


## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- Our cloud deck has lowered a bit more than first thought, leading to mist around the area. Pockets of mist and thus reduced visibility will be possible out through ~10-11 AM. A very iso leftover shower cannot be ruled out as well through this timeframe. Beyond this, clearing is expected and drier weather is favored the rest of the day
- Winds the next few hours will be coming out of the SW at 13-18 MPH, and then eventually more NW by around Noon at 10-15 MPH with gusts 15-20 MPH possible. Winds then look to be more Northerly by midnight.
- Temps are expected to be in the lower 80s for most stations, mid 80s further inland.
- *Aside from pockets of reduced visibility this morning from a low cloud deck / mist, widespread fog is not favored today.*


## Sustained Winds (2 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (10 AM CT)






## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- **No precipitation favored Sunday**
  
- **Winds Sunday start out coming from the N, then shifting to more NE by ~8 AM, E by ~Noon, and then SE by ~4 PM. Sustained winds most of the day will be 8-13 MPH with gusts 13-18 MPH possible.**
  
- **High temps Sunday look to sit in the upper 70s.**
  - ***No fog expected Sunday.***


## Sustained Winds (3 PM CT)



## Simulated Radar Snapshot (4 PM CT)






## Short-Term Forecast Discussion

- ***No fog expected Monday.***


## Sustained Winds (11 AM CT)





## Simulated Radar Snapshot (1 PM CT)




## Long-Range Forecast Discussion

- Warmer than normal temperatures especially as we work into next week with the period averaging out above normal overall though a cold front is possible to end the period.
- Following the cold front to end week 1, cooler air likely lingers for a few days allowing temperatures to average out slightly below normal. Some additional storm activity is possible in this period but heaviest risks remain east.
- Pattern remains relatively seasonable for Mid-May, but perhaps slightly more active with additional severe risks especially to our north.
