

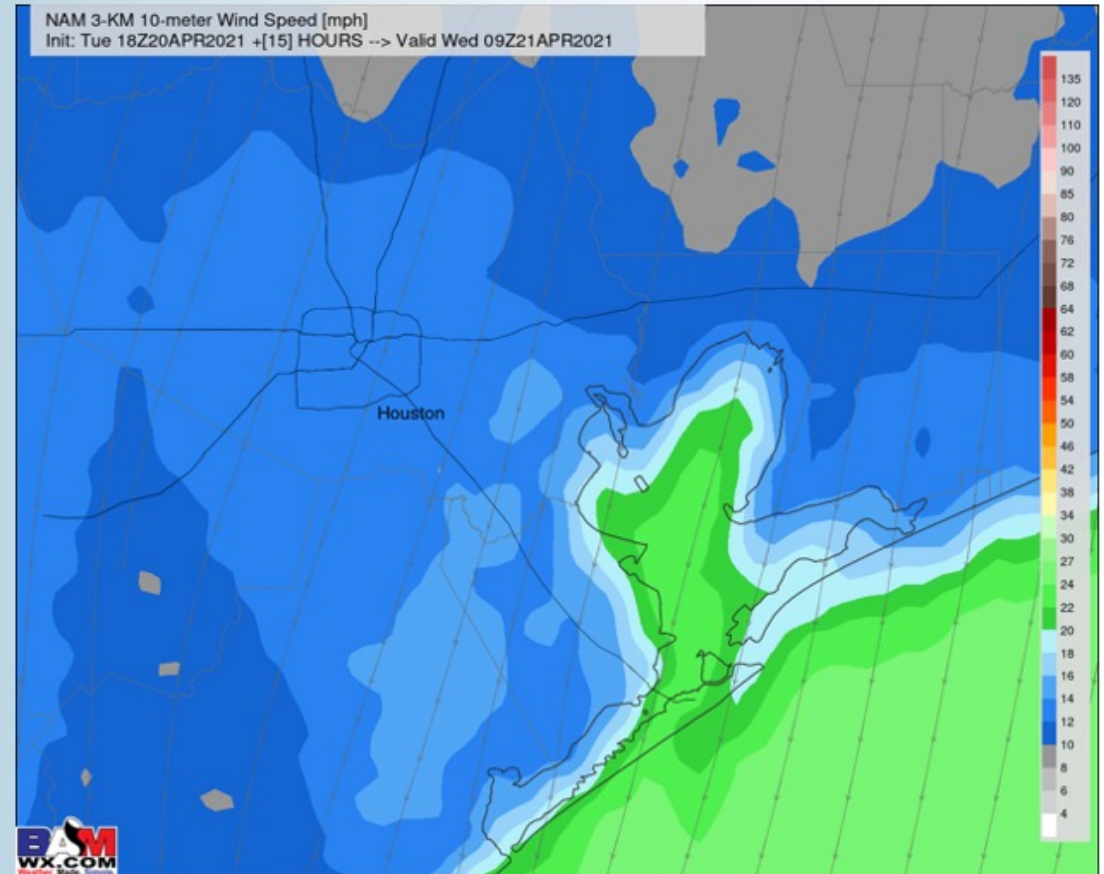

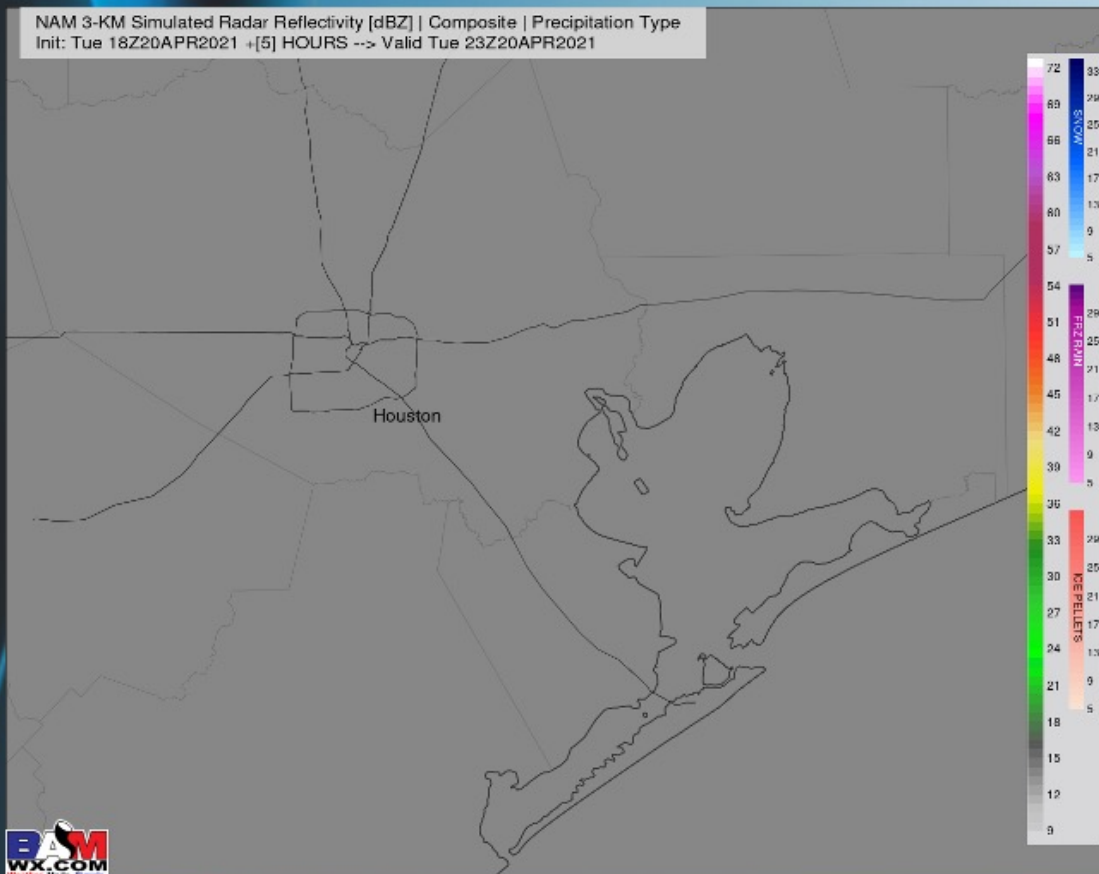
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Drier conditions expected to continue through tonight.**
- **Winds are expected to shift out of the north as we work into the overnight hours following consistent southerly winds this evening. After