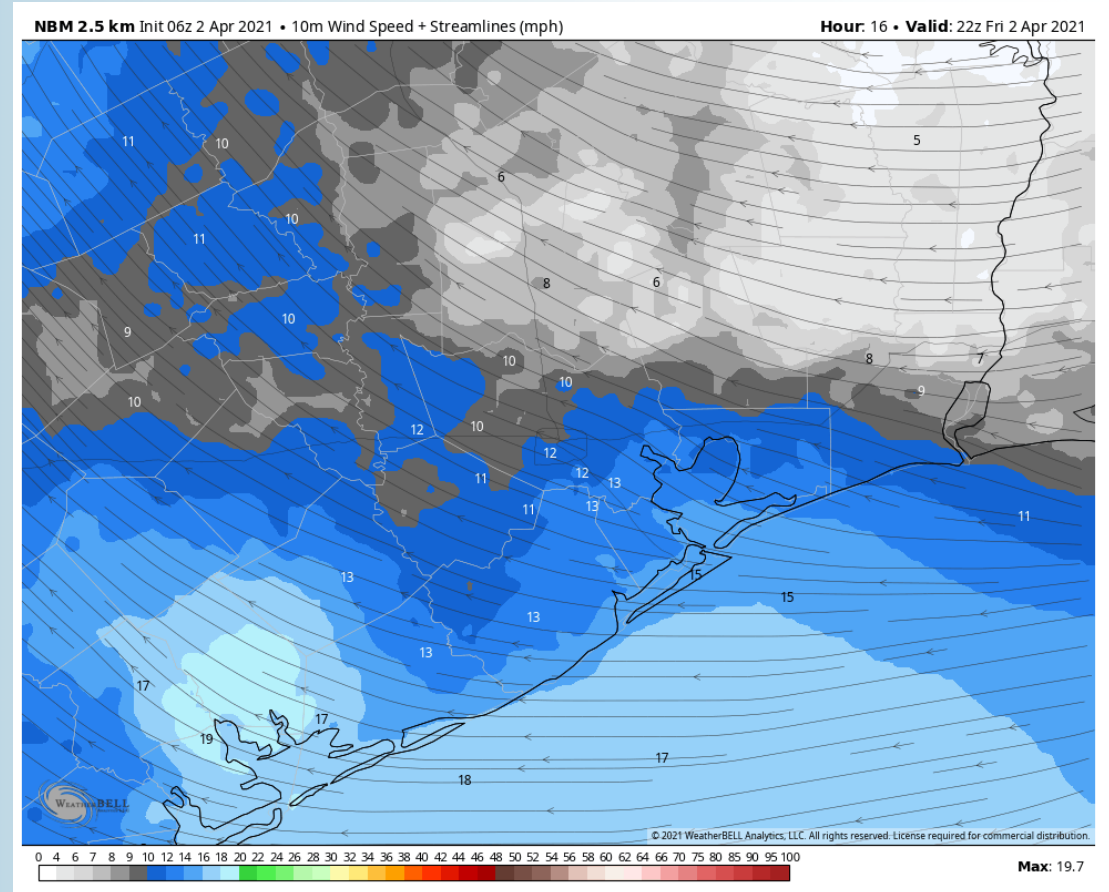

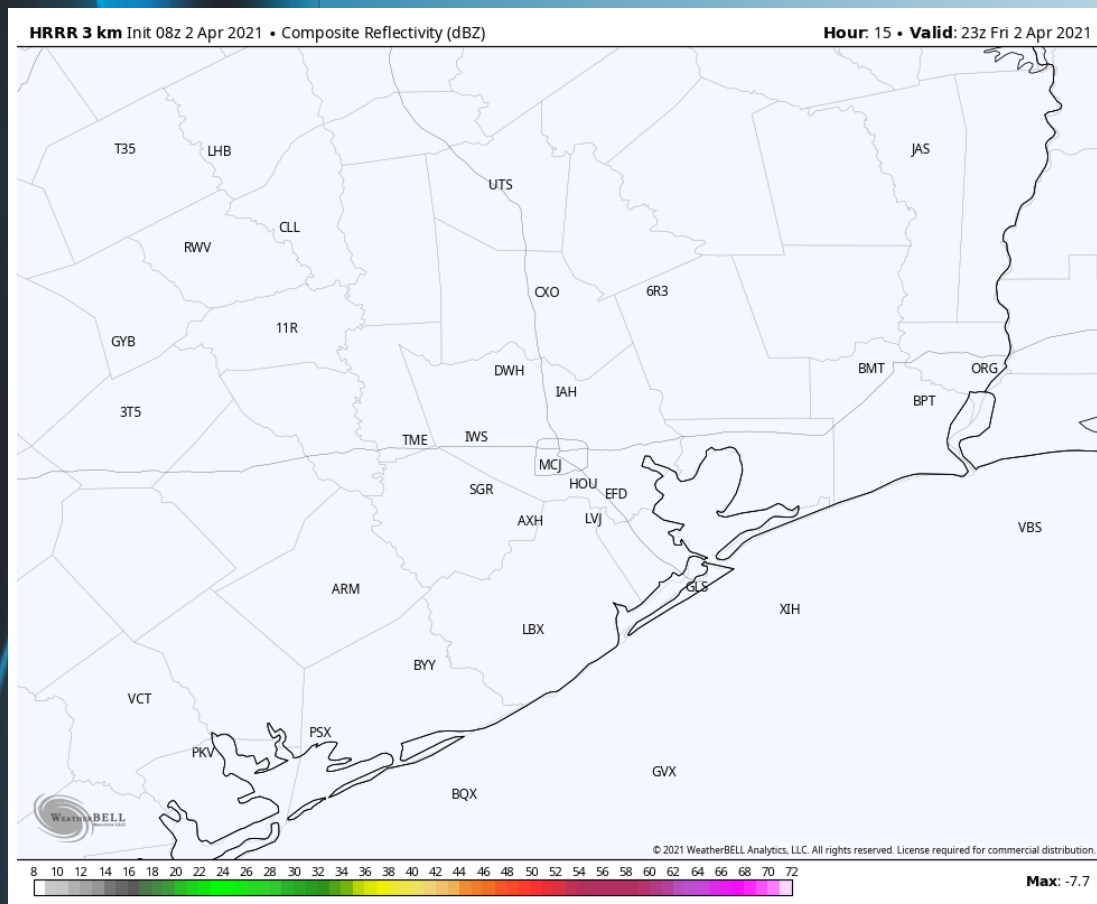
## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Friday is anticipated to be a dry day.
- Winds this morning slowly start to shift more out of the E/ SE, sustained around 10 – 20 MPH (windiest towards the Boarding Station). Winds