




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Drier conditions expected to continue today.
- Winds today will slowly shift from N to more NE during the day, 20-25 MPH sustained (gusting at times to 25-35 MPH) through ~11 AM, gradually weakening to 10-15 MPH sustained into the afternoon/evening hours.
- Today's temps will sit in the upper 60s to near 70 for a high.
 - *No fog expected today.*


Sustained Winds (9 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)




High Temperatures Today




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Drier conditions expected to continue for much of Thursday. An isolated shower will be possible beyond ~5 PM, but this threat looks to be ~20% and any precipitation would be favored to be rather light.
- Expecting winds more E around ~4 AM Thursday and then SE by mid-morning (continuing SE the rest of the day). Winds will be 15-20 MPH sustained with gusts 20-25 MPH for the first half of the day, beyond Noon winds increase 20-25 with gusts 25-30 MPH possible
- Thursday temps will be around 70F for highs.
 - *No fog expected Thursday.*


Sustained Winds (9 AM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (6 PM CT)




High Temperatures Thursday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Friday is looking to be a rather active day. Shower and iso t-storm activity will be scattered in the morning hours before becoming more widespread into the afternoon. Strong storms will certainly be possible and a few severe storms cannot be ruled out at this distance. Precip should be out of the area by Sat AM.
- Winds will come out of the SE for Friday, currently favoring sustained winds of 15-20 MPH with gusts 20-25 MPH.
- High temps on Friday should be in the mid 70s
 - *No fog expected Friday.*


Sustained Winds (1 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (2 PM CT)





High Temperatures Friday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temperatures still look to average out below normal for week 1, but warming as we work into next week. Precipitation chances look to be the best late this weekend into the weekend with severe weather risks possible in parts of the S. Plains/Deep South that we'll need to monitor.
- We expect week 2 to be warmer than normal with an active pattern continuing early in the week before a drier pattern could dry to re-develop mid-late week.
- We expect that the pattern can stay warmer and a bit drier for early-mid May overall.