the front passes, sustained winds of 15-20+ MPH at times is possible with gusts to 30 MPH at times.**
- **Temps will fall into the mid-upper 50s over water tonight.**
 - ***No fog expected tonight night.***

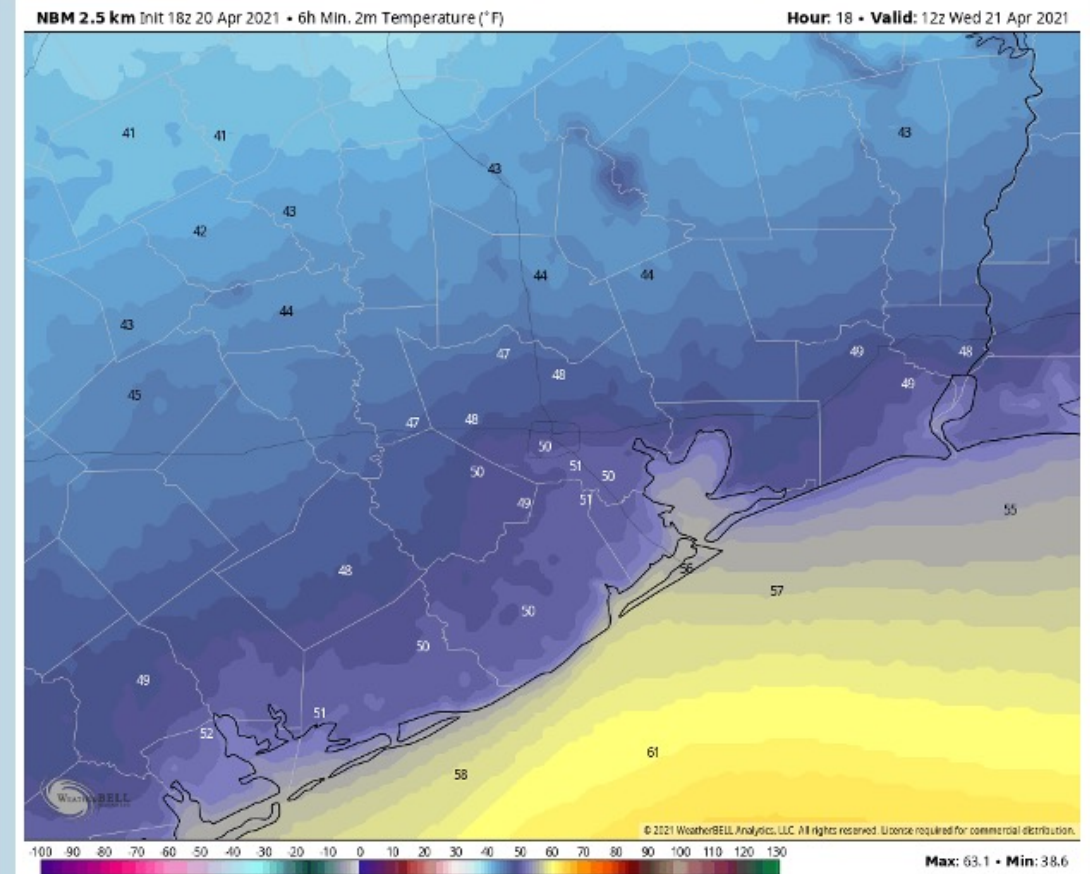
Sustained Winds (4AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (6 PM CT)