are expected to be from the ESE into the afternoon (after 4 PM), calming down to winds around 8-15 (windiest towards the Boarding Station) MPH with gust around ~15-20 MPH.
- High temperatures look be in the low 60s F over the Boarding Stations on Friday.
- ***No Fog Anticipated Tonight.***

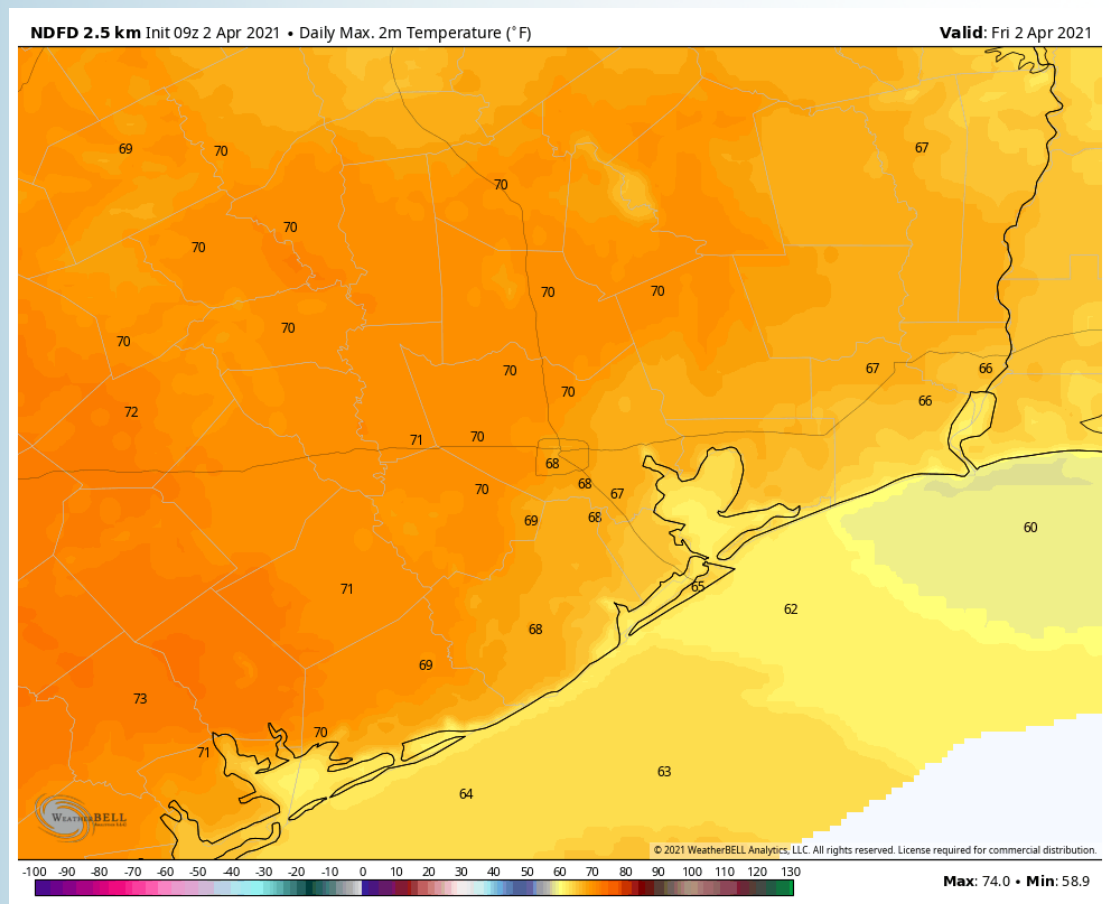
## Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (6 PM CT)



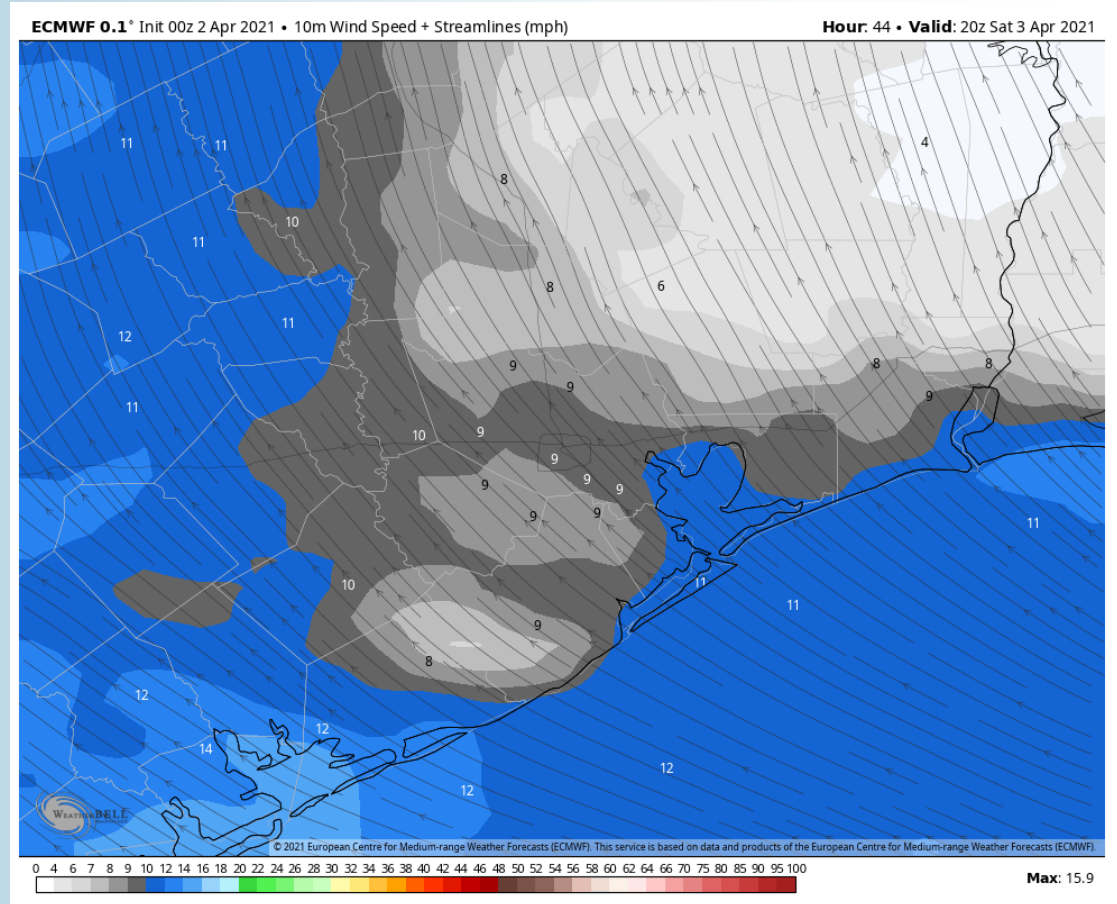

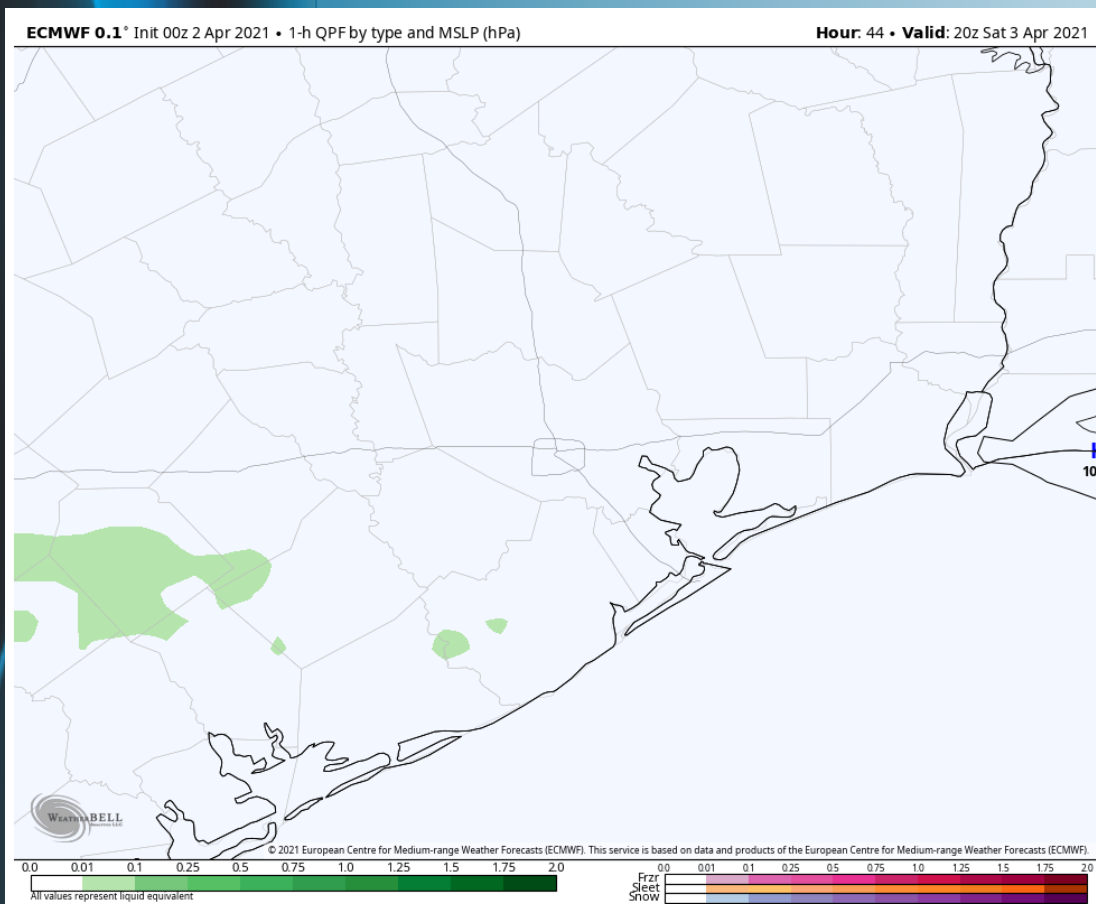
## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Saturday is favored to be a dry day. There is a very small chance (less than 10%) for very light