




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Drier conditions expected to continue today.**
- **Winds should continue to weaken this afternoon with sustained NE winds at 8 - 13 MPH. They may try to pick back up overnight over the harbor with winds at 15-20 MPH at times.**
- **Temps will fall into the 60s tonight over the water.**
- ***No fog expected today.***


Sustained Winds (5 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)




Low Temperatures Tonight




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **Drier conditions expected to continue for much of Thursday. An isolated shower will be possible to the north/west beyond ~5 PM, but this threat looks to be quite low and very light overall.**
- **Expecting winds more E around ~4 AM Thursday and then SE by mid-morning (continuing SE the rest of the day). Winds will be 15-20 MPH sustained with gusts 20-25 MPH for the first half of the day, beyond Noon winds increase 20-25 with gusts 25-30 MPH possible**
- **Thursday temps will be around 70F for highs.**
 - ***No fog expected Thursday.***


Sustained Winds (4 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (7 PM CT)




High Temperatures Thursday




Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Friday is looking to be a rather active day. Shower and iso t-storm activity will be scattered in the morning hours before becoming more widespread into the afternoon. Strong storms will certainly be possible and a few severe storms cannot be ruled out at this distance. Precip should be out of the area by Sat AM.
- Winds will come out of the SE for Friday, currently favoring sustained winds of 15-20 MPH with gusts 20-25 MPH.
- High temps on Friday should be in the mid 70s
 - *No fog expected Friday.*


Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)





High Temperatures Friday





Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Temperatures start off this period cooler than normal before trending warmer into next week. Precipitation chances increase late this week into the weekend with the risk of a few strong or severe storms in the area.
- A warm up to start the week 2 period is likely with a cooler period possible into early May related to a cold front. We average out normal to slightly below normal.
- We expect that a warmer pattern overall develops as we work into May with the potential for drier risks to re-establish under a ridge of high pressure.