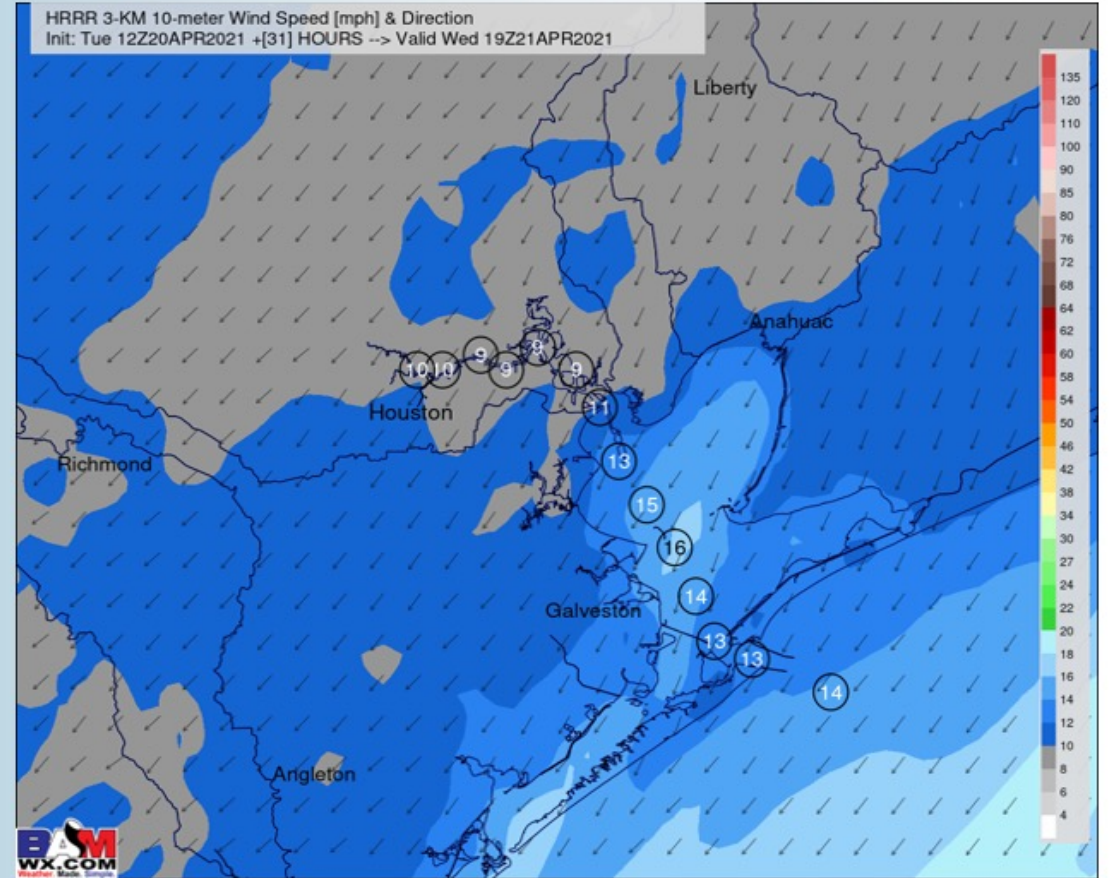
Low Temperatures Tonight



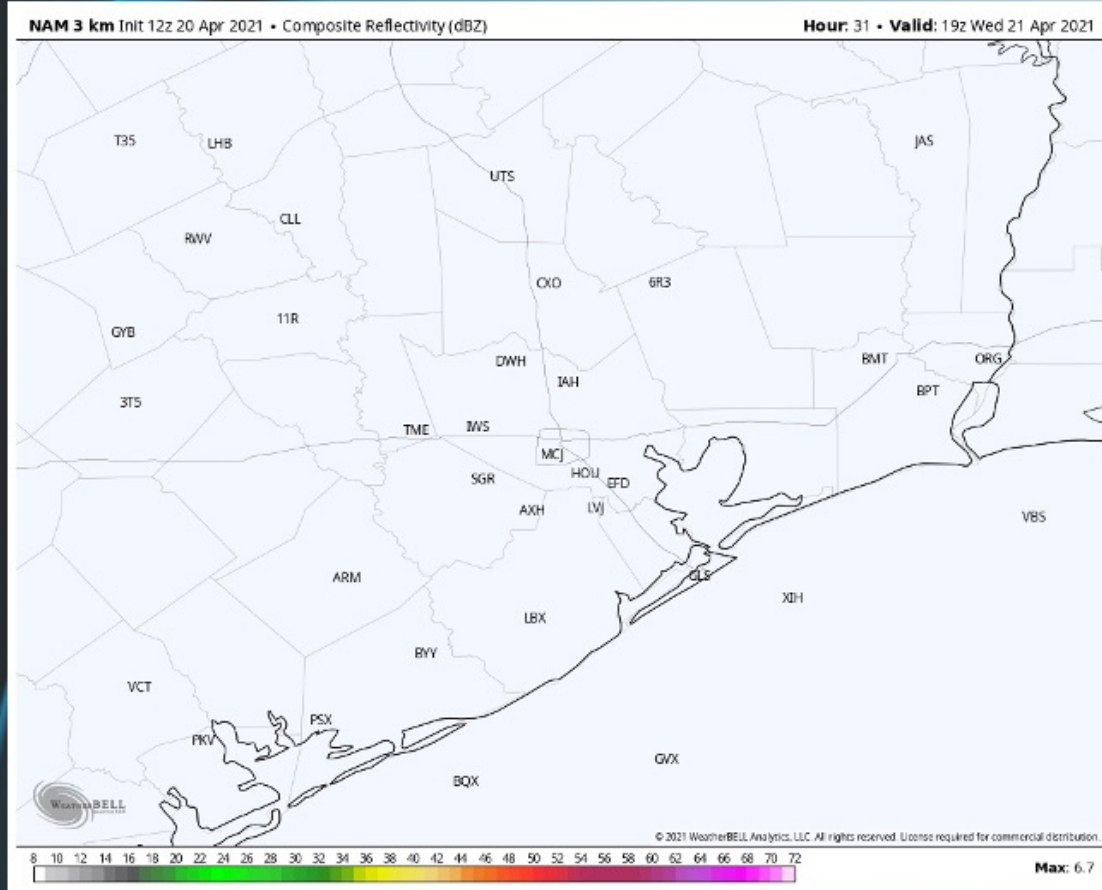
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Drier conditions expected to continue Wednesday.**
- **Winds will be out of the NE, 15-20 MPH (gusting at times to 25-30 MPH) sustained through noon, dropping to 8-13 MPH into the afternoon to evening hours.