moisture in the PM, but plenty of dry air should keep this threat quite limited.
- Winds will be from the SE at 8-13 MPH, gusting at times to 15-20 MPH.
- High temperatures look to get into the mid to upper 60's F on Saturday..
- *Not expecting fog on Saturday night at this time.*

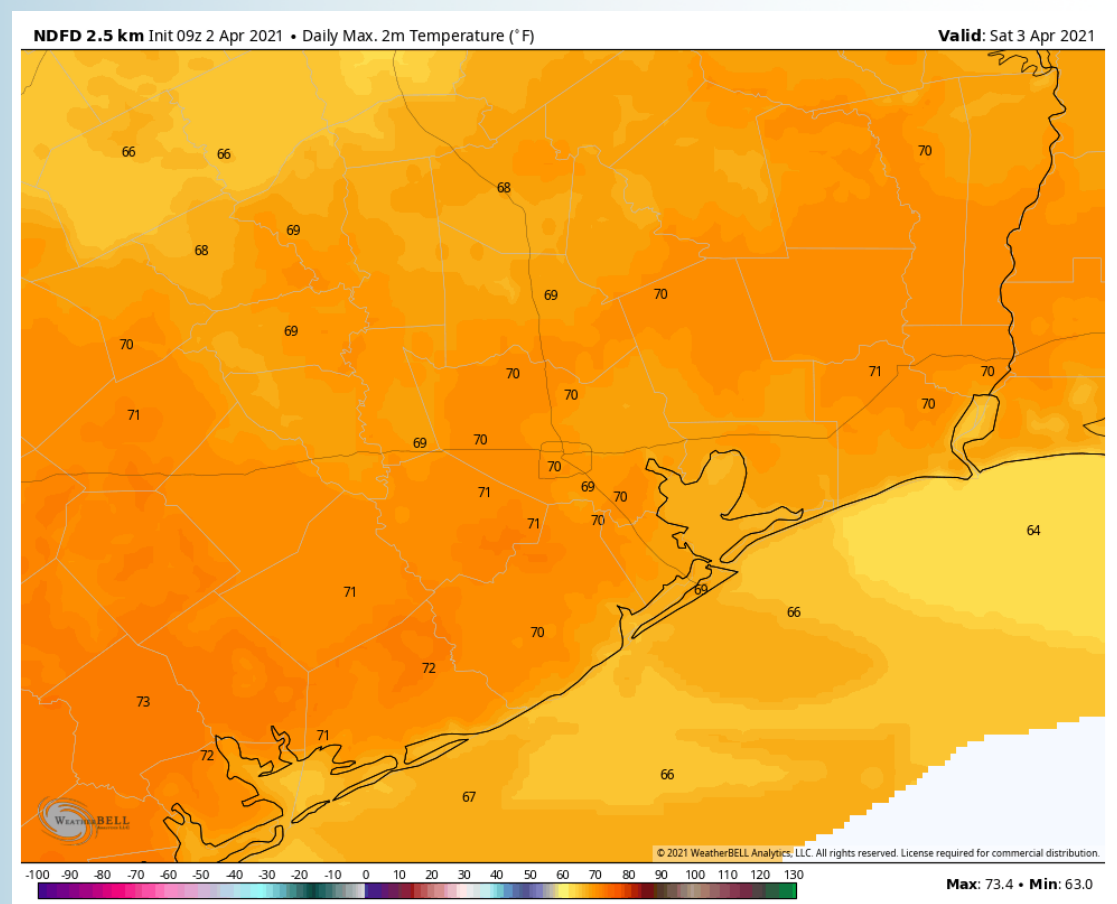
## Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)



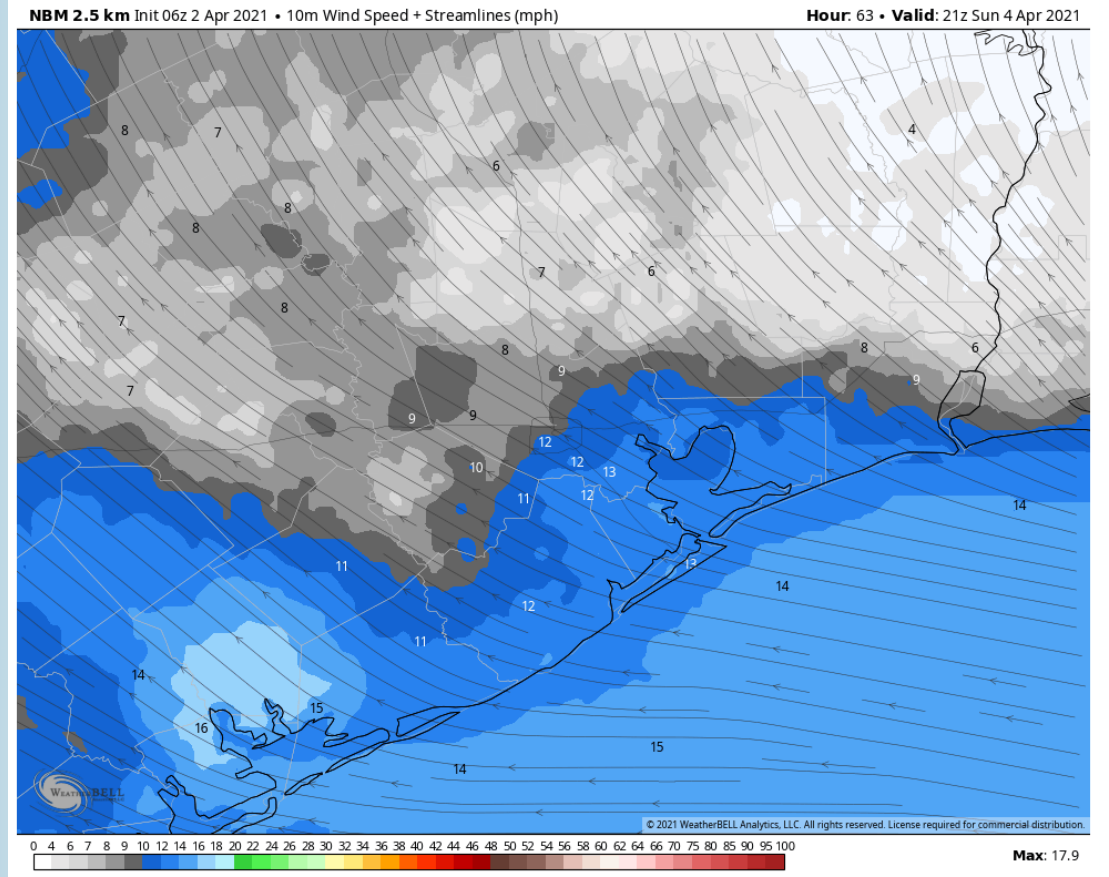

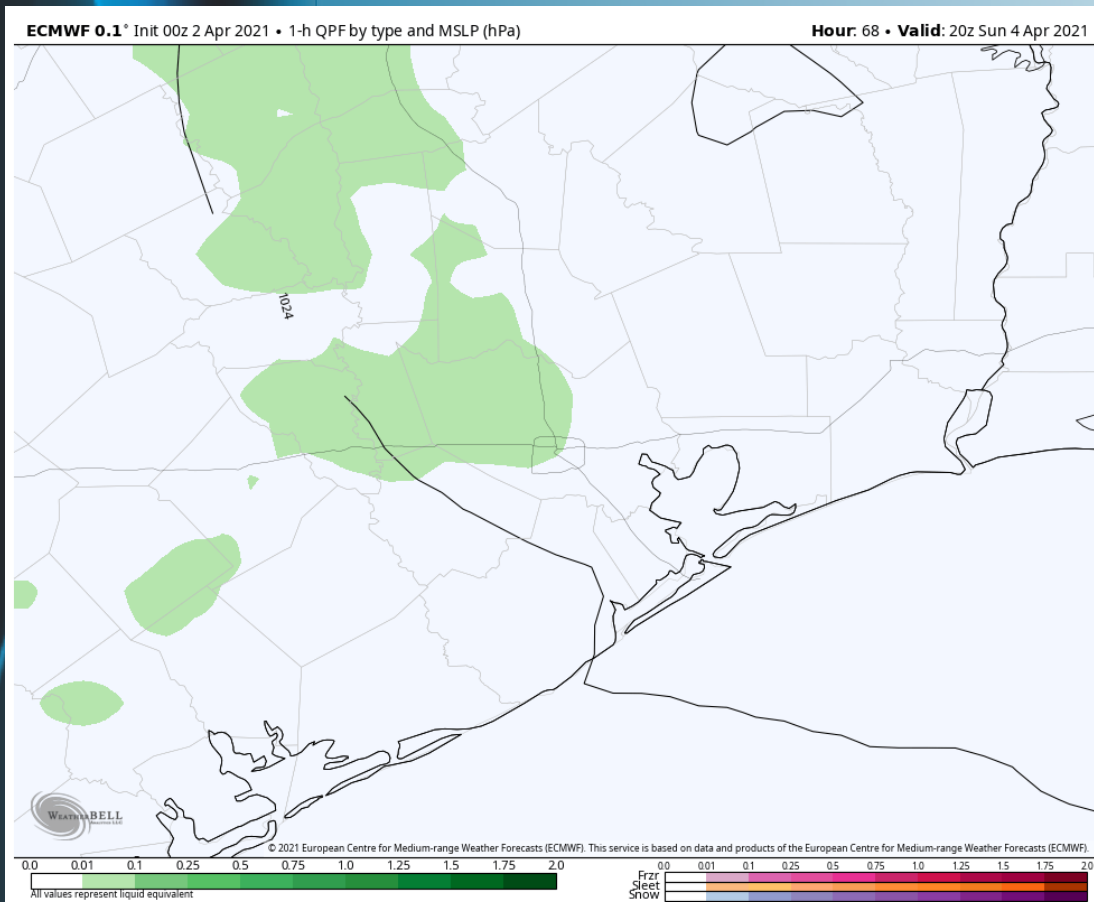
## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Sunday is favored to be a dry day. A very small chance for light moisture, but again, dry air should keep any chances limited.
- Winds in the morning SUN should be on the lighter side (5 – 10 MPH) of of the E/ ESE, before shifting more out of the SE in the afternoon. Winds in the afternoon on Sunday look to be sustained around 8 – 13 MPH with gust around 15 – 20 MPH possible.
- High Temperatures look to get into the upper 60's F.
  - *Not expecting fog tonight across the area.*

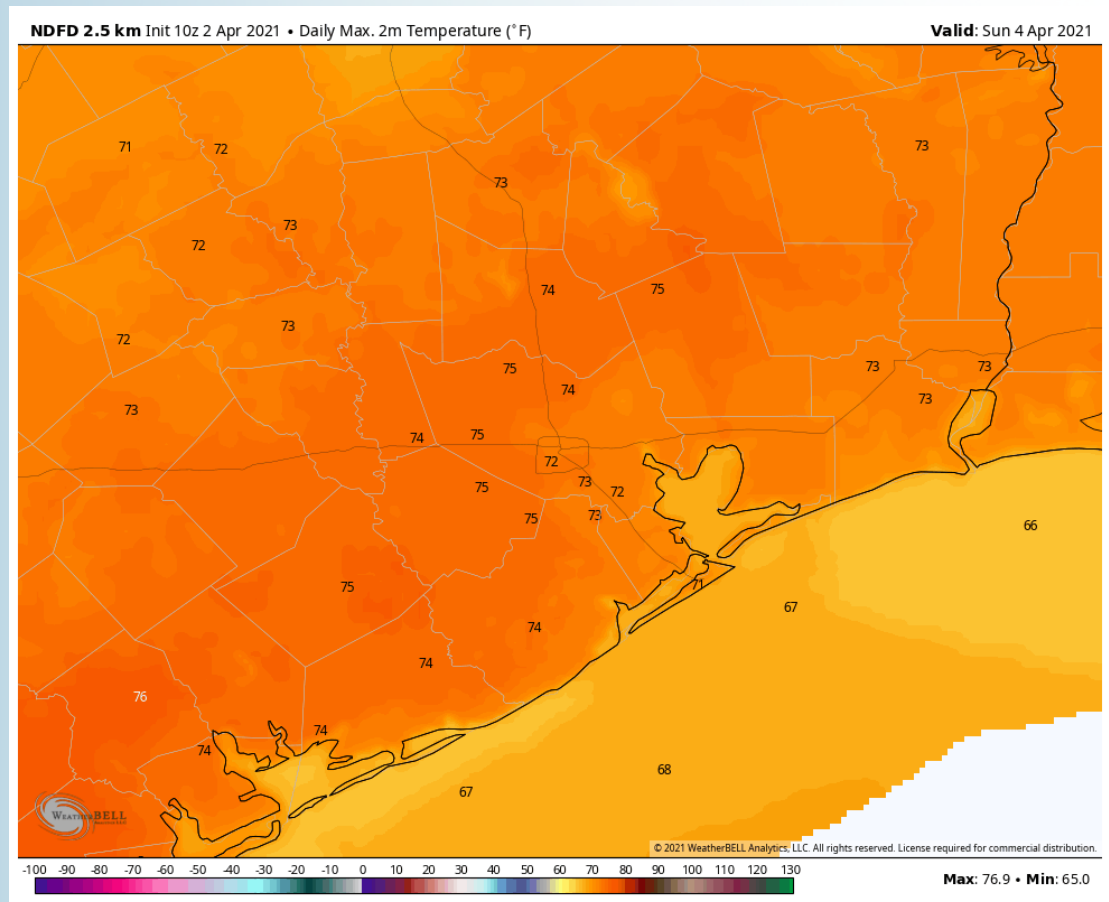
## Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (3 PM CT)

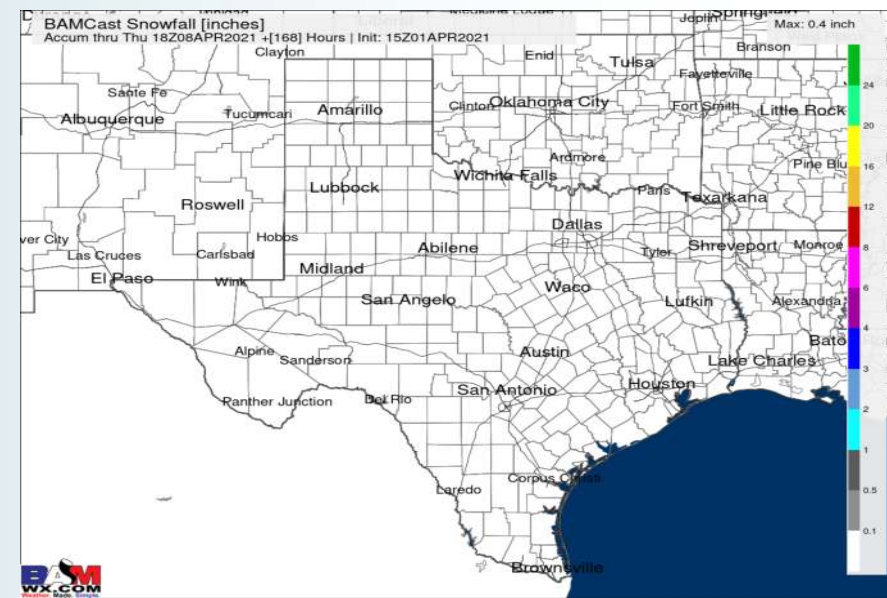
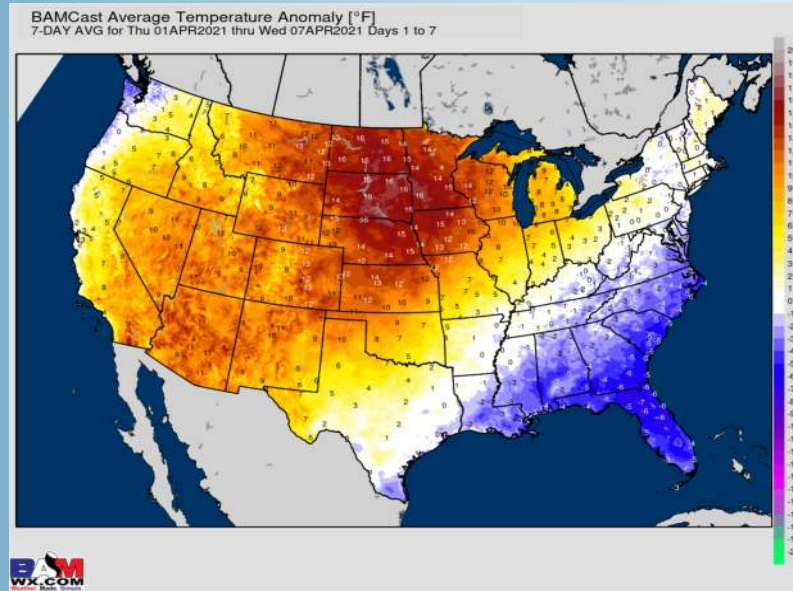

## Week 1 Forecast

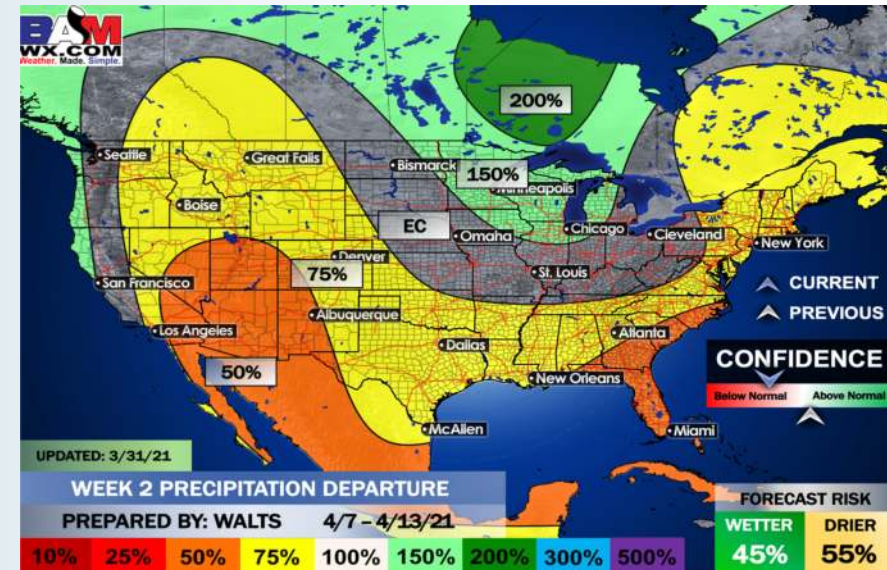
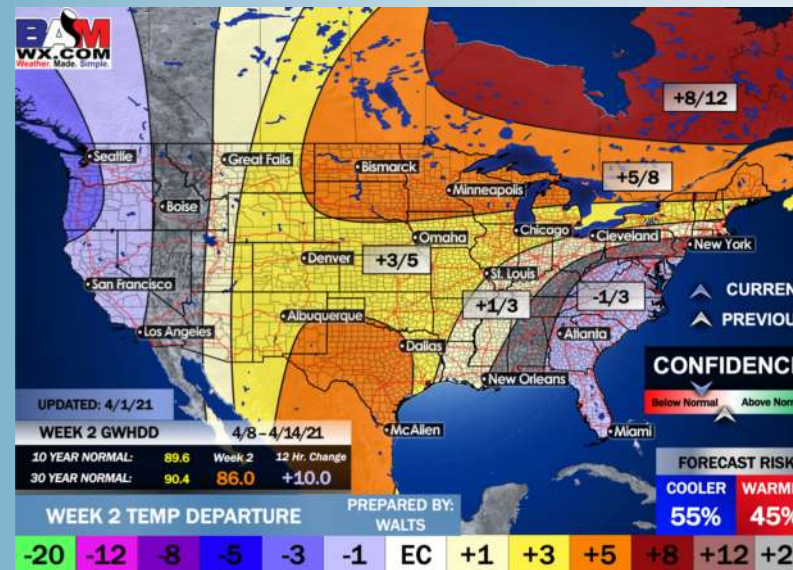
### Long-Range Forecast Discussion



➤ Precipitation chances will be little to none over the next week across the area. Temperatures will average out close to normal as a whole over the next week as well (but increasing each day going forward), but nothing notable.

➤ Precipitation looks to continue to stay below normal in the week 2 timeframe, temps are still anticipated to be slightly above normal as well.
