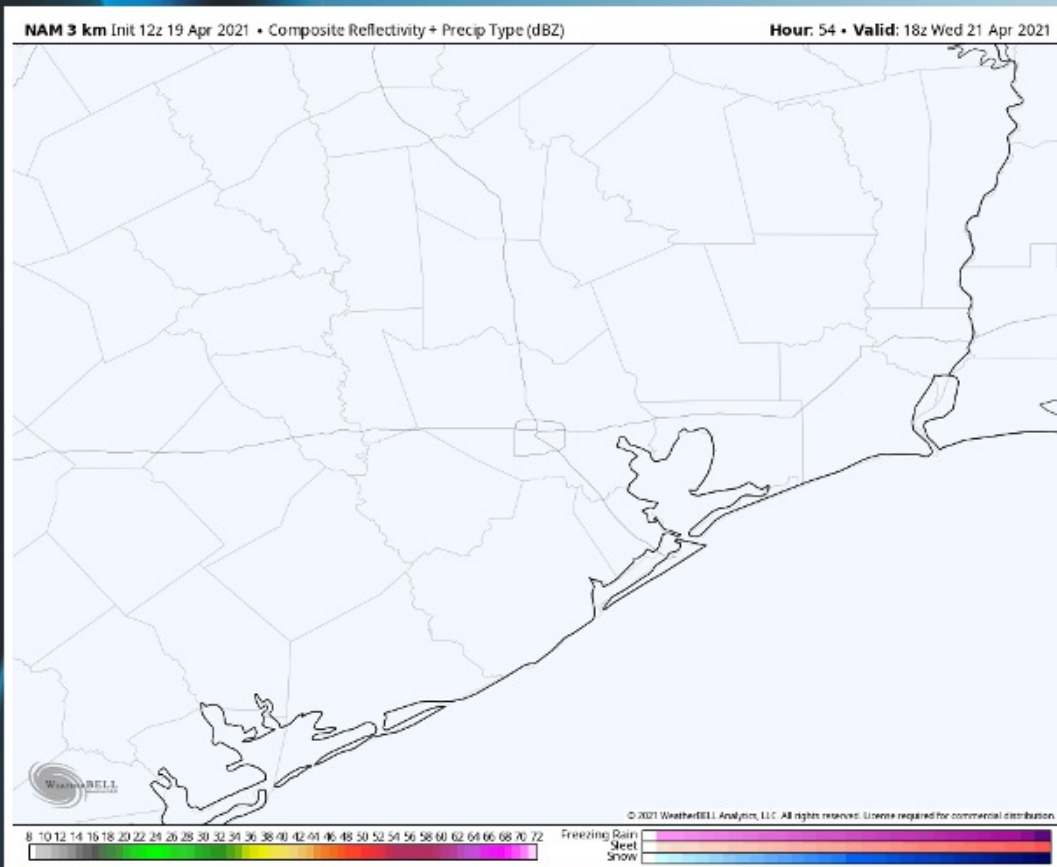
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Drier conditions expected to continue Wednesday.**
- **Winds will be out of the NE, 15-20 MPH sustained through noon, dropping to 8-13 MPH into the afternoon to evening hours with gusts at 15-20.**
- **Wednesday's temps will drop down to the upper 60s to near 70 for a high for our stations.**
- ***No fog expected Wednesday night.***