**
- **Wednesday's temps will drop down to the upper 60s to near 70 for a high.**
 - ***No fog expected Wednesday night.***

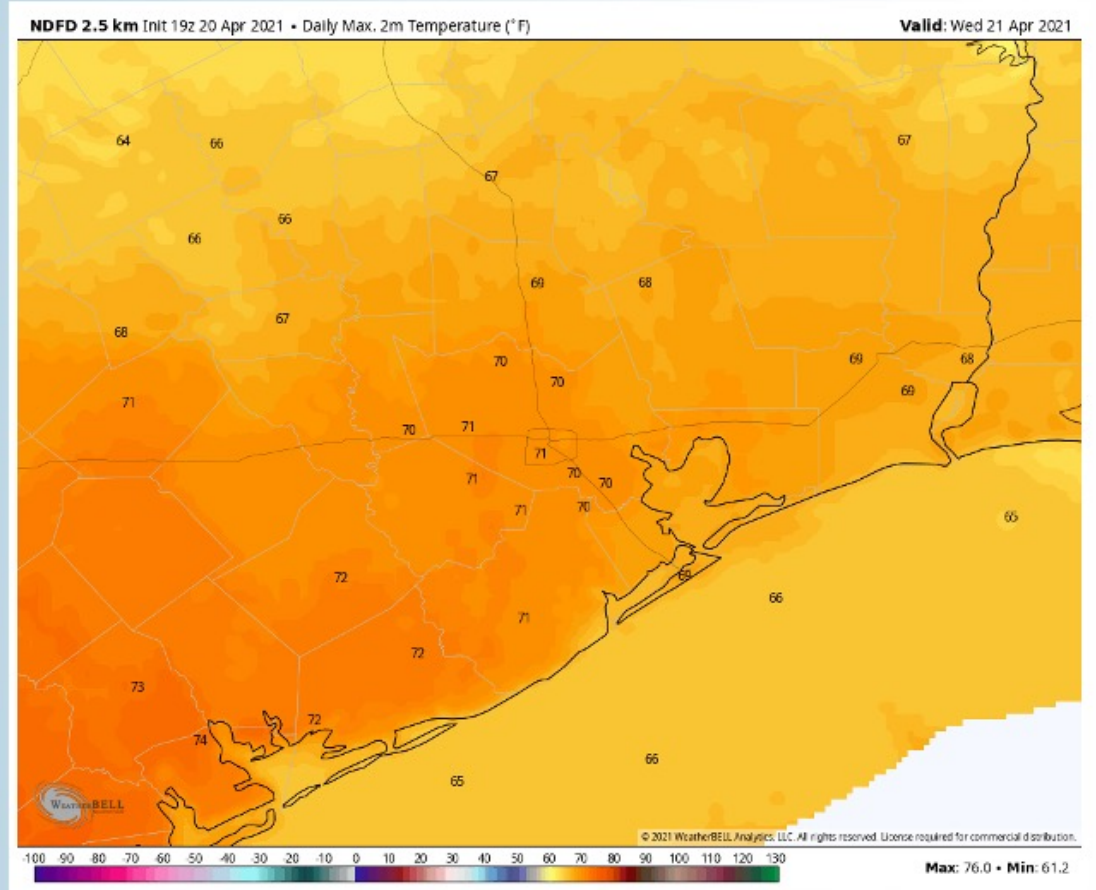
Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)



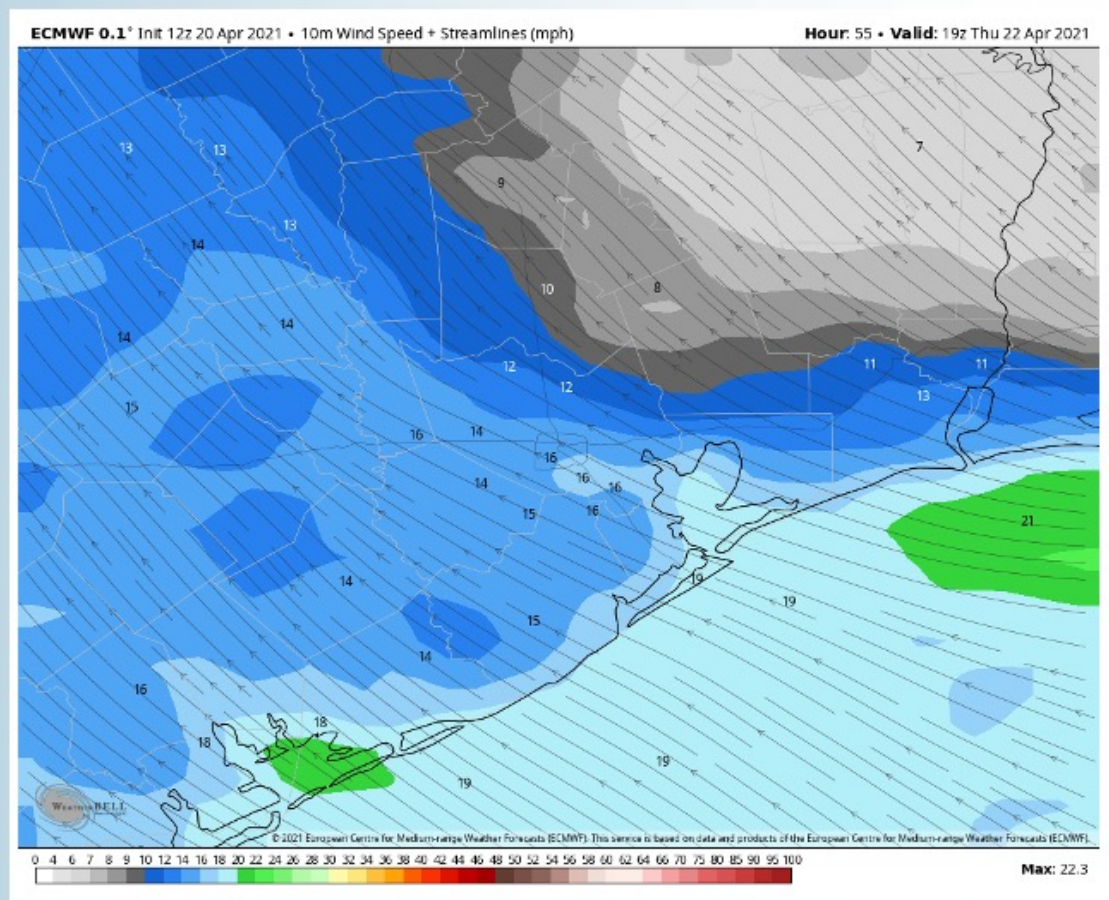
High Temperatures Wednesday



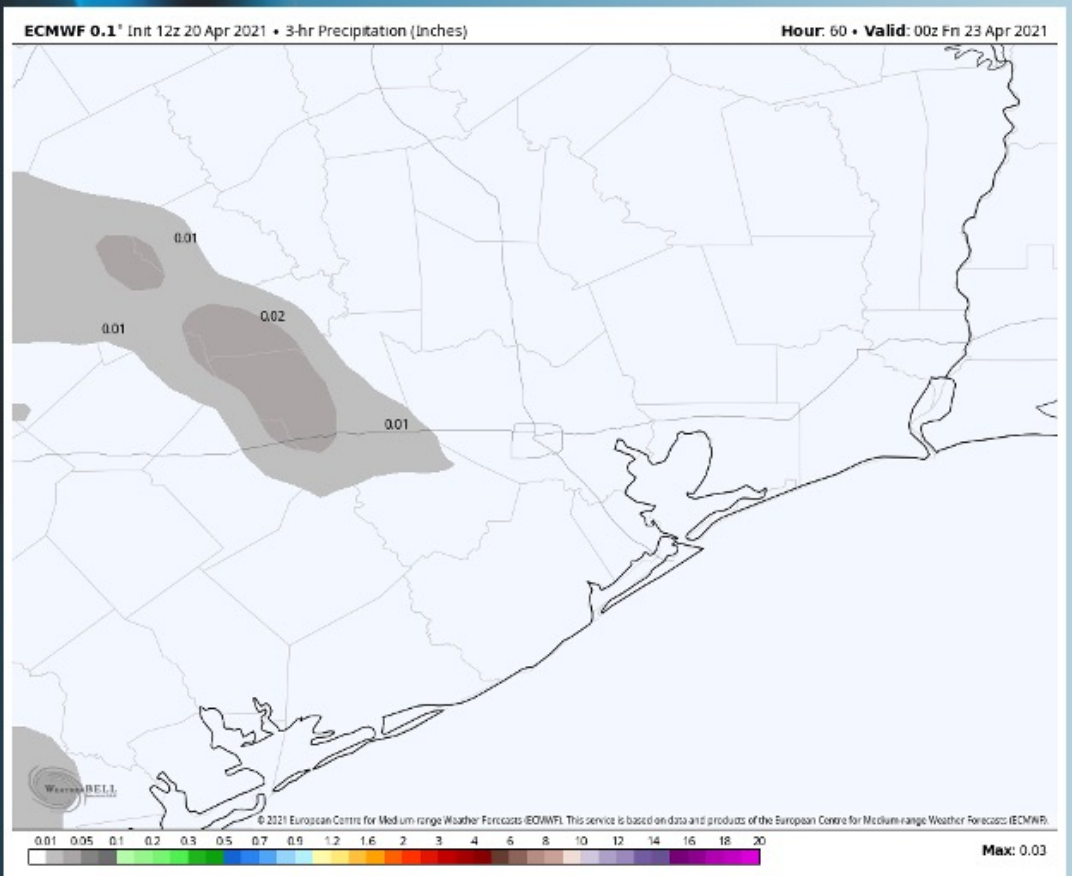
Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Drier conditions expected to continue Thursday. An isolated shower west of the Boarding Stations will be possible in the afternoon/evening.**
- **Winds will shift from East to Southeast on Thursday, breezy, with sustained