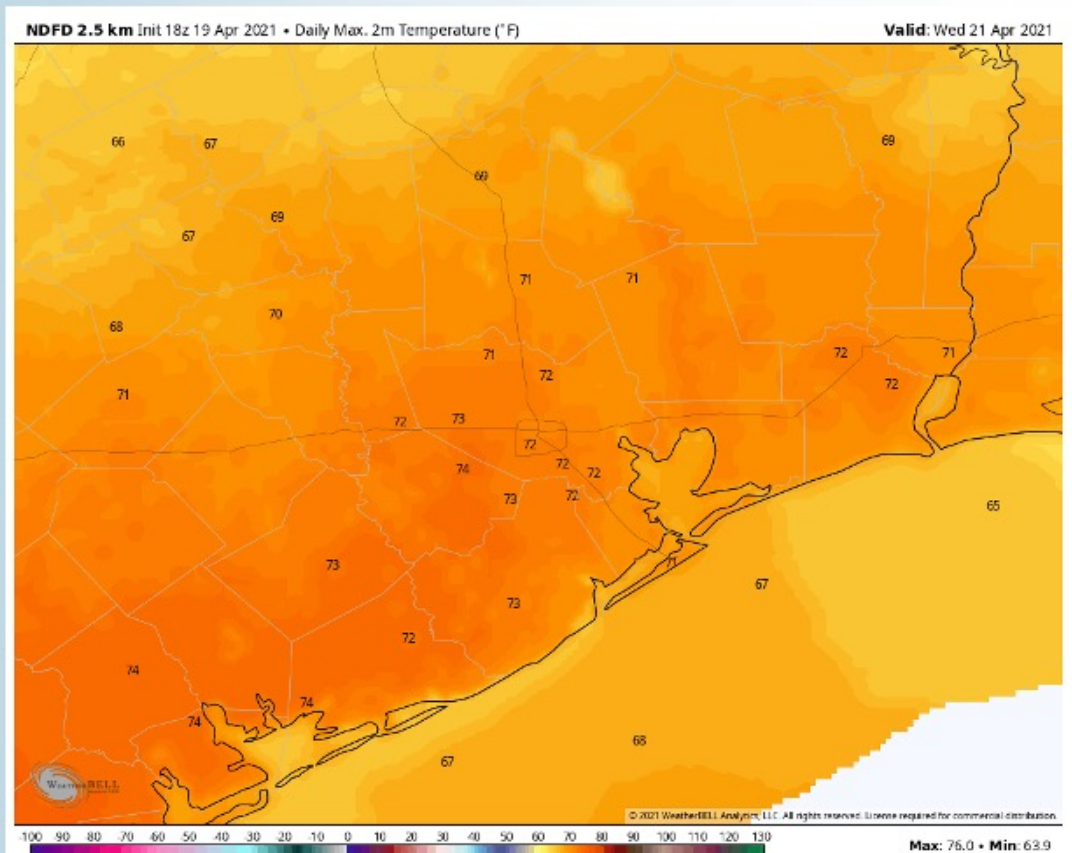
Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)



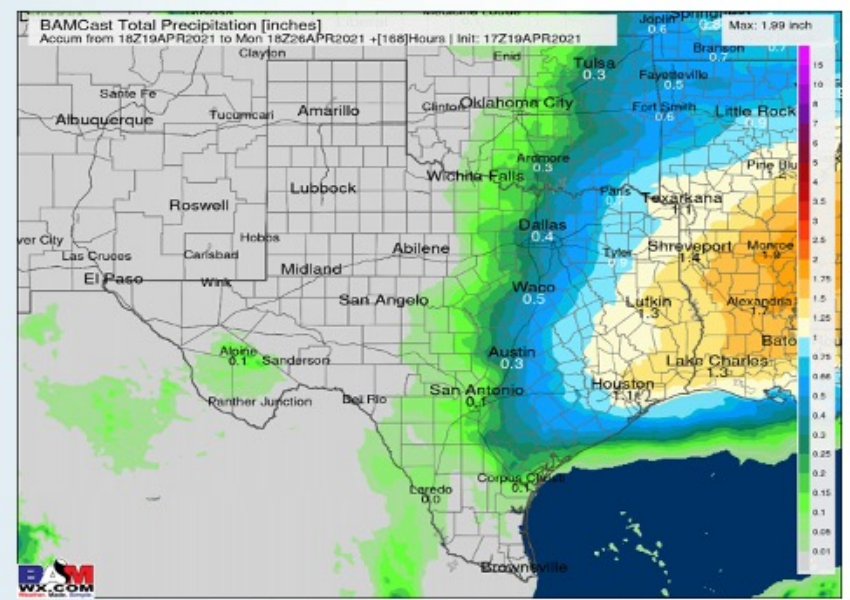
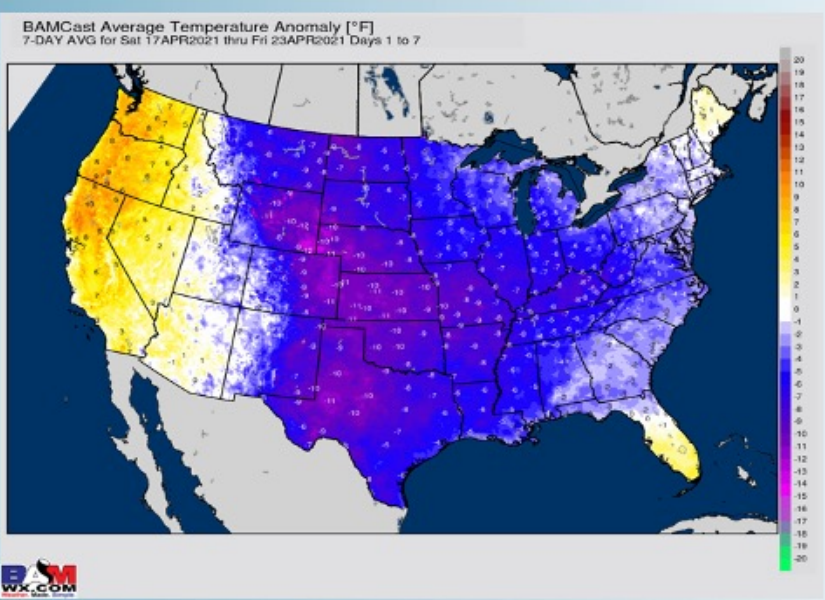
Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)



High Temperatures Wednesday



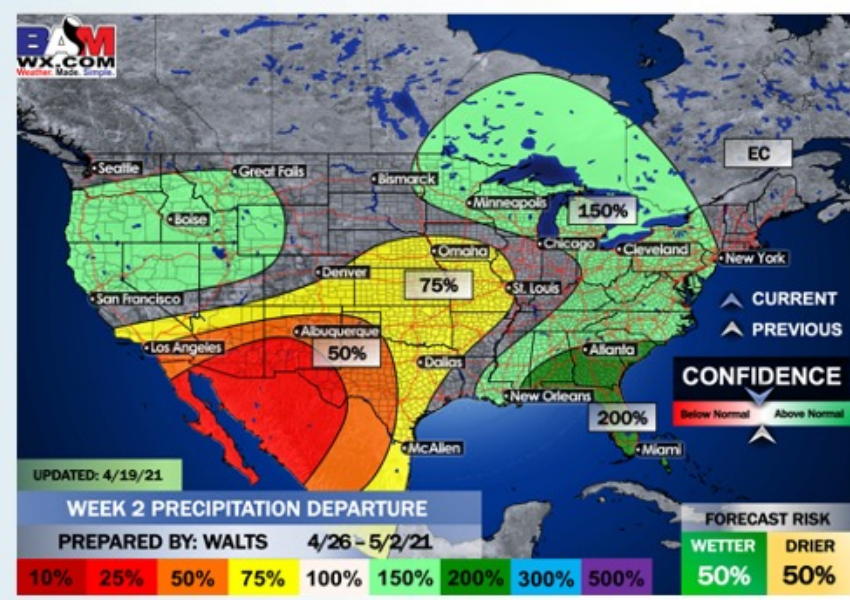
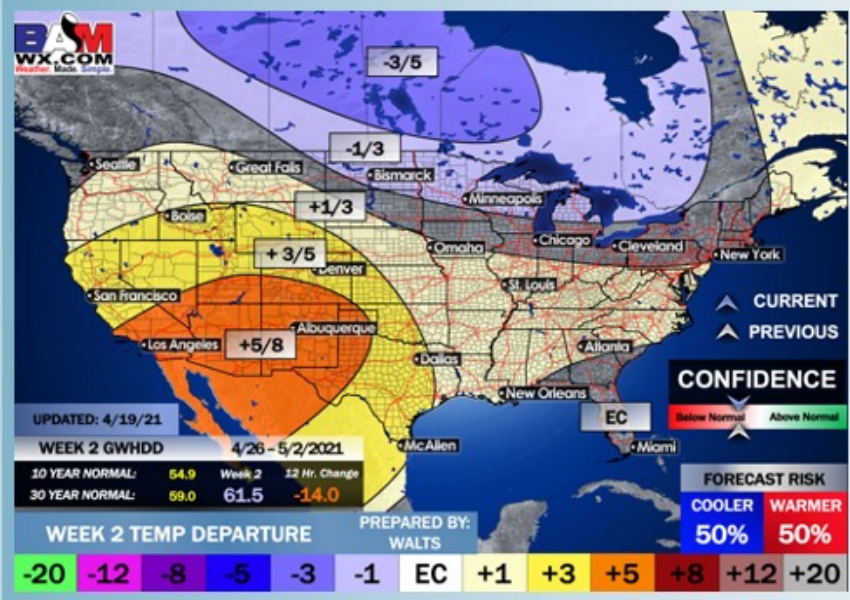
Week 1 Forecast



Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temperatures will be below normal over the next week. The week starts out quiet down here, eyeing our best precip chance to come Friday later this week, turning drier into the weekend.
- The week 2 period will see a warm up to seasonable to above normal temperatures. Best precipitation will stay just east in the Deep South with near normal precipitation likely.
- We expect that a warmer pattern develops as we work into May with the potential for drier risks to re-establish under a ridge of high pressure.