winds expected at 15-20 MPH...gusting at times to 25-30 MPH.**
- **Thursday temps will be around 70F for highs.**
 - ***No fog expected Thursday night.***

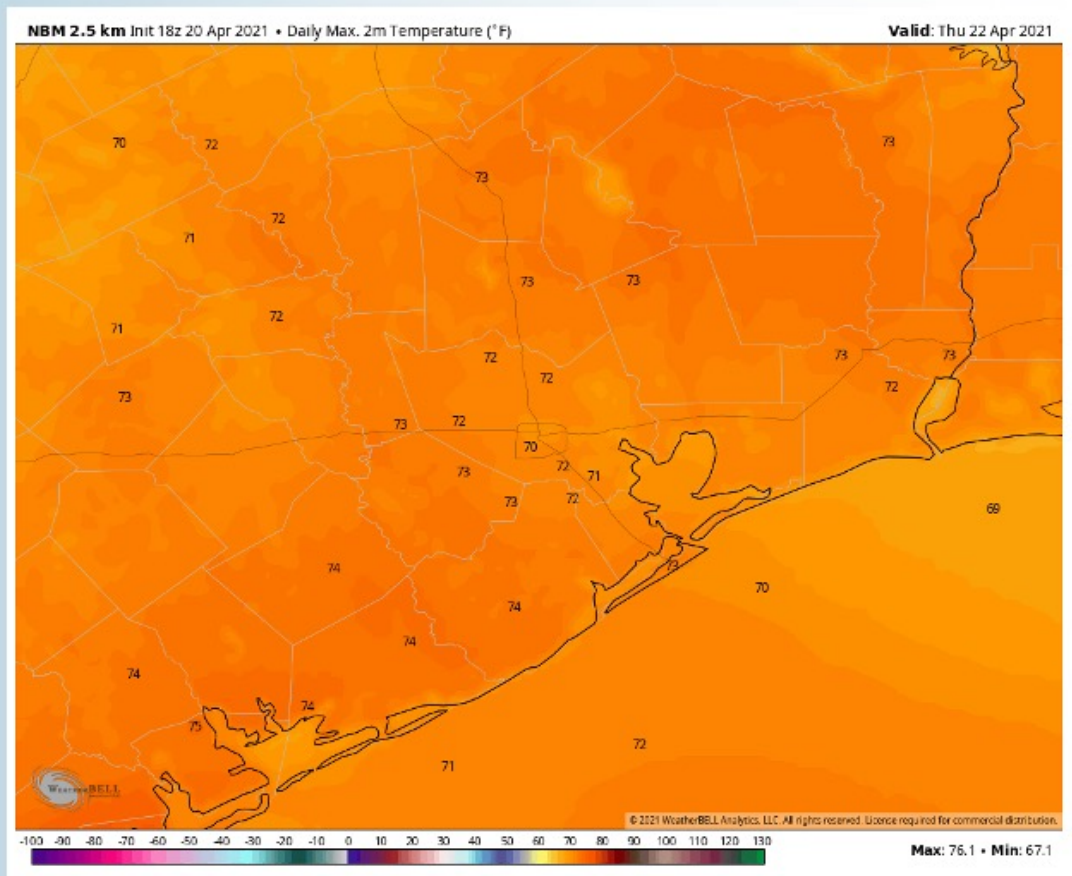
Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (7 PM CT)



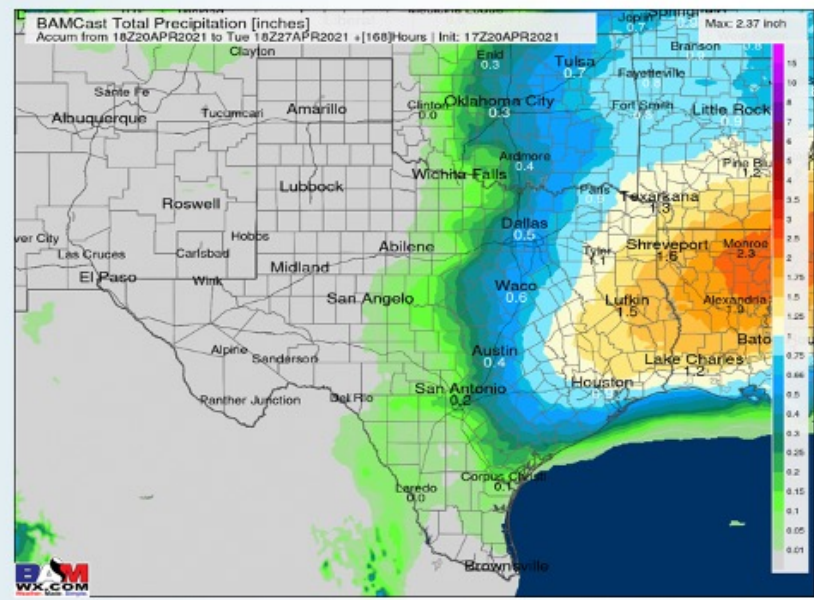
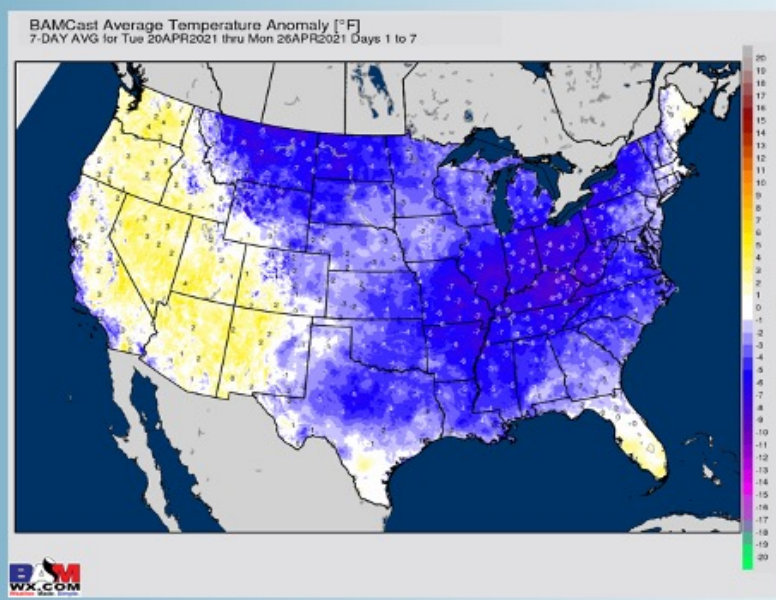
High Temperatures Thursday



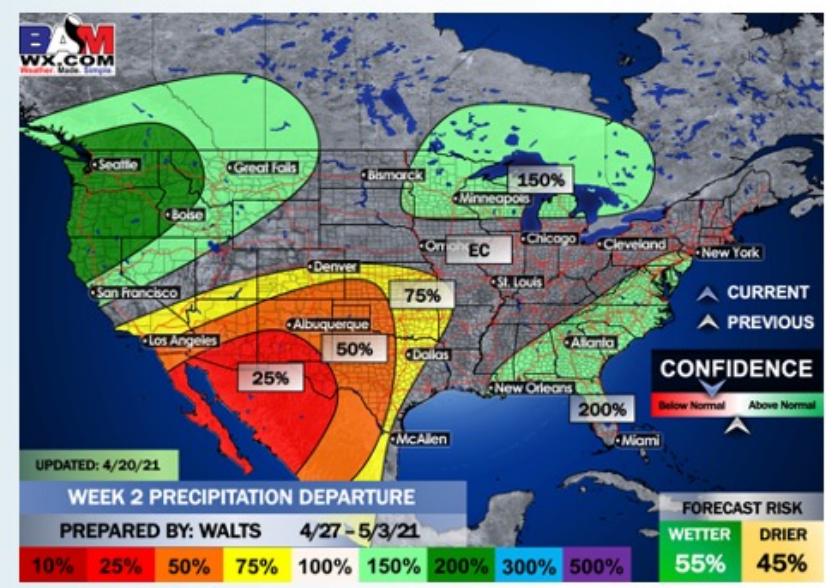
Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temperatures still look to average out below normal for week 1, but warming as we work into next week. Precipitation chances look to be the best late this weekend into the weekend with severe weather risks possible in parts of the S. Plains/Deep South that we'll need to monitor.
- We expect week 2 to be warmer than normal with an active pattern continuing early in the week before a drier pattern could dry to re-develop mid-late week.
- We expect that the pattern can stay warmer and a bit drier for early-mid May overall